The ornamental design for an article of flatware, as
shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front elevational view of an article of flat-
ware showing my new design as embodied in a fork;
FIG. 2 is a side elevational view from the right of FIG.
1;
FIG. 3 is a rear elevational view of FIG. 1;
FIG. 4 is a cross-sectional view taken on line 4—4 of
FIG. 1;

FIG. 5 is a cross-sectional view taken on line 5—5 of
FIG. 1;
FIG. 6 is a cross-sectional view taken on line 6—6 of
FIG. 1;
FIG. 7 is a cross-sectional view taken on line 7—7 of
FIG. 1;
FIG. 8 is an end elevational view from the top of FIG.
1;
FIG. 9 is an end elevational view from the bottom of
FIG. 1;
FIG. 10 is a front elevational view of an article of flat-
ware showing my new design as embodied in a knife;
FIG. 11 is a side elevational view from the right of FIG.
10;
FIG. 12 is a cross-sectional view taken on line 12—12 of
FIG. 10;
FIG. 13 is a cross-sectional view taken on line 13—13 of
FIG. 10;
FIG. 14 is an end elevational view from the bottom of
FIG. 10;
FIG. 15 is an end elevational view from the top of FIG.

FIG. 16 is a front elevational view of an article of flat-
ware showing my new design as embodied in a spoon;
FIG. 17 is a side elevational view from the left of FIG.
16;
FIG. 18 is a rear elevational view of FIG. 16;
FIG. 19 is an end elevational view from the bottom of
FIG. 16;
FIG. 20 is an end elevational view from the top of FIG.
16;
FIG. 21 is a front elevational view of an article of flat-
ware showing my new design as embodied in a gravy
ladle;
FIG. 22 is a side elevational view from the left of FIG.
21;
FIG. 23 is a rear elevational view of FIG. 21;
FIG. 24 is an end elevational view from the bottom of
FIG. 21;
FIG. 25 is an end elevational view from the top of FIG.
21;
The sides opposite the handle portions in FIGS. 2, 10,
11, 17 and 22 are mirror images of the respective shown
sides.
The distinguishing feature of my new design for an
article of flatware resides in the handle configuration.

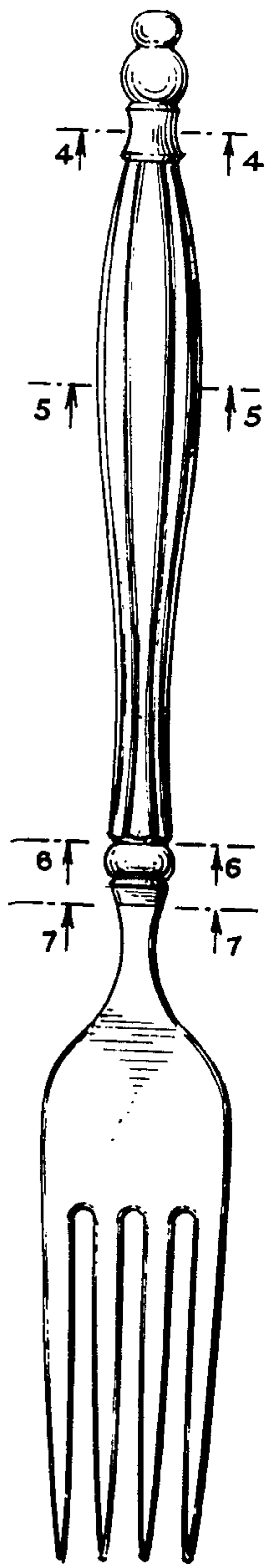

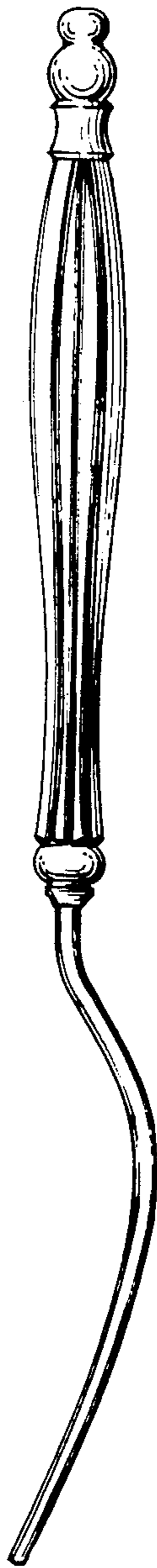

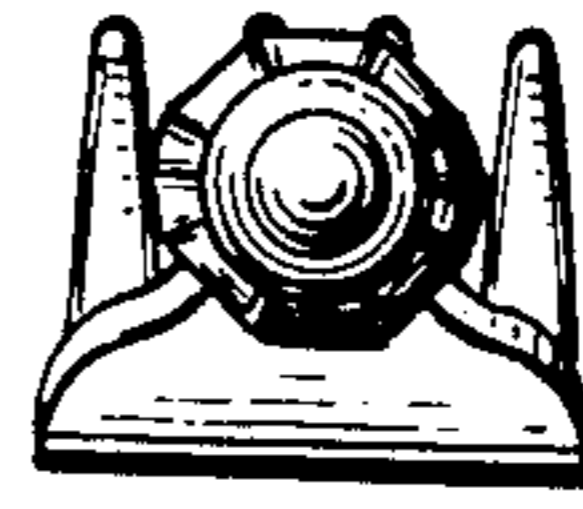

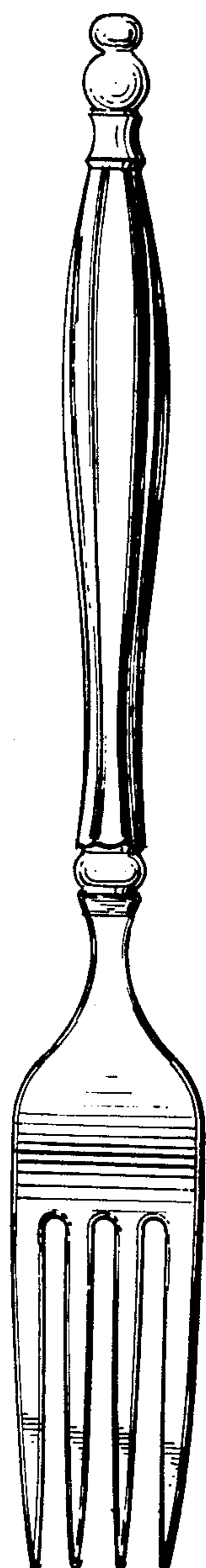

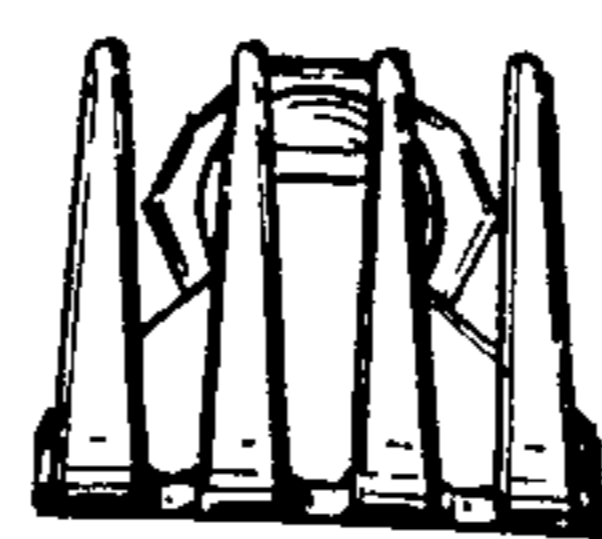

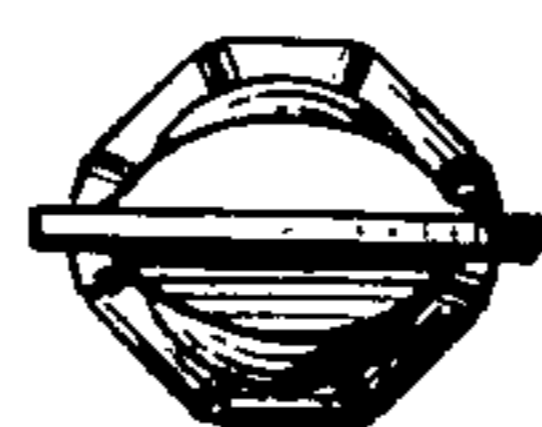

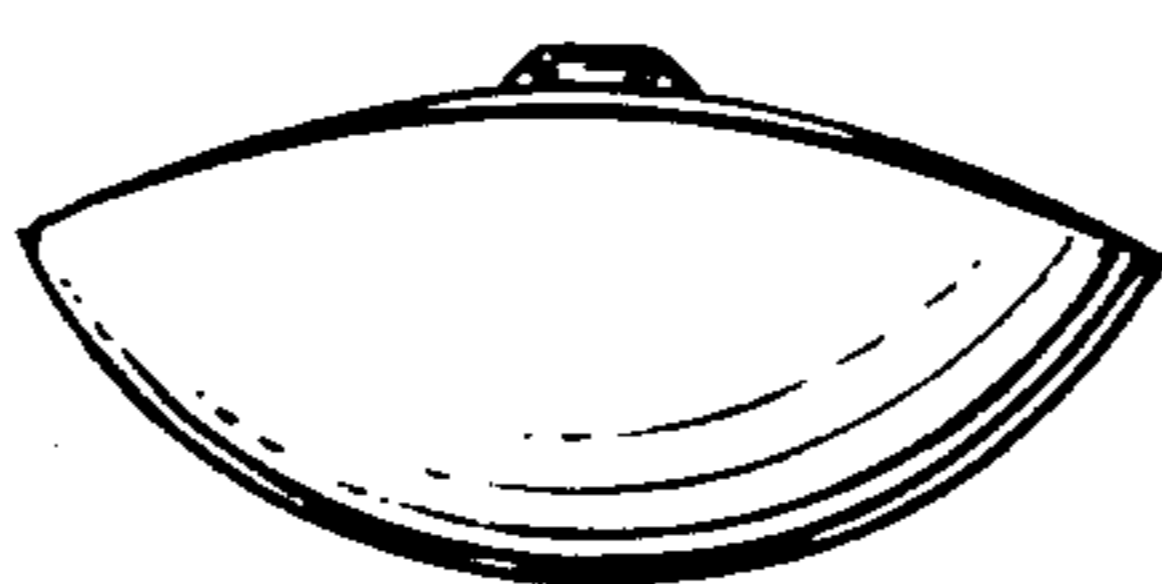

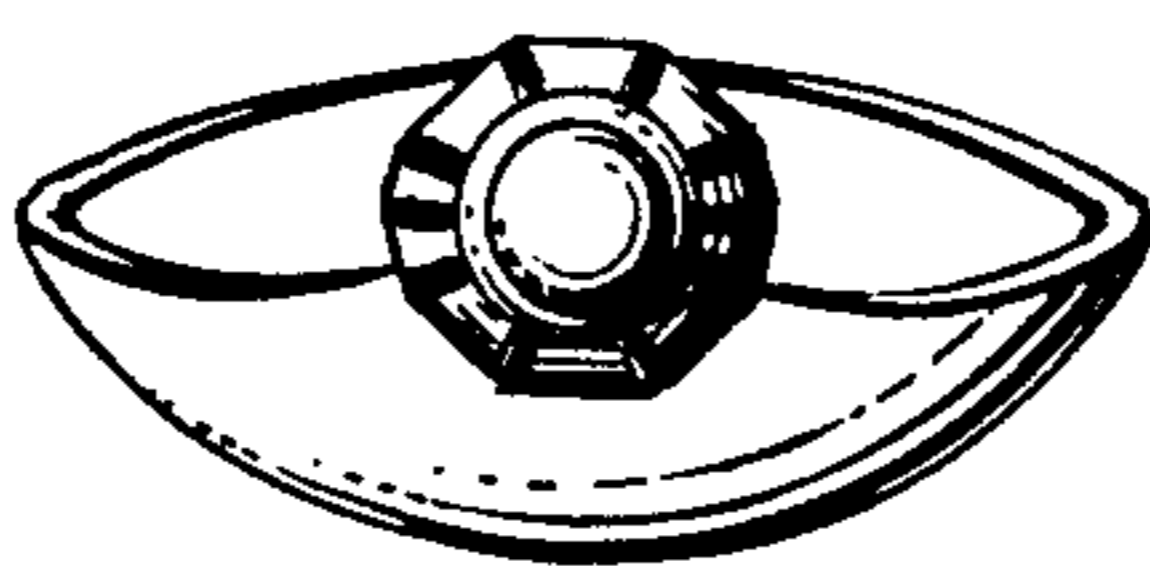

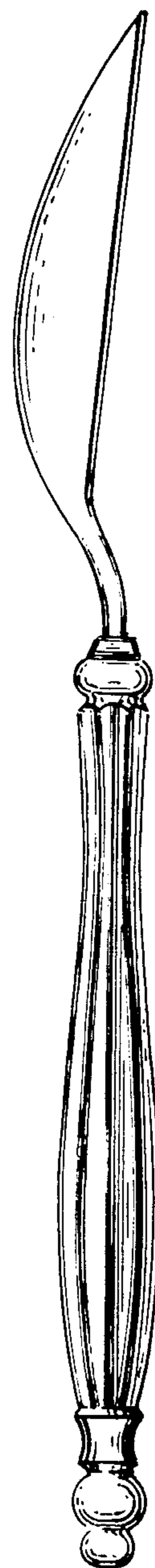

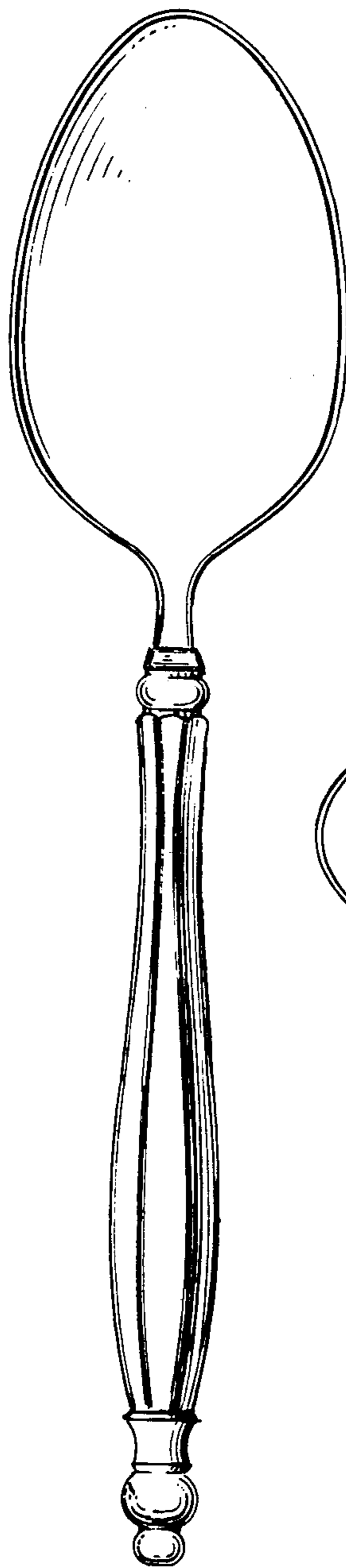
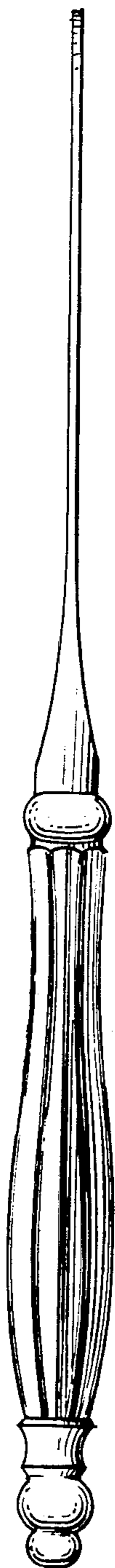
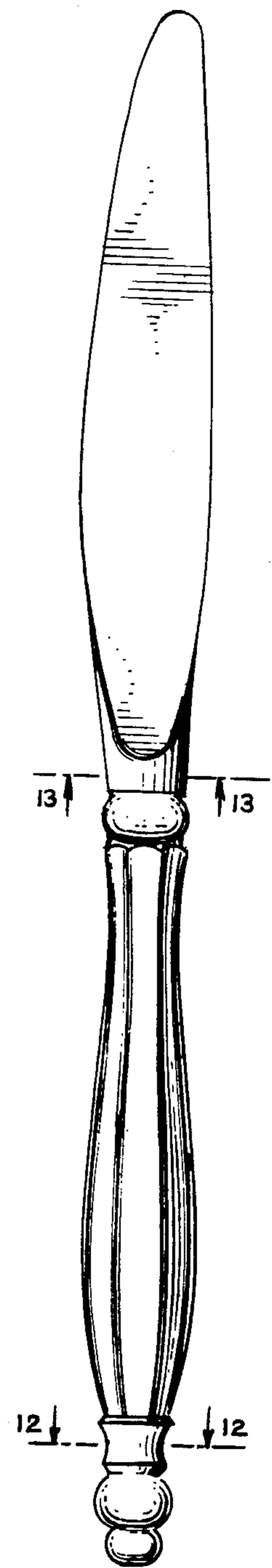

