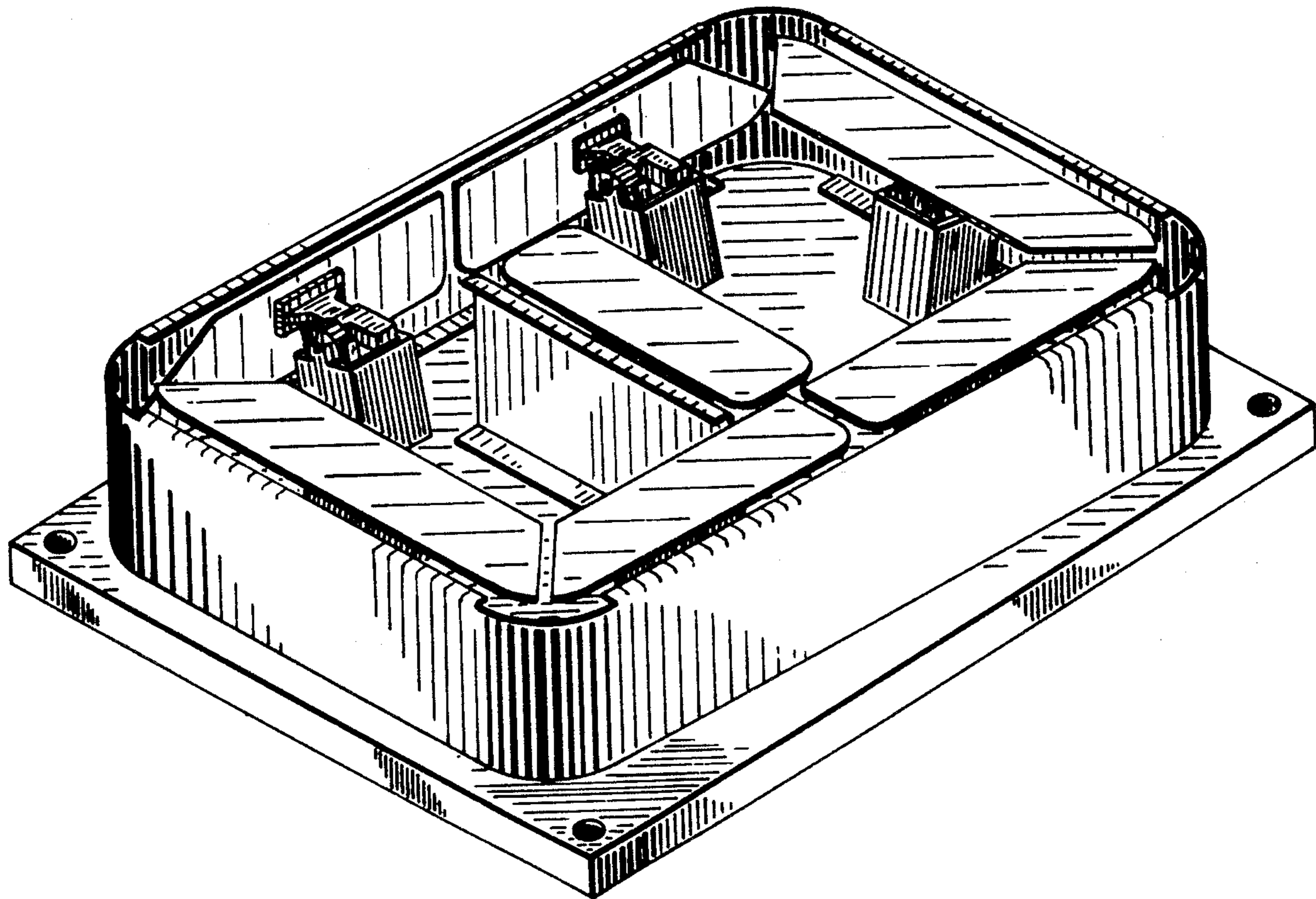

The bottom view (not shown) is planar.



