DESCRIPTION

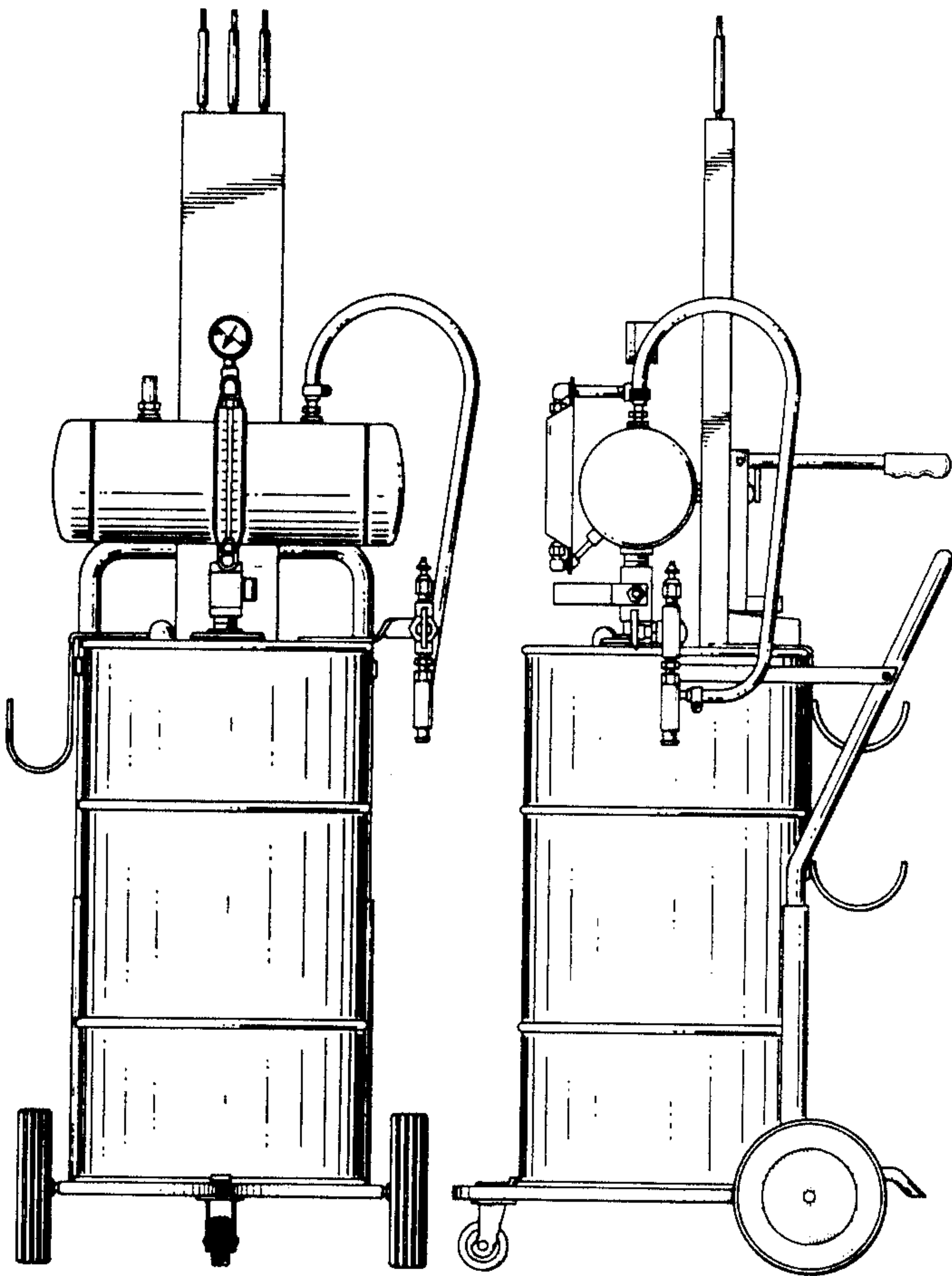
FIG. 1 is a front elevational view of a vacuum draining unit for lubricants from internal combustion engines showing my new design;

FIG. 5 is a top plan view thereof.



