DESCRIPTION

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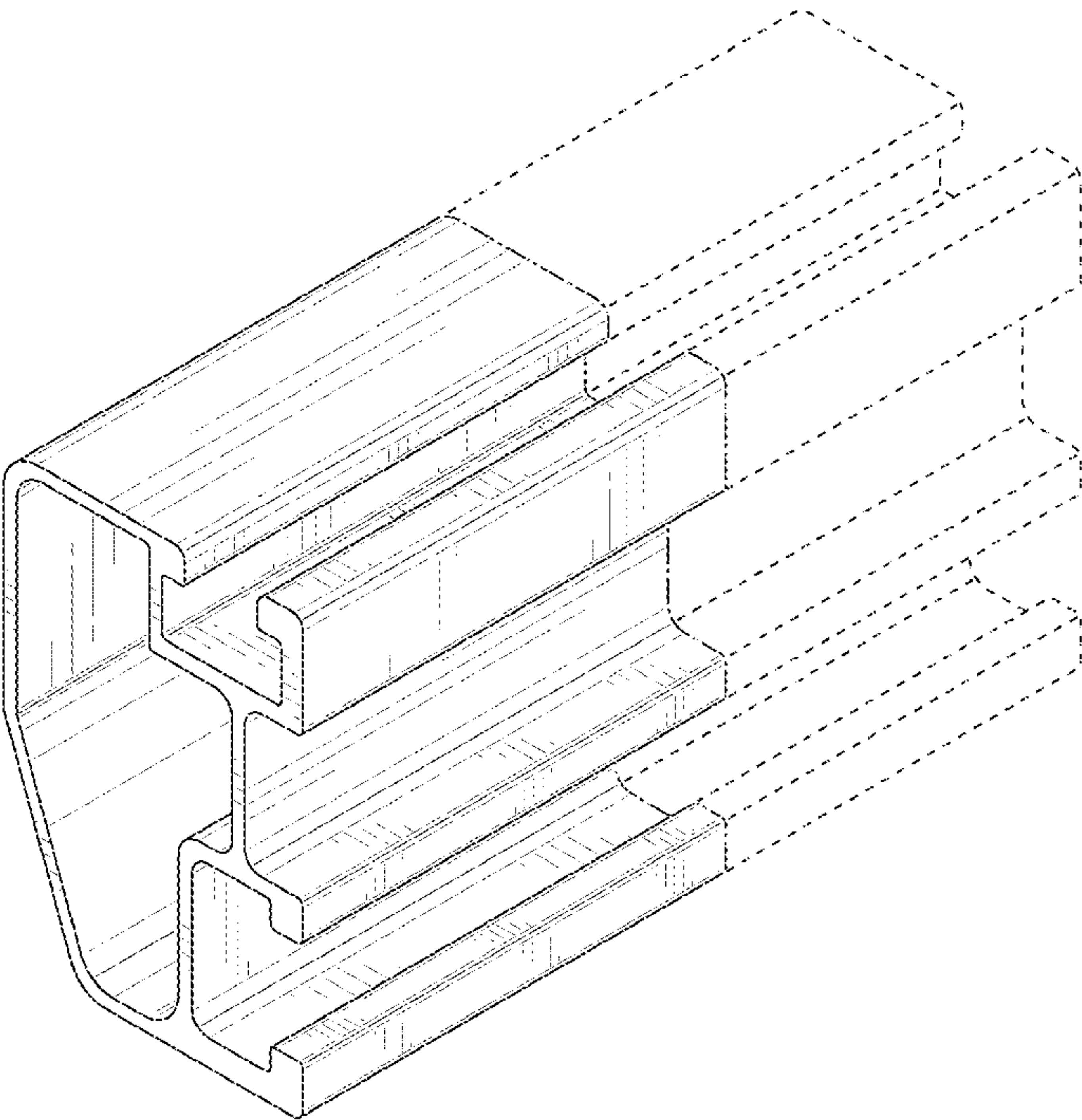
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FIG. 