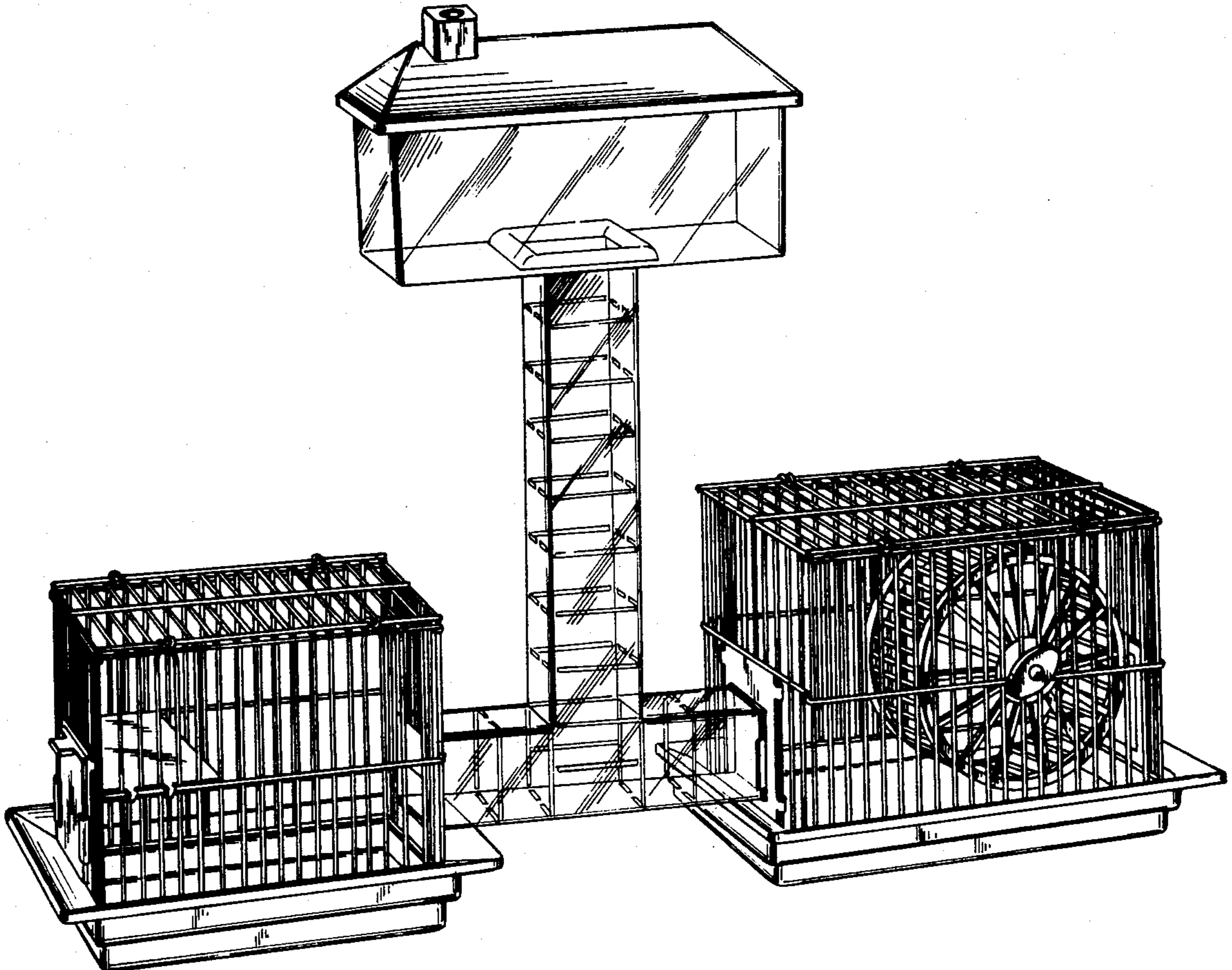

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of a modular pet habitat showing our new design; and, FIG. 2 is an exploded bottom rear perspective view thereof.



