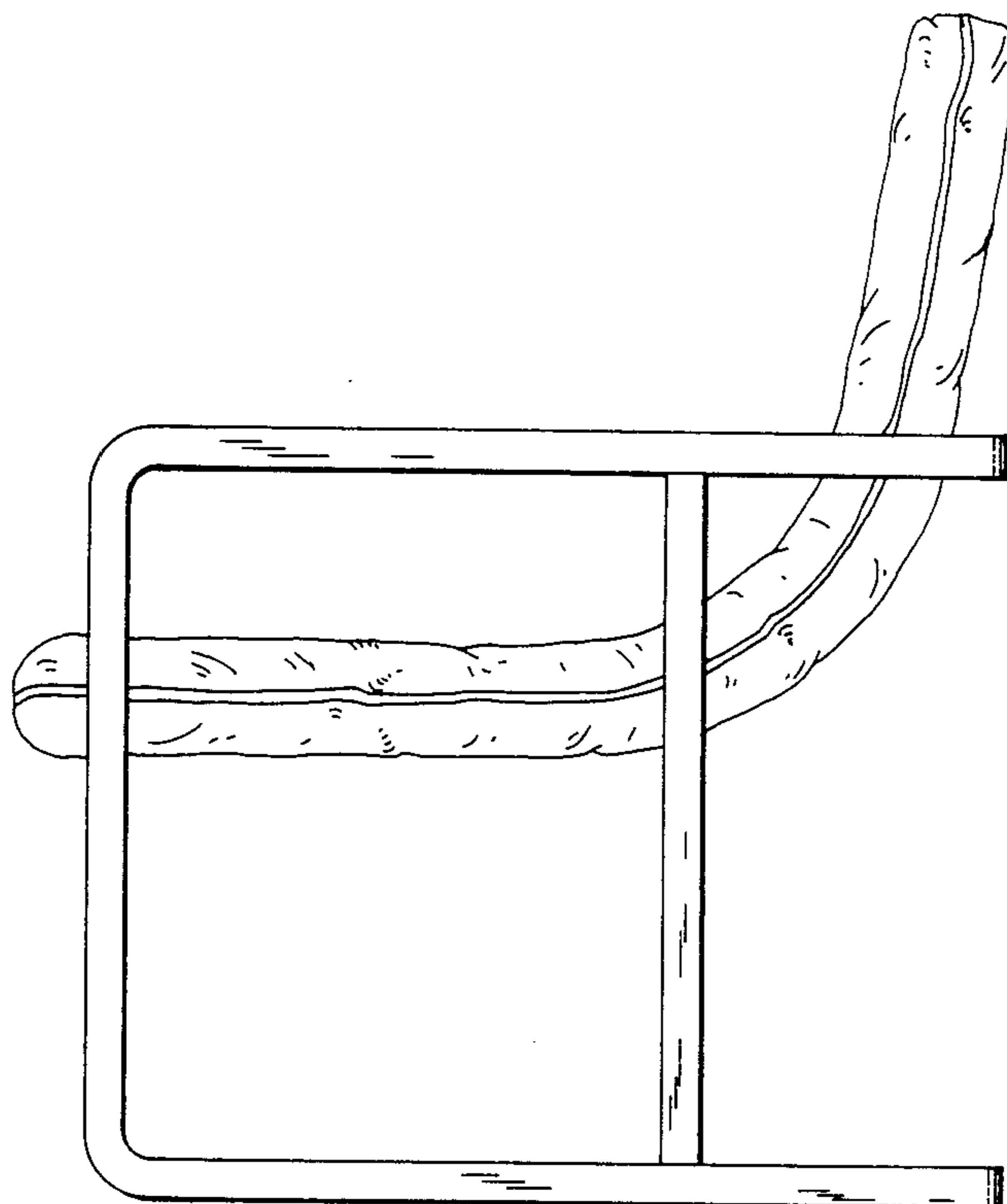

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is side elevation view of a chair showing my new design, the undisclosed side being substantially identical with the side shown;
 FIG. 2 is a front elevation view thereof;
 FIG. 3 is a rear elevation view of my new design;
 FIG. 4 is a top view of my new design;
 FIG. 5 is an enlarged cross-section taken on line 5—5 of FIG. 2;
 FIG. 6 is a cross-section taken on line 6—6 of FIG. 2;
 FIG. 7 is a second embodiment of FIG. 1;
 FIG. 8 is a third embodiment of FIG. 1;
 FIG. 9 is a fourth embodiment of FIG. 1;
 FIG. 10 is a fifth embodiment of FIG. 1.



