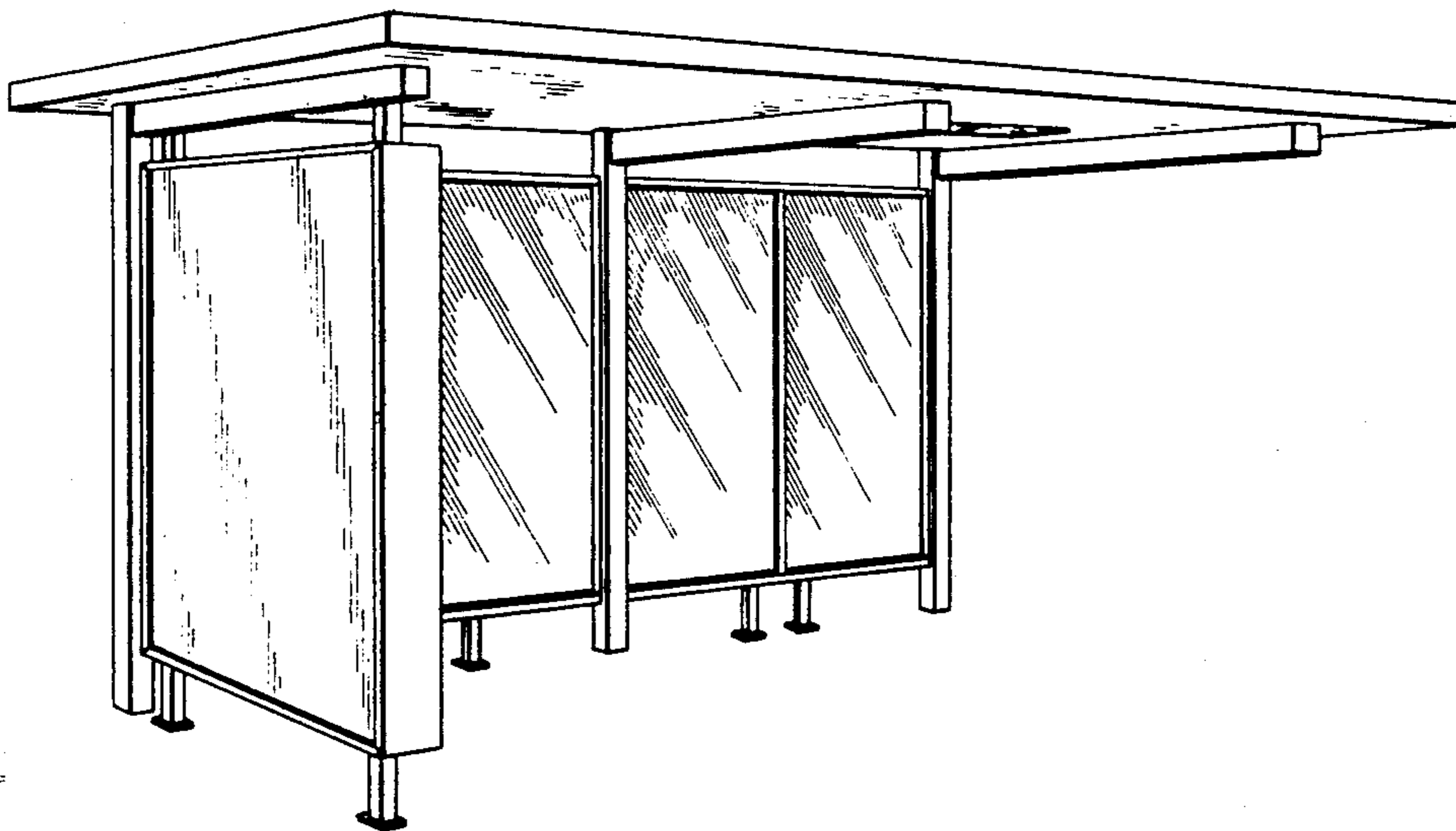

The ornamental design for a bus stop shelter, as shown.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of the bus stop shelter;
FIG. 2 is a front elevational view of the shelter;
FIG. 3 is a rear elevational view of the shelter;
FIG. 4 is an elevational view of the left end of the shelter shown in FIG. 1;
FIG. 5 is an elevational view of the right end of the shelter shown in FIG. 1;
FIG. 6 is a top view of the shelter; and
FIG. 7 is a bottom view of the shelter.



