DESIGN FOR A COOKING-STOVE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 19,394, dated October 29, 1889.

Application filed October 3, 1889. Serial No. 325,926. Term of patent 14 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES F. WALTHER, a citizen of the United States, residing at Buffalo, in the county of Erie and State of New York, have invented and produced a new and original Design for Stoves, of which the following is a specification.

The object of my invention is to give an ornamental appearance to a stove adjacent to the hearth-plate; and to this end it consists in imparting an ornamental design of convolute or volute form to the stove adjacent to the end of the edge, rim, or flange of the hearth-plate.

The photograph which accompanies this specification shows a stove provided with my design, referring to which—

1 designates the hearth, the rim 2 of which extends along the face of the side plate 3 of

the stove. Adjacent to the end of the rim 2 20 is a convolute ornament 4, the rim 2 having the appearance of merging into such ornament, and this is supplemented by a leaf ornament 5, extending from the convolute 4 toward the hearth and resting upon the rim 2. 25

The essential feature of the design is the convolute or volute ornament adjacent to the end of the hearth-rim.

What I claim is—

The design for stoves, substantially as 30 herein described, and shown in the accompanying photograph.