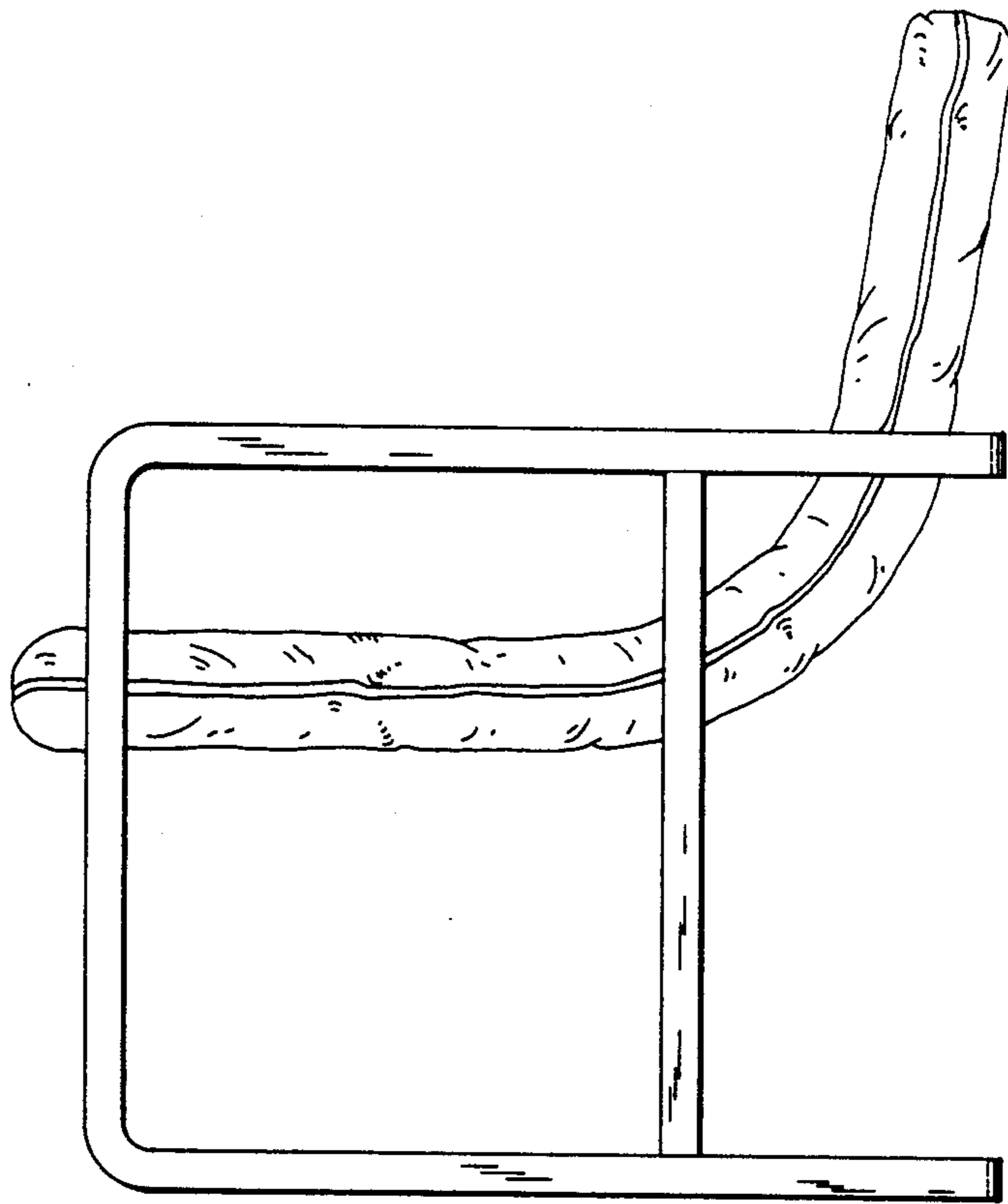