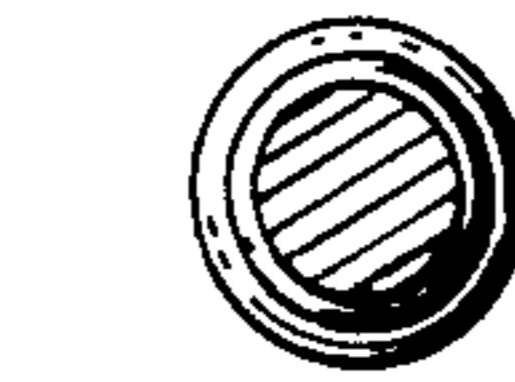
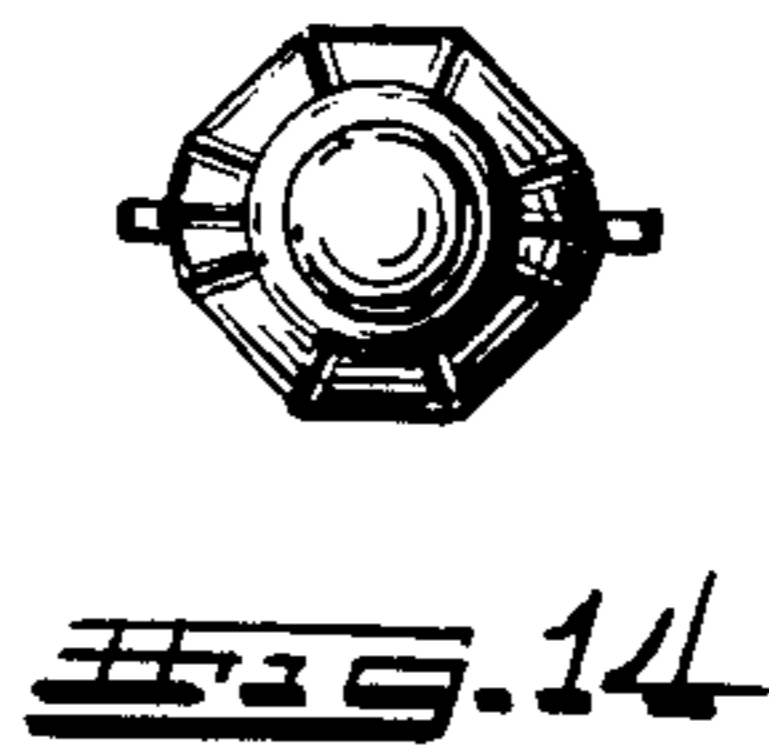

