DESCRIPTION

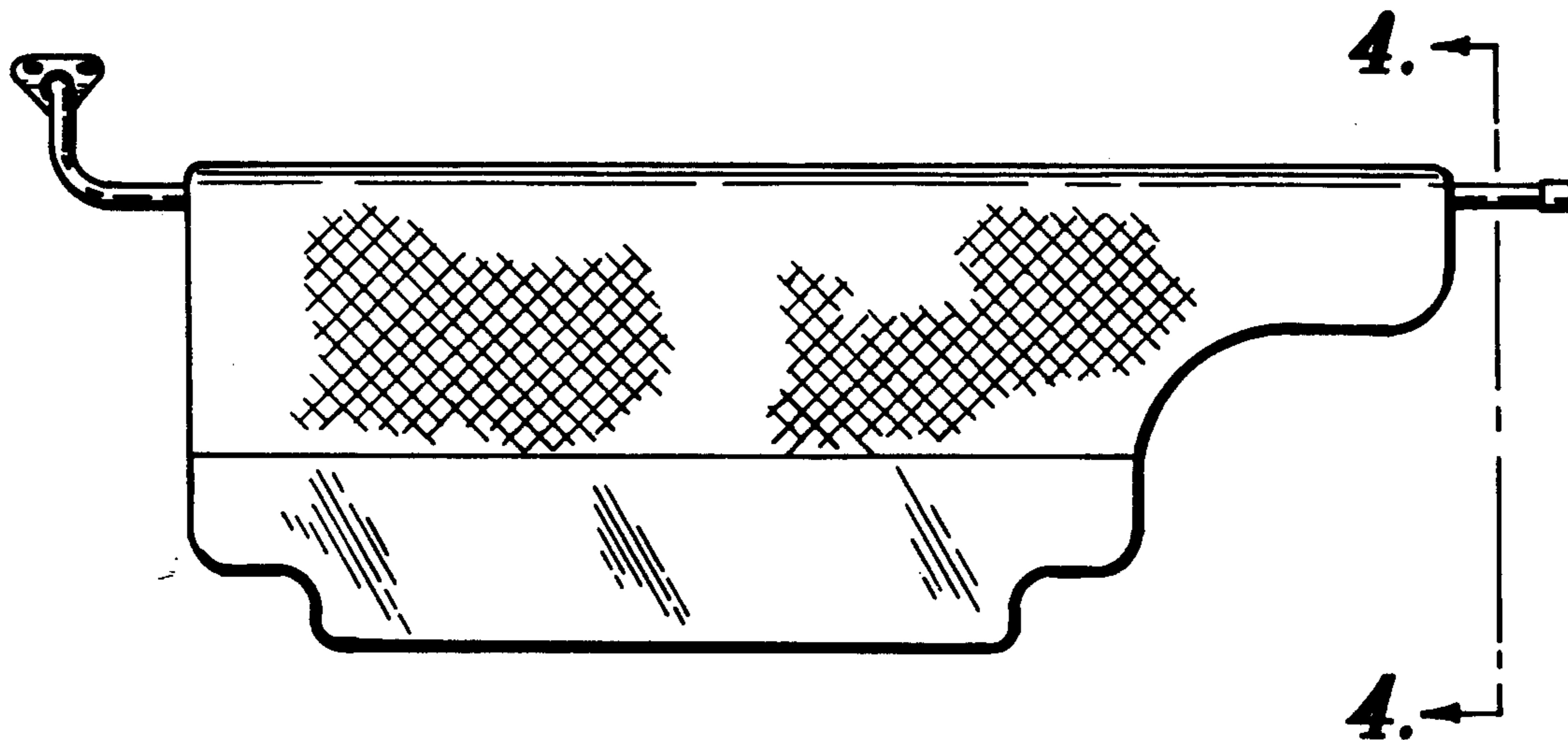
FIG. 1 is a front elevational view of a sun-visor for vehicles embodying my design.

