FIG. 1 is a front perspective view of a seat showing the design in the form of a sofa;

FIG. 2 is a rear elevational view of the sofa shown in FIG. 1;

FIG. 3 is a front perspective view of the design shown in the form of a loveseat; and

FIG. 4 is a front perspective view of the design in the form of an armchair.