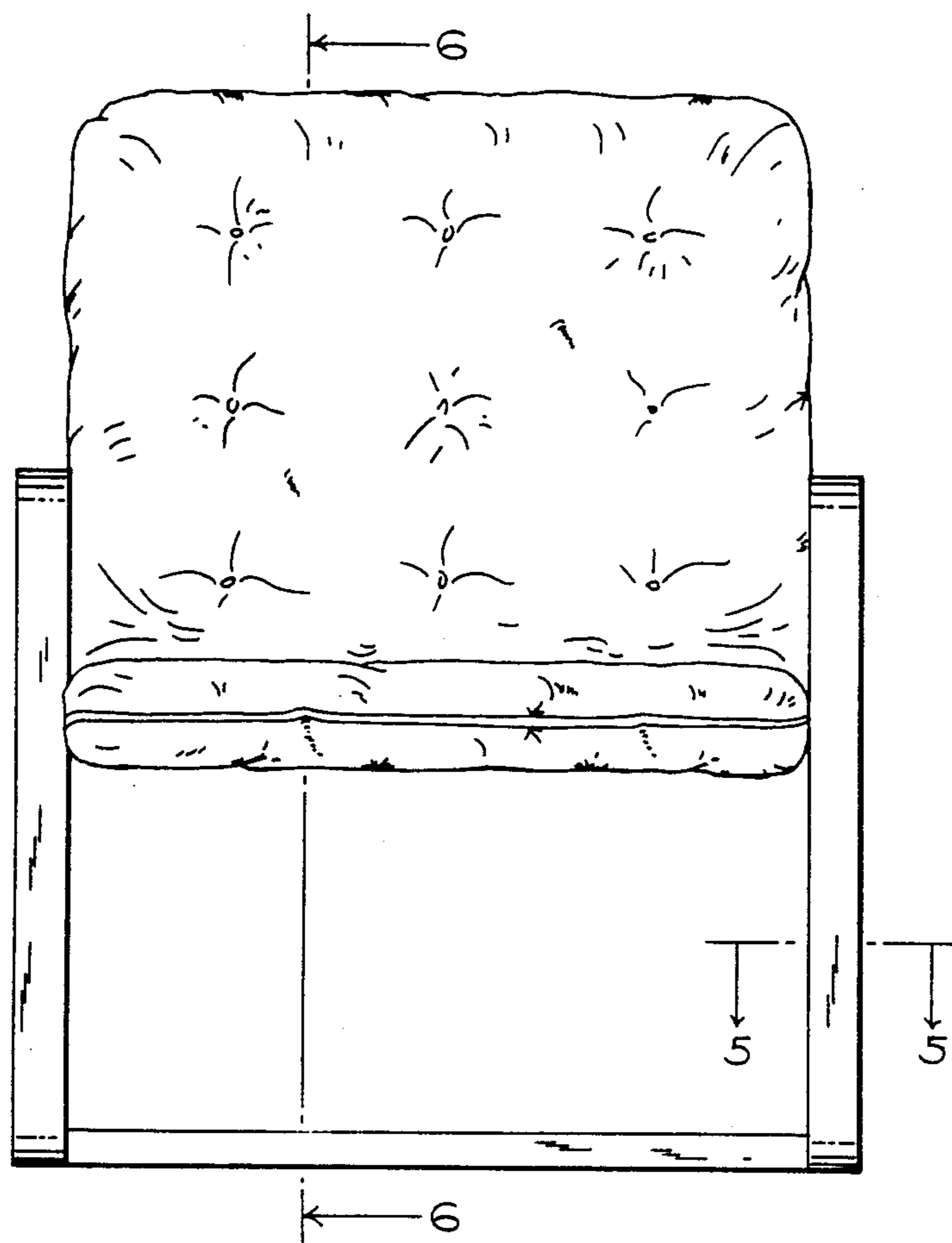

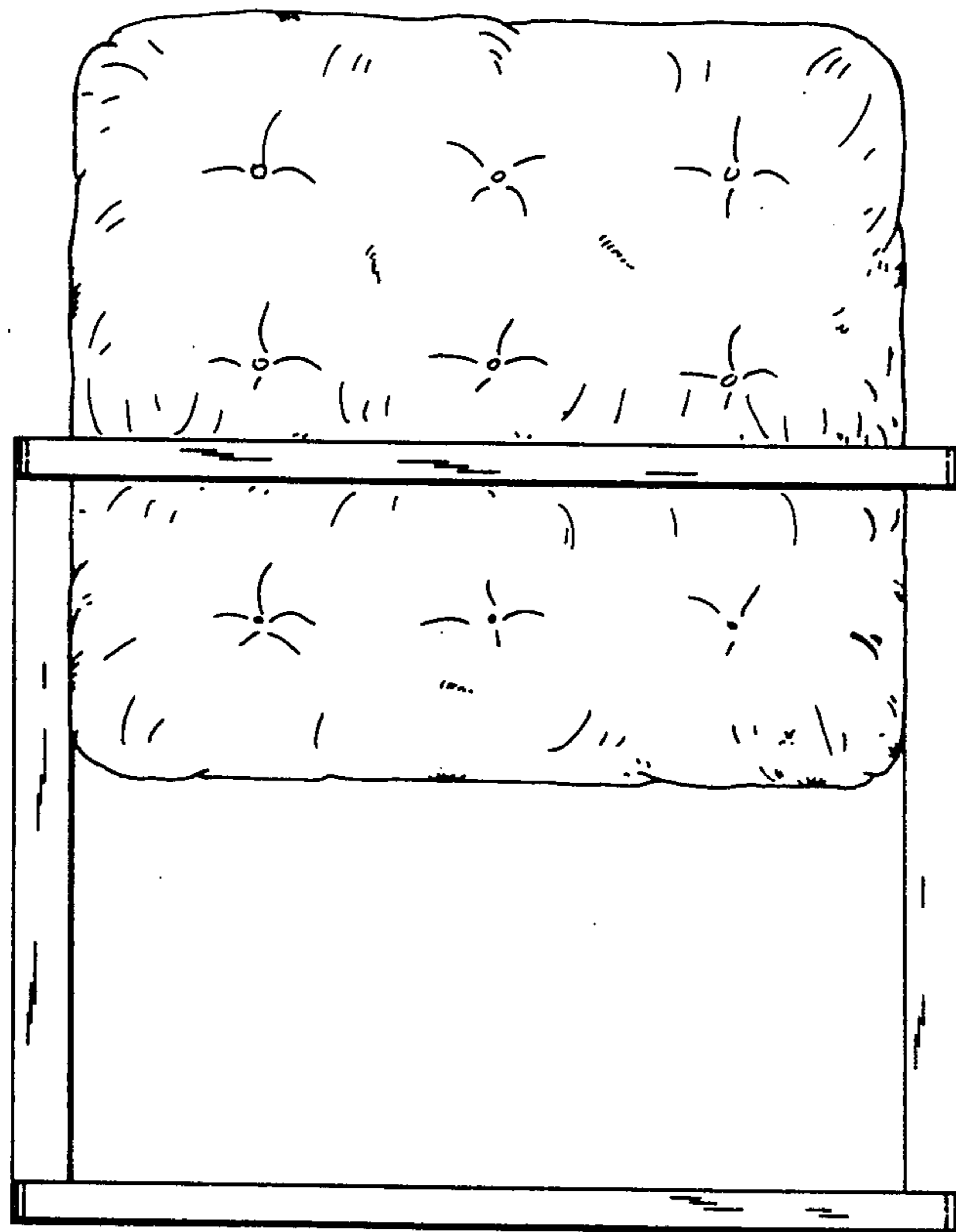

