[57] **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a spoon or similar article of flatware, substantially as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front elevation view of a spoon or similar article of flatware showing my new design;

FIG. 2 is a side elevation view thereof;


FIG. 3 is a rear elevation view thereof;

FIG. 4 is a bottom elevation view thereof;

FIG. 5 is a cross-sectional view taken along section 5—5 of FIG. 1; and

FIG. 6 is a cross-sectional view taken along section 6—6 of FIG. 1

The particular ornamentation on the handle in combination with the handle configuration is intended for use with spoons, forks, and other articles of flatware.