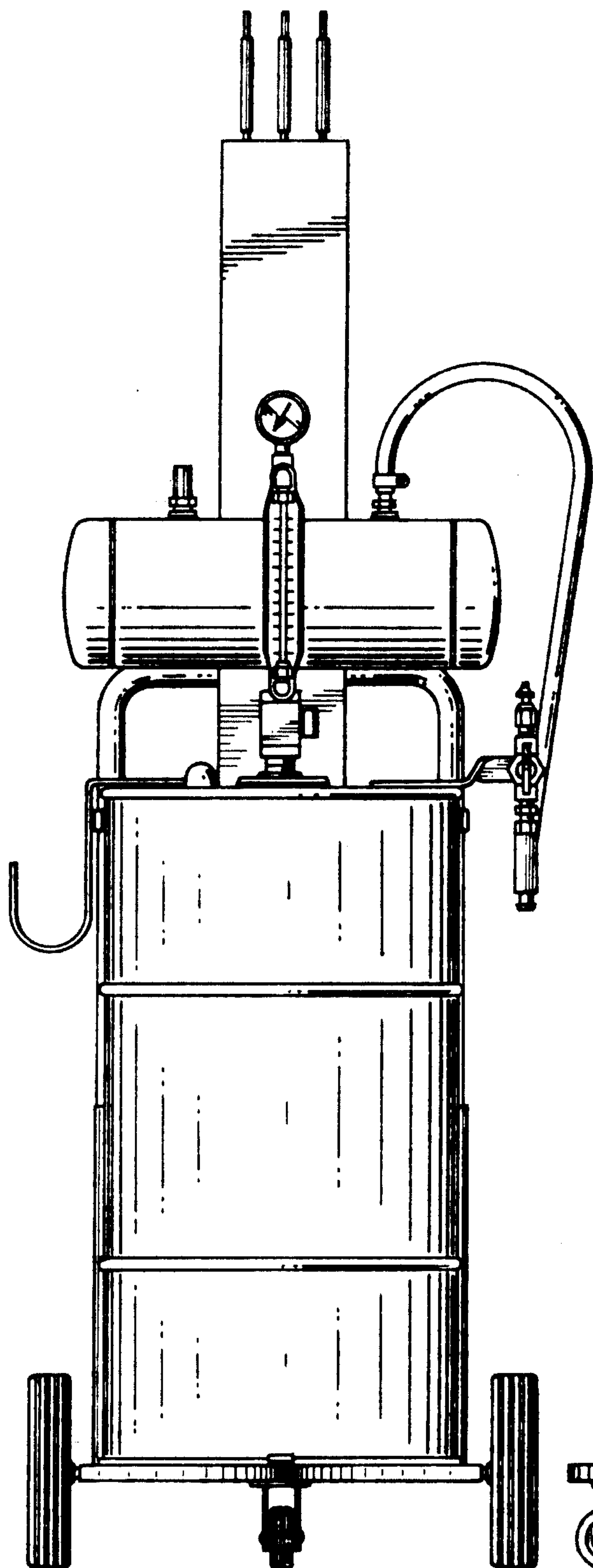