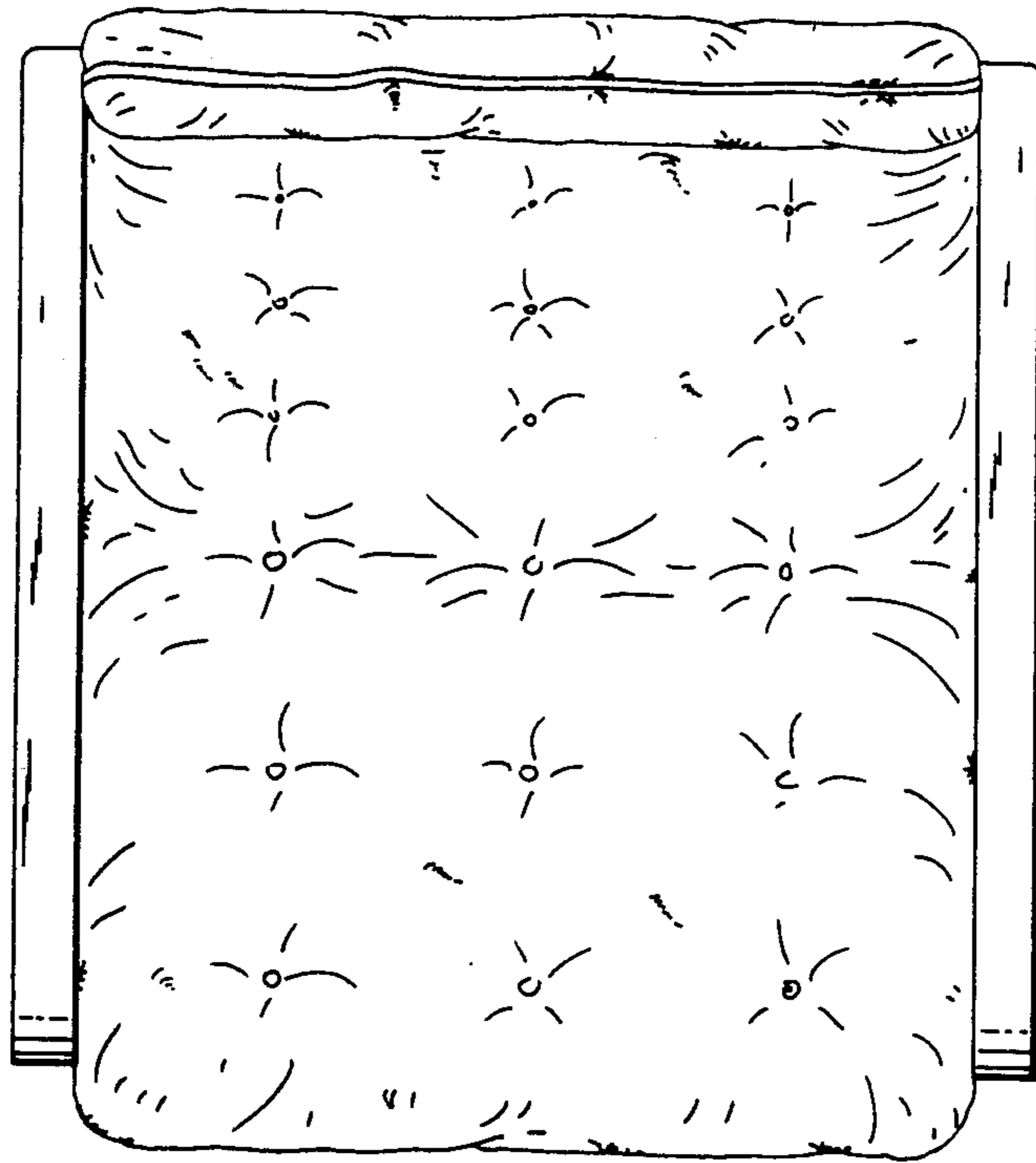

