CLAIM

The ornamental design for a cover panel for window air
conditioner as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front perspective view of a cover panel for
window air conditioner showing our new design;
FIG. 2 is a rear perspective view thereof;
FIG. 3 is a front elevation view thereof;
FIG. 4 is a rear elevation view thereof;
FIG. 5 is a left-side elevation view thereof, a right-side
elevation view being a mirror image thereof;
FIG. 6 is a top plan view thereof;
FIG. 7 is a bottom plan view thereof;
FIG. 8 is an enlarged view of portion 8 in FIG. 2;
FIG. 9 is another enlarged view of portion 8, showing the
cover panel for window air conditioner in an alternate
configuration; and,
FIG. 10 is a front perspective view of the cover panel for
window air conditioner, shown in an environment of use.
The evenly-spaced broken lines in FIGS. 1-9 depict portions
of the cover panel for window air conditioner that form no
part of the claimed design. The dot-dot-dash broken lines
shown in FIGS. 2 and 8 indicate the enlargement area that
form no part of the claimed design. The dot-dash broken
lines shown in FIG. 9 indicate the enlargement area that
form no part of the claimed design. The evenly-spaced
broken lines and the dot-dot-dash broken lines in FIG. 10
respectively illustrate an environmental structure and a
boundary of a view with environment that form no part of
the claimed design.

