The ornamental design for computer module cabinet, substantially as shown and described.

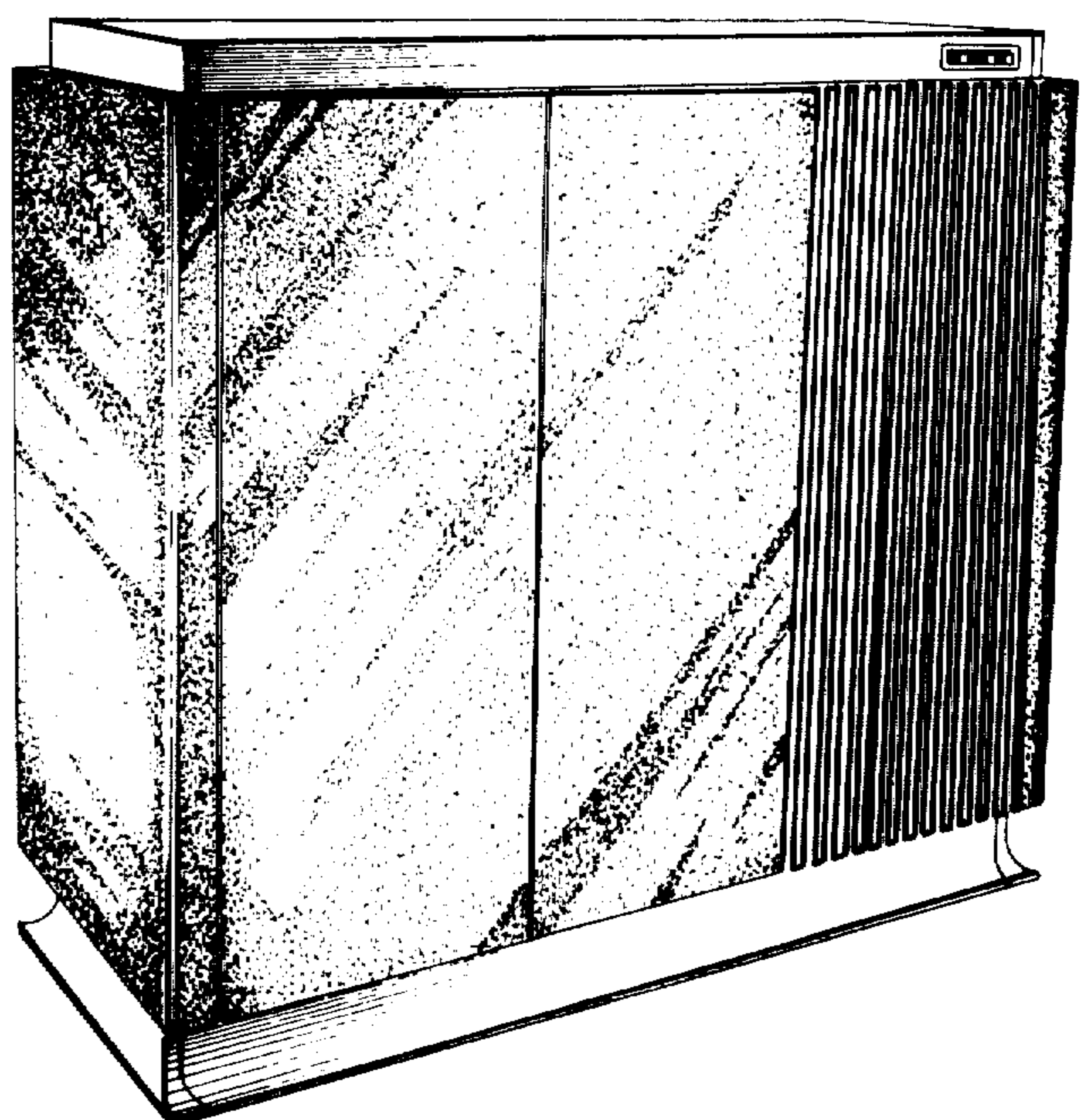
