DESCRIPTION

FIG. 6 is a bottom plan view thereof.

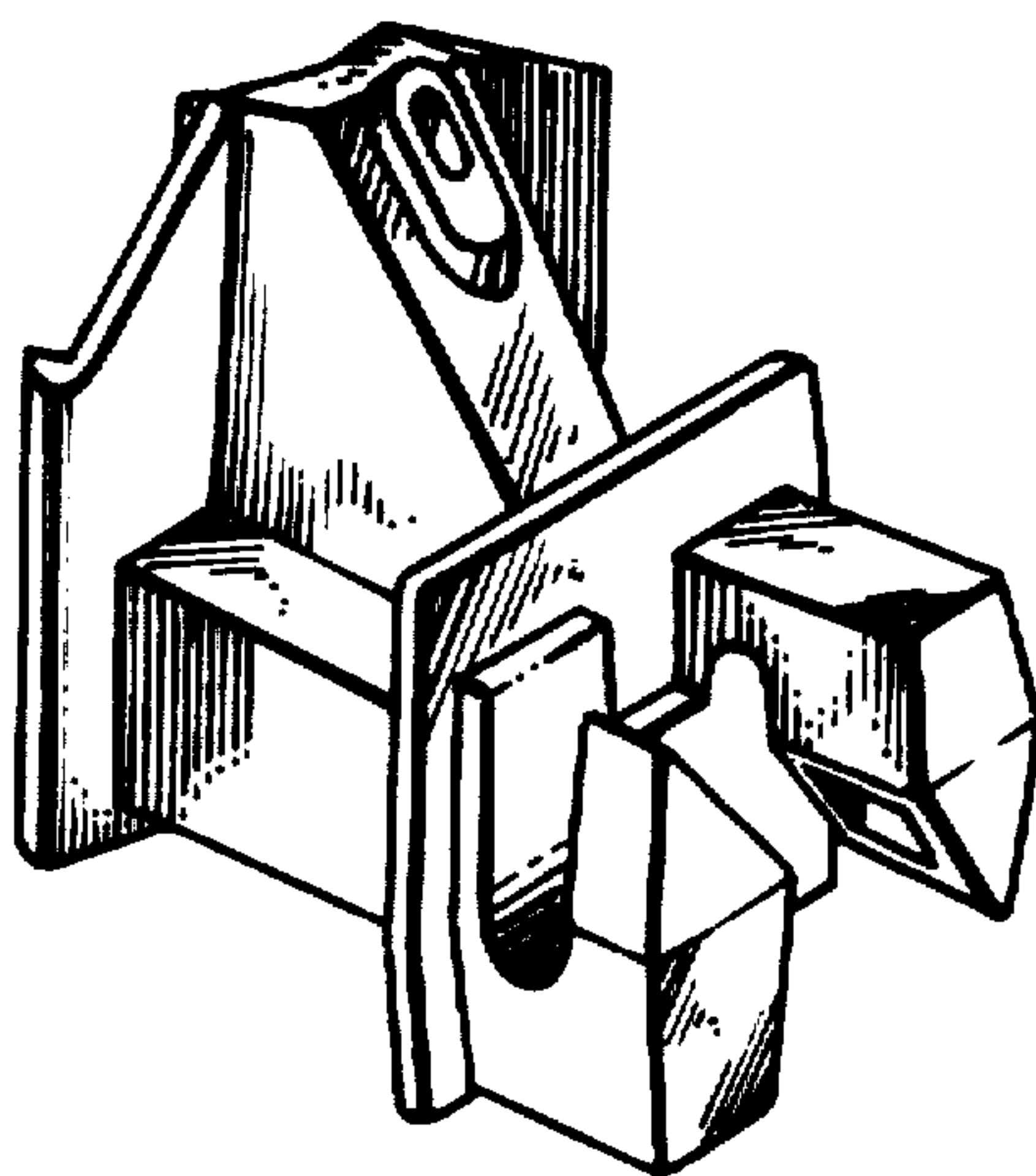