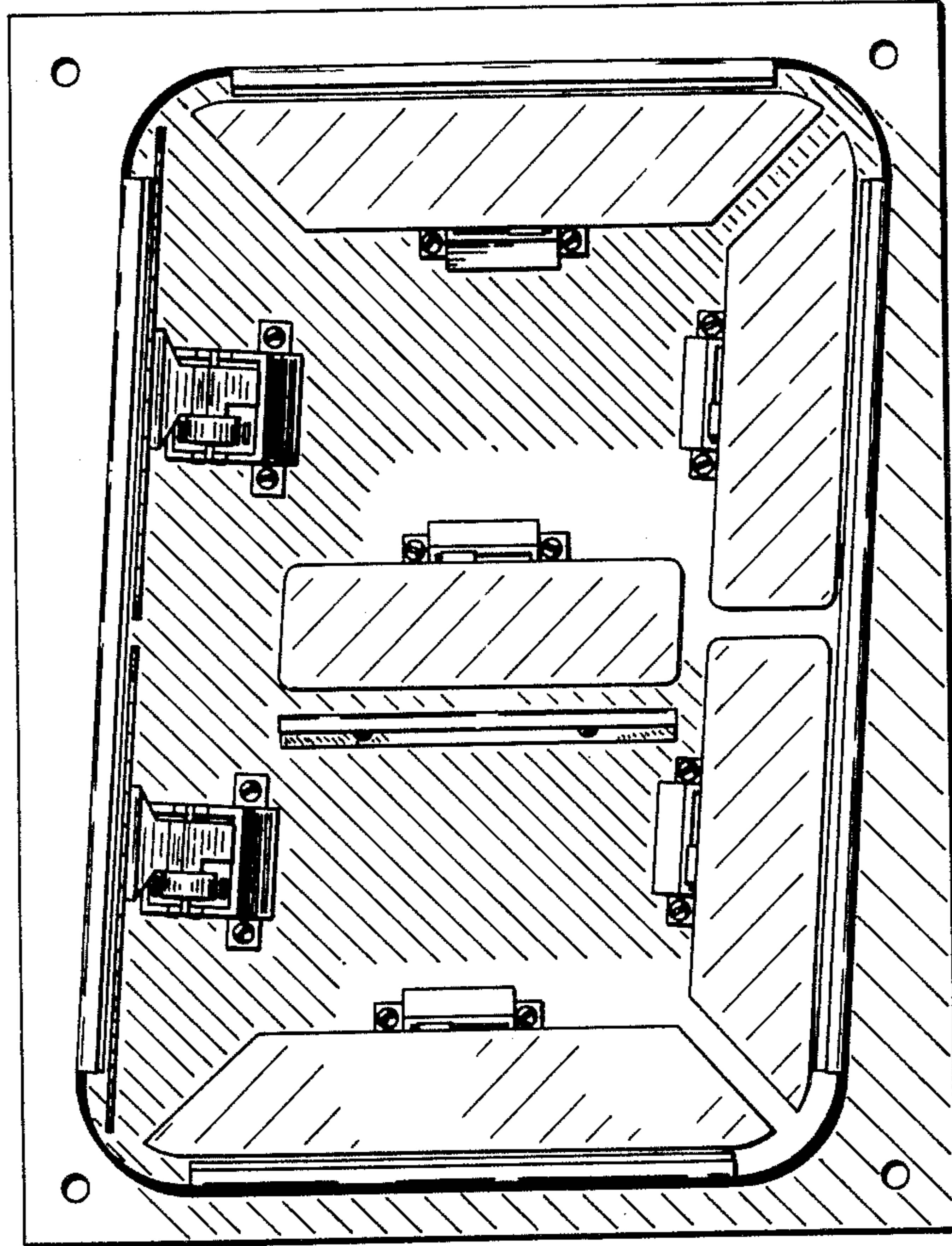

