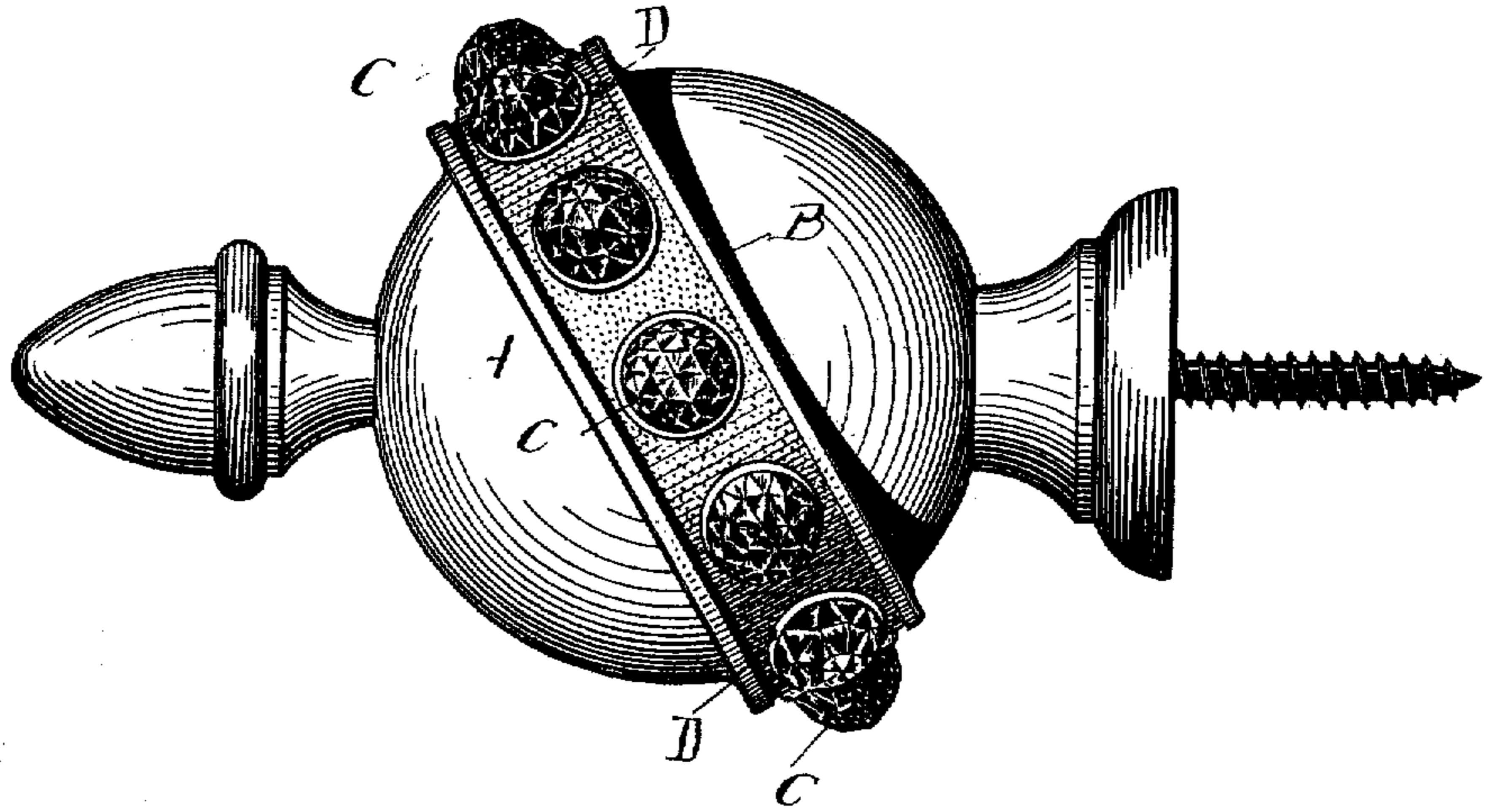

DESIGN FOR A CURTAIN-POLE END.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 18,887, dated January 29, 1889.

Application filed May 23, 1888. Serial No. 274,842. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES W. LAWRENCE, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for a Curtain-Pole End, of which the following is a specification.

The leading features of this design for a curtain-pole end are a ball-shaped body, a band encircling said body, faceted ornaments of approximately hemispherical shape on said body, and bands encircling said ornaments as their bases.

My design is represented in the accompanying drawing.

A in the drawing represents the enlarged body of a curtain-pole end, which body is spherical or approximately so.

B is a recessed band which encircles the body A, and C are faceted ornaments hemispherical or approximately so.

D represents a band encircling each of the faceted ornaments at its base.

The recessed band having the faceted ornaments provided with the encircling bands at their bases has the appearance of jewels set on the recessed band and imparts a rich ornamental appearance to the curtain-pole end.

Having thus described my design, I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

The design for a curtain-pole end herein shown and described, the same consisting of a spherical body, a band encircling said body, faceted ornaments of approximately hemispherical shape on said body, and bands encircling said faceted ornaments at their bases.
