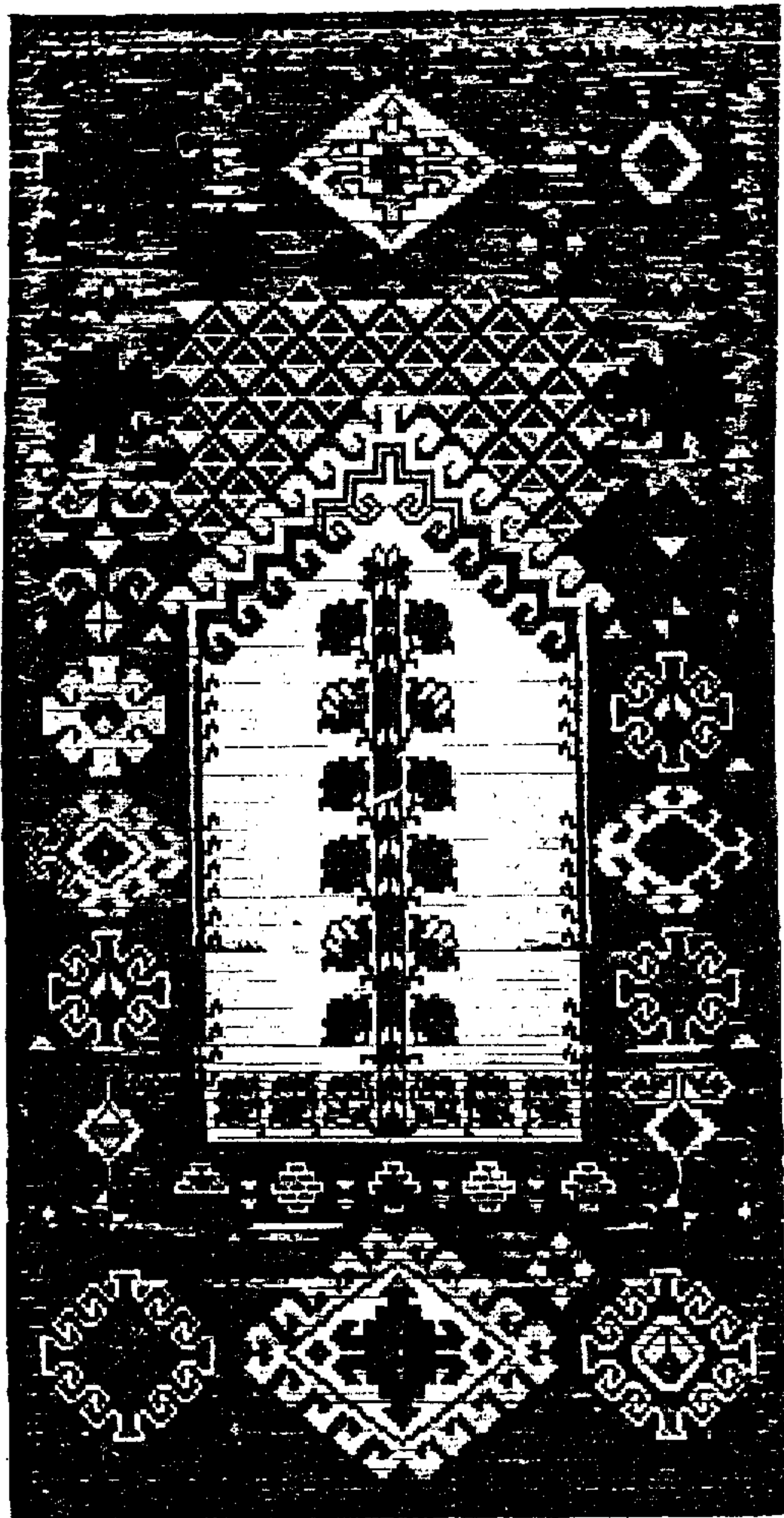

DESIGN FOR A RUG.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 19,392, dated October 29, 1889.

Application filed October 7, 1889. Serial No. 326,282. Term of patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ADOLPH PETZOLD, a
citizen of the United States, residing at Phila-
delphia, in the county of Philadelphia and
5 State of Pennsylvania, have invented and pro-
duced a new and original Design for a Rug,