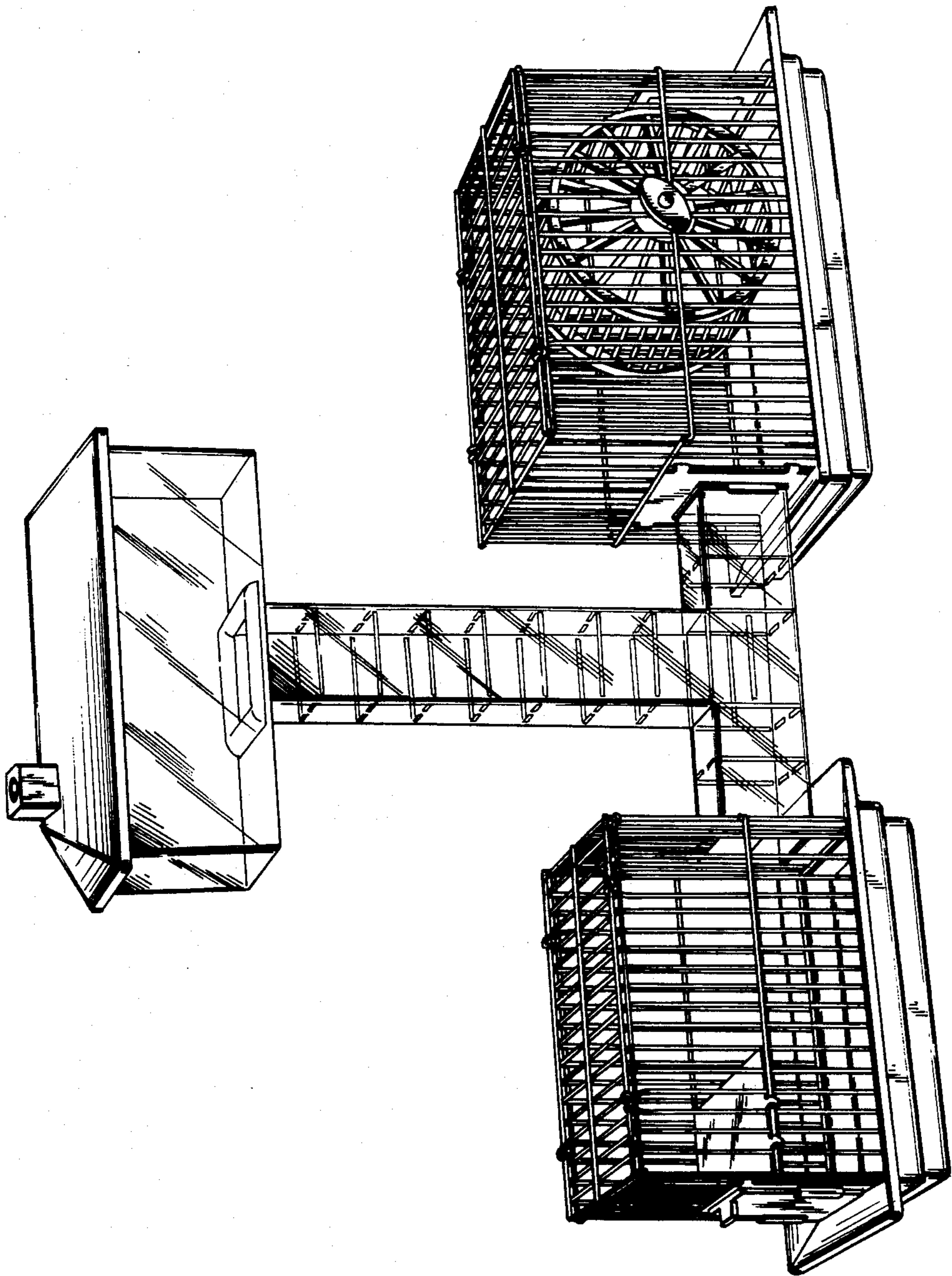

