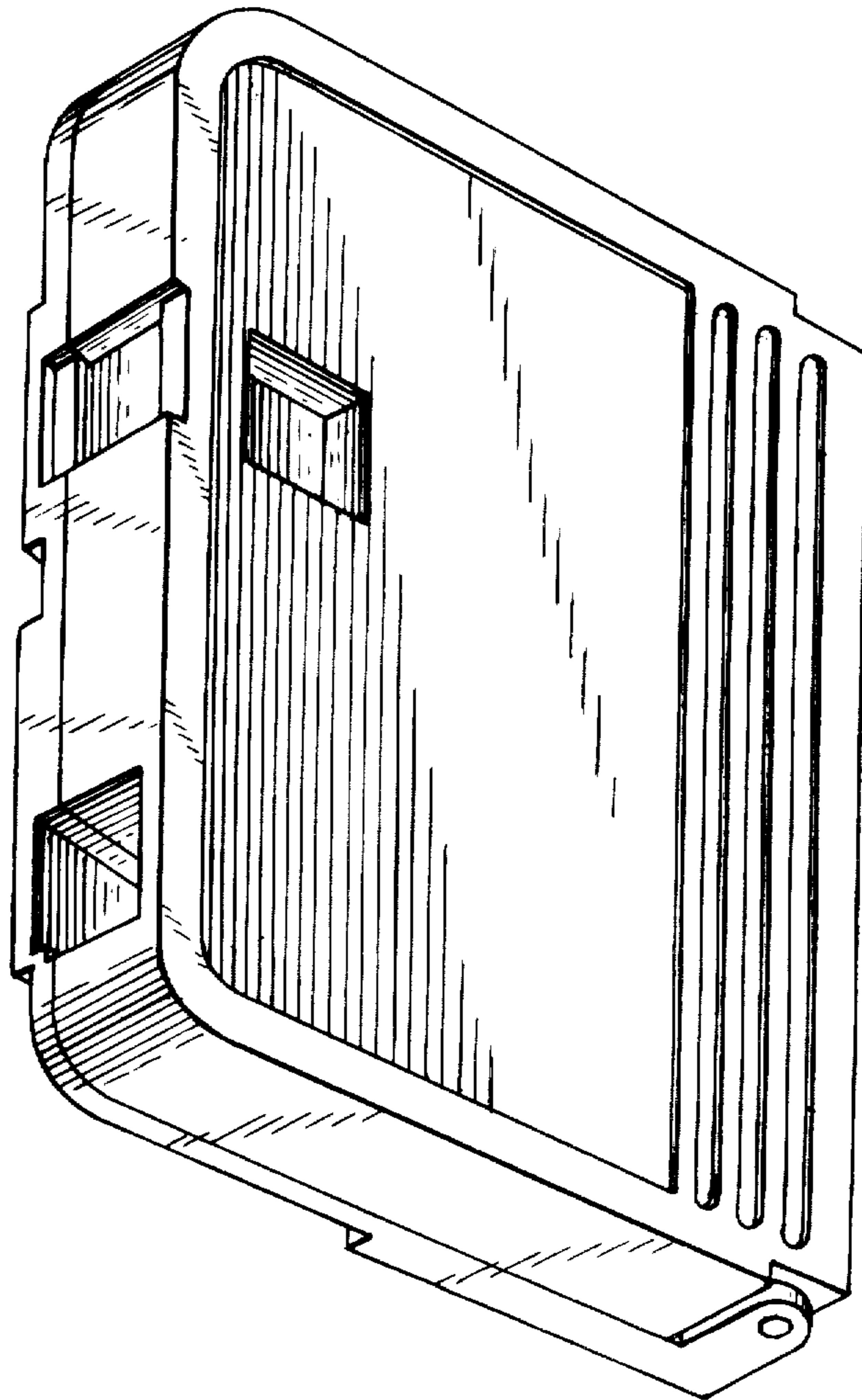

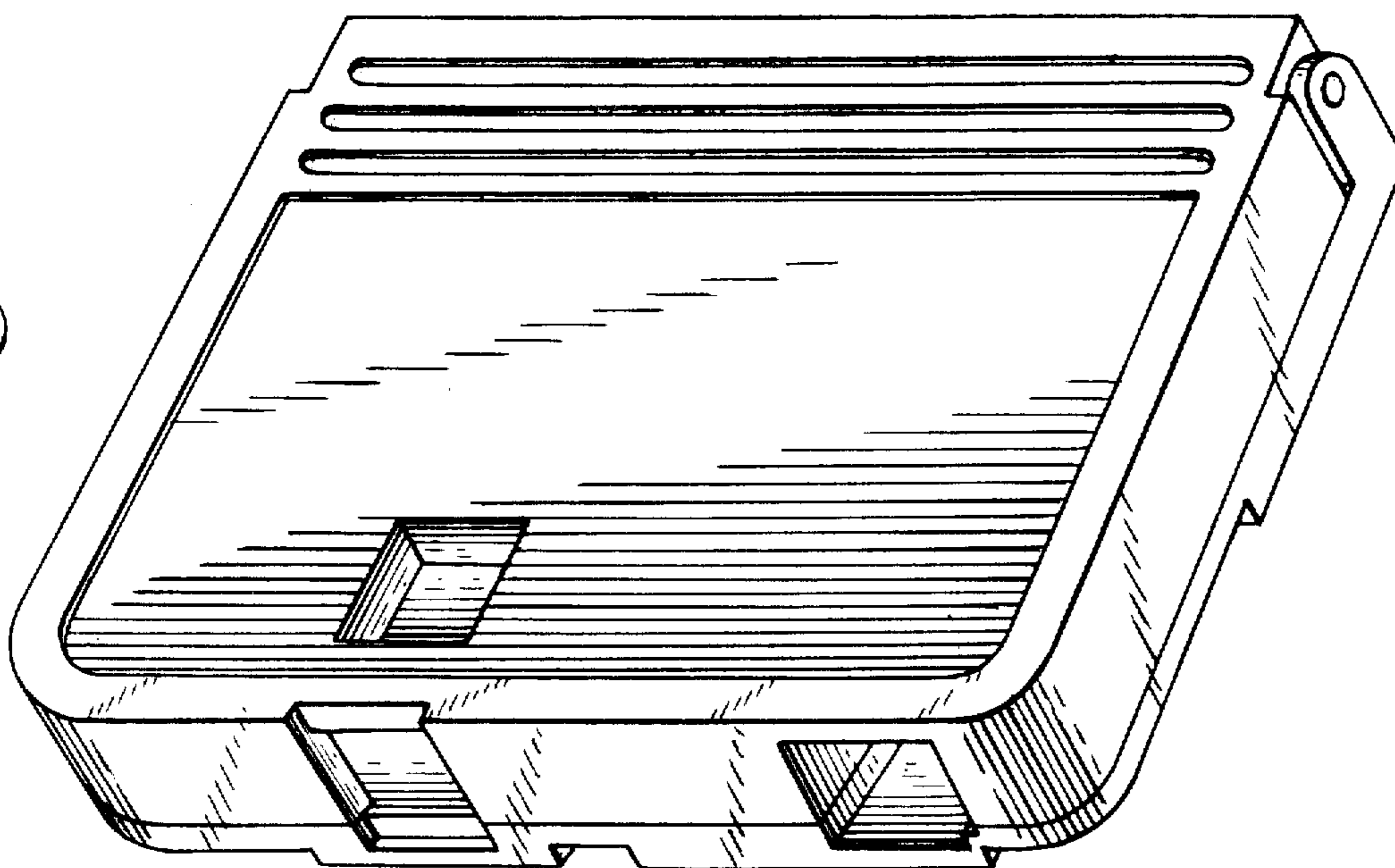
The ornamental design for a reusable microfilm cartridge, or similar article, as shown.