1 is a top, front, and right-side perspective view of a mounting apparatus showing our new design;

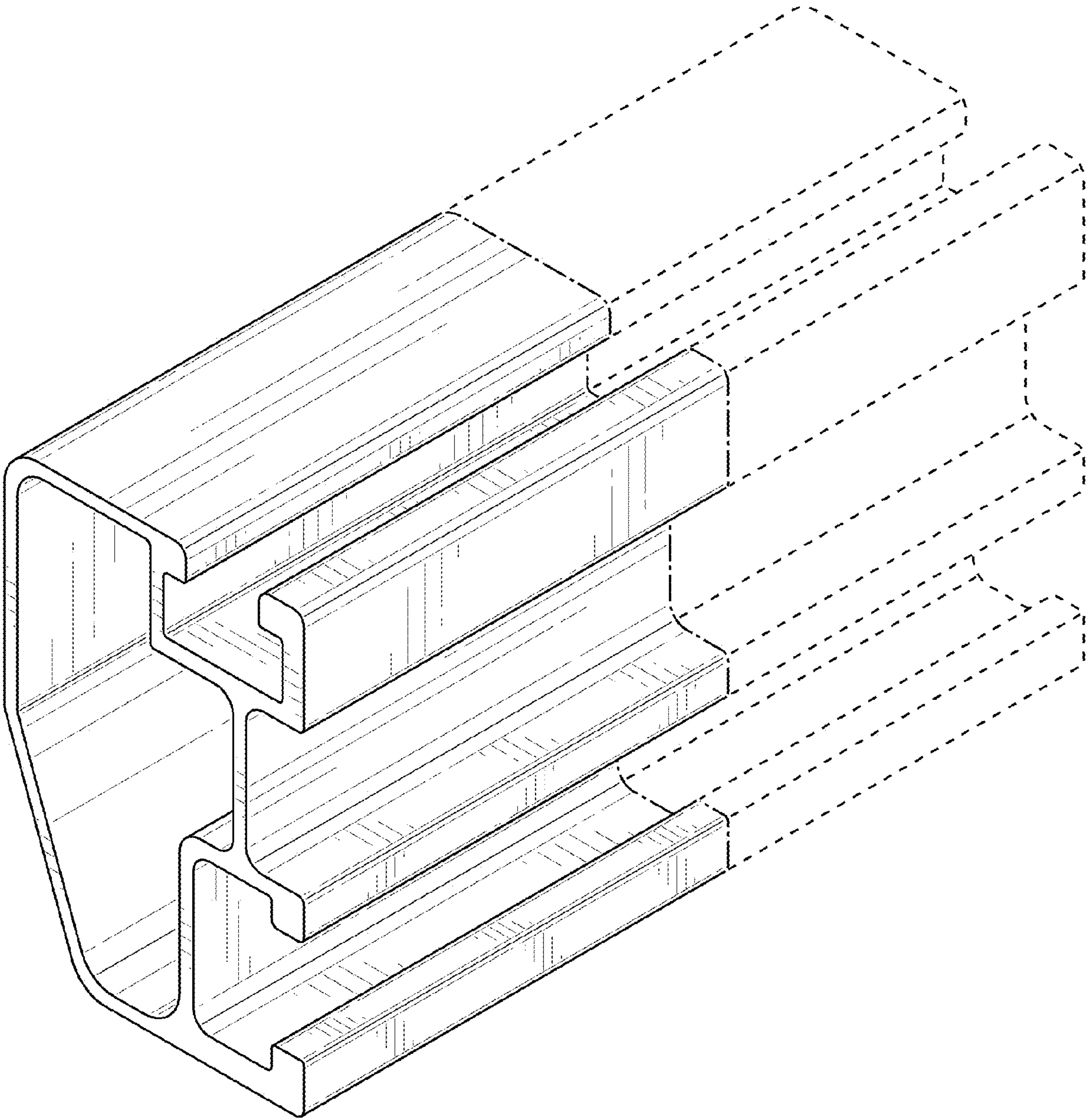