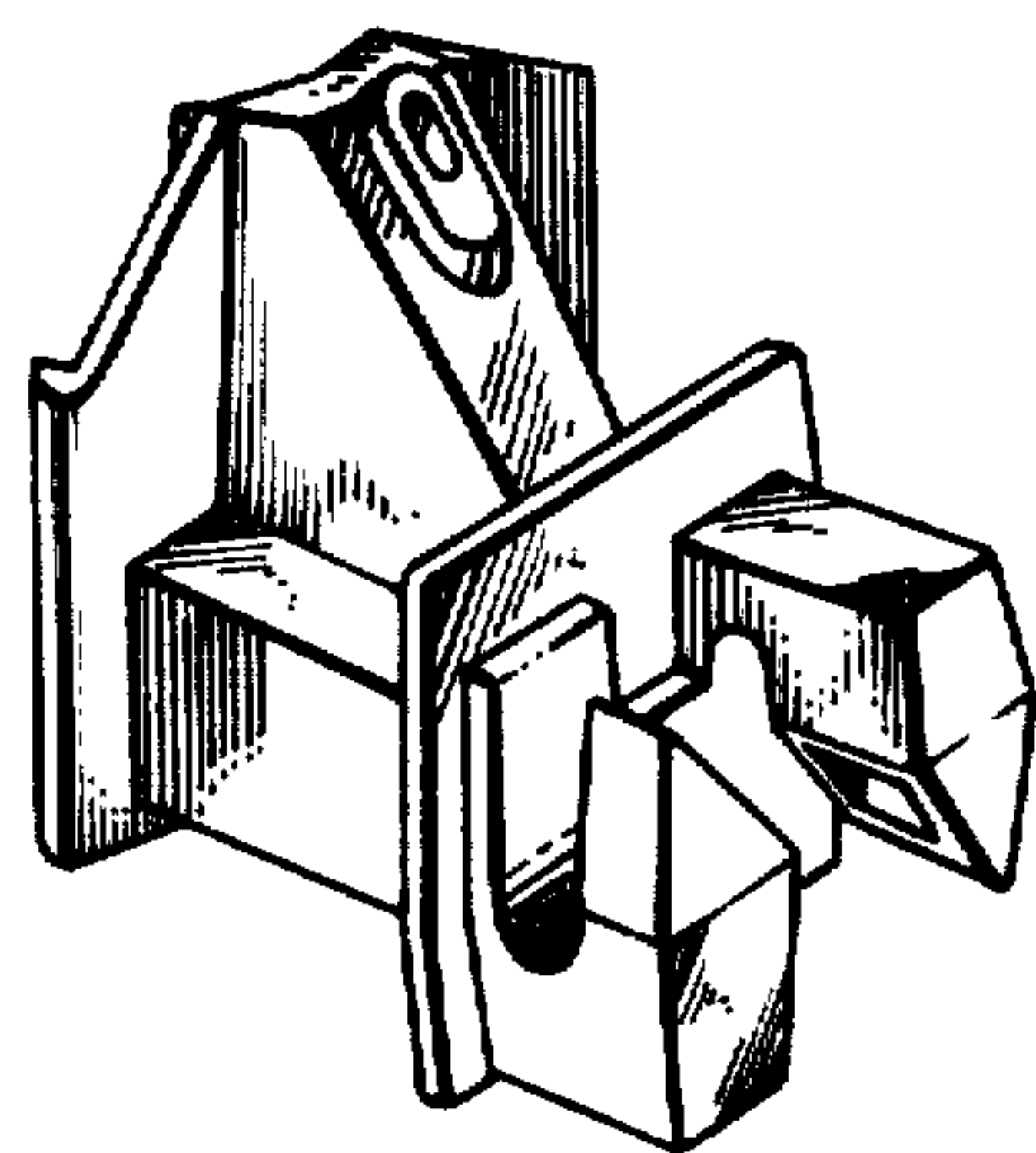

