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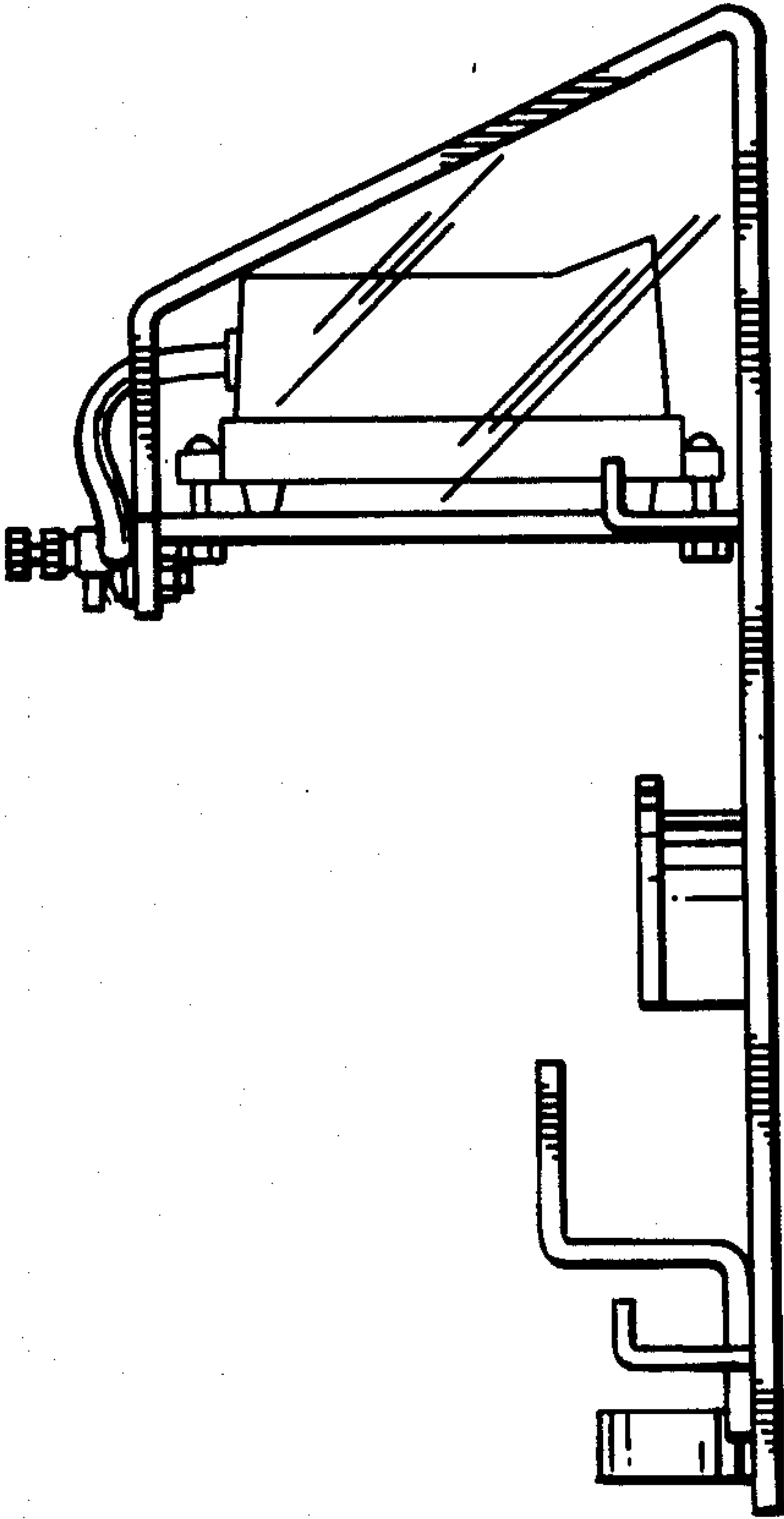
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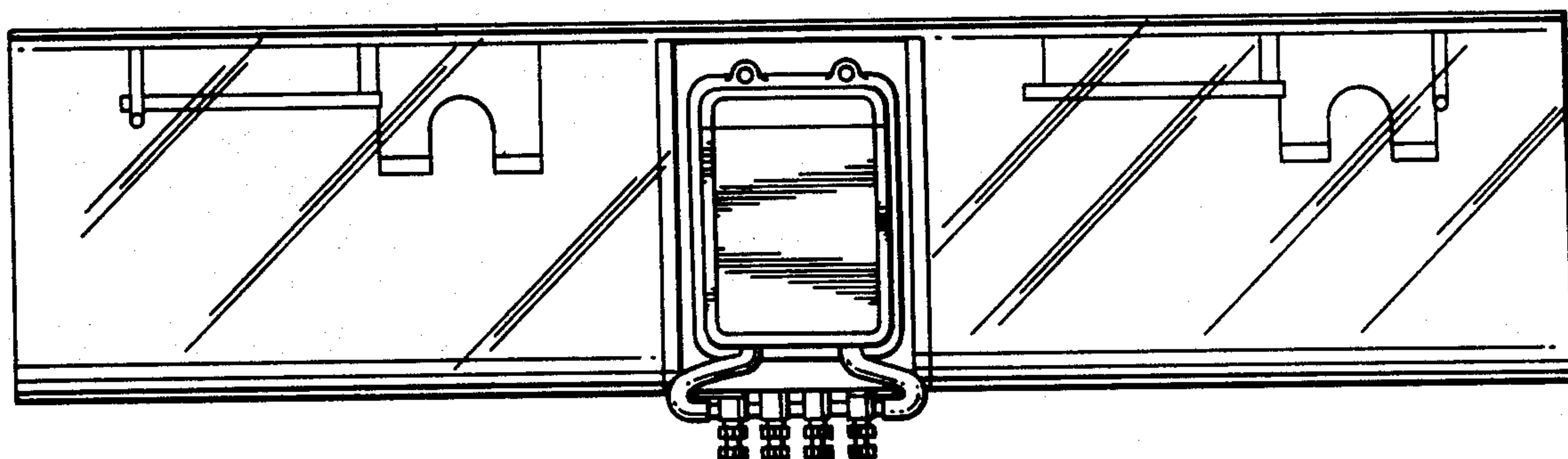
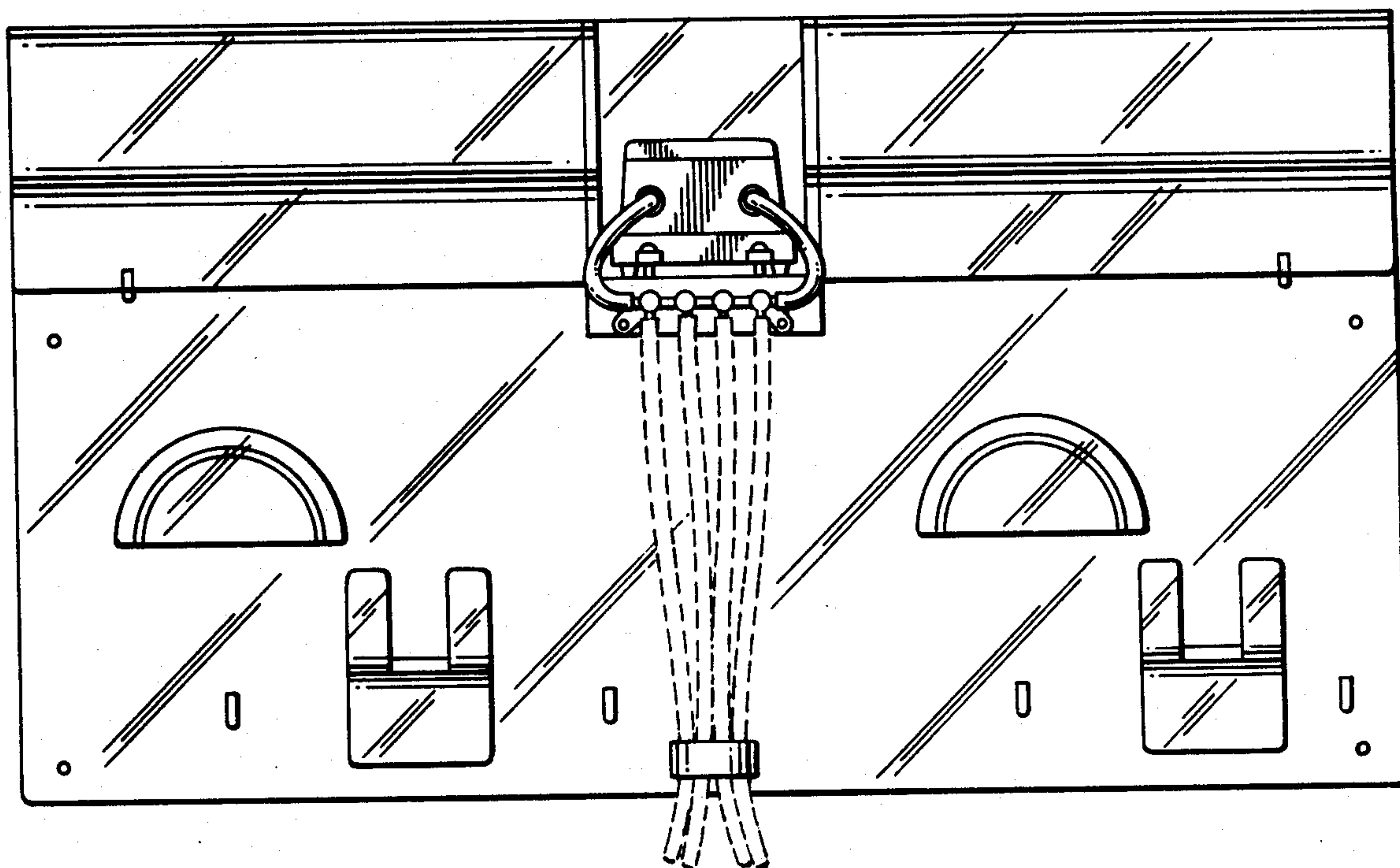
[57] **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a combined rack and air drying unit for fiberoptic scopes or the like, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a top elevational view of the combined rack and air drying unit for fiberoptic scopes or the like showing my new design;
FIG. 2 is a front elevational view thereof, the four lengths of tubing being shown in broken lines for illustrative purposes only;
FIG. 3 is an end elevation thereof.