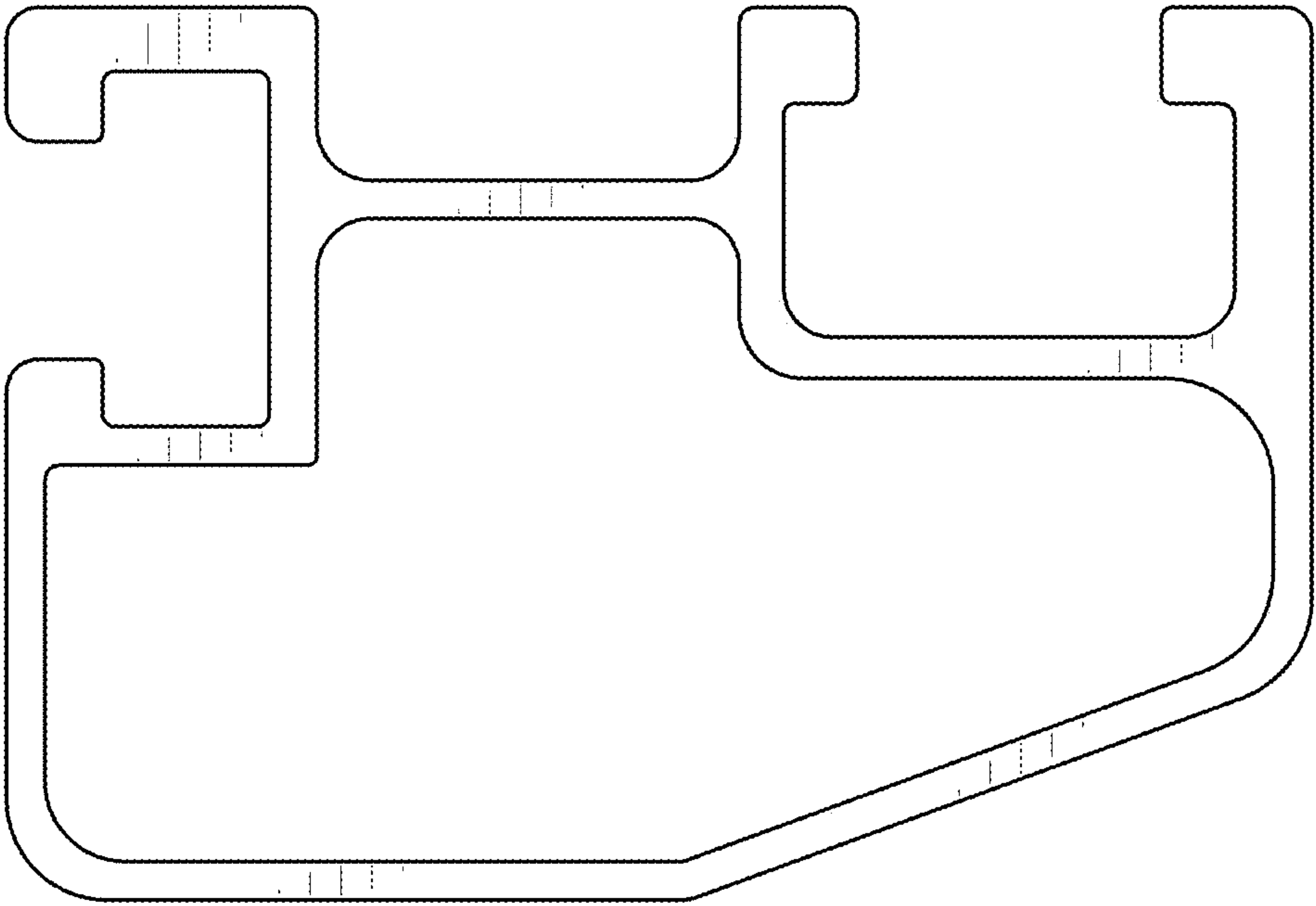

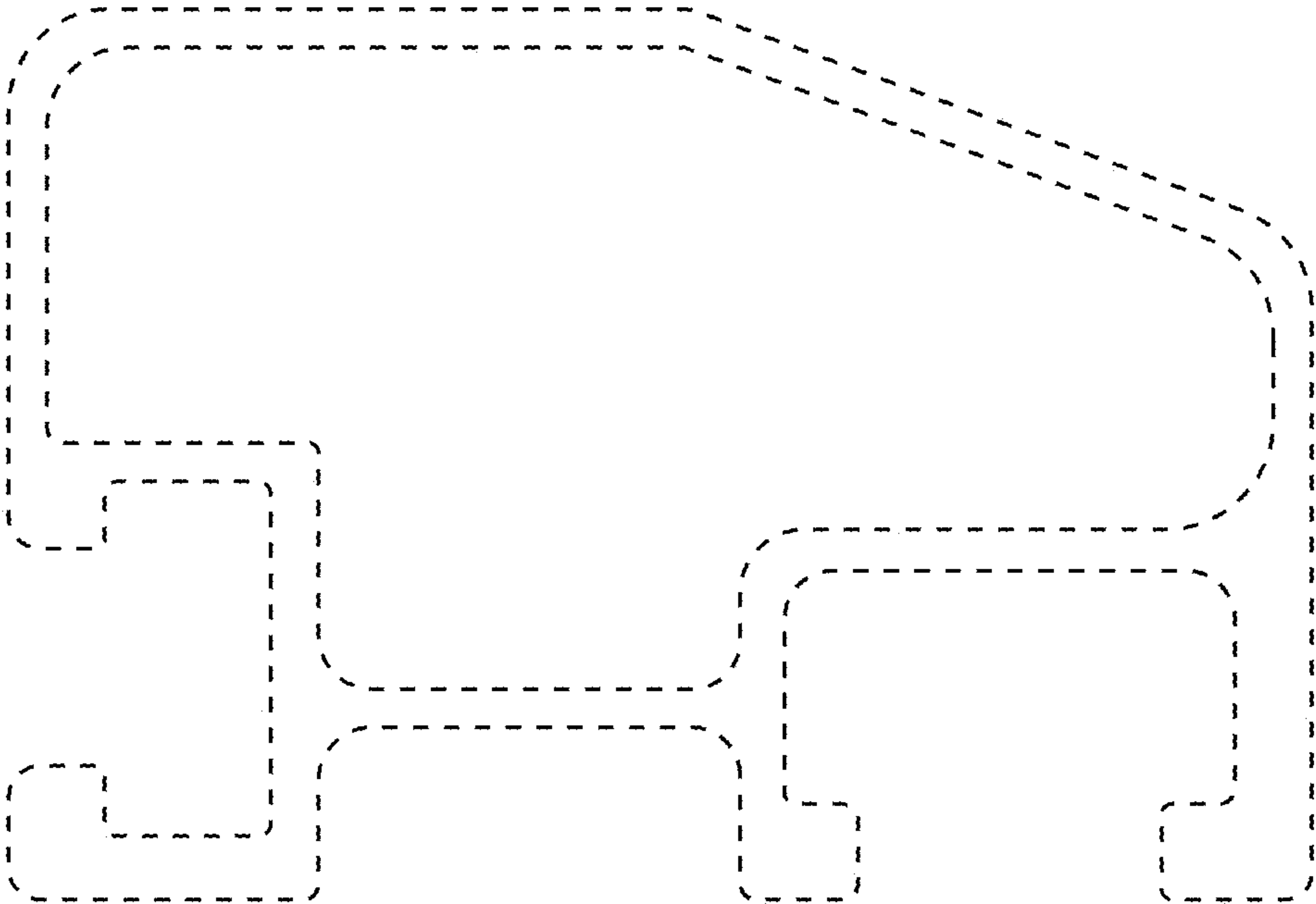

