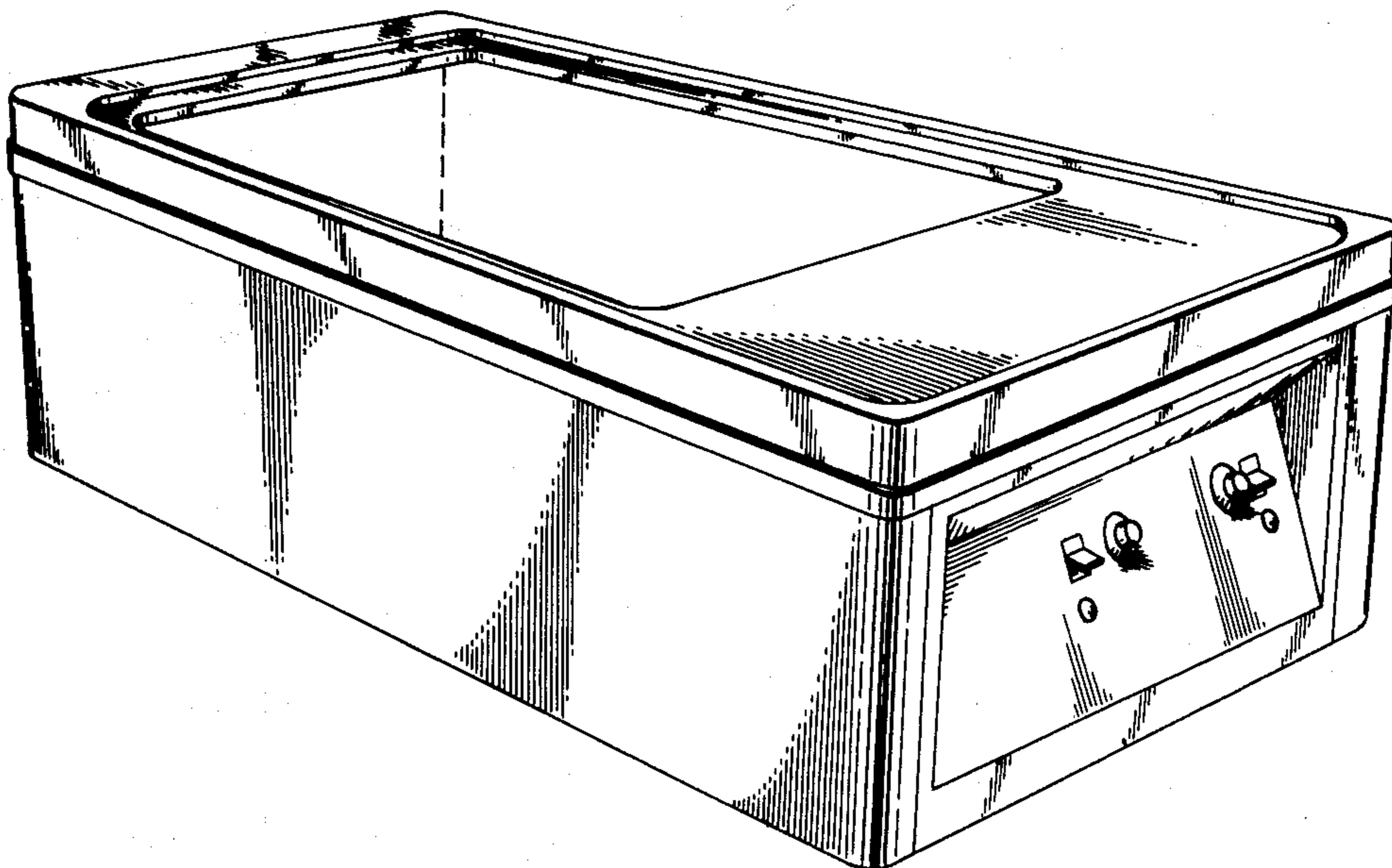

[57] **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a cabinet for a water bath shaker, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view taken from the front, top and one side of a cabinet for a water bath shaker showing my new design; and
 FIG. 2 is a perspective view taken from the rear, bottom and side opposite that shown in FIG. 1.
