FIG. 1 is a right side elevational view of a motorcycle sidecar coach showing my new design;


FIG. 2 is a left side elevational view thereof;


FIG. 3 is a front elevational view thereof to an enlarged scale;


FIG. 4 is a rear elevational view thereof to an enlarged scale; and