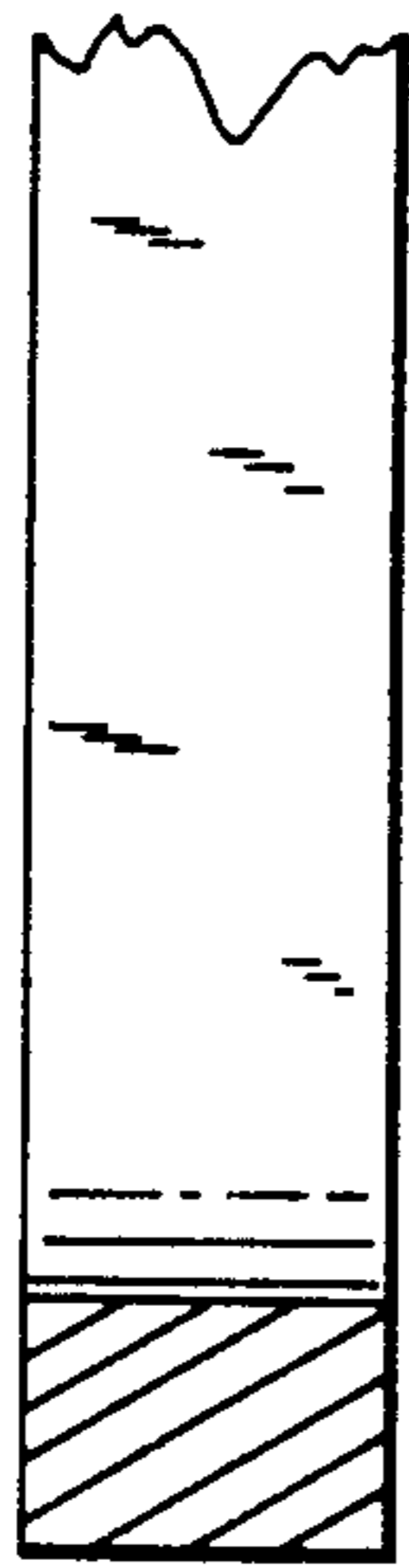

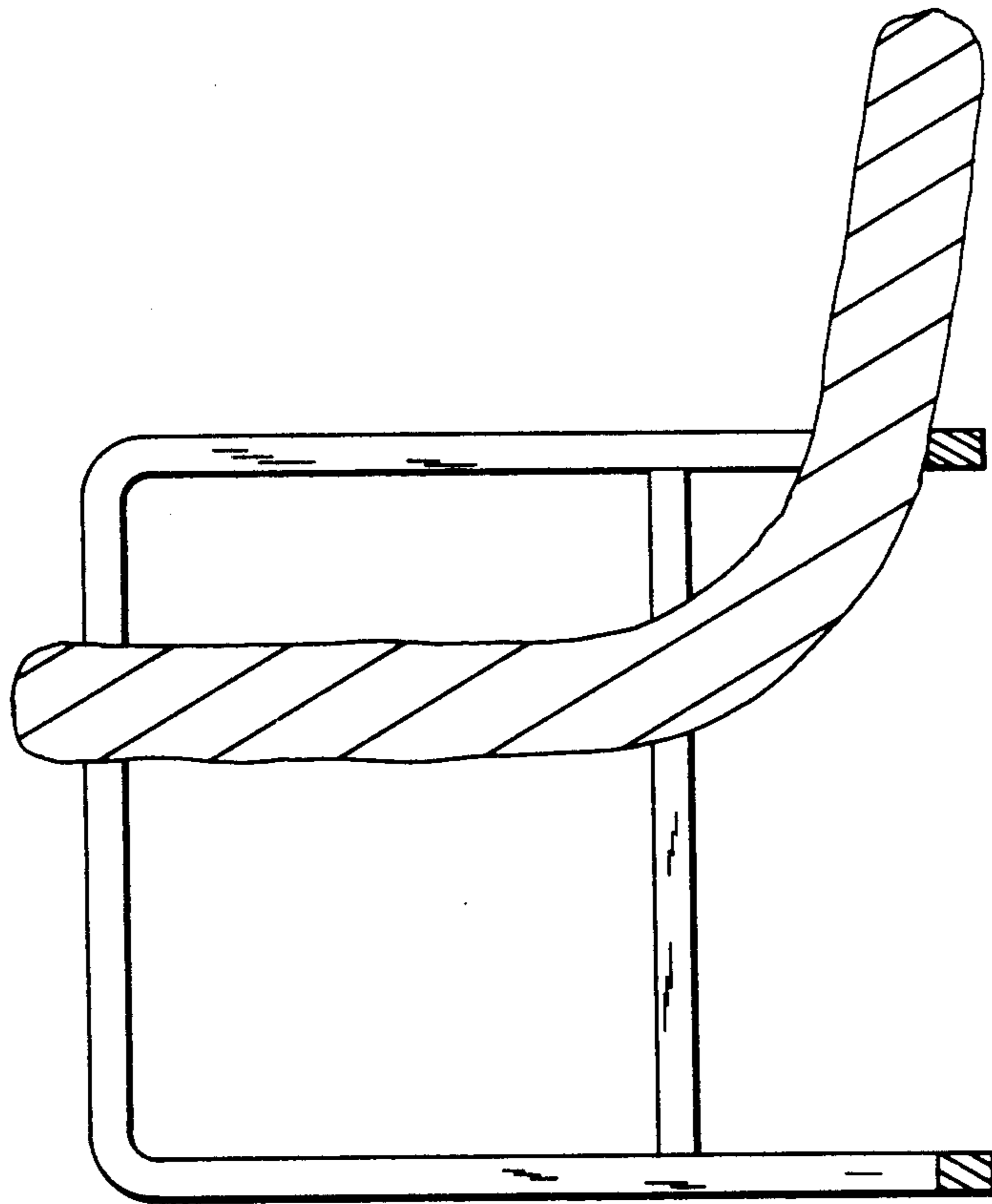