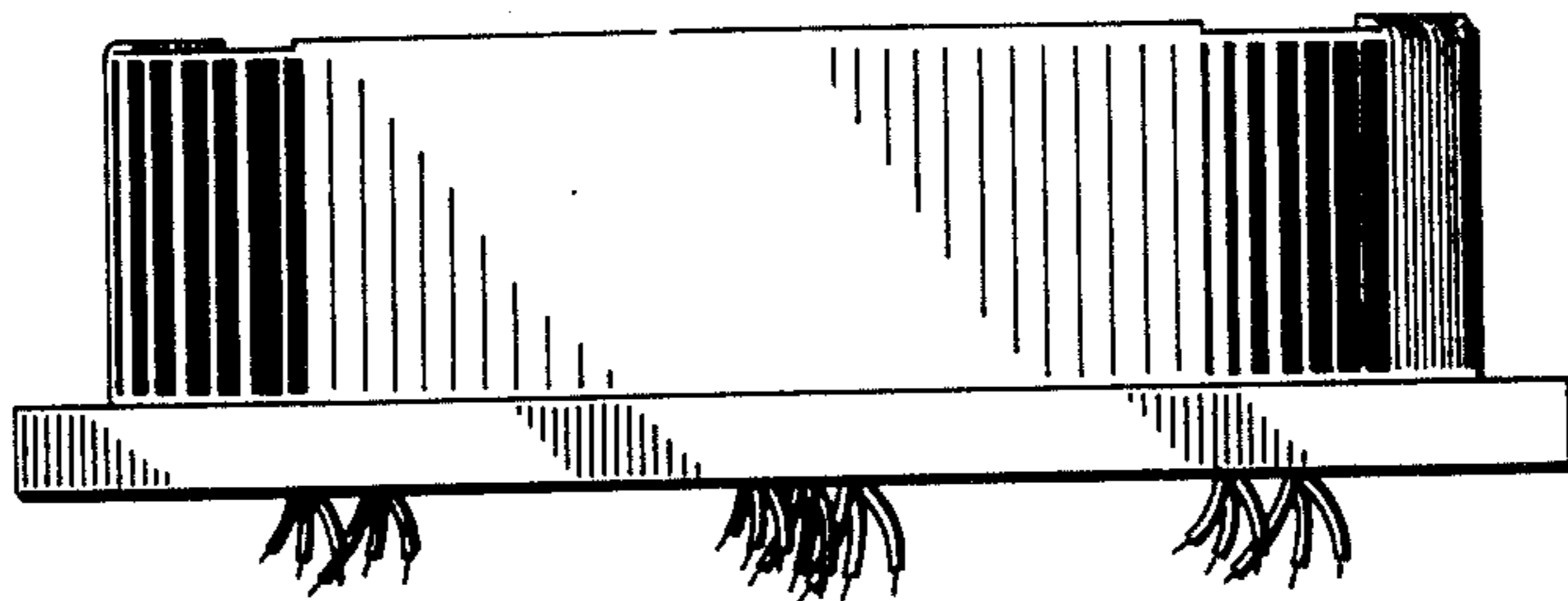

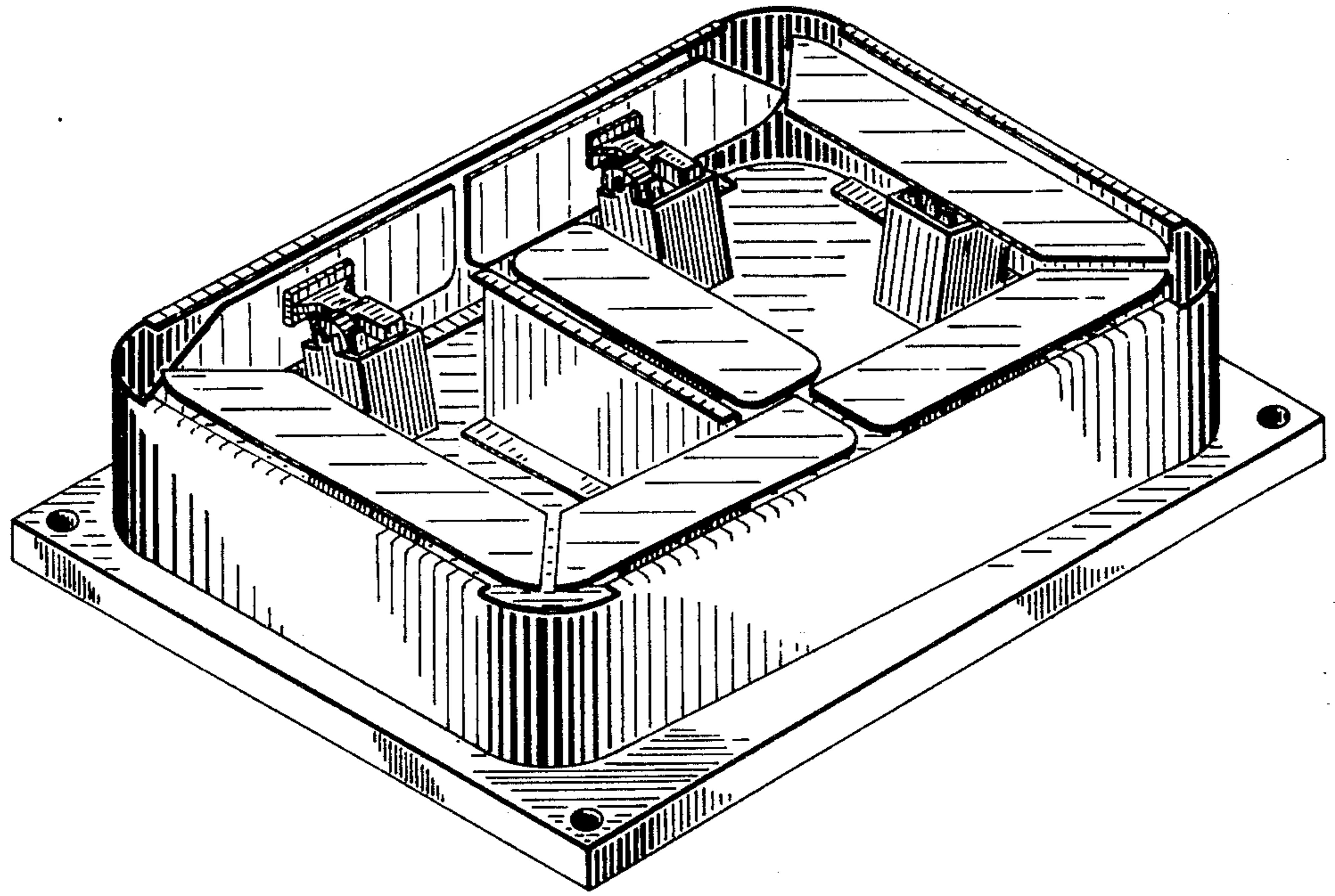