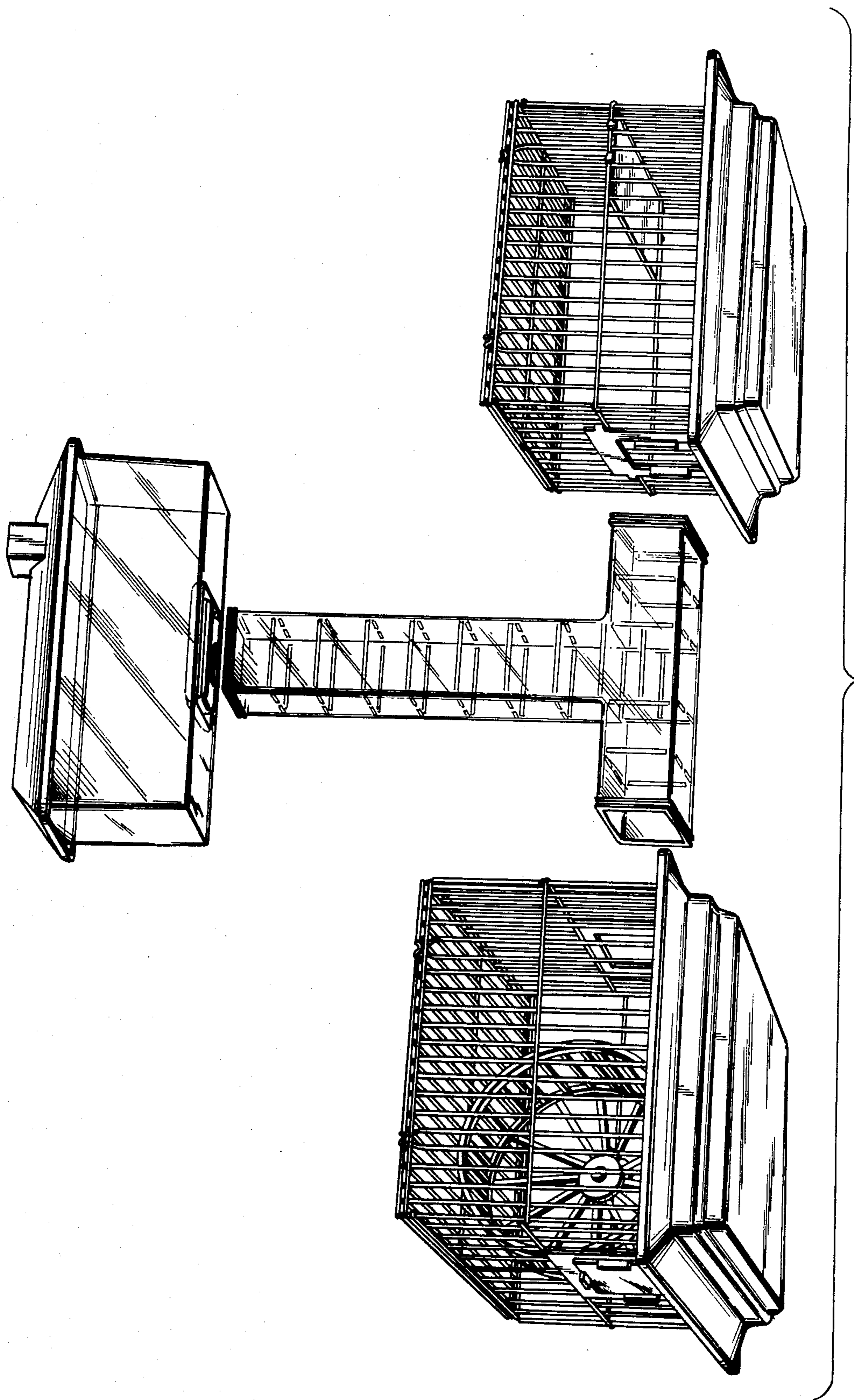
