CHARLES EDWARD HAVILAND, OF LIMOGES, FRANCE.

DESIGN FOR A DISH.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 17,074, dated January 25, 1887.

Application filed June 28, 1886. Serial No. 206,539. Term of patent 14 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES EDWARD HAVILAND, a citizen of the United States, residing at Limoges, in the Republic of France, have invented and produced a new and original Design for Dishes, which is described and fully represented in the following specification and accompanying fac-simile, forming a part of the same.

The accompanying fac-simile illustrates the design embodied in a covered dish, and from which a ready understanding of its essential characteristics may be had. These characteristics are a rectangular body with doubly-curved corners having a single depression, and outwardly curved or bellied sides.

The general shape of the body A of the dish is rectangular, with corners formed by double outward curves, and sides and ends that bend very slightly inwardly, producing a contour of body corresponding, when considered horizontally, with the edge line of the cover B, as

is clearly shown. Considered vertically, this body curves outward for a short distance below the top edge and then inwardly until the 25 foot or bottom is reached, thus forming bellied sides.

The handles shown are not claimed herein, as they form the subject-matter of another patent.

What is claimed is—

The design for dishes, the same consisting of a shape that horizontally forms a rectangular figure, with corners having a single depression formed by double curves, and, vertically 35 considered, having bellied sides, substantially as shown and described.