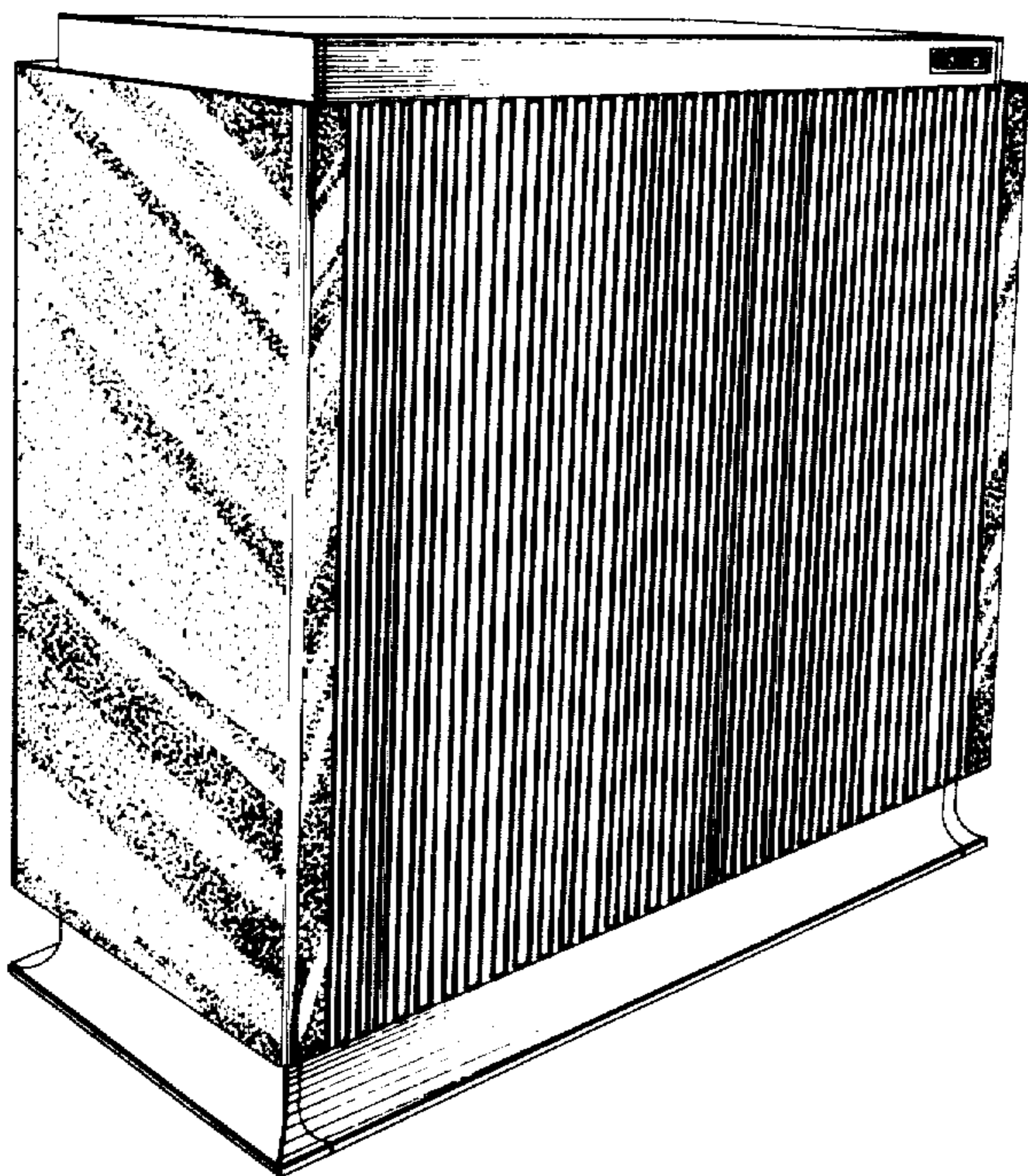
DESCRIPTION

FIG. 4 is a rear perspective view thereof.