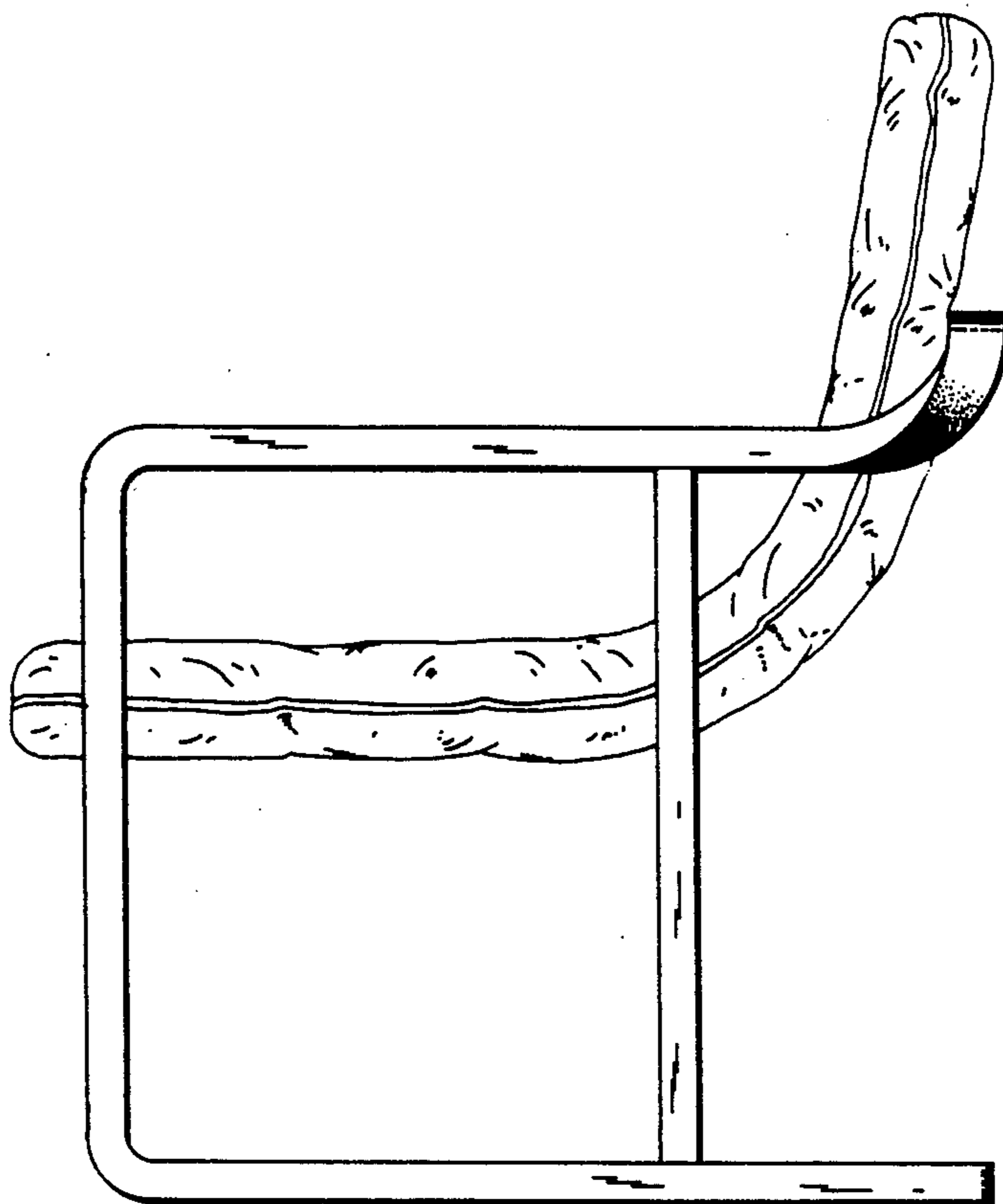

