[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for an article of flatware, as shown and described.

## DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front elevational view of an article of flatware showing my new design as embodied in a fork; FIG. 2 is a cross-sectional view taken on line 2—2 of FIG. 1;

FIG. 3 is a cross-sectional view taken on line 2—3 of FIG. 1;

FIG. 4 is a cross-sectional view taken on line 4—4 of

FIG. 1; FIG. 5 is a cross-sectional view taken on line 5—5 of

FIG. 1; FIG. 1.

FIG. 1; FIG. 7 is a side elevational view from the right of FIG.

FIG. 8 is an end elevational view thereof of the handle portion from the bottom of FIG. 1;

FIG. 9 is a front elevational view of an article of flatware showing my new design as embodied in a serving fork;

FIG. 10 is a front elevational view of an article of flatware showing my new design as embodied in a sugar spoon;

FIG. 11 is a front elevational view of an article of flatware showing my new design as embodied in a tablespoon;

FIG. 12 is a front elevational view of an article of flatware showing my new design as embodied in a knife;

FIG. 13 is a side elevational view from the left of FIG. 12;


FIG. 14 is a cross-sectional view taken on line 14——of FIG. 13;

FIG. 15 is a cross-sectional view taken on line 15—15; FIG. 16 is an enlarged cross-sectional view taken on line 16—16; and


FIG. 17 is an enlarged cross-sectional view taken on line 17—17.

The sides opposite the handle portions shown in FIGS. 1, 7, 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13 are mirror images of the respective sides shown.


The distinguishing feature of my new design for an article of flatware resides in the handle configuration.