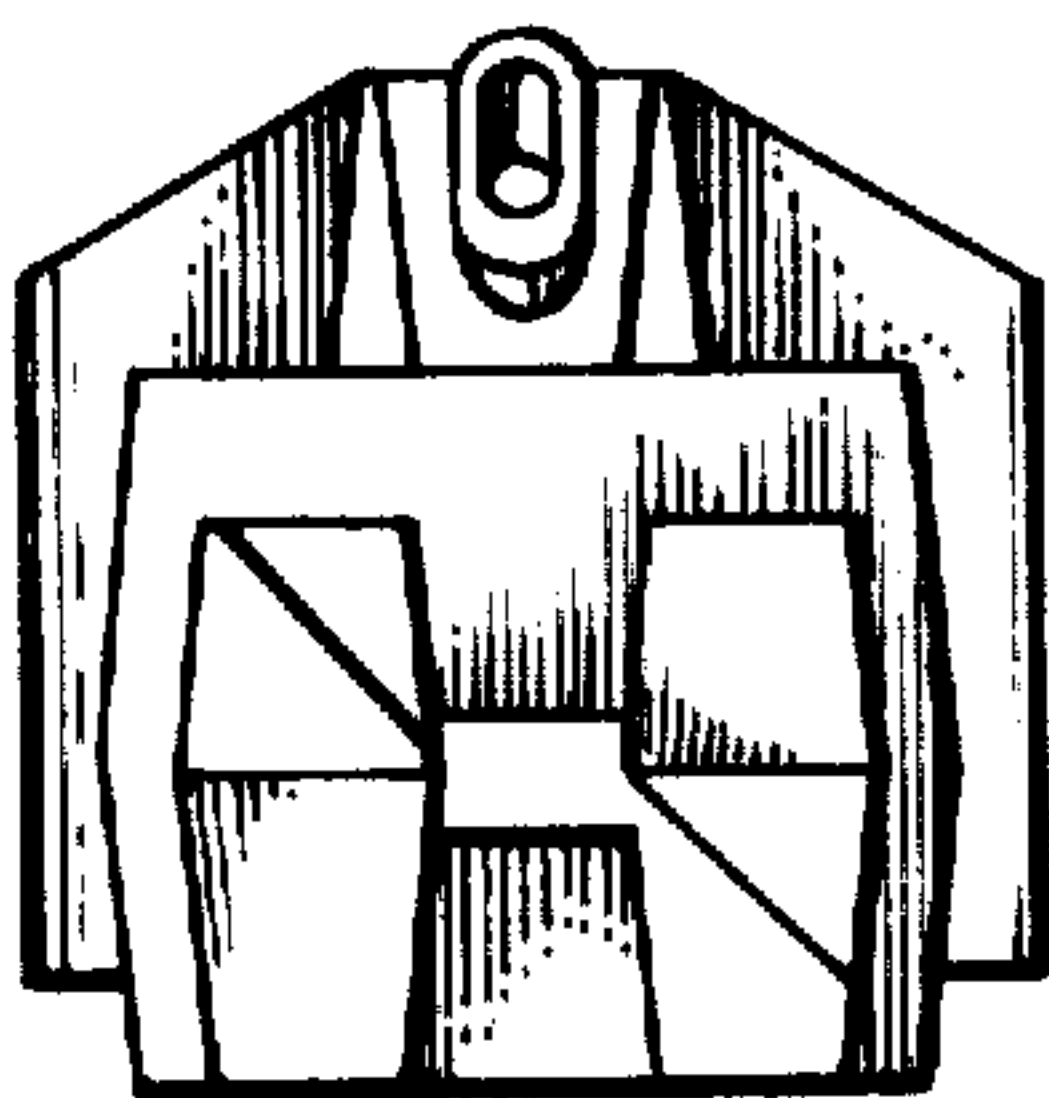

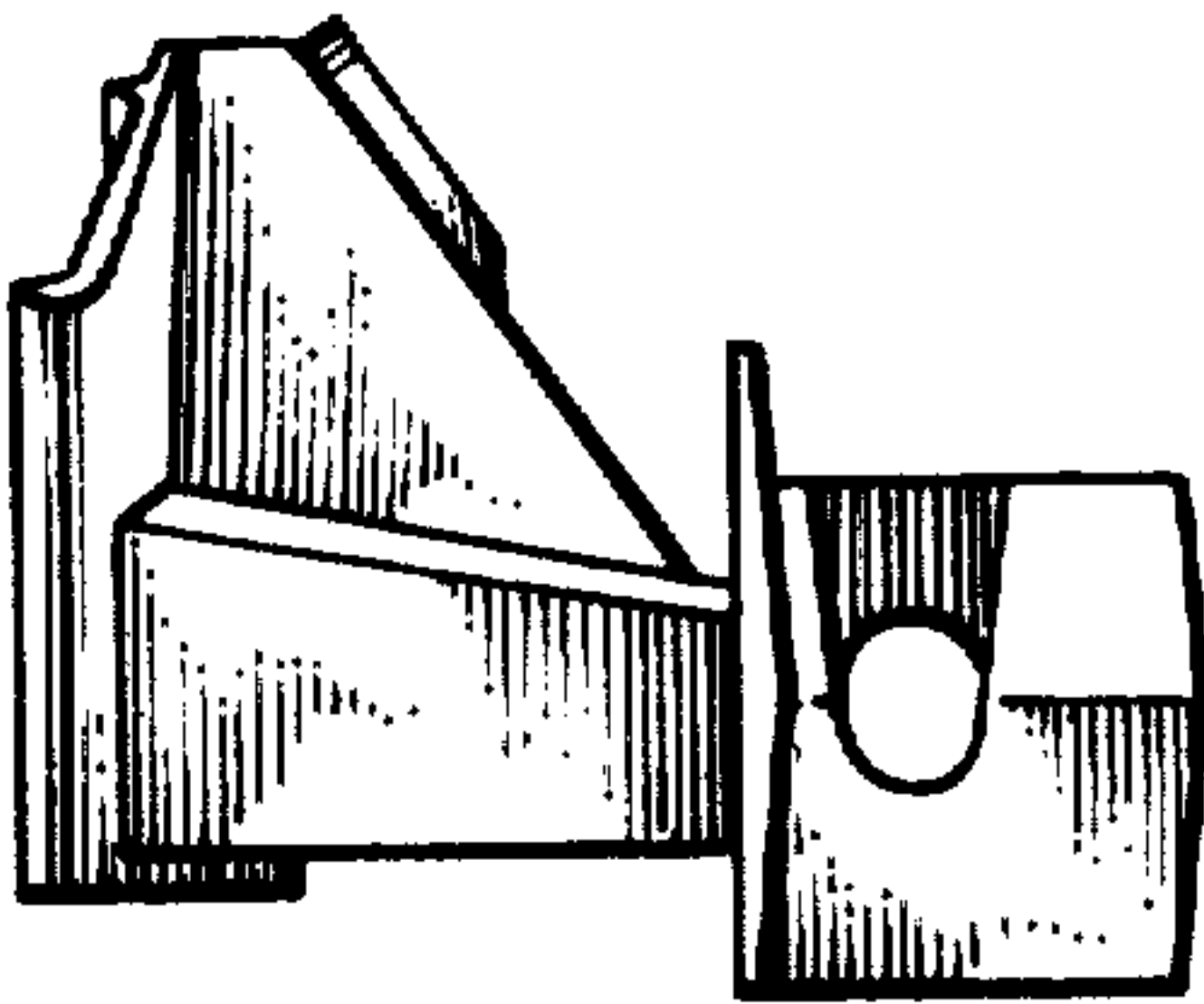

