[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a miniature hurricane lamp for dollhouses and the like, substantially as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is an elevational view of a miniature hurricane lamp for dollhouses and the like showing my new design, the opposite side being identical to the side shown; FIG. 2 is a top view of FIG. 1; and FIG. 3 is a bottom view of FIG. 1.

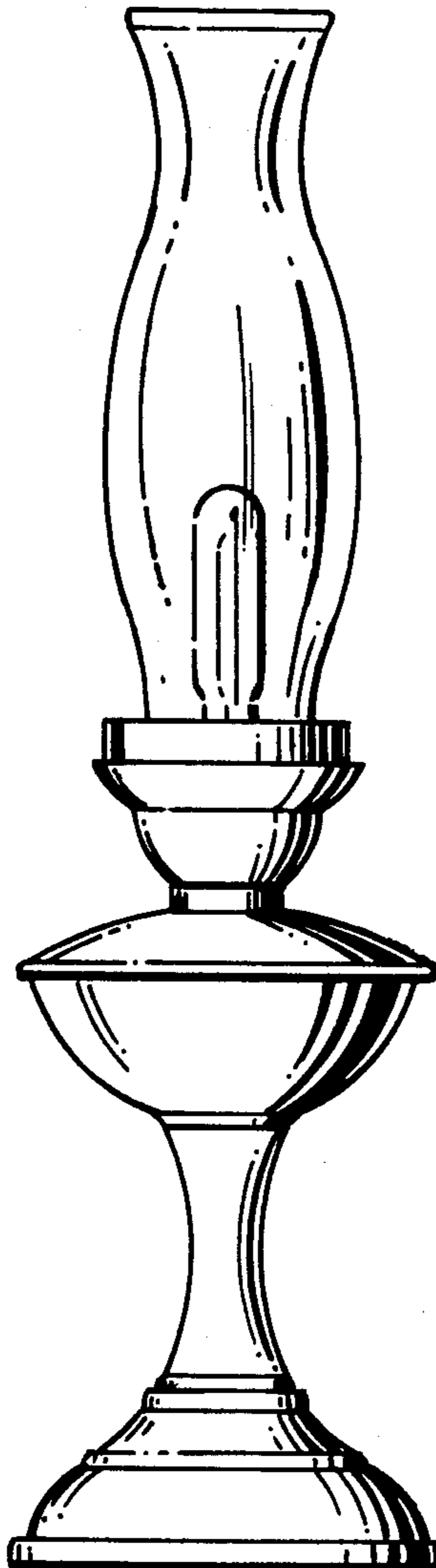

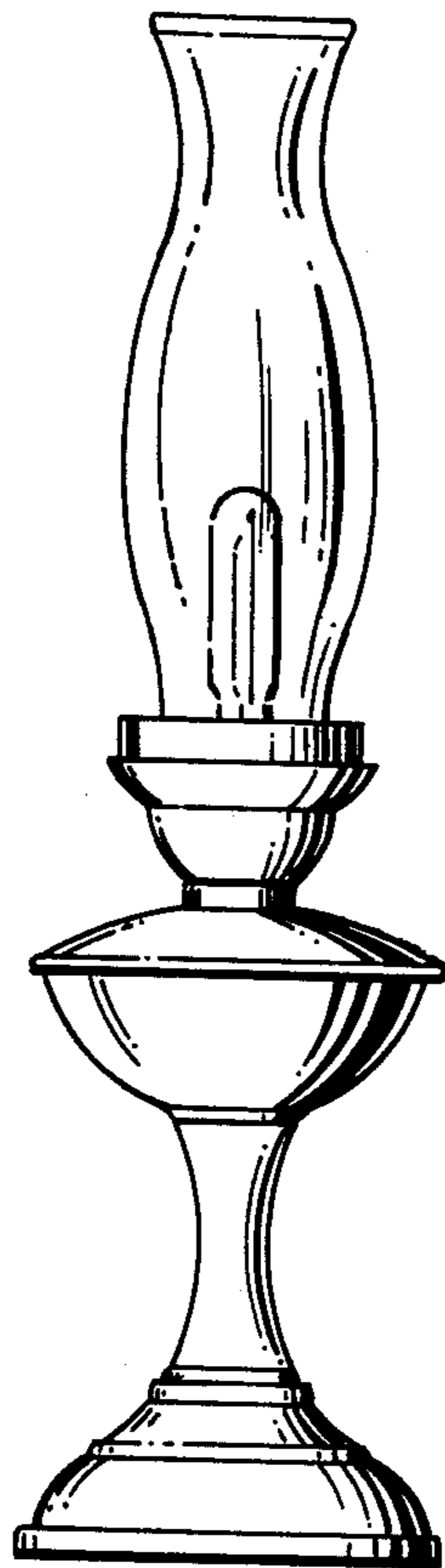

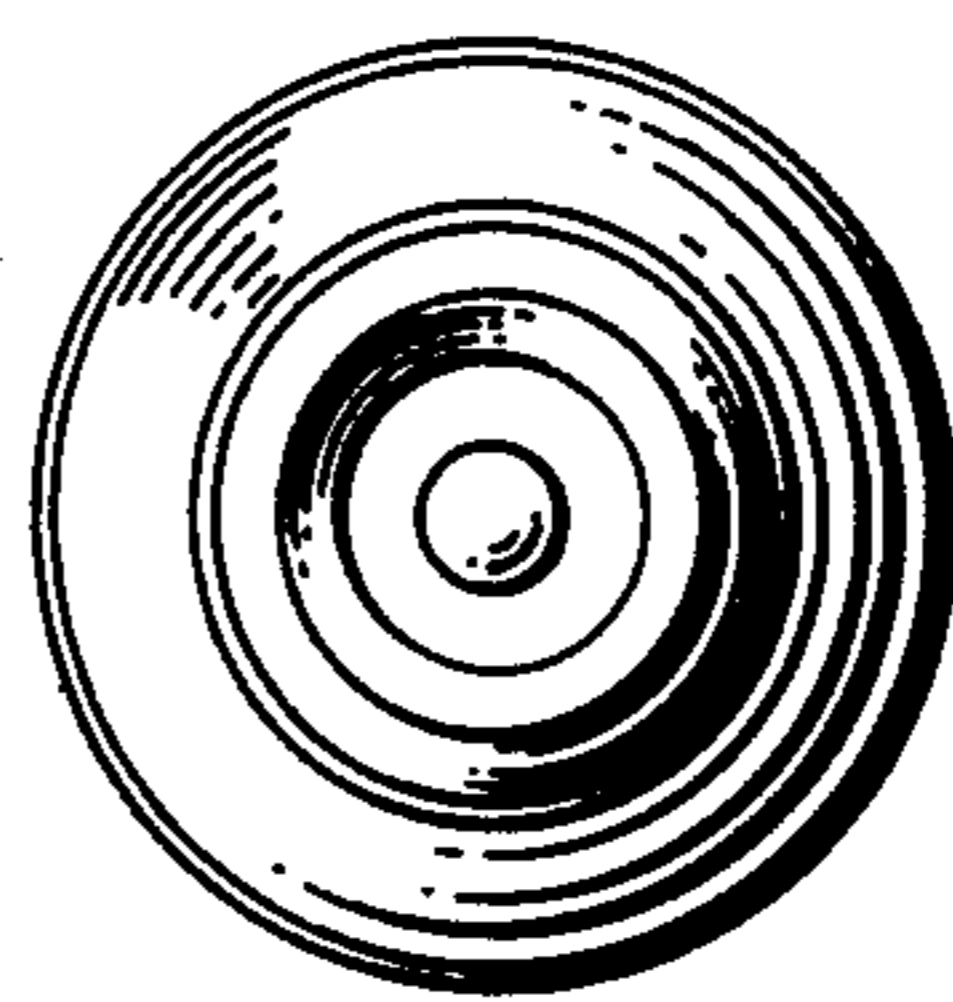