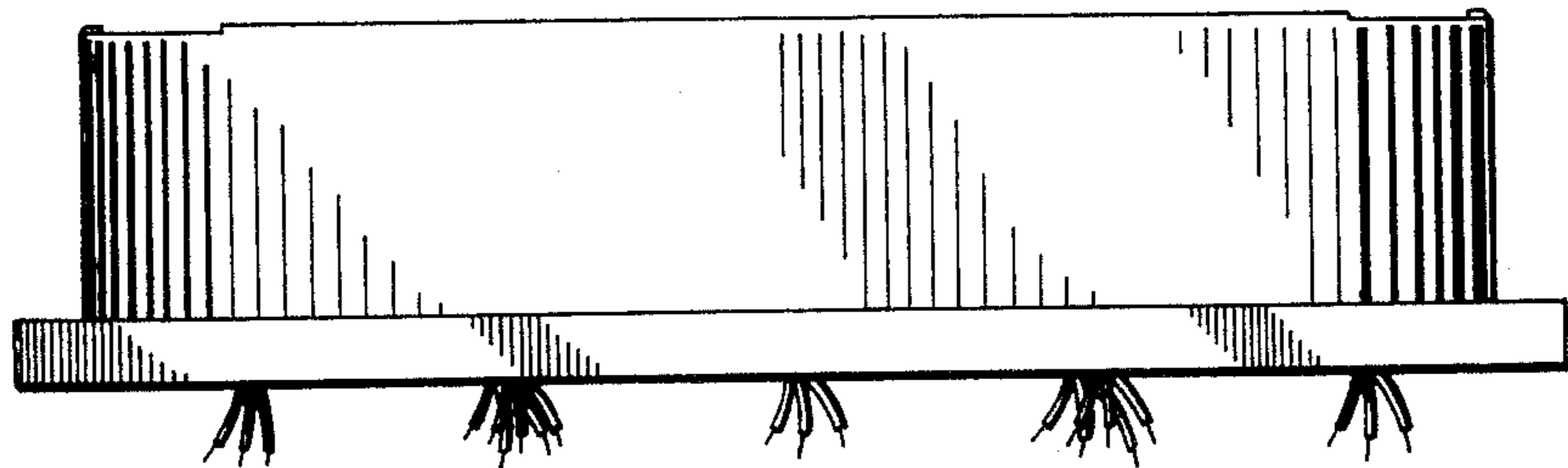