FIG. 2 is a rear elevational view thereof.

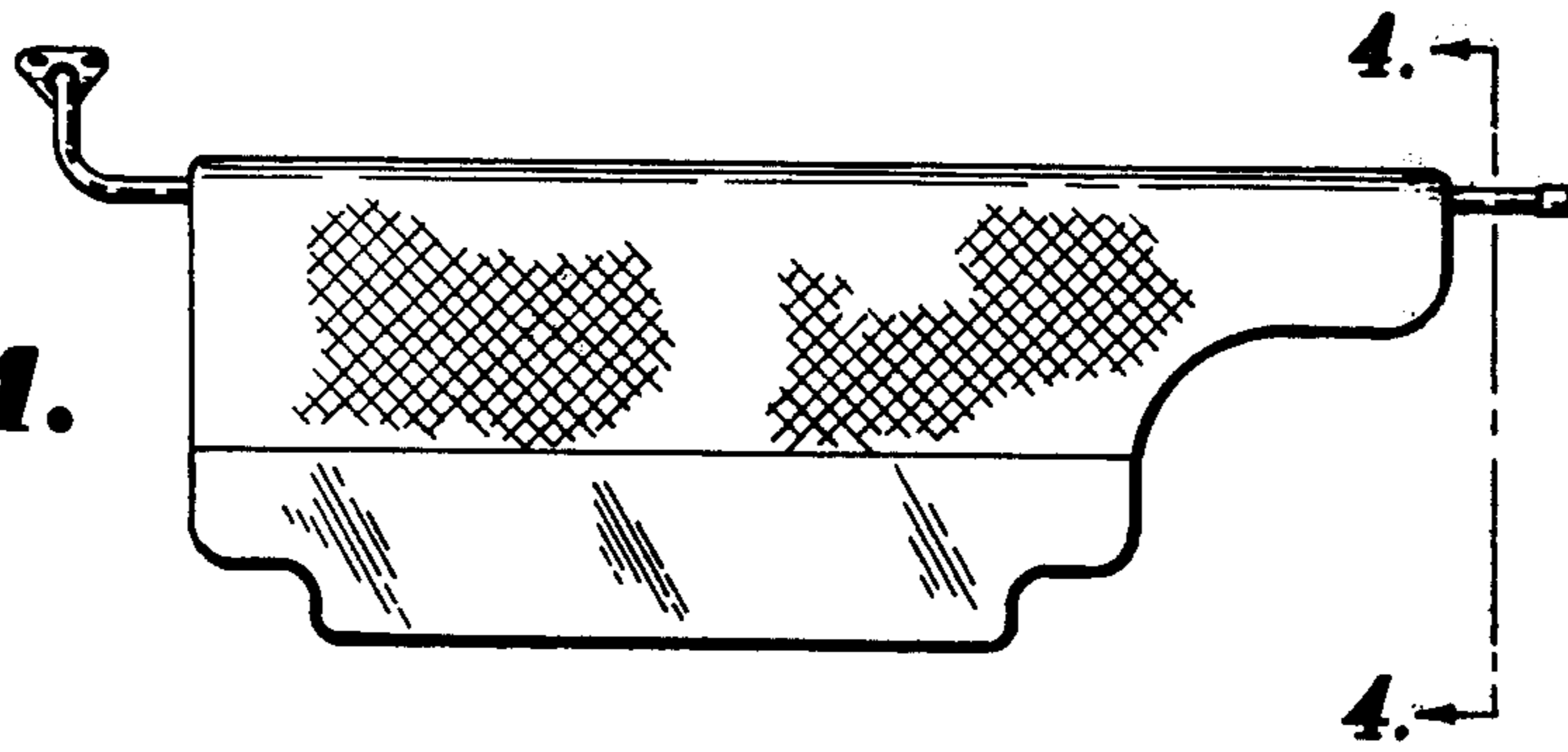
FIG. 3 is a cross-sectional view thereof taken along line 3—3, in FIG. 2.

