[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a mirror frame, substantially as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front elevational view of a mirror frame showing our new design, the side opposite being substantially flat, plain and unornamented;

FIG. 2 is a top plan view thereof;

FIG. 3 is a left side elevational view thereof;

FIG. 4 is a right side elevational view thereof;

FIG. 5 is a bottom plan view thereof.

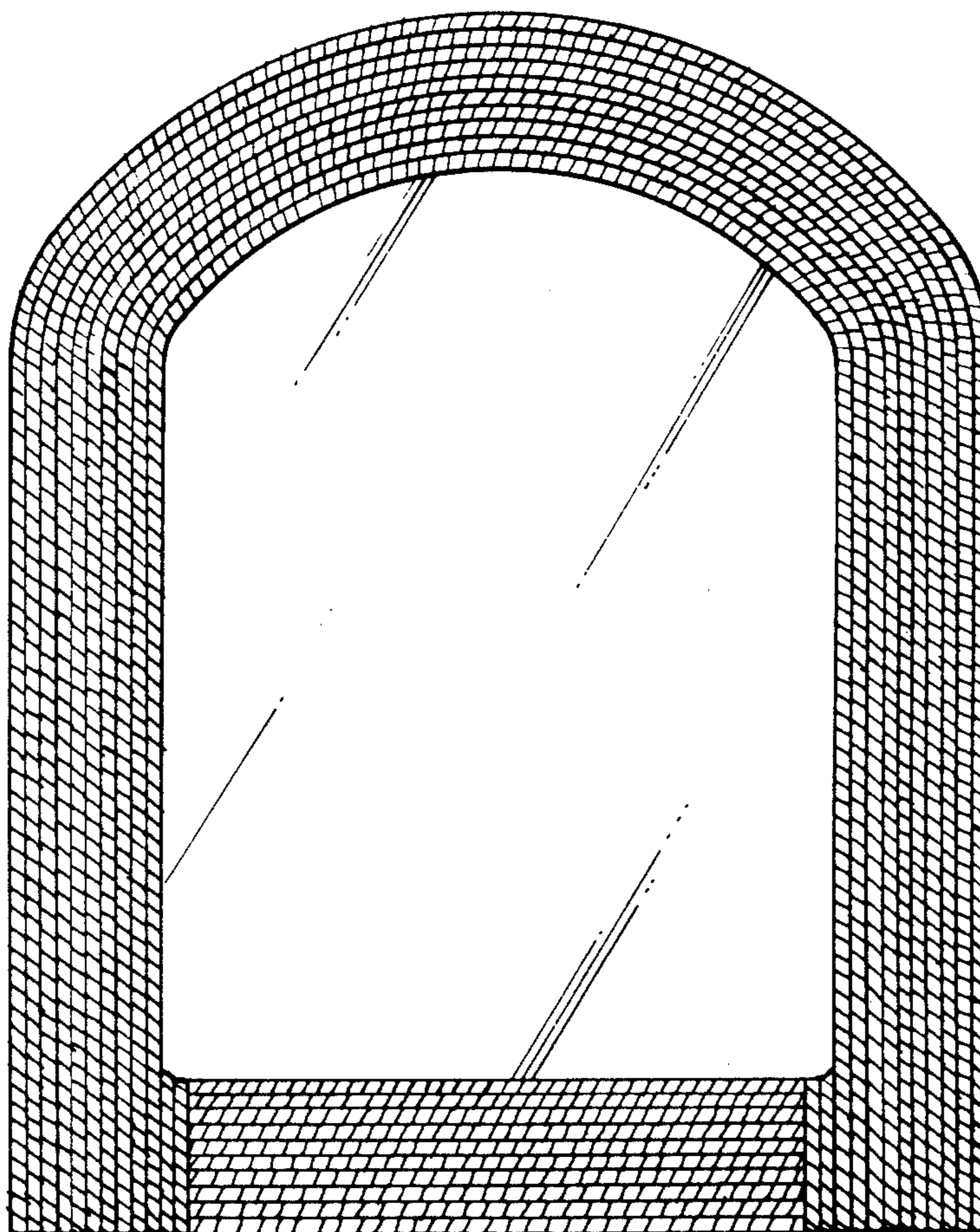

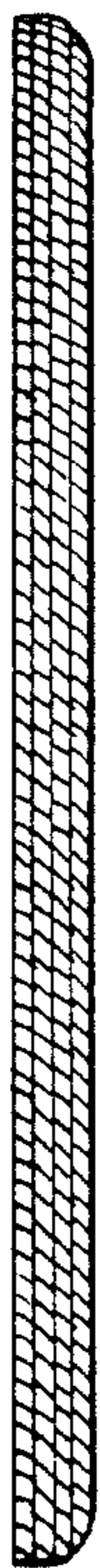
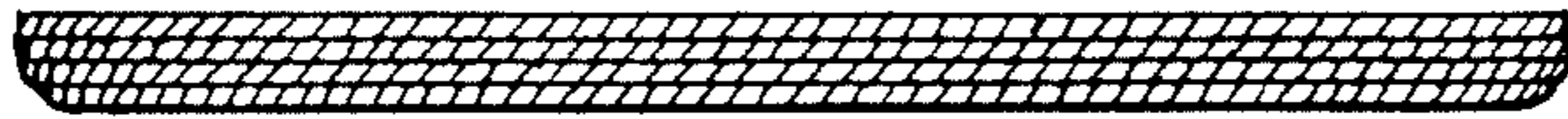

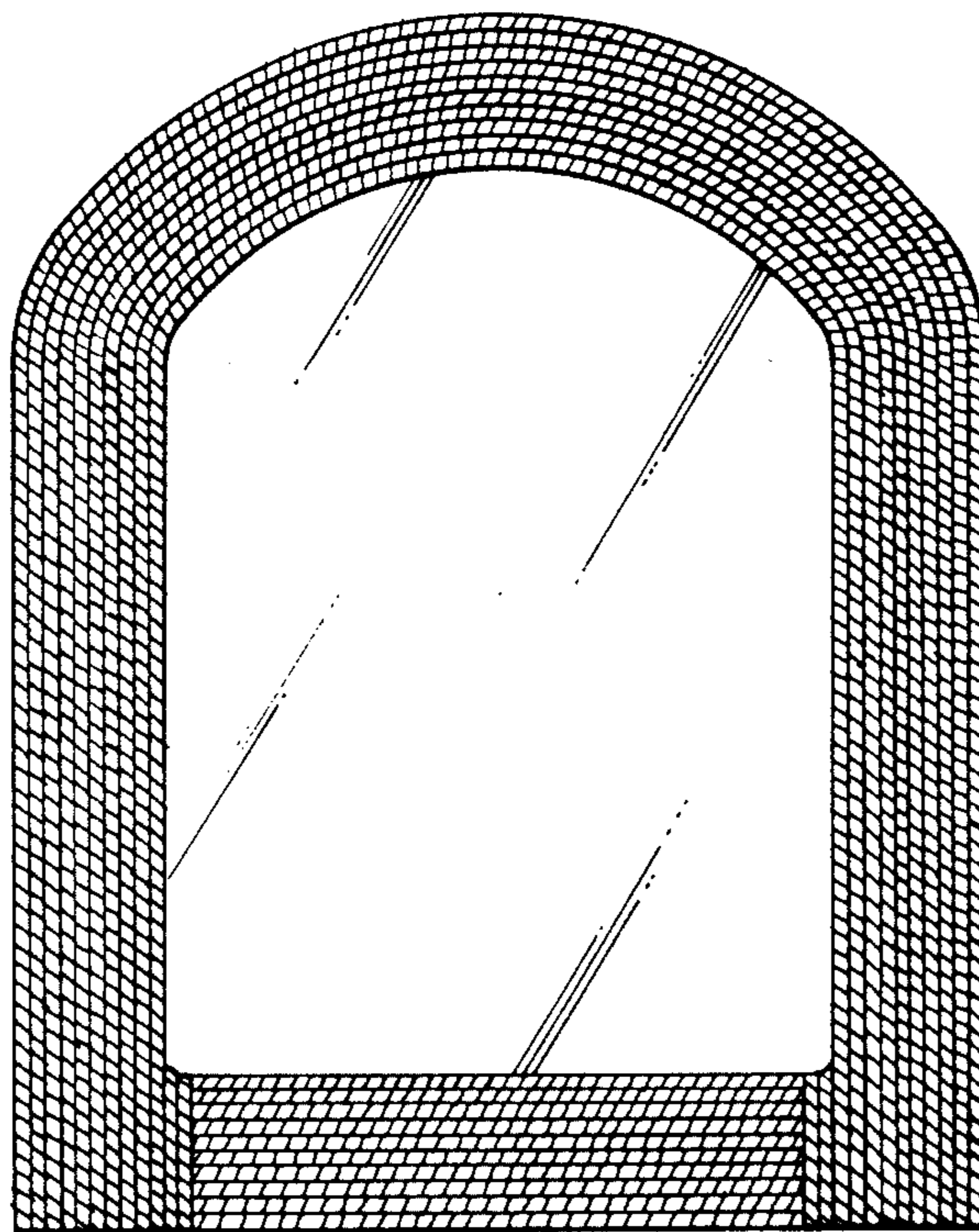
