DESIGN FOR A RUG.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 19,392, dated October 29, 1889.

Application filed October 7, 1889. Serial No. 326,282. Term of patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ADOLPH PETZOLD, a citizen of the United States, residing at Philadelphia, in the county of Philadelphia and State of Pennsylvania, have invented and produced a new and original Design for a Rug, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying photographic print, forming a part thereof, which conveys to any one skilled in the art of rug-weaving a clear understanding of the same,