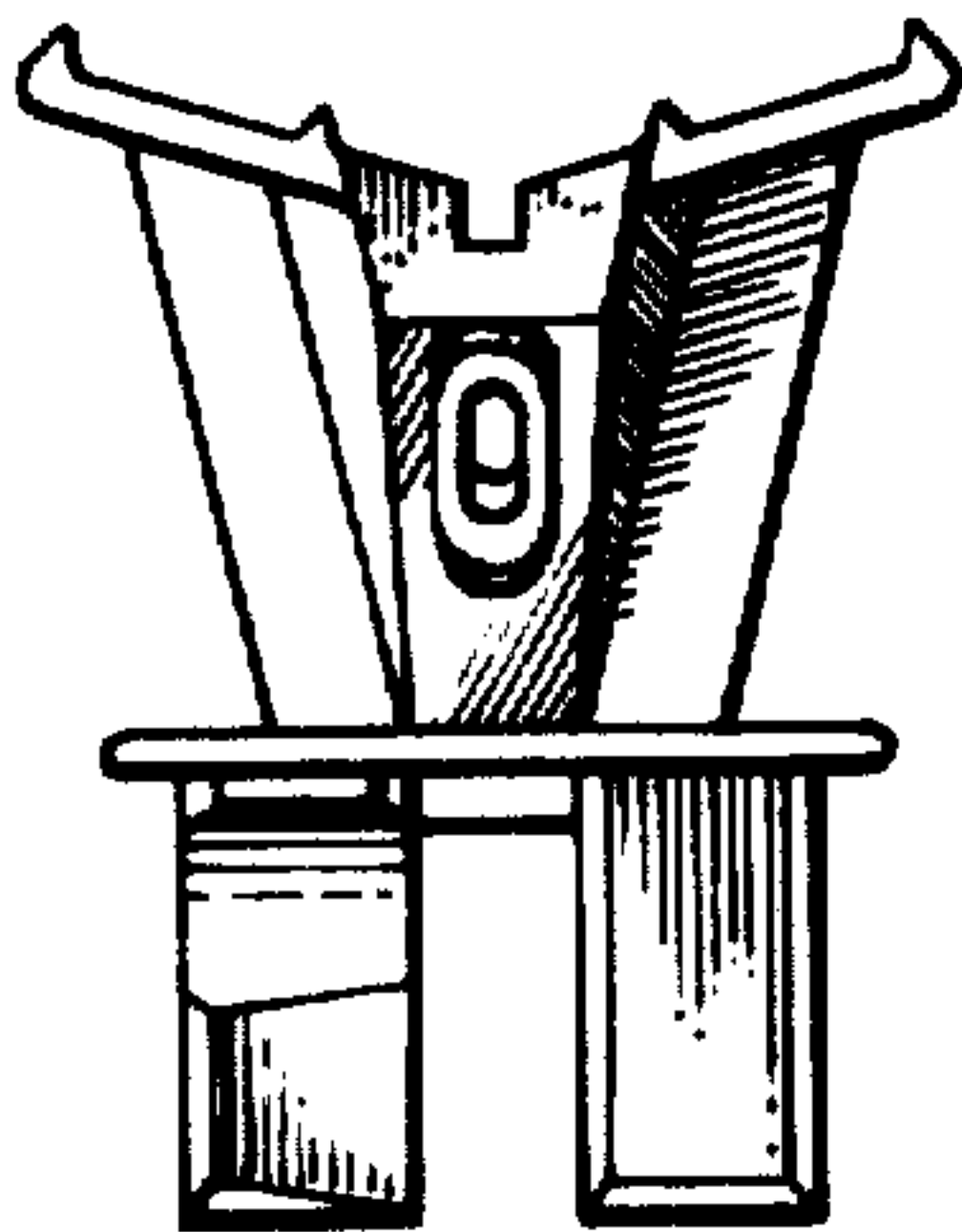

