The ornamental design for a retaining and protective device for intravenous infusion means, as shown.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a bottom plan view of a retaining and protective device for intravenous infusion means, showing my new design;

FIG. 2 is a top plan view;

FIG. 3 is a left side elevational view of FIG. 1;

FIG. 4 is a front elevational view of FIG. 2; and

FIG. 5 is a transverse sectional view taken on line 5 — 5 of FIG. 1.

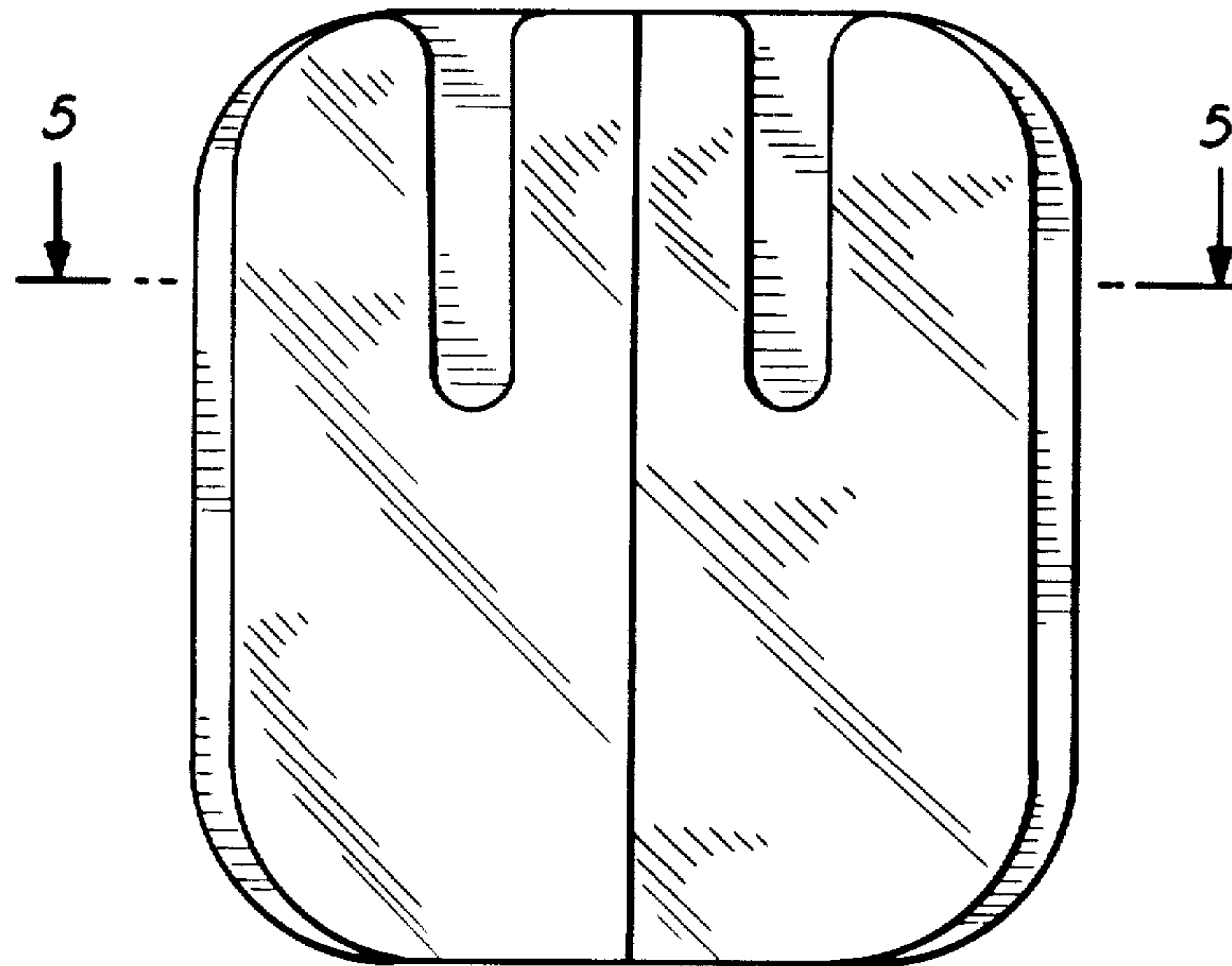

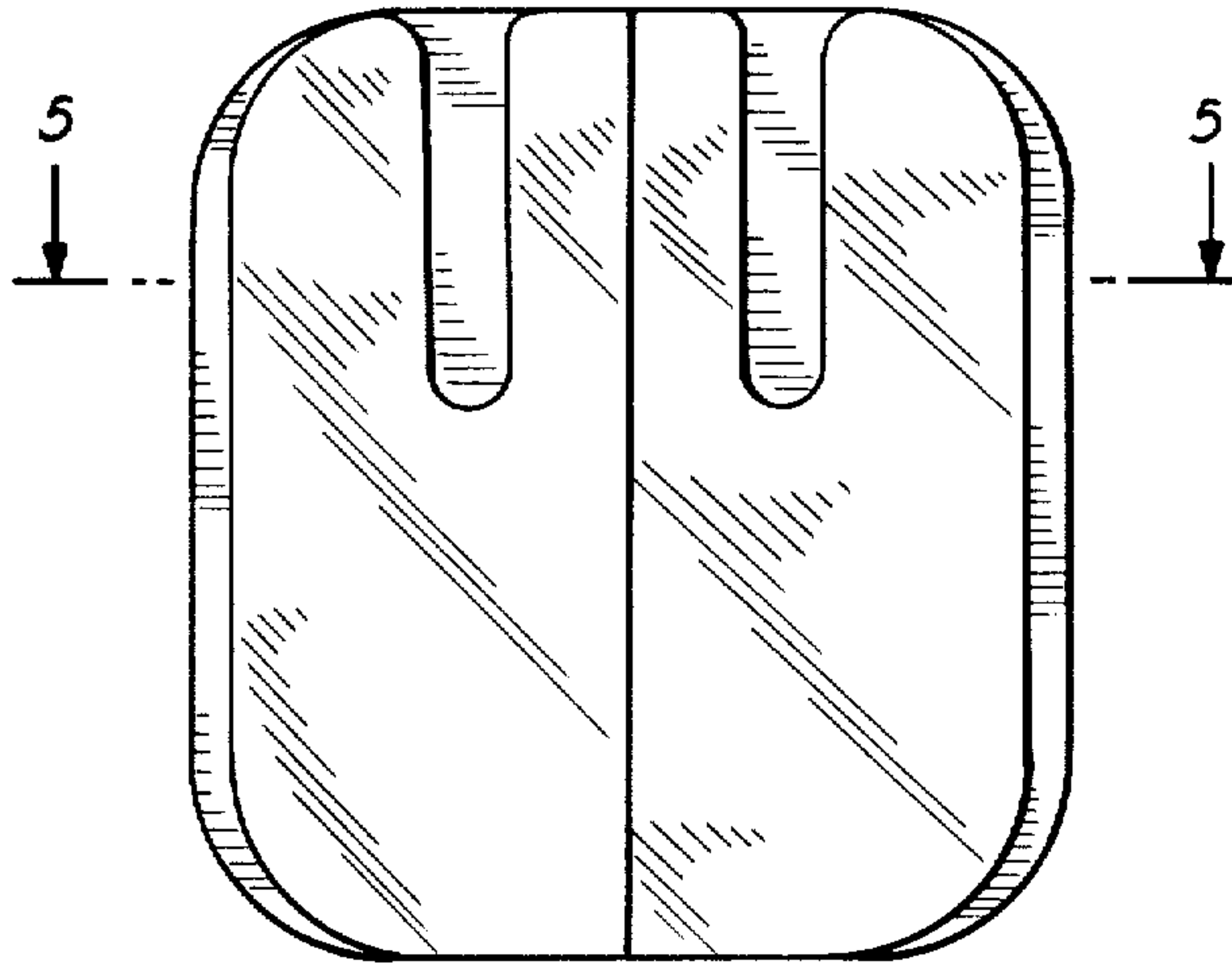

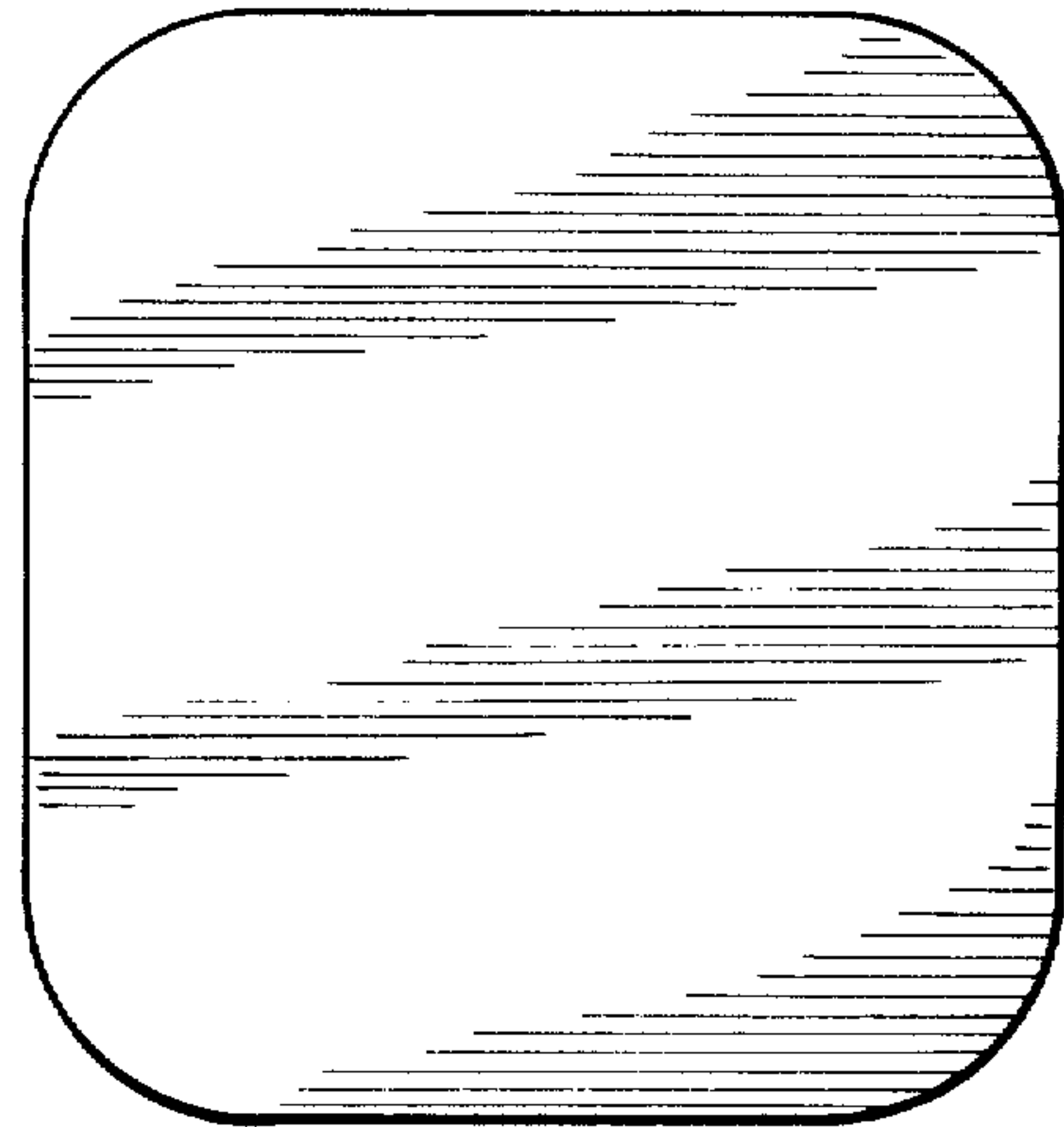