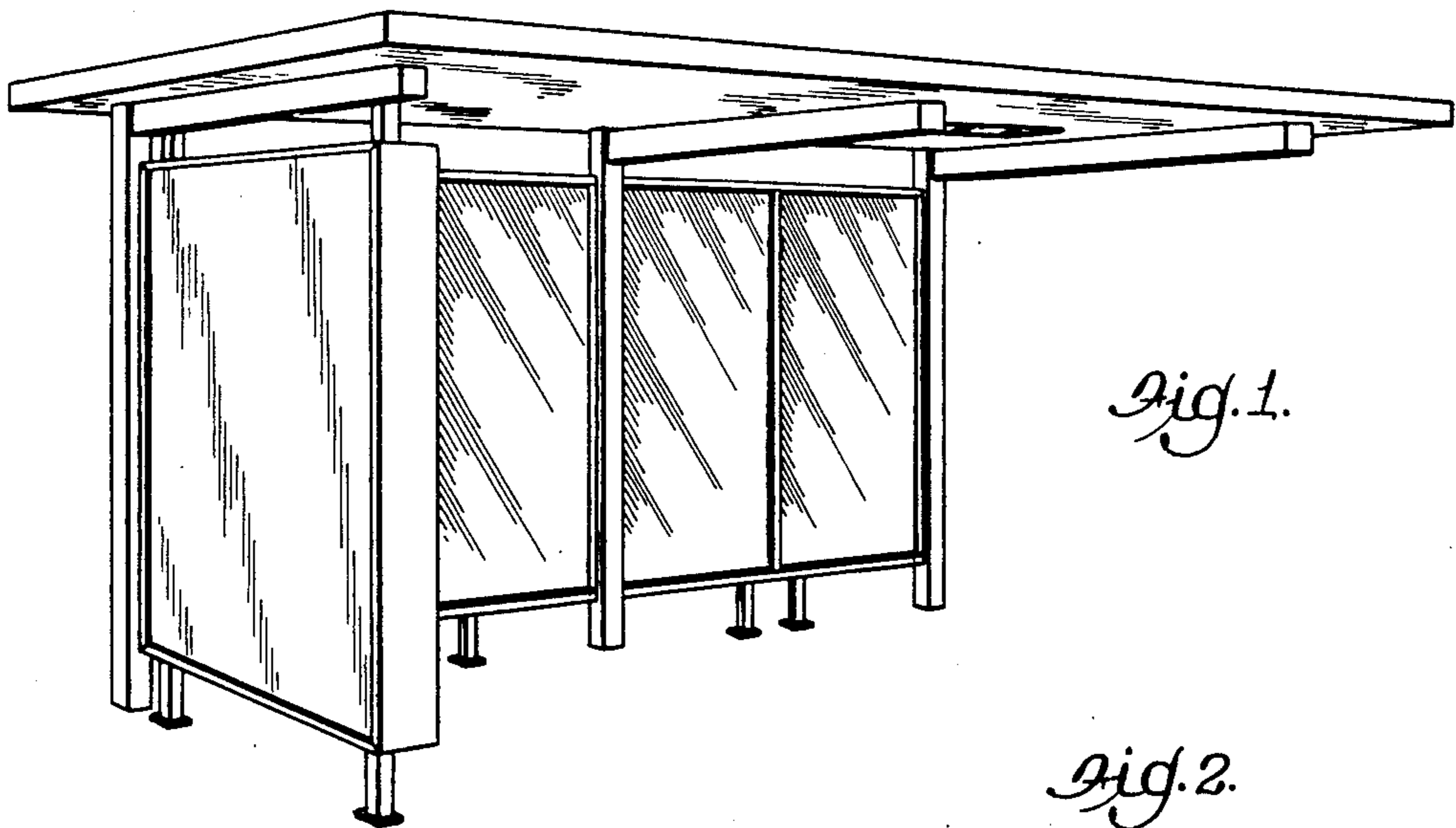