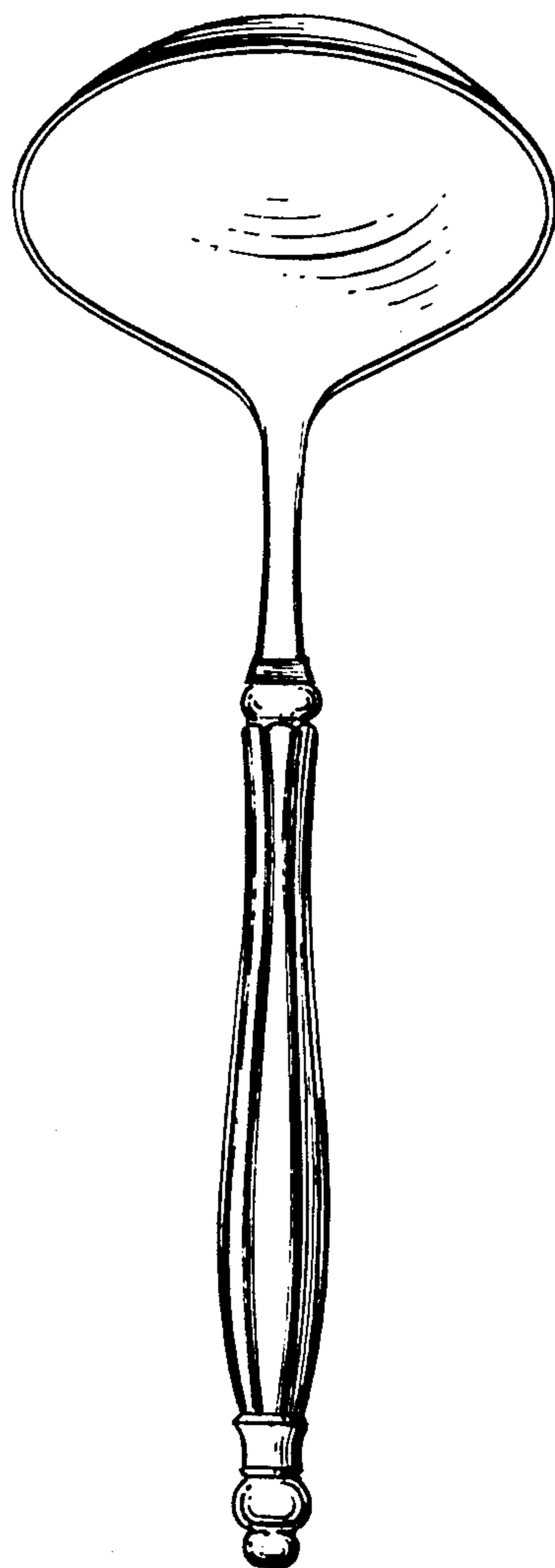

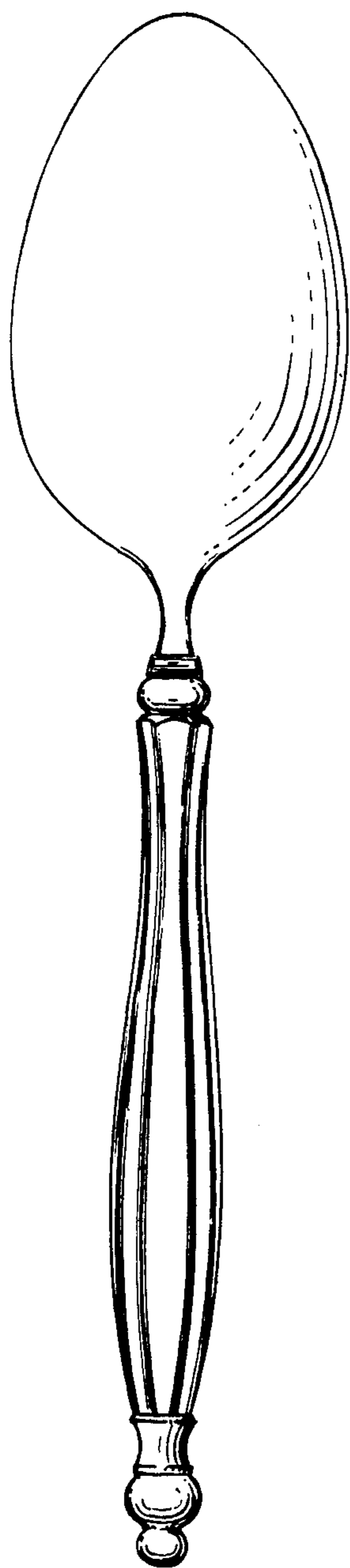