FIG. 4 is a cross-sectional view thereof taken along line 4—4, in FIG. 1.

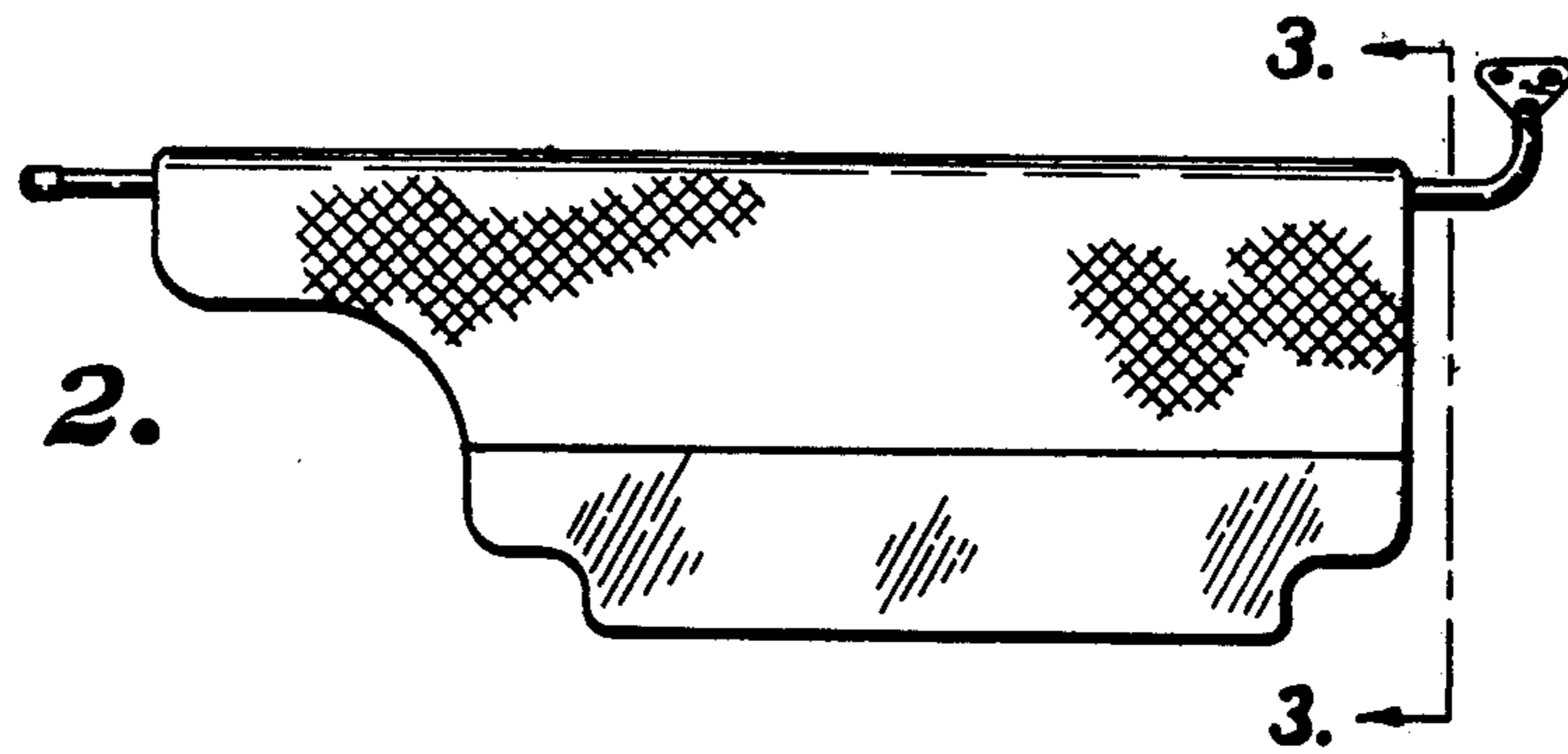