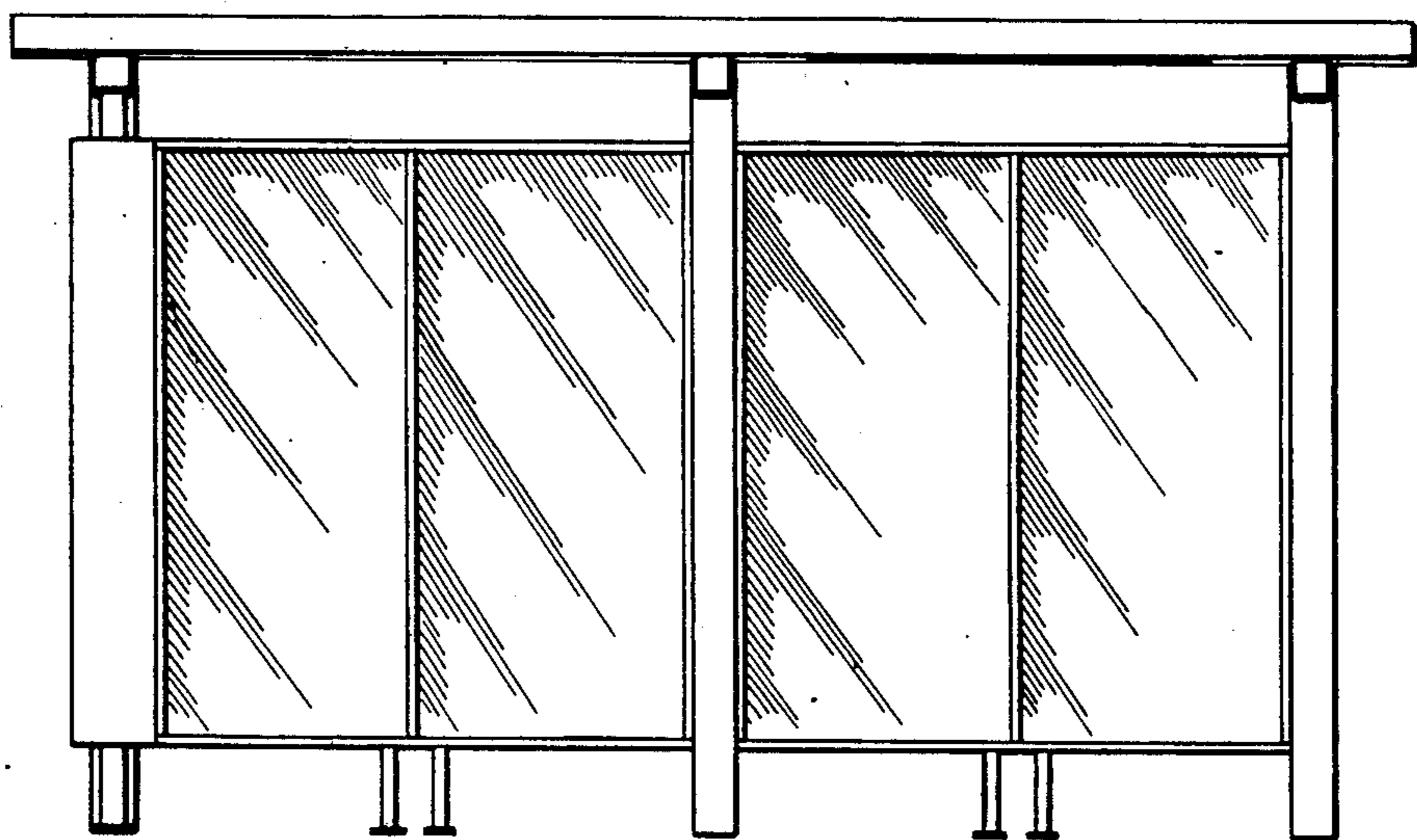

