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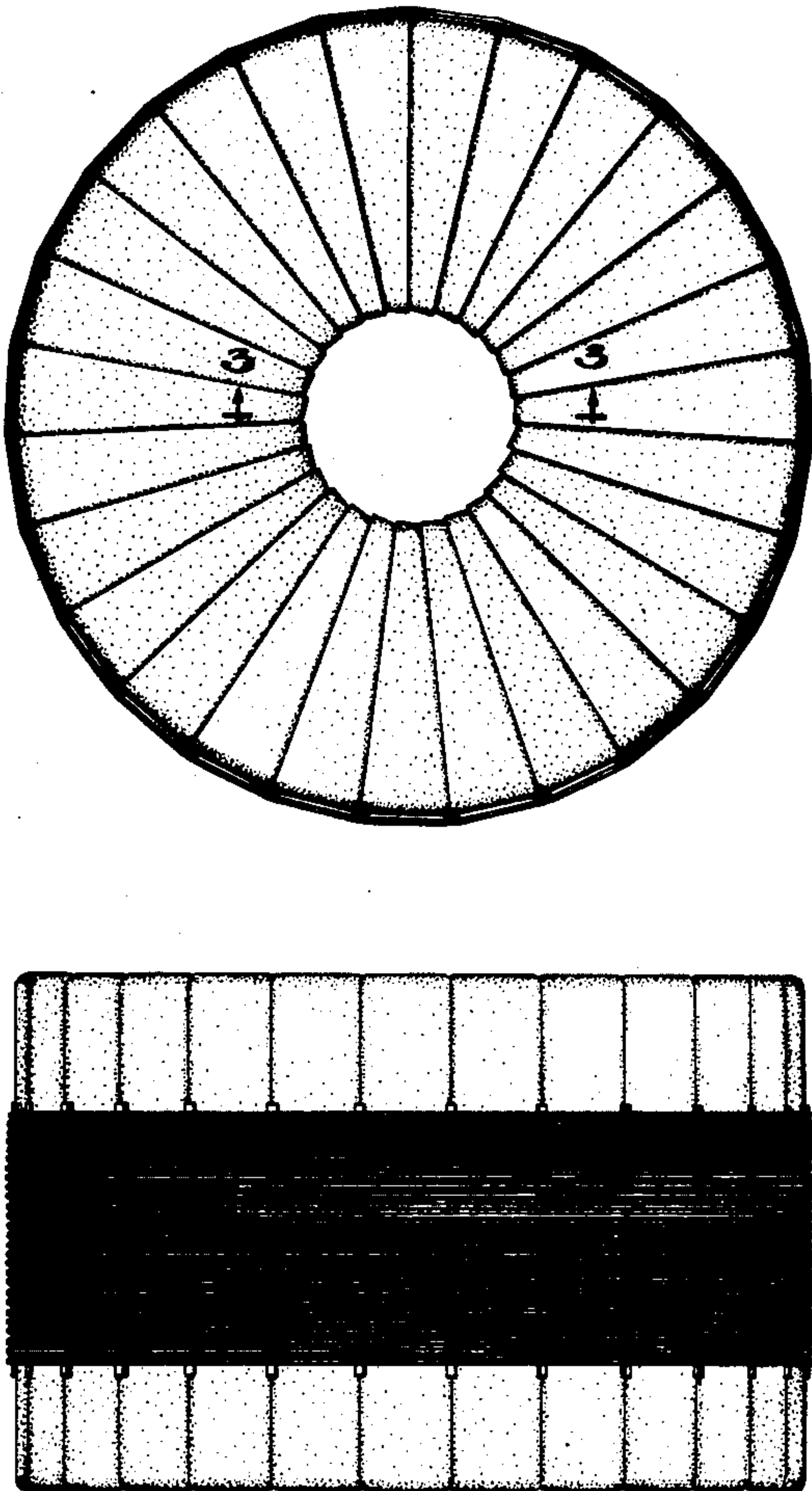
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[57] CLAIM

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a top plan view showing my new design for an electrostatic radiator;
FIG. 2 is a side elevational view thereof; and
FIG. 3 is a fragmentary sectional view taken along lines 3—3 of FIG. 1 showing the exposed central opening.