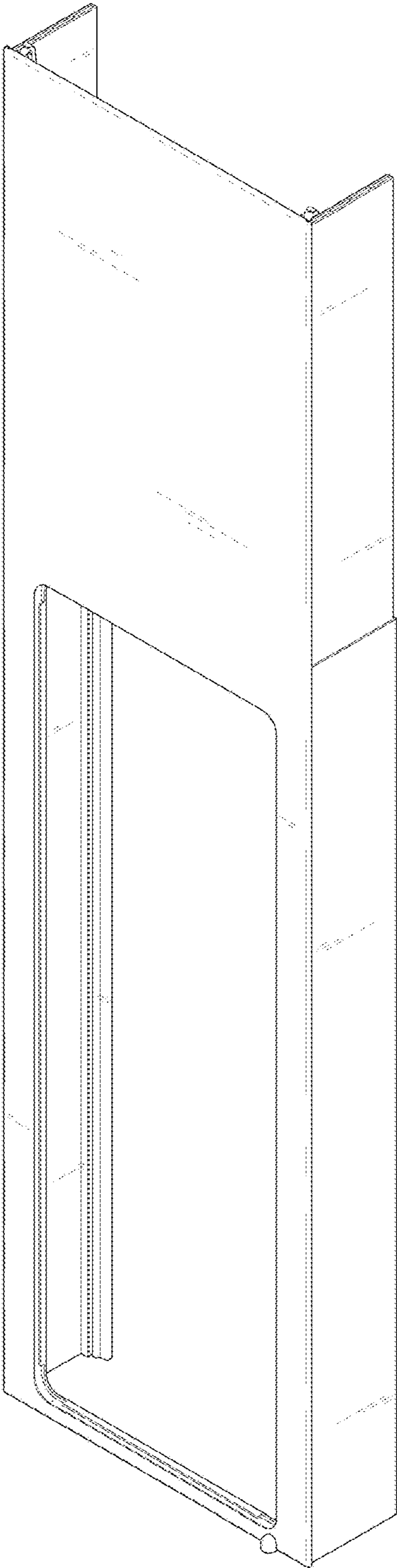

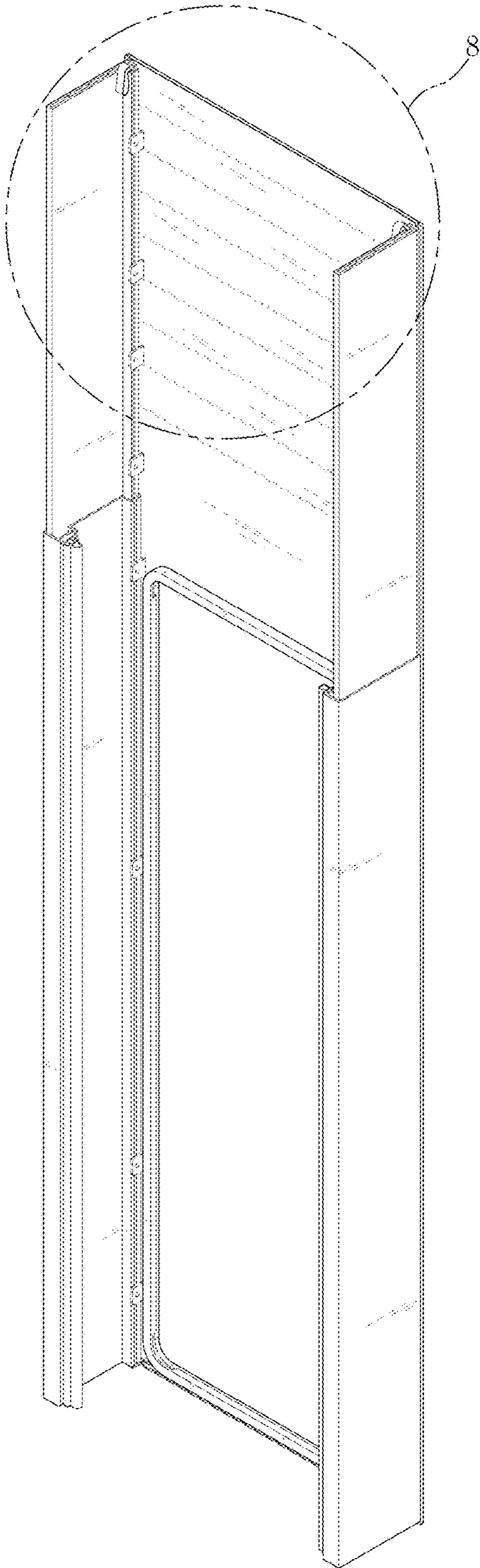

