[57] **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a decorative door, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

The FIGURE is a front elevation of a decorative door embodying my new design, the broken lines being shown for illustrative purposes only.

The door is of conventional thickness and the decorative panel shown thereon is on one side only, the rear being plain.