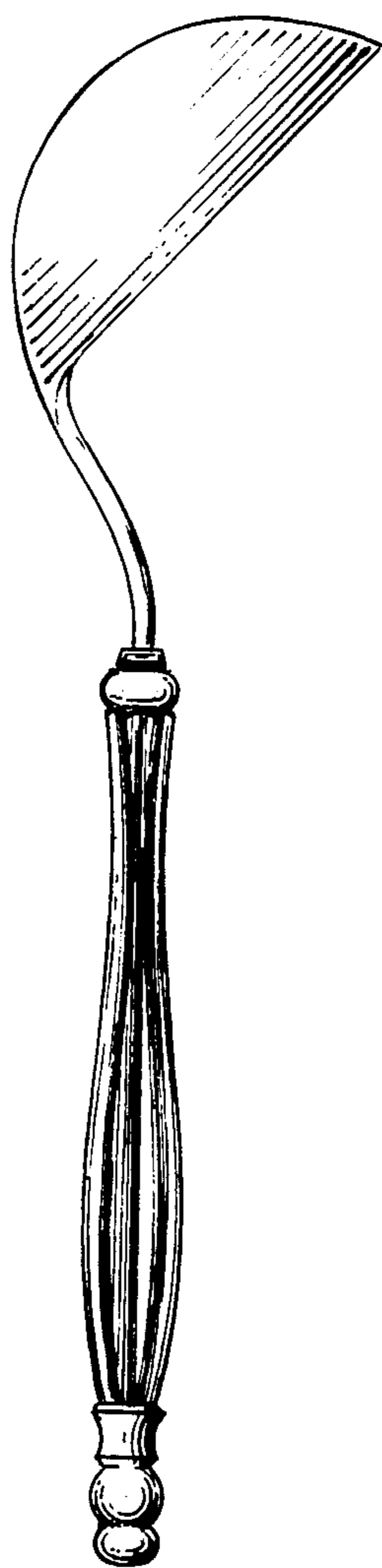

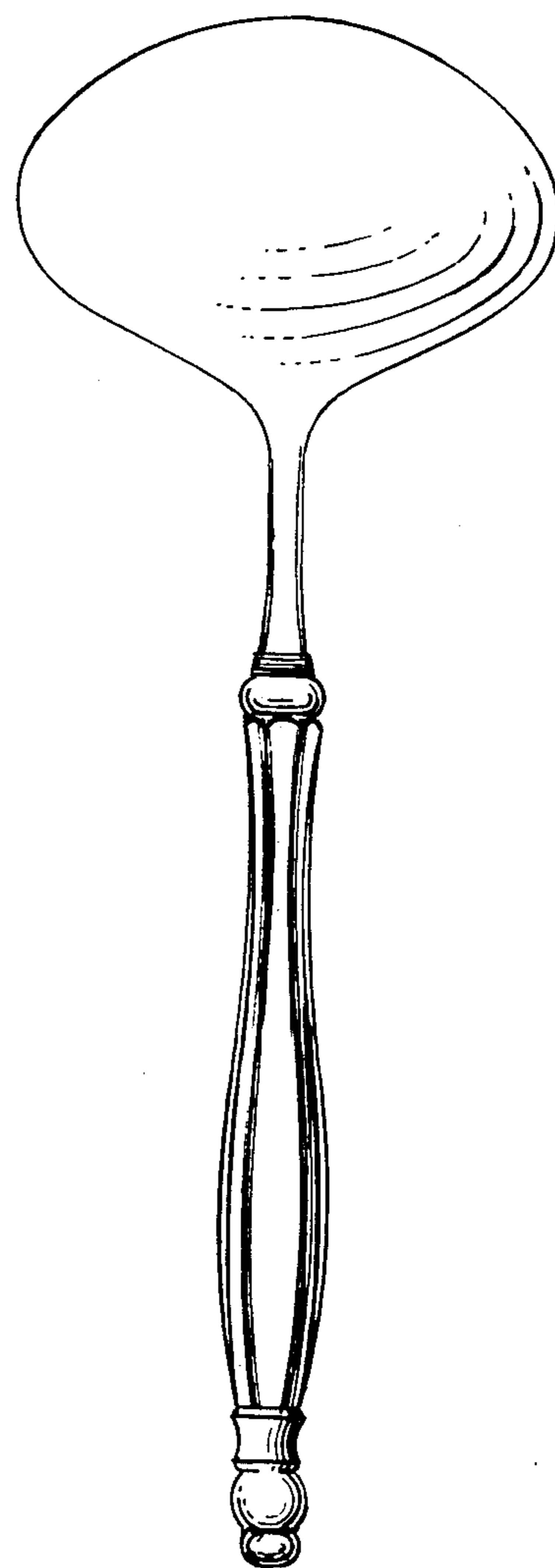