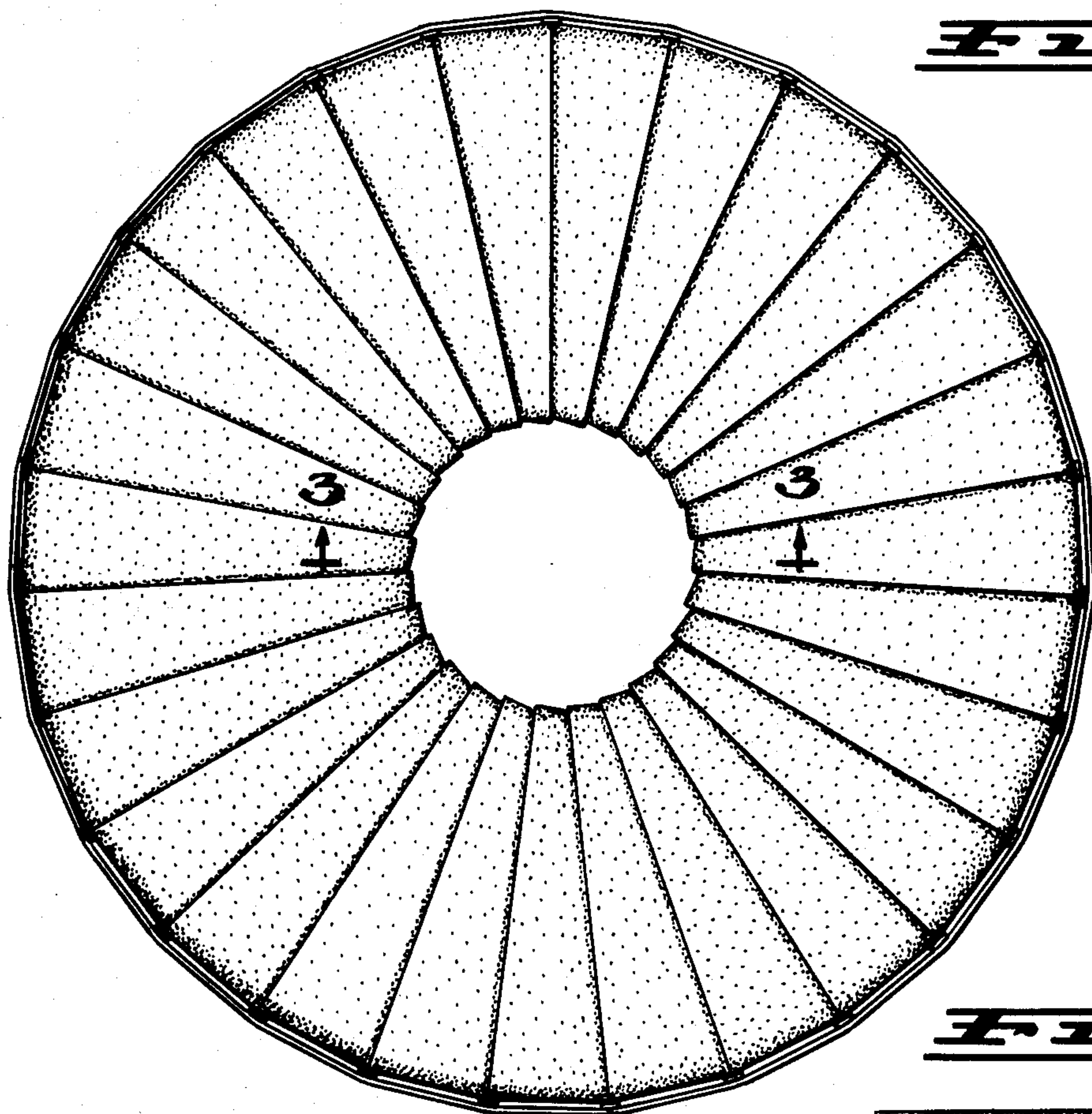

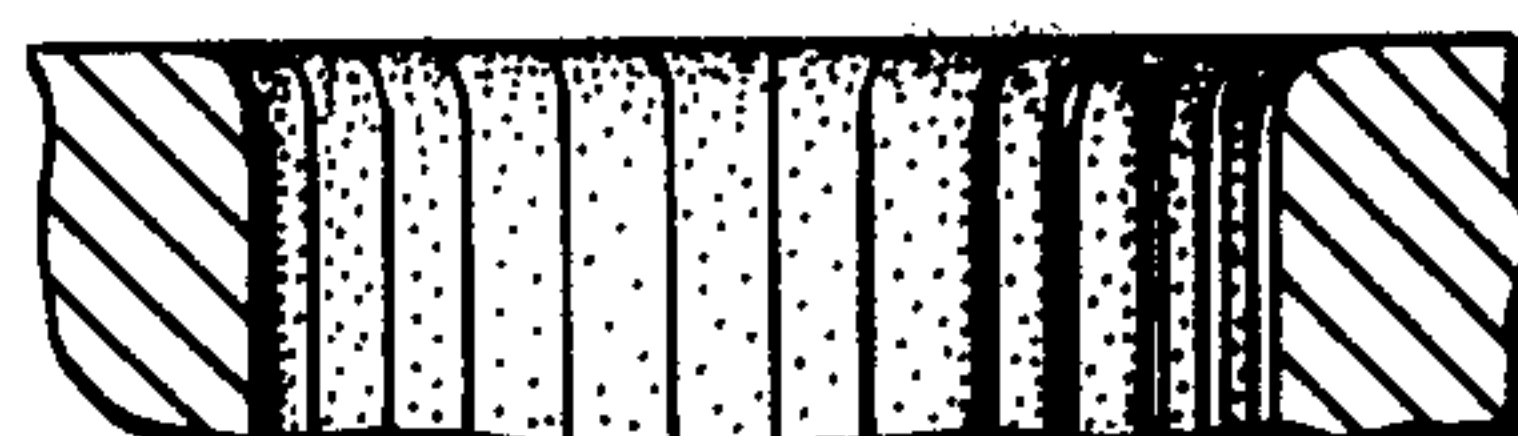