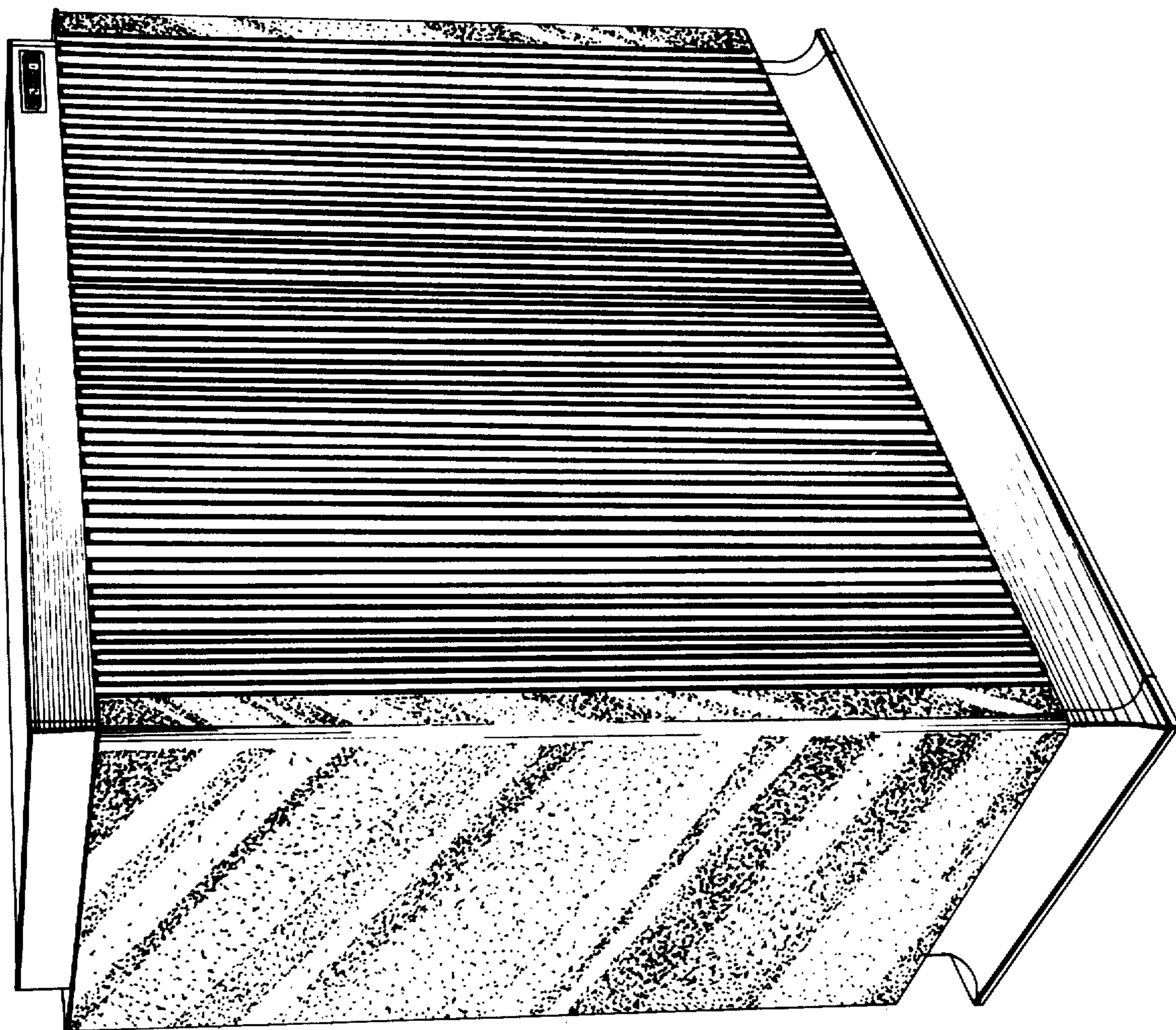