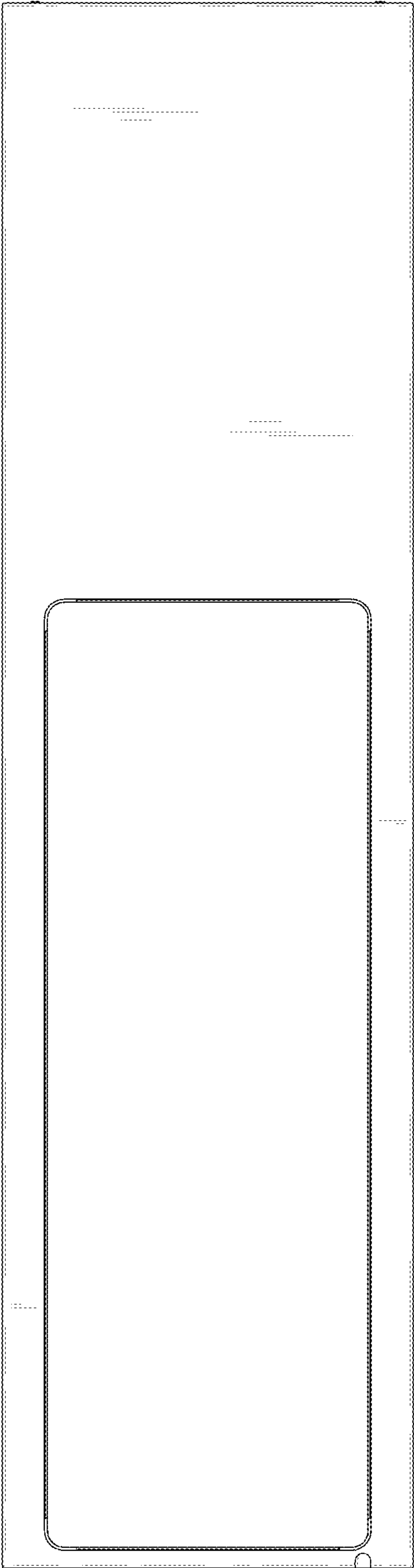

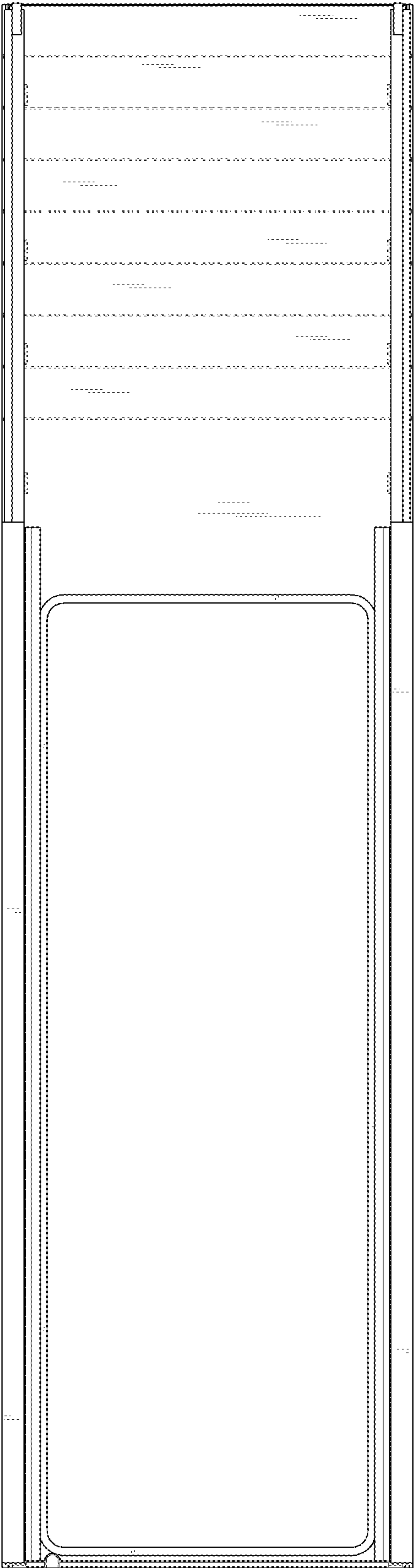