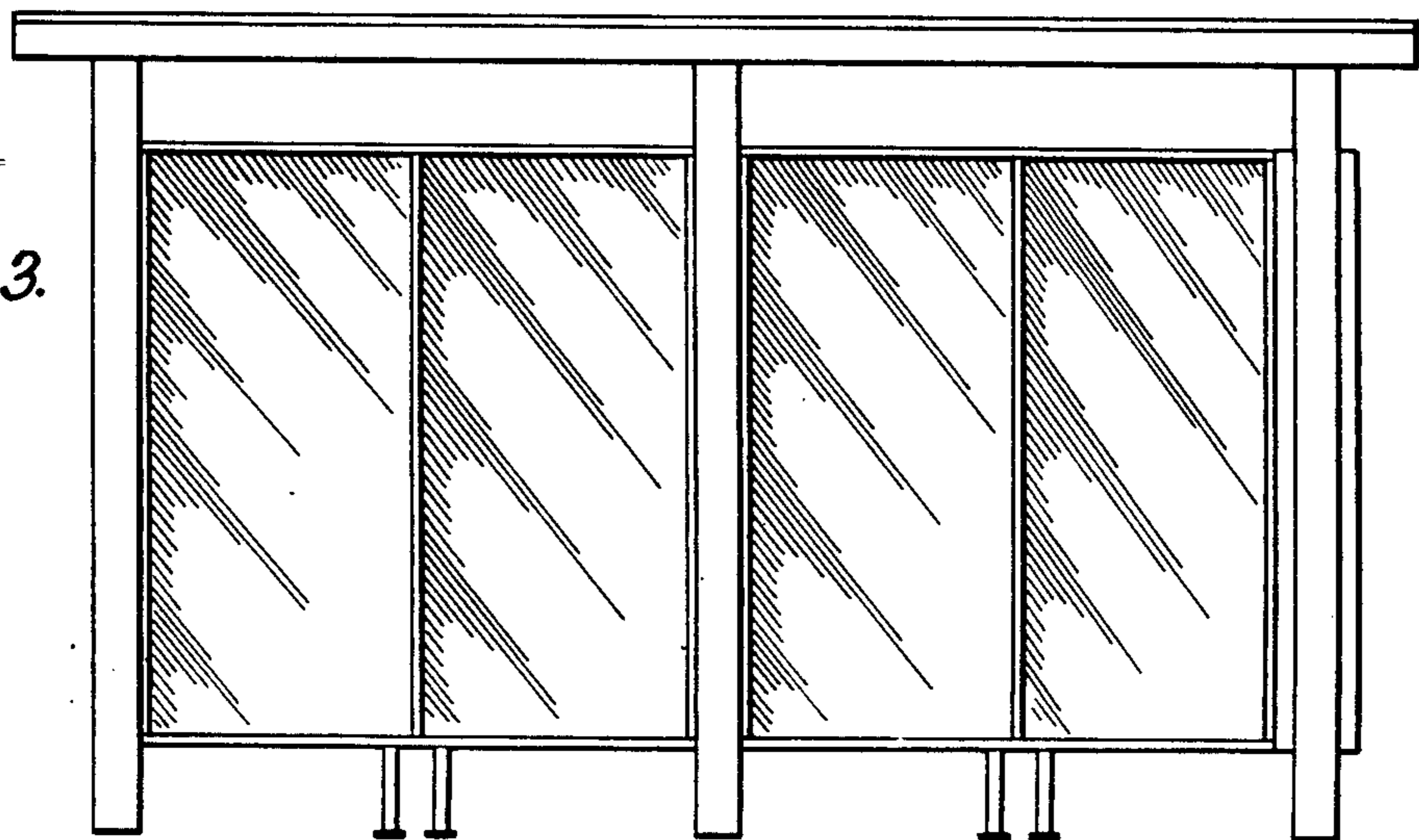