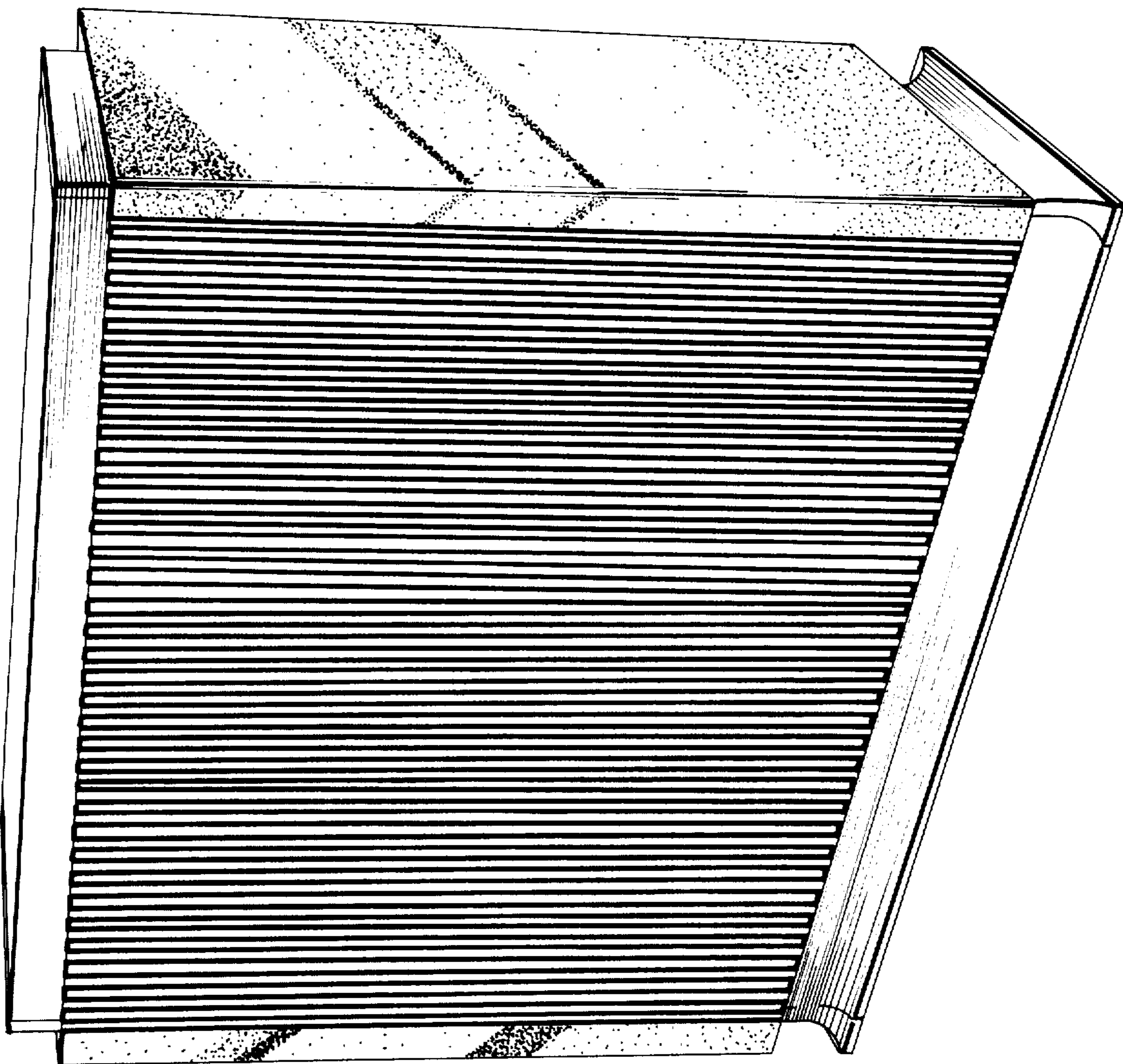