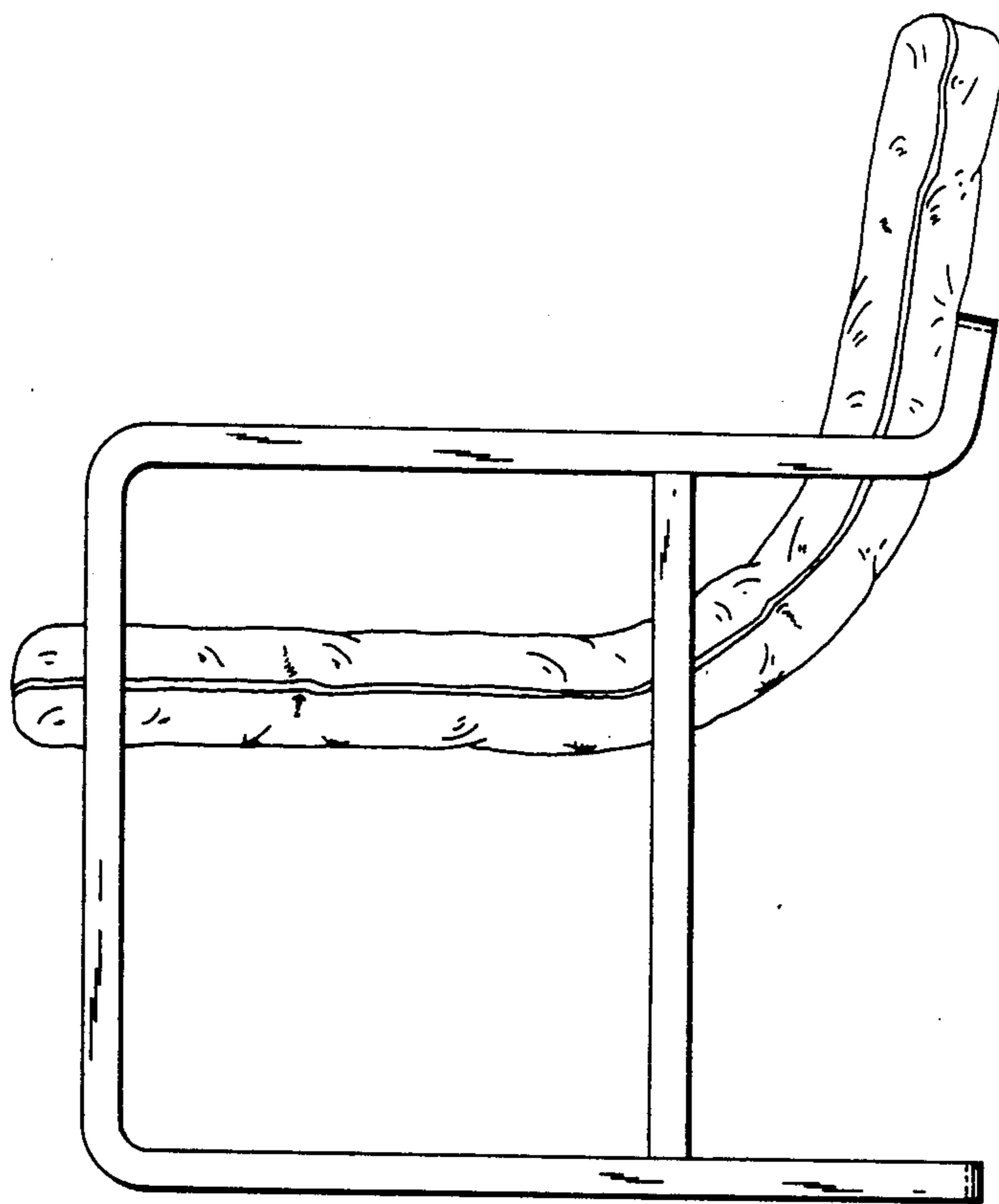

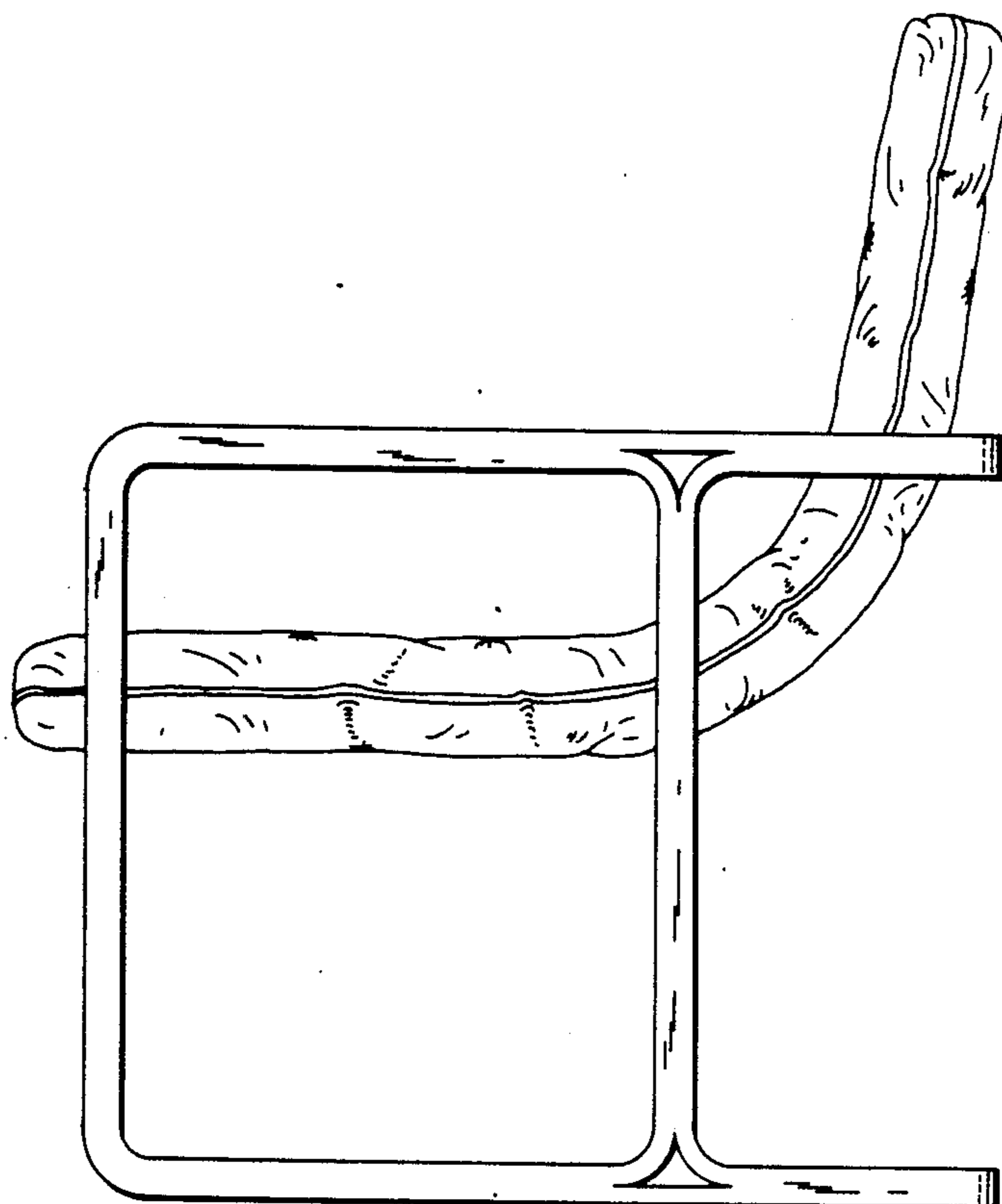