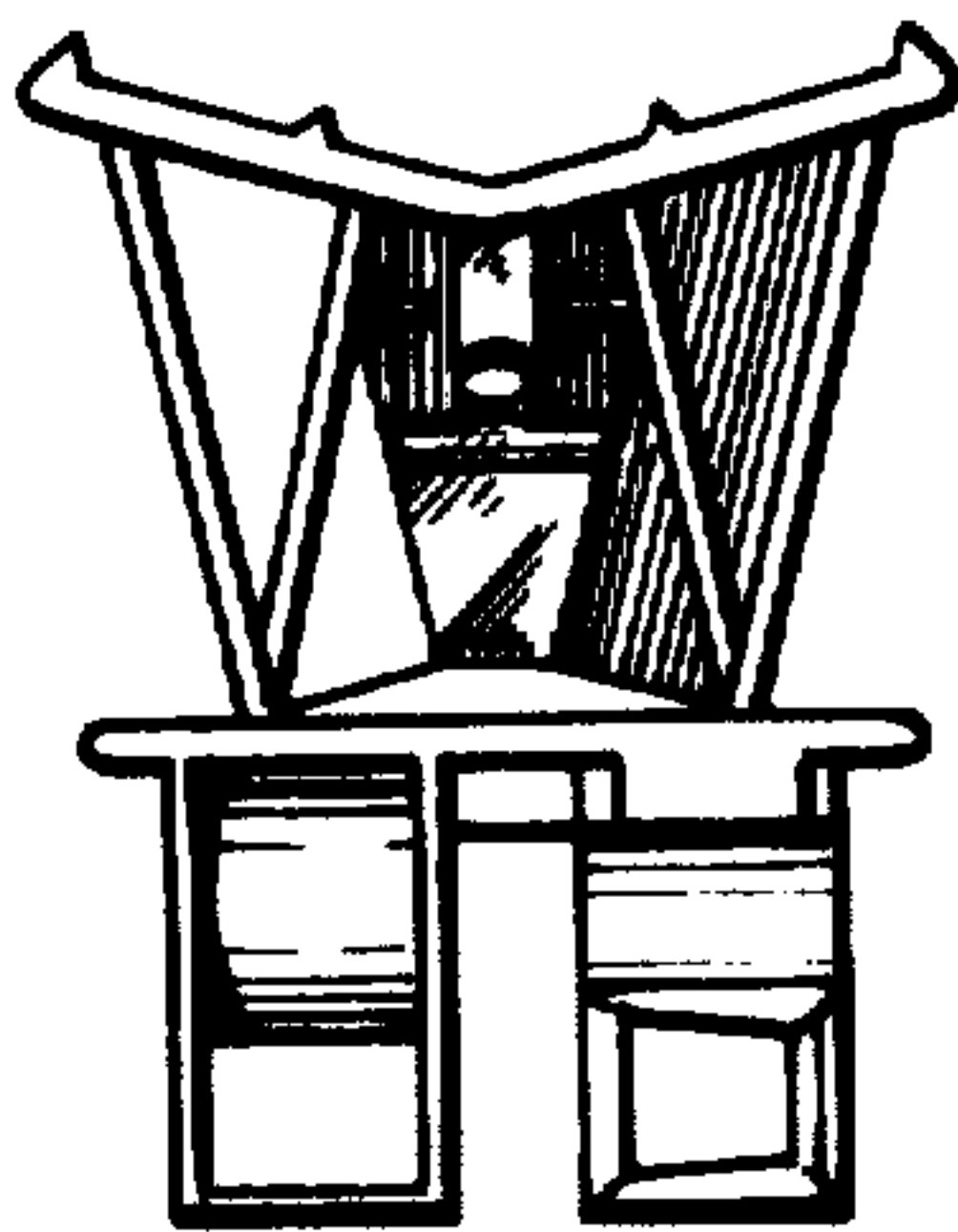