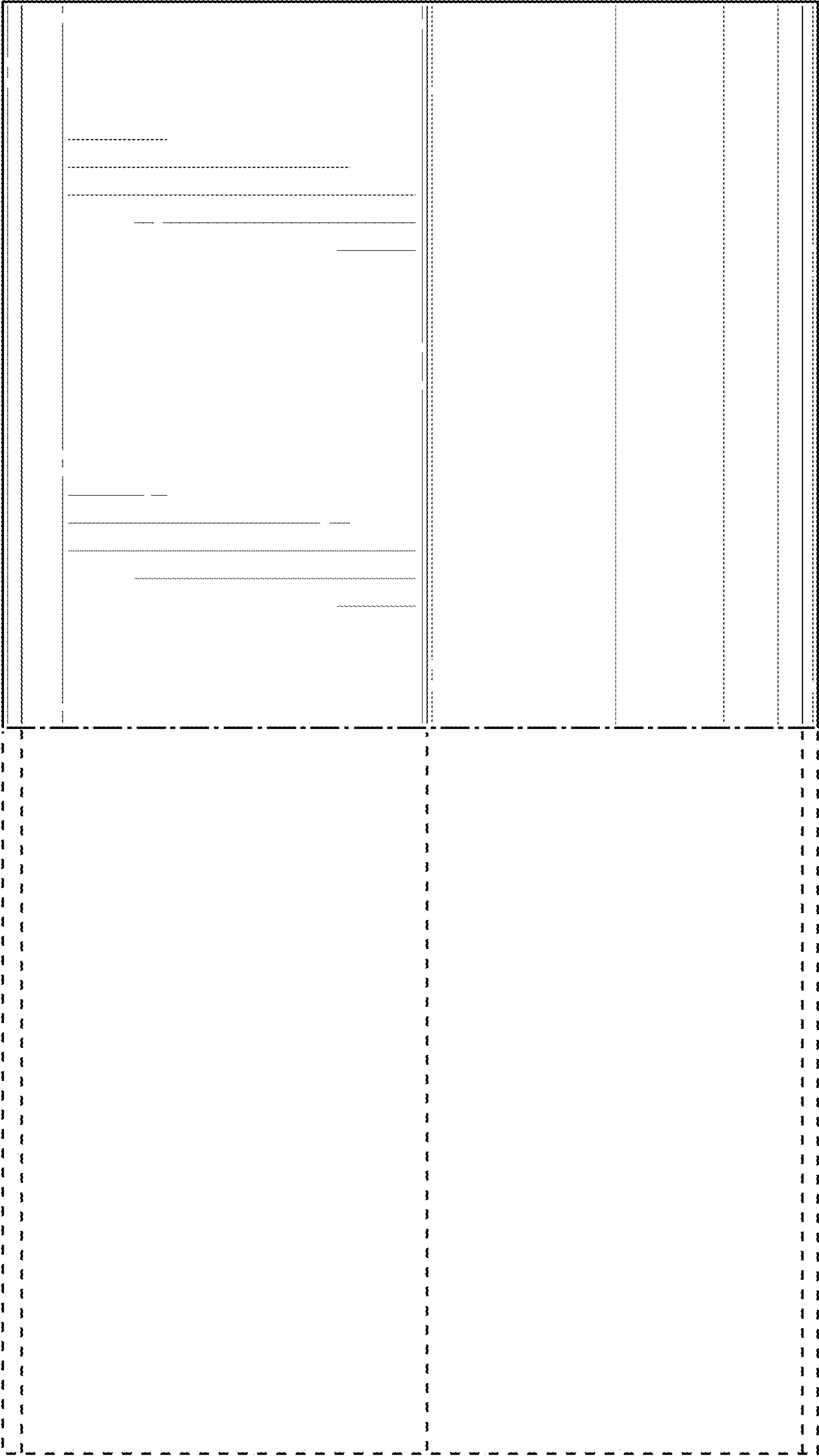

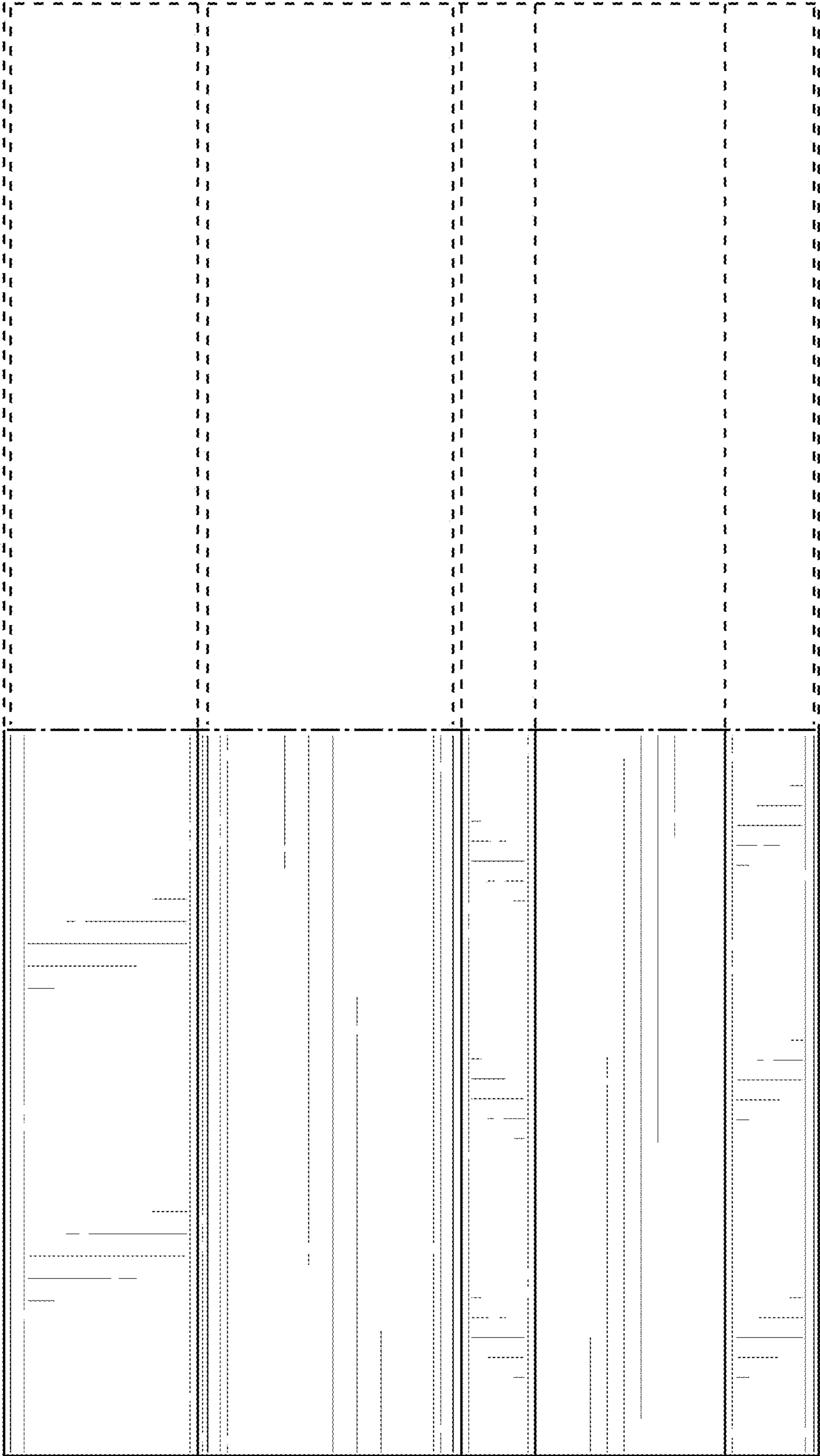