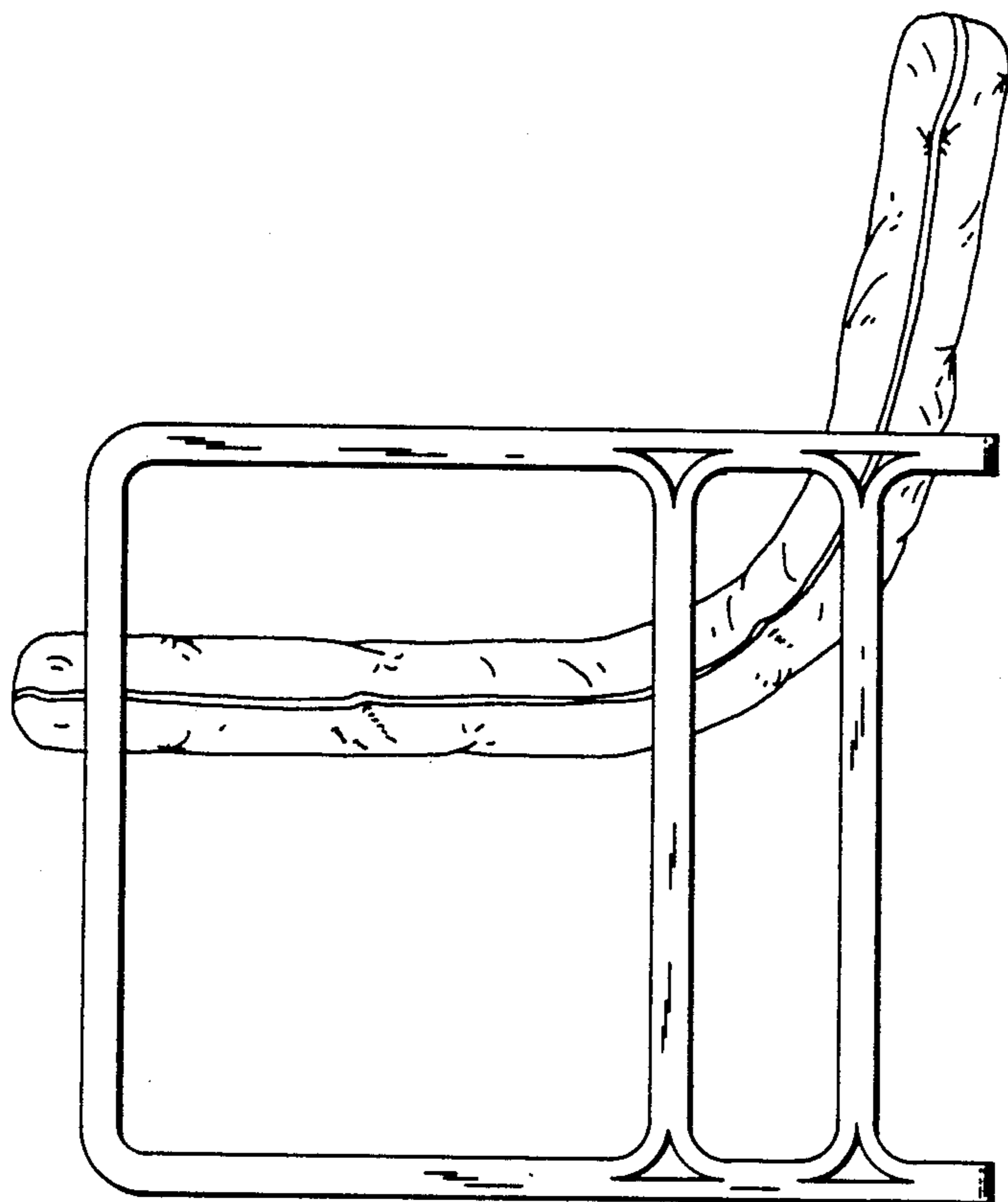