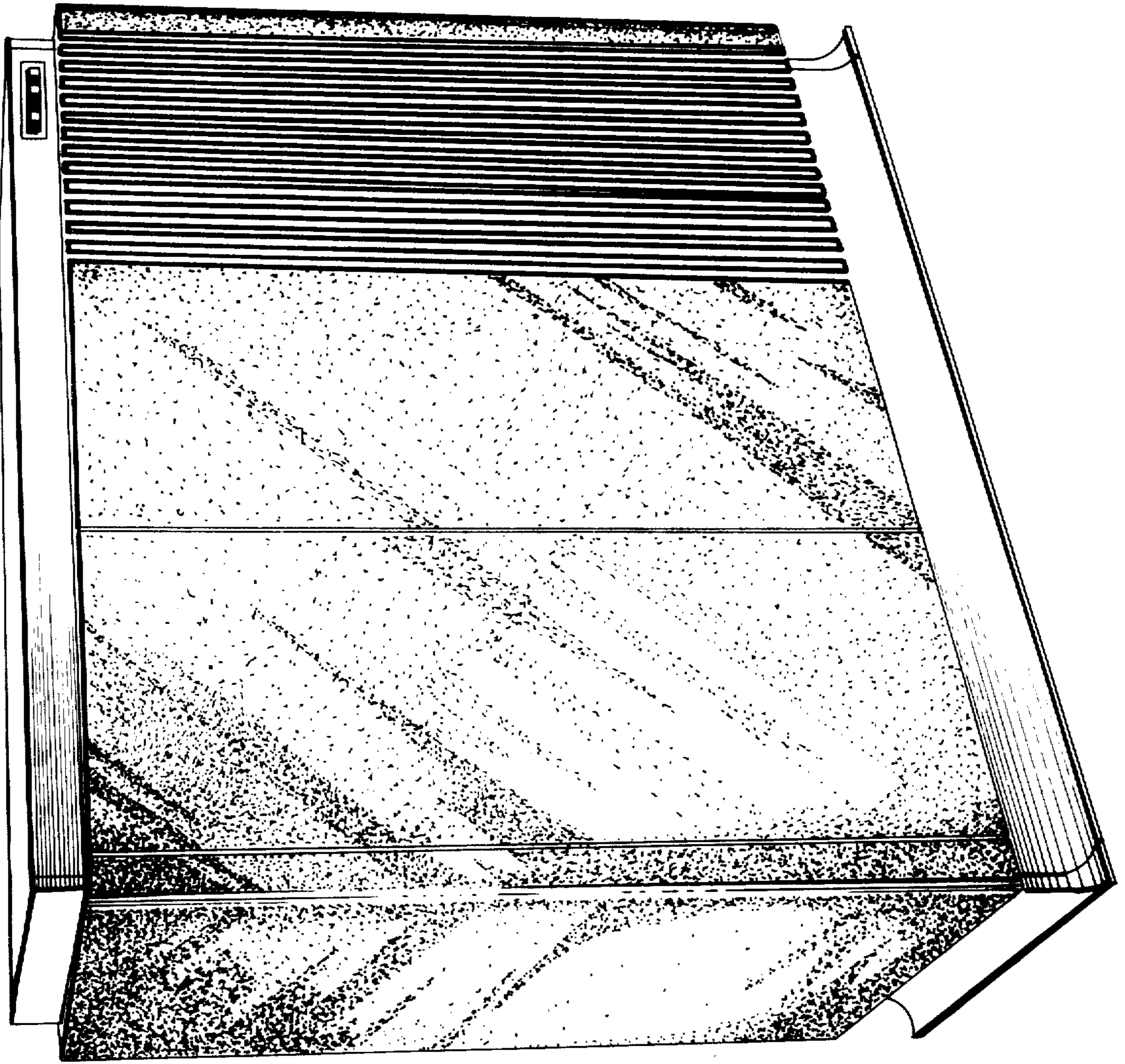