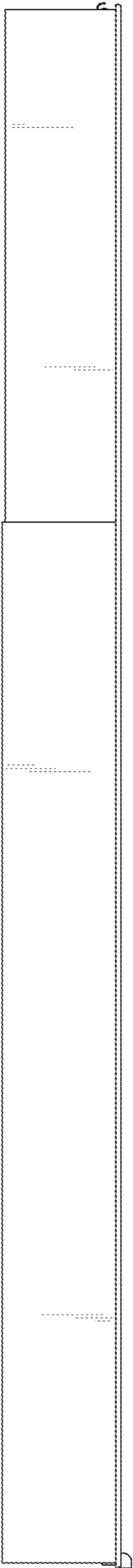

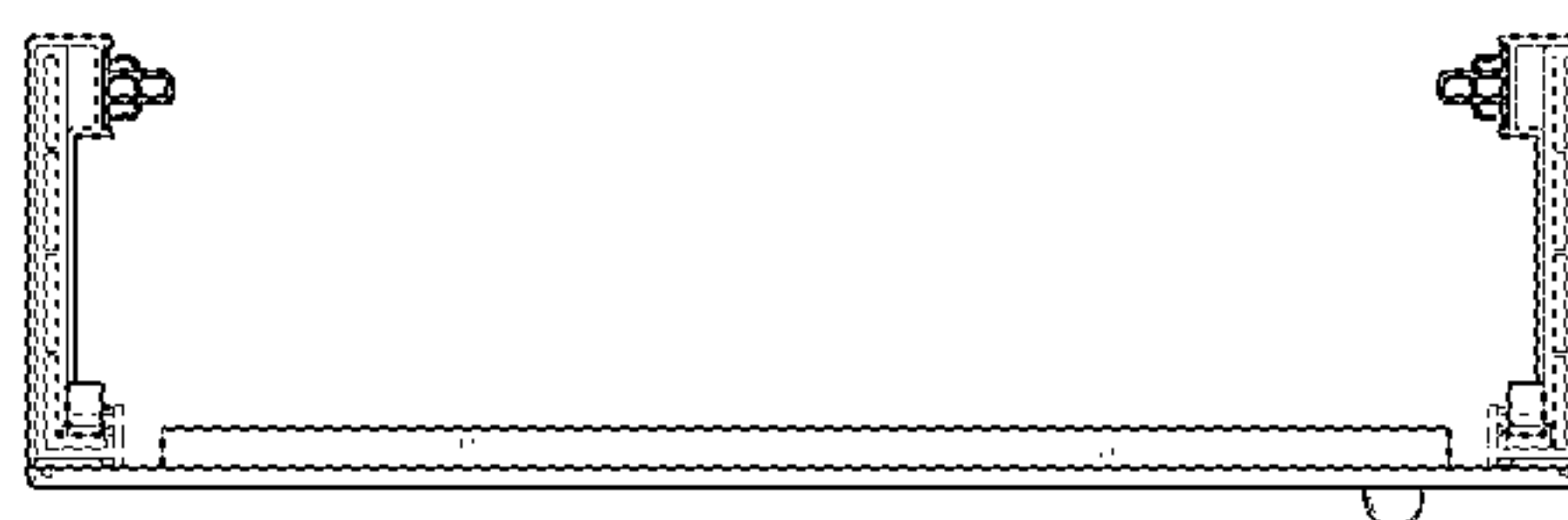