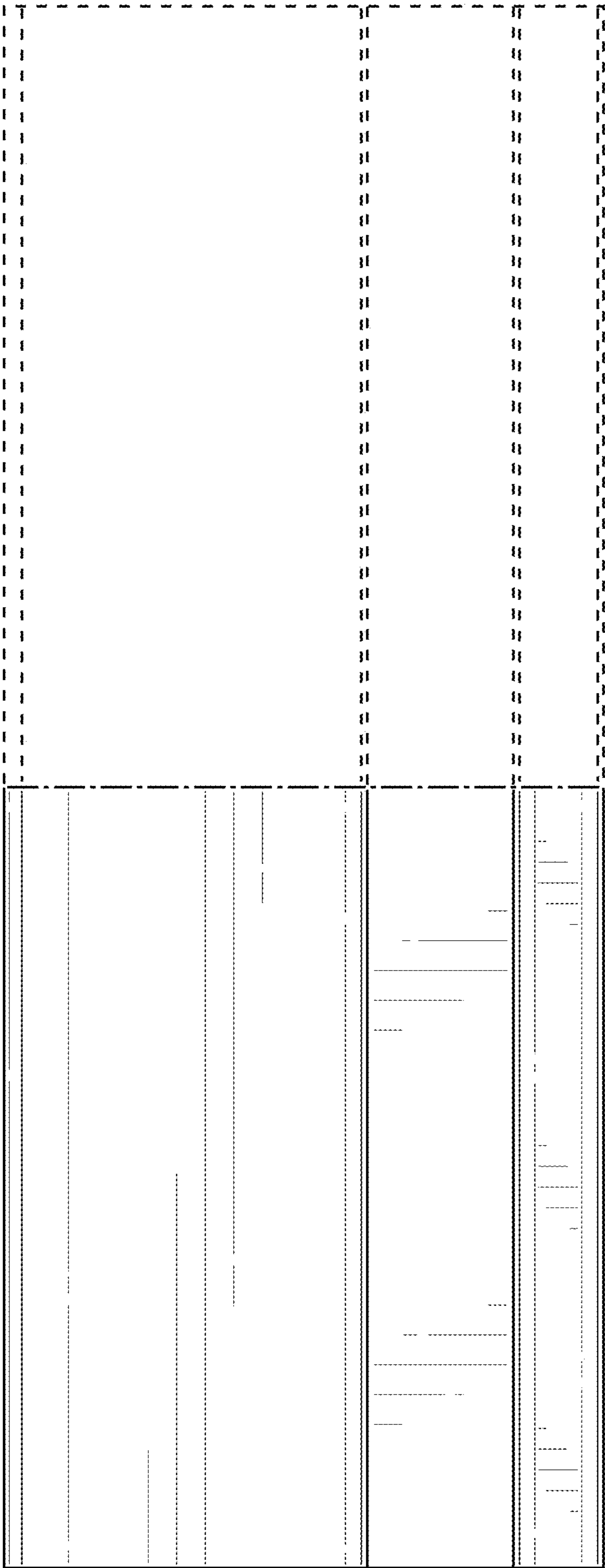

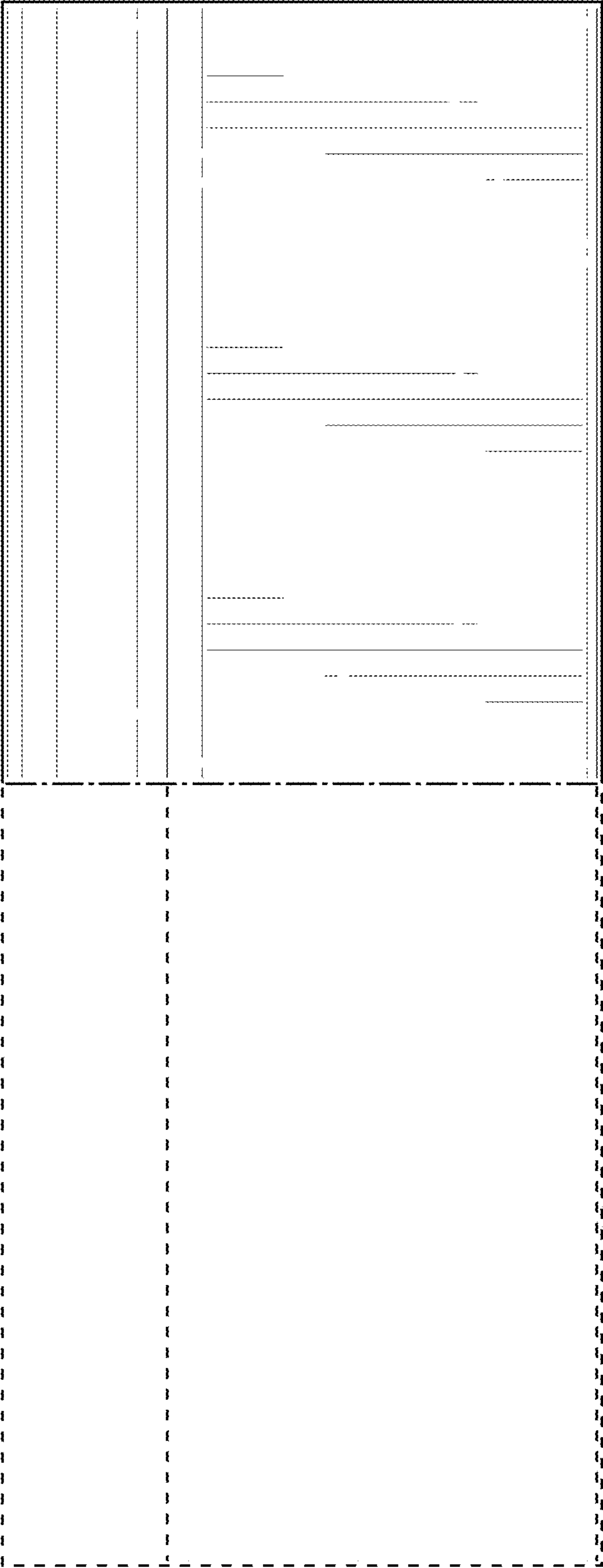