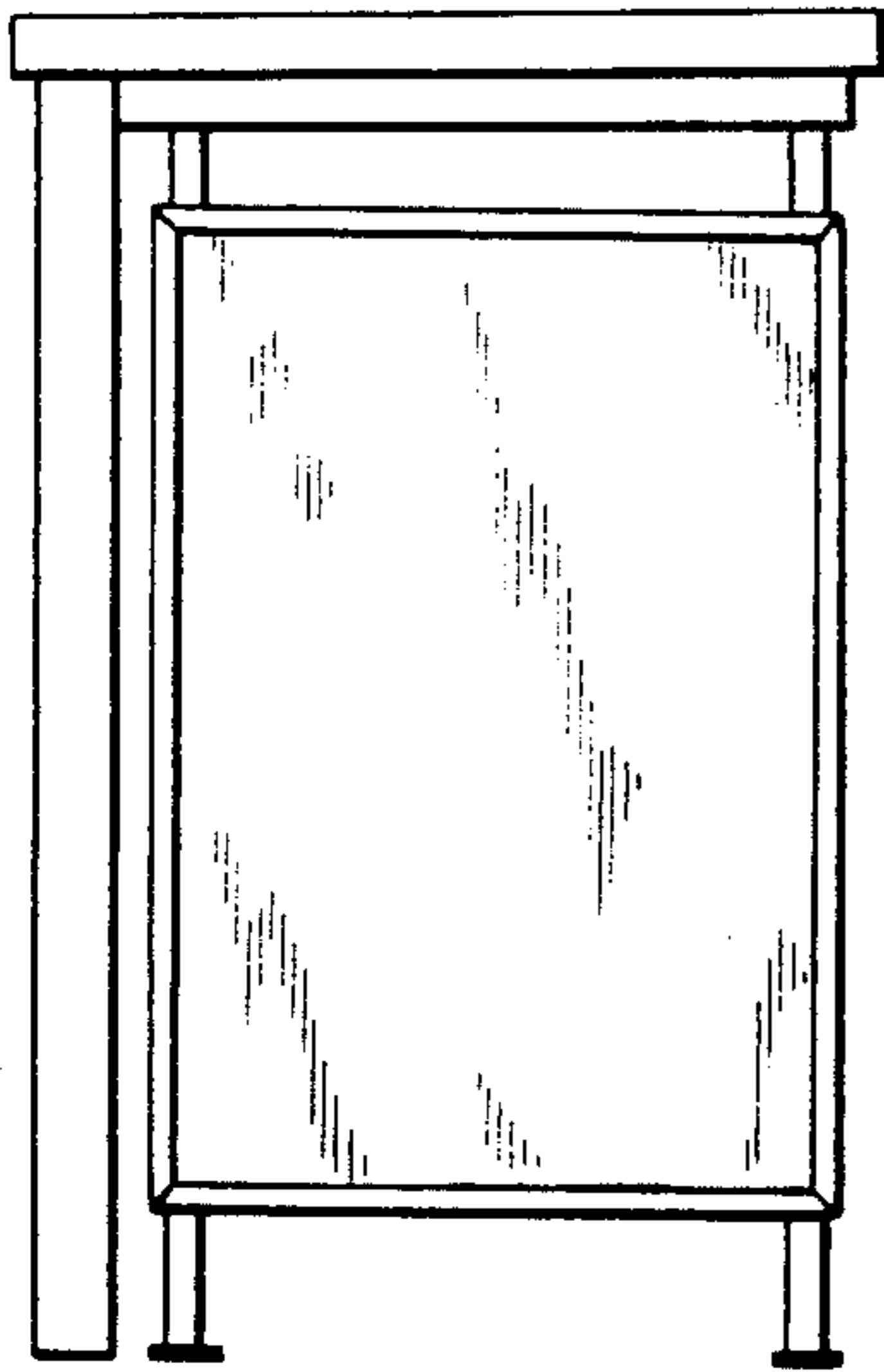