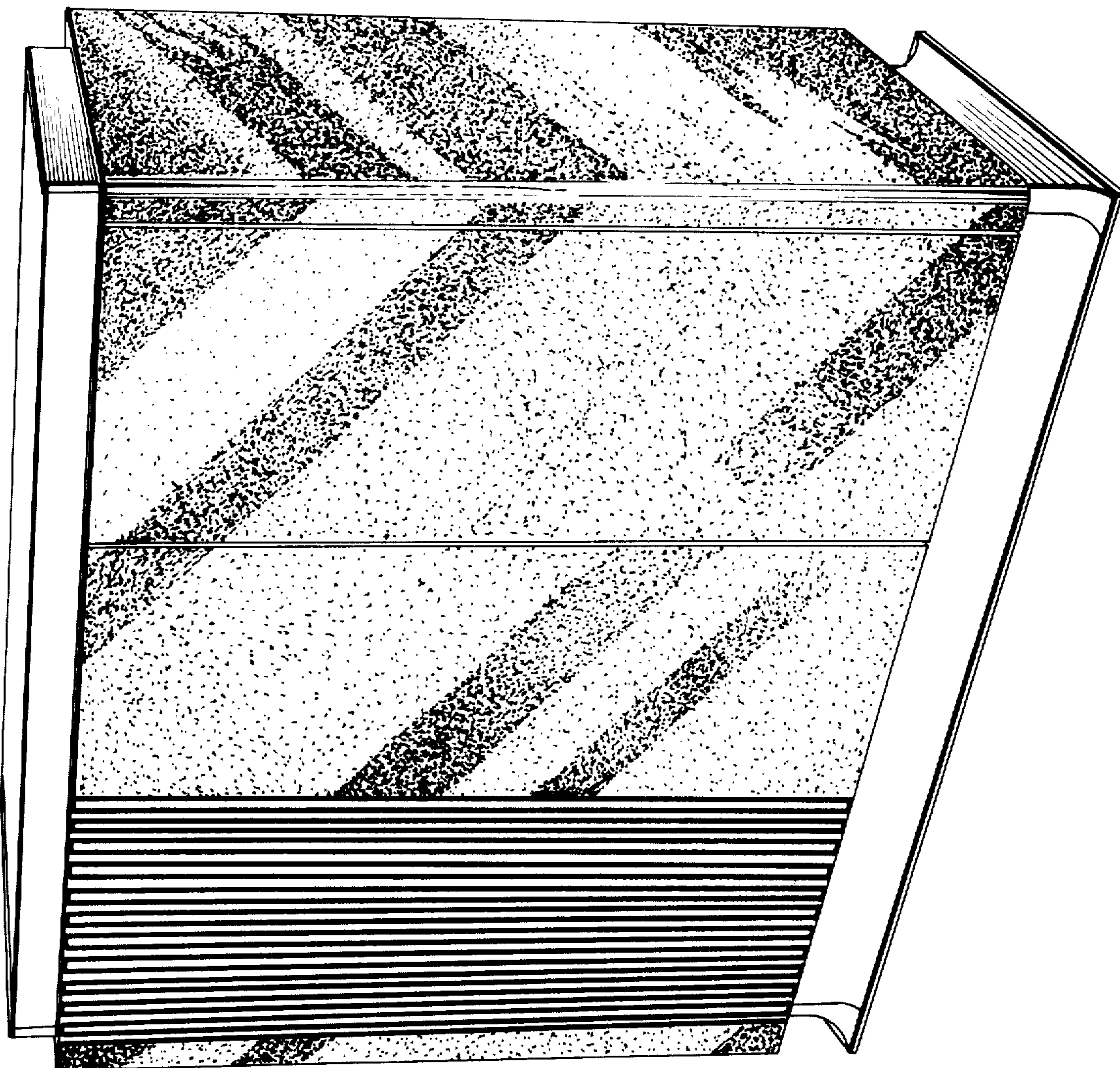
