The ornamental design for tennis racket, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front elevational view of a first embodiment of a tennis racket embodying our new design;

FIG. 2 is a side elevational view of the embodiment of FIG. 1:

FIG. 3 is a top plan view of the embodiment of FIG. 1; FIG. 4 is a bottom plan view of the embodiment of FIG. 1.

FIG. 11 is a front elevational view of a third embodiment of a tennis racket embodying our new design;


FIG. 12 is a side elevational view of the embodiment of FIG. 11;

FIG. 14 is a bottom plan view of the embodiment of FIG. 11;

FIG. 15 is an enlarged fragmentary elevational view of the throat portion of the embodiment of FIG. 11; and FIG. 16 is an enlarged fragmentary front elevational view of the racket portion between the head and handle grip, this portion being common to the embodiments of FIGS. 1-15.

The sides opposite FIGS. 1, 6 and 11 are identical to that shown and the shading shown in FIGS. 5, 10 and 15 have been omitted from FIGS. 1, 6 and 11 for convenience of illustration.