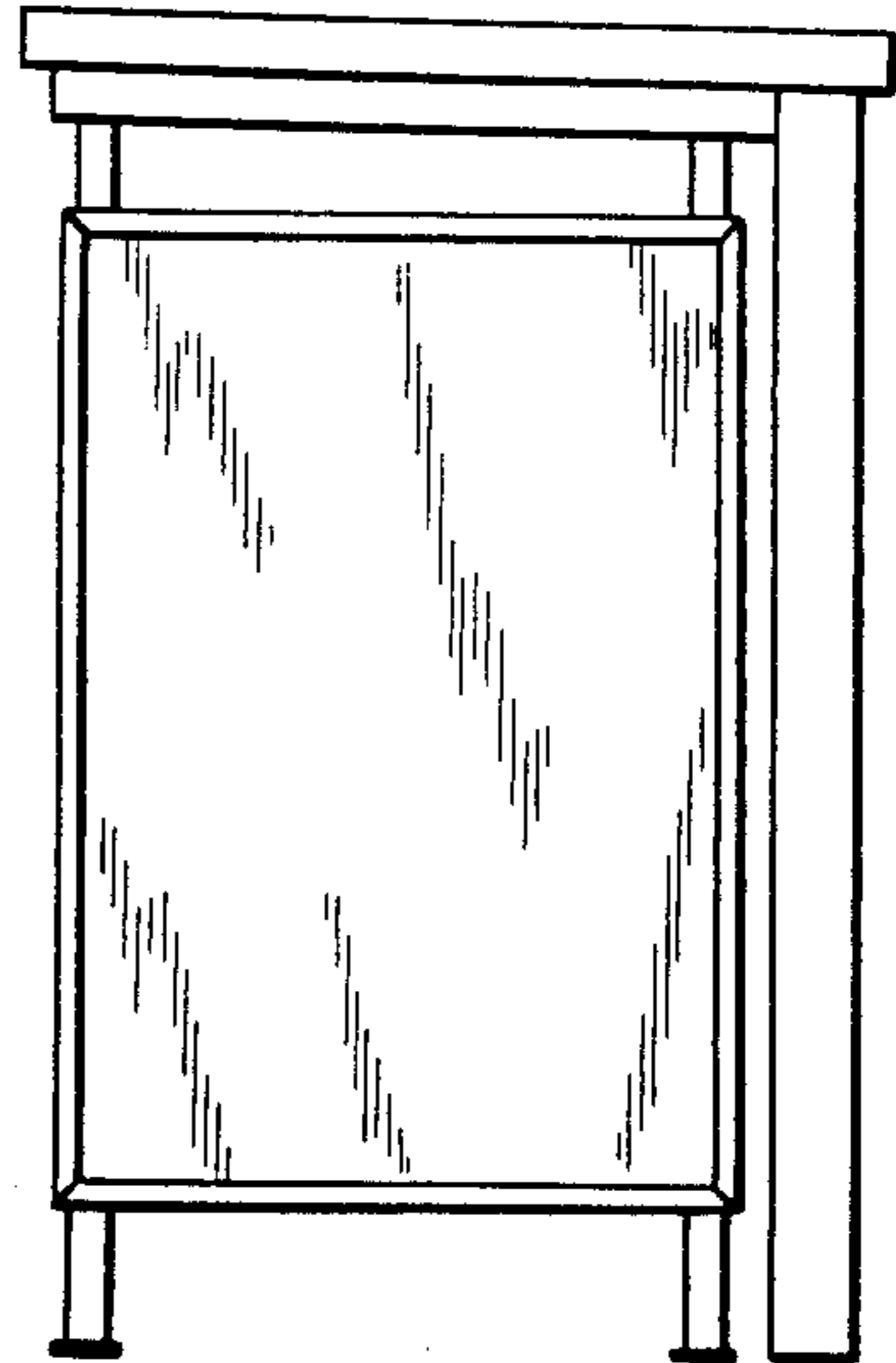