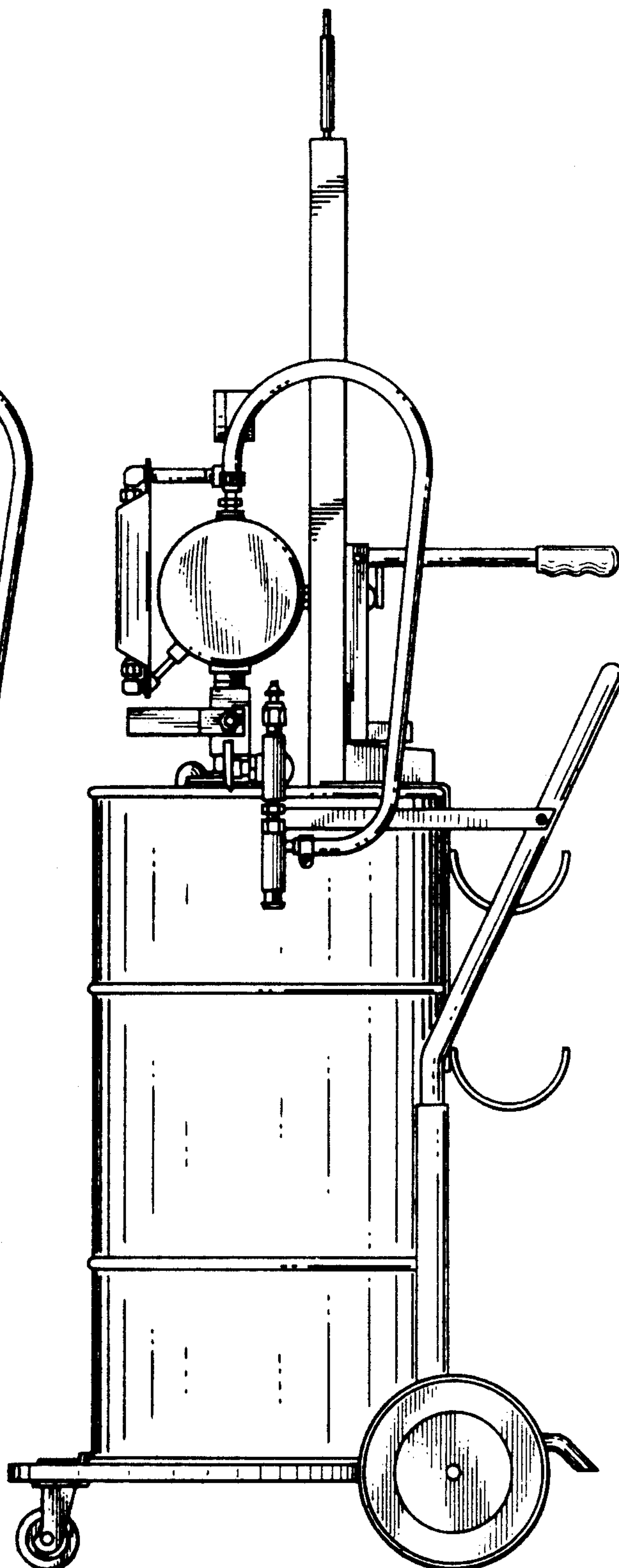