 The broken line representation of a tub in FIG. 1 is for purposes of illustration only.



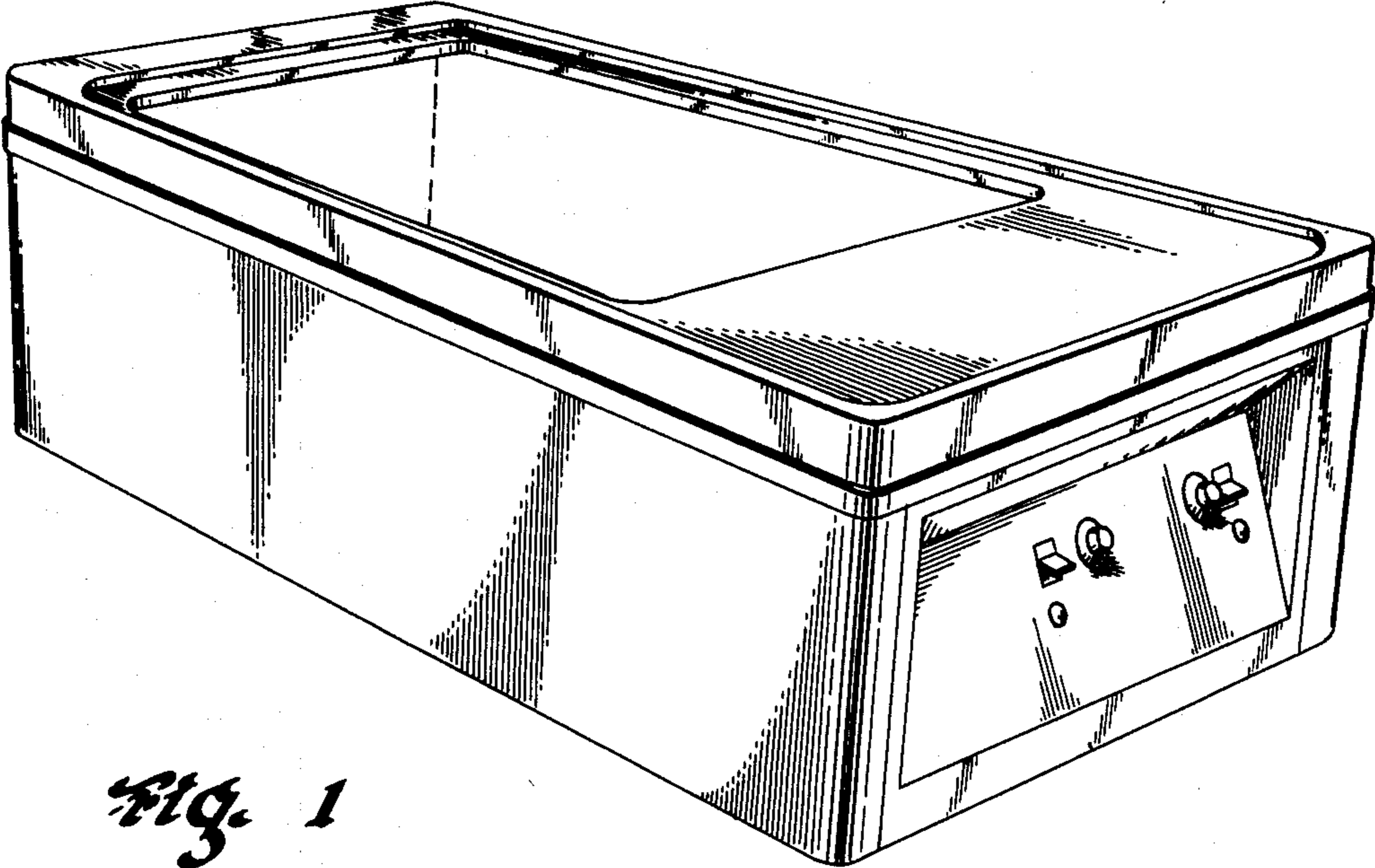

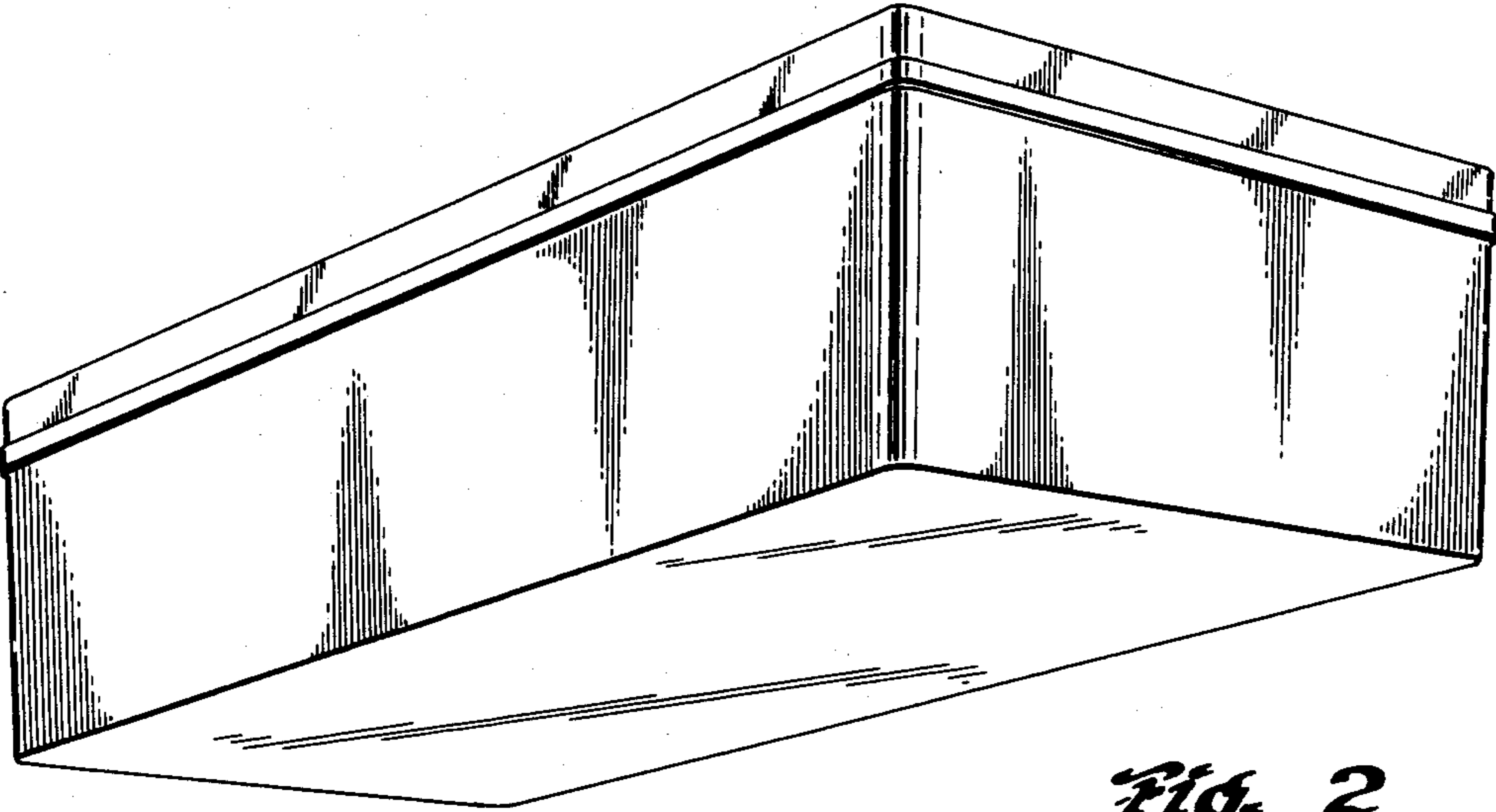