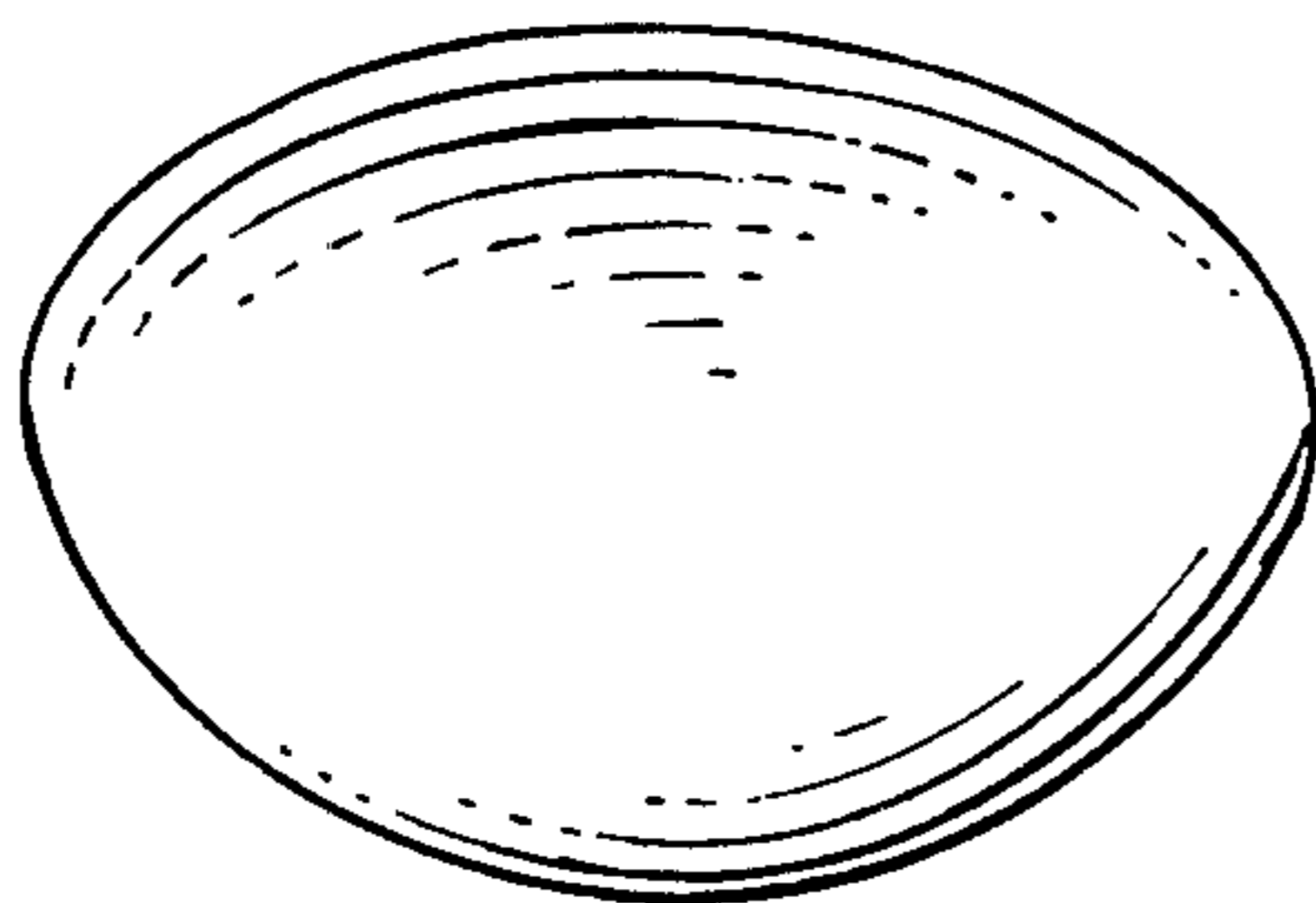

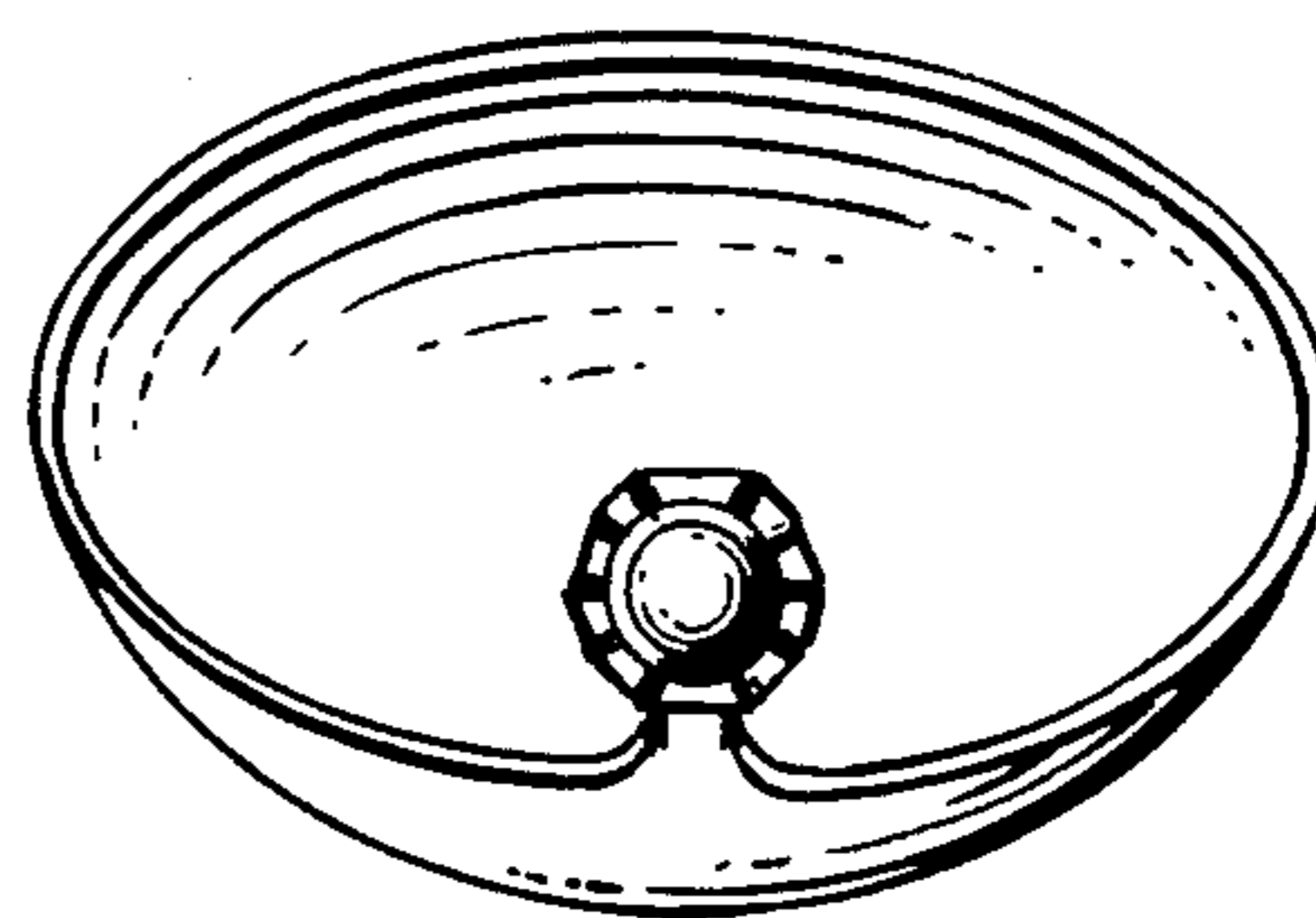