The rear of the combined rack and air drying unit for fiberoptic scopes or the like is flat and unornamented.

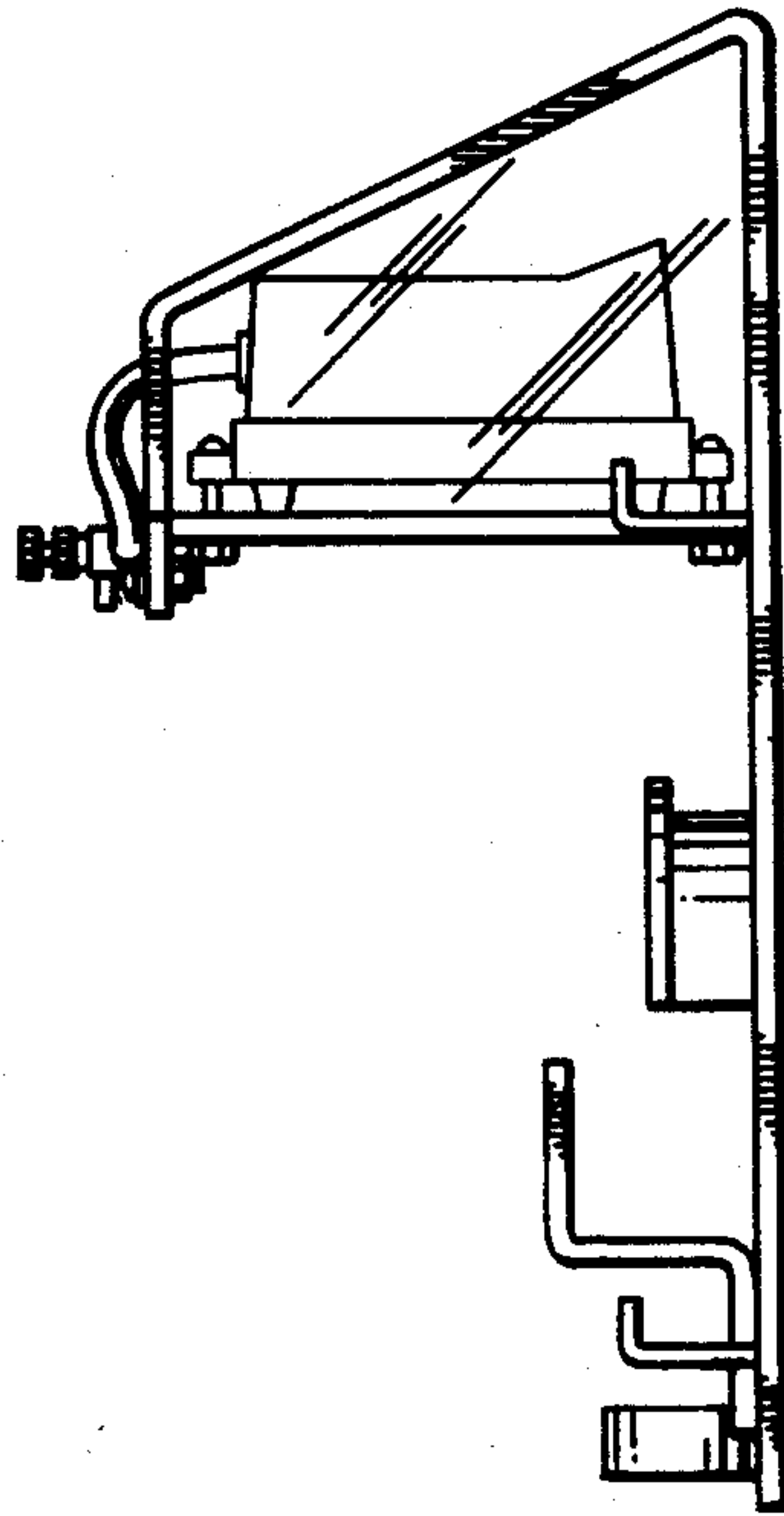