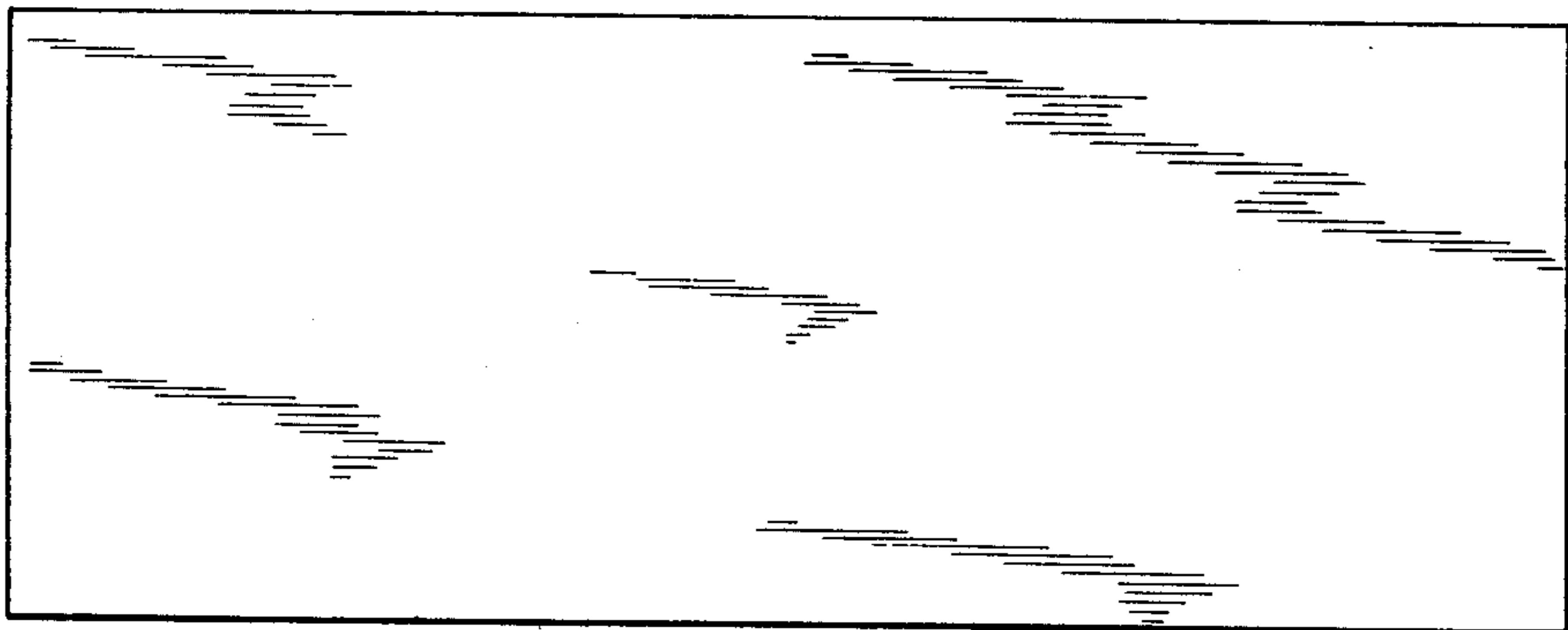