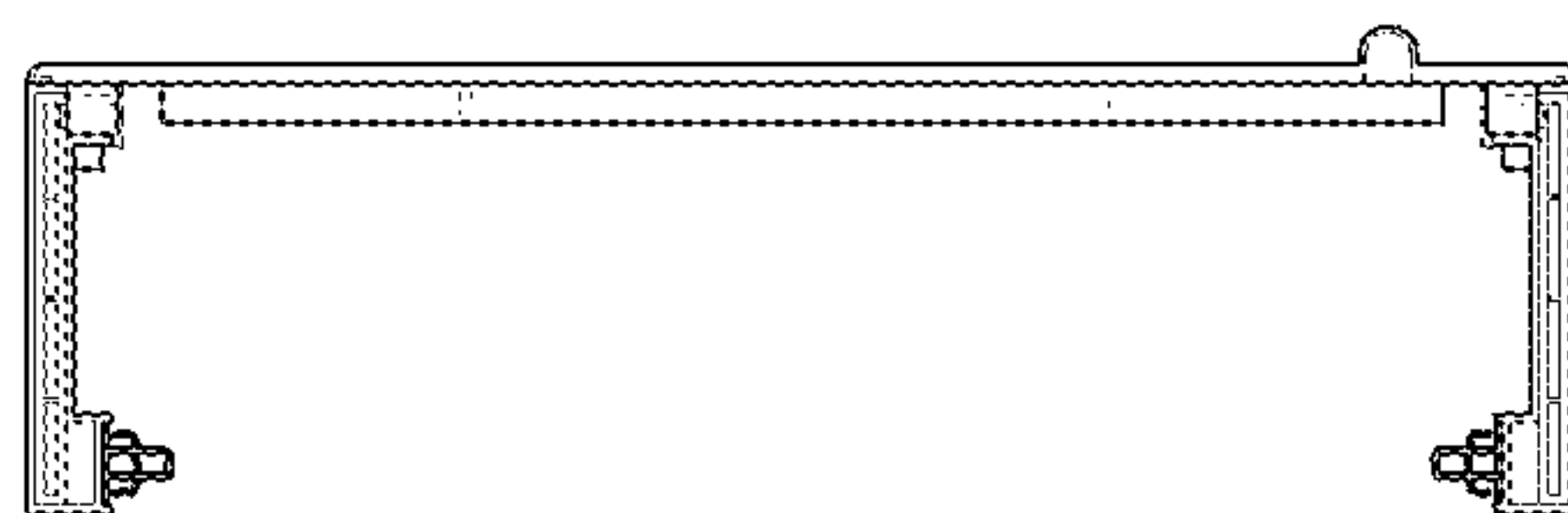

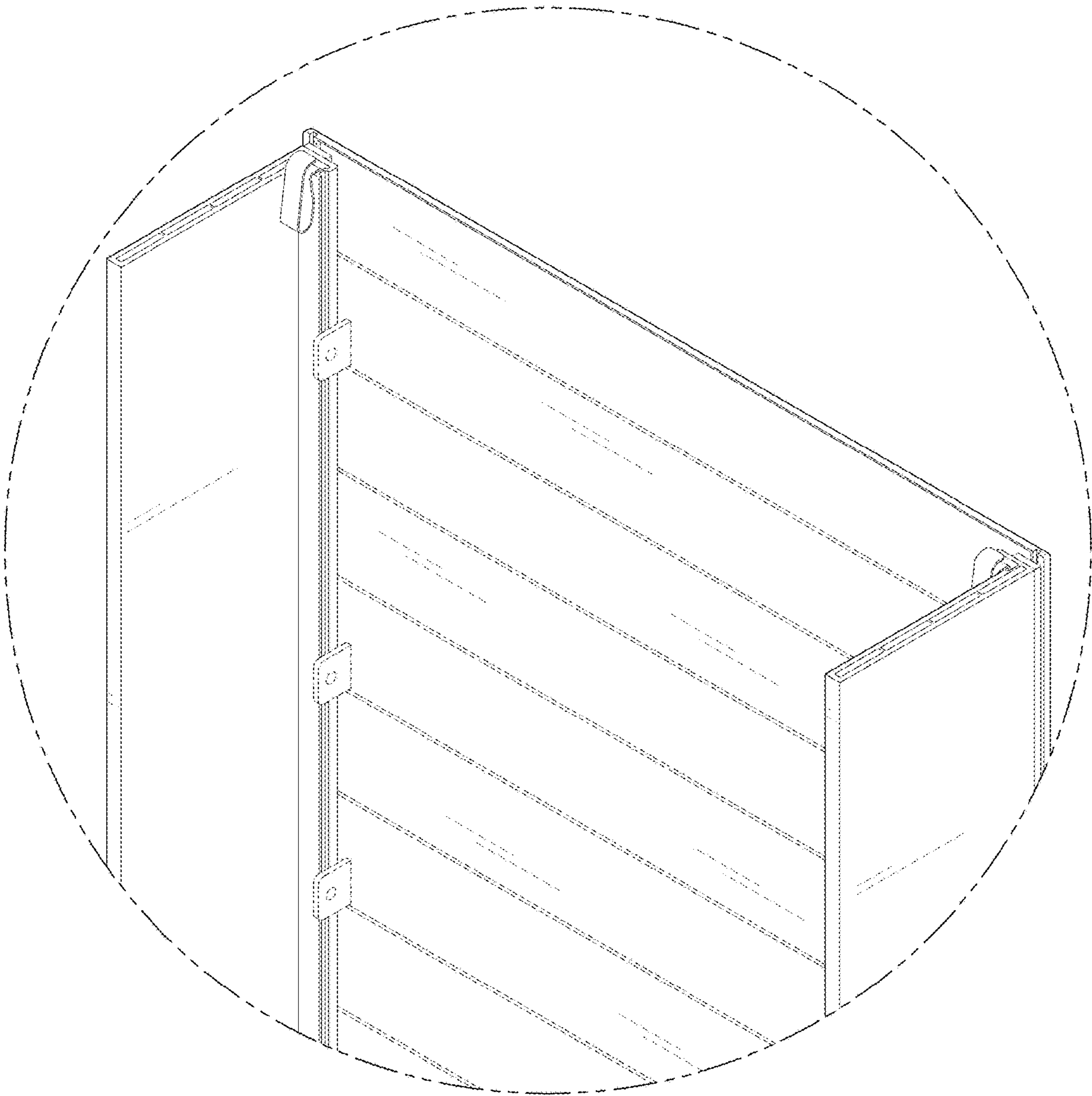
