FIG. 4 is a perspective view thereof.



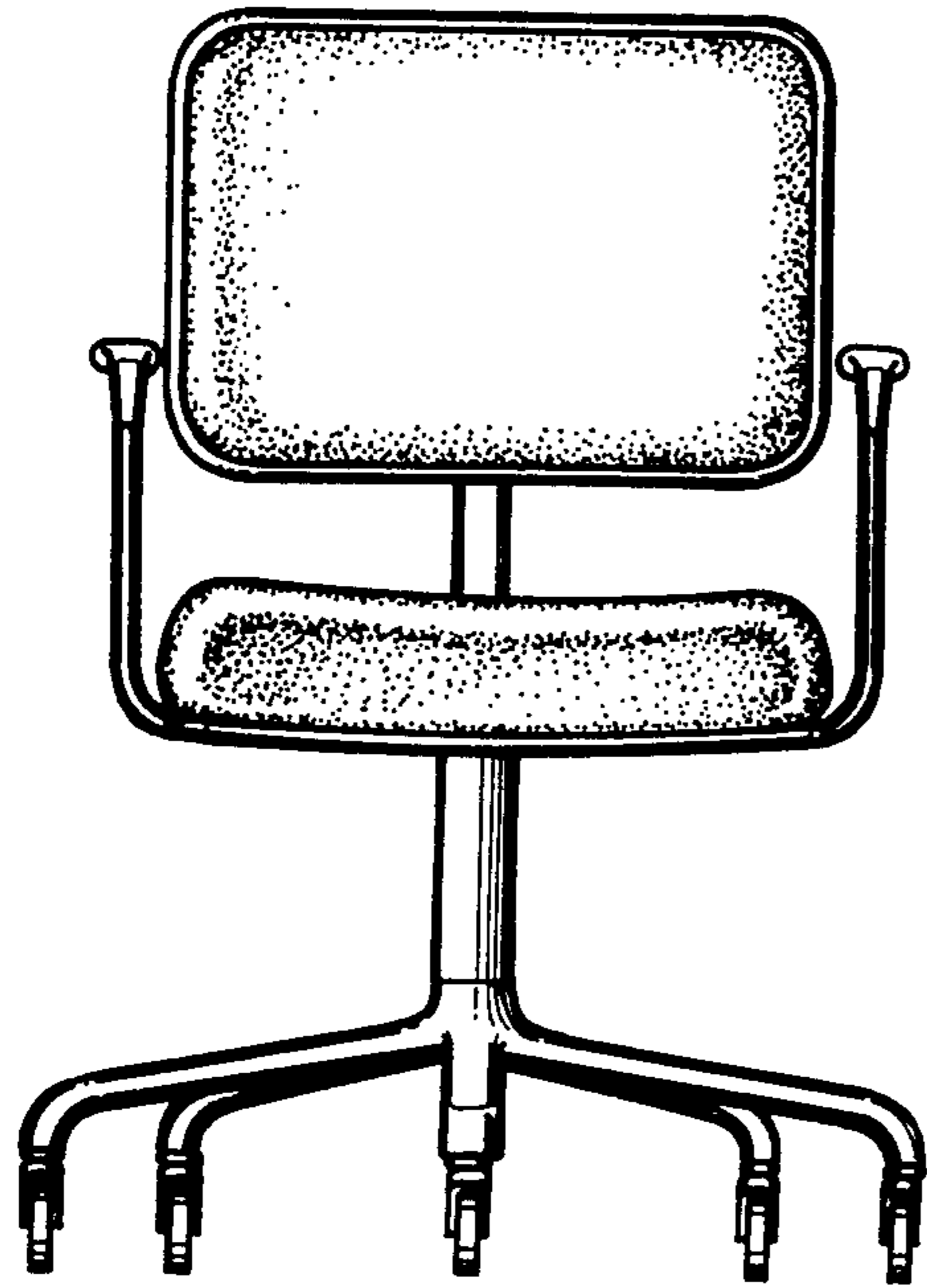