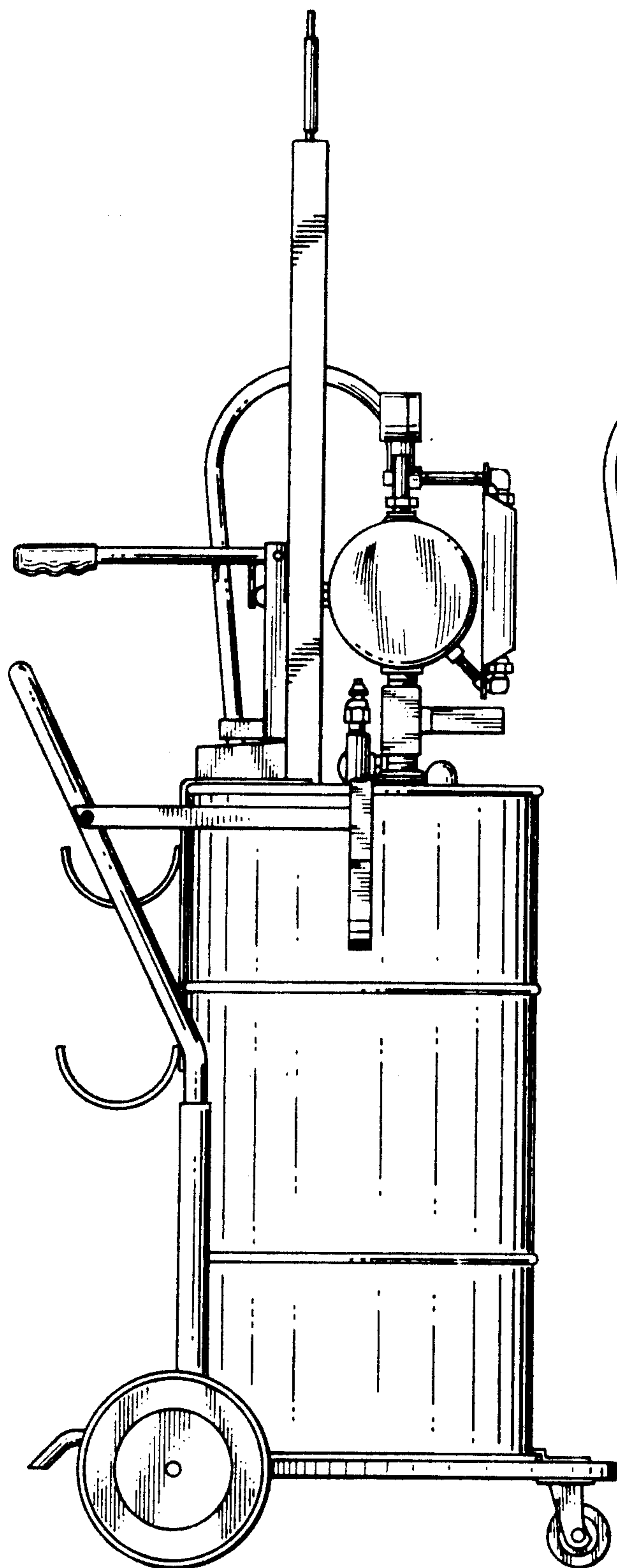

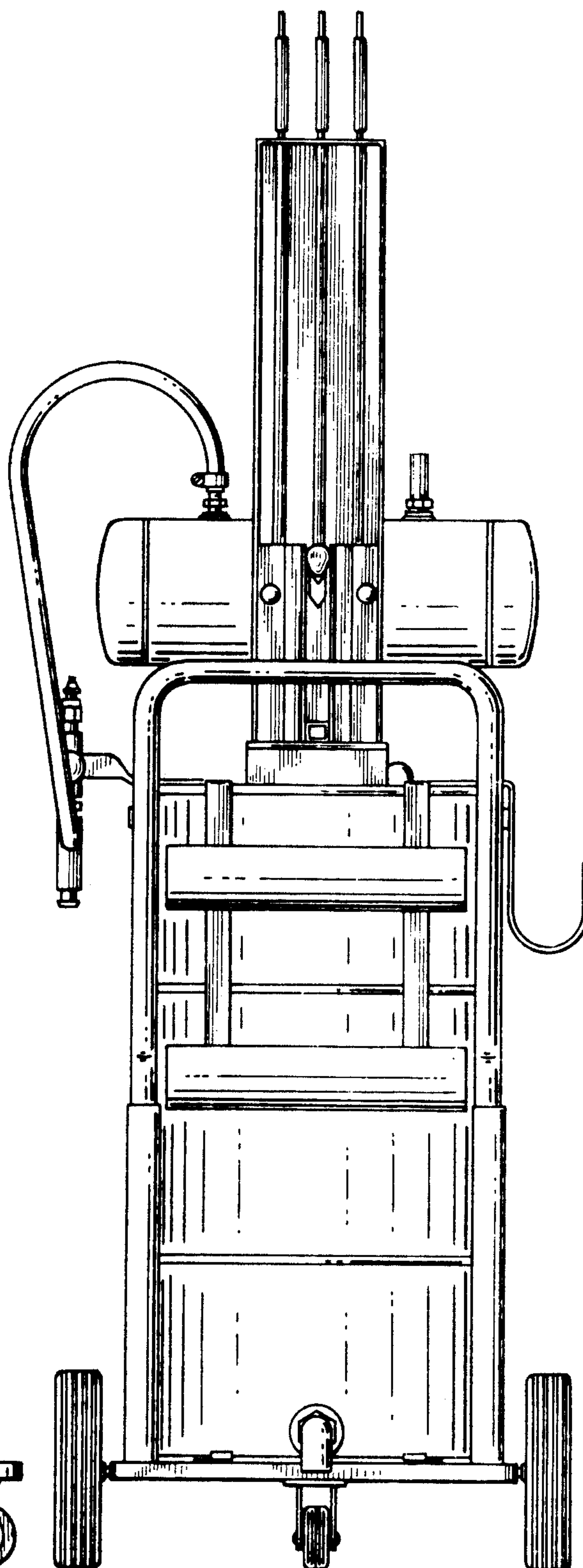

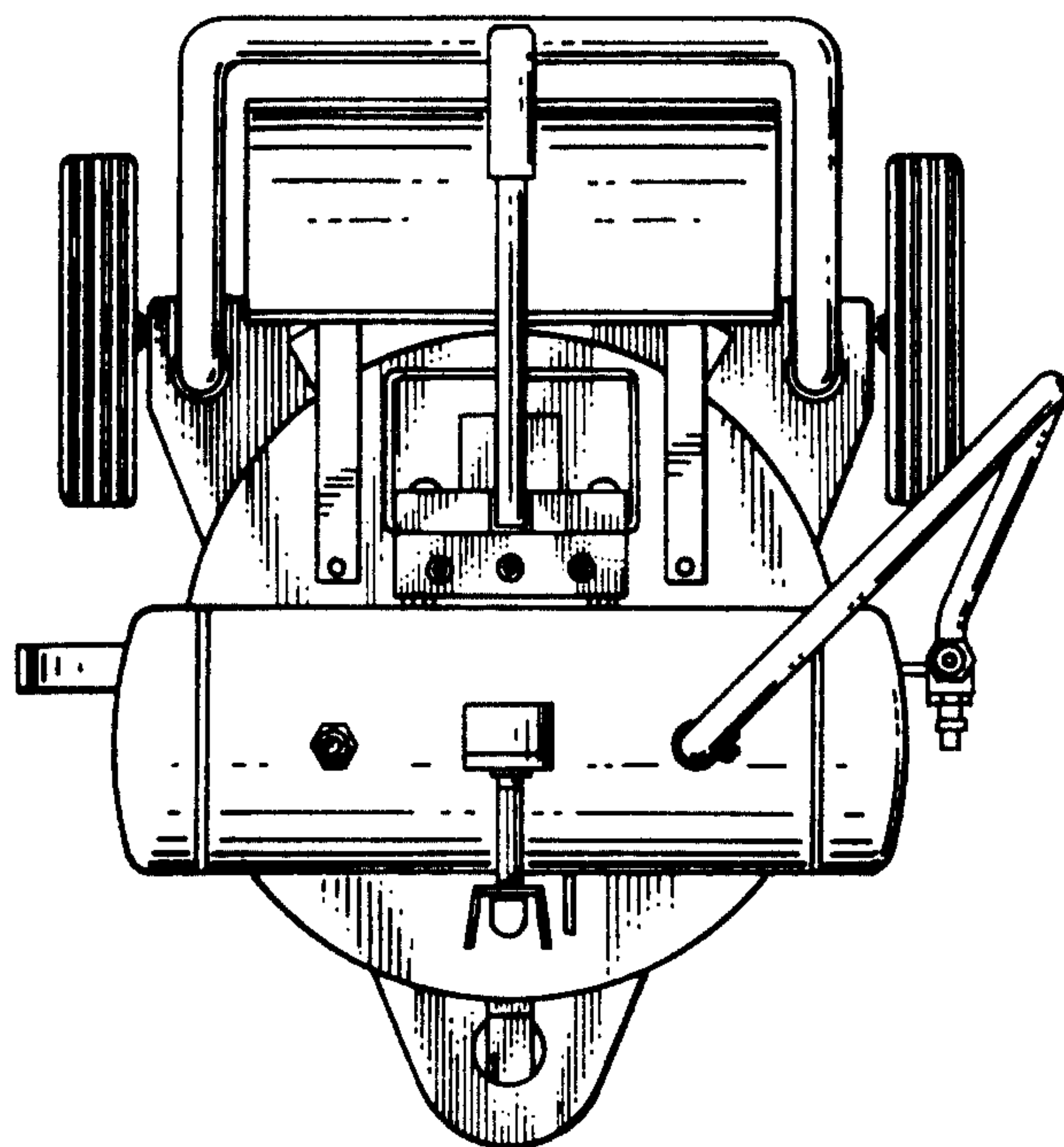
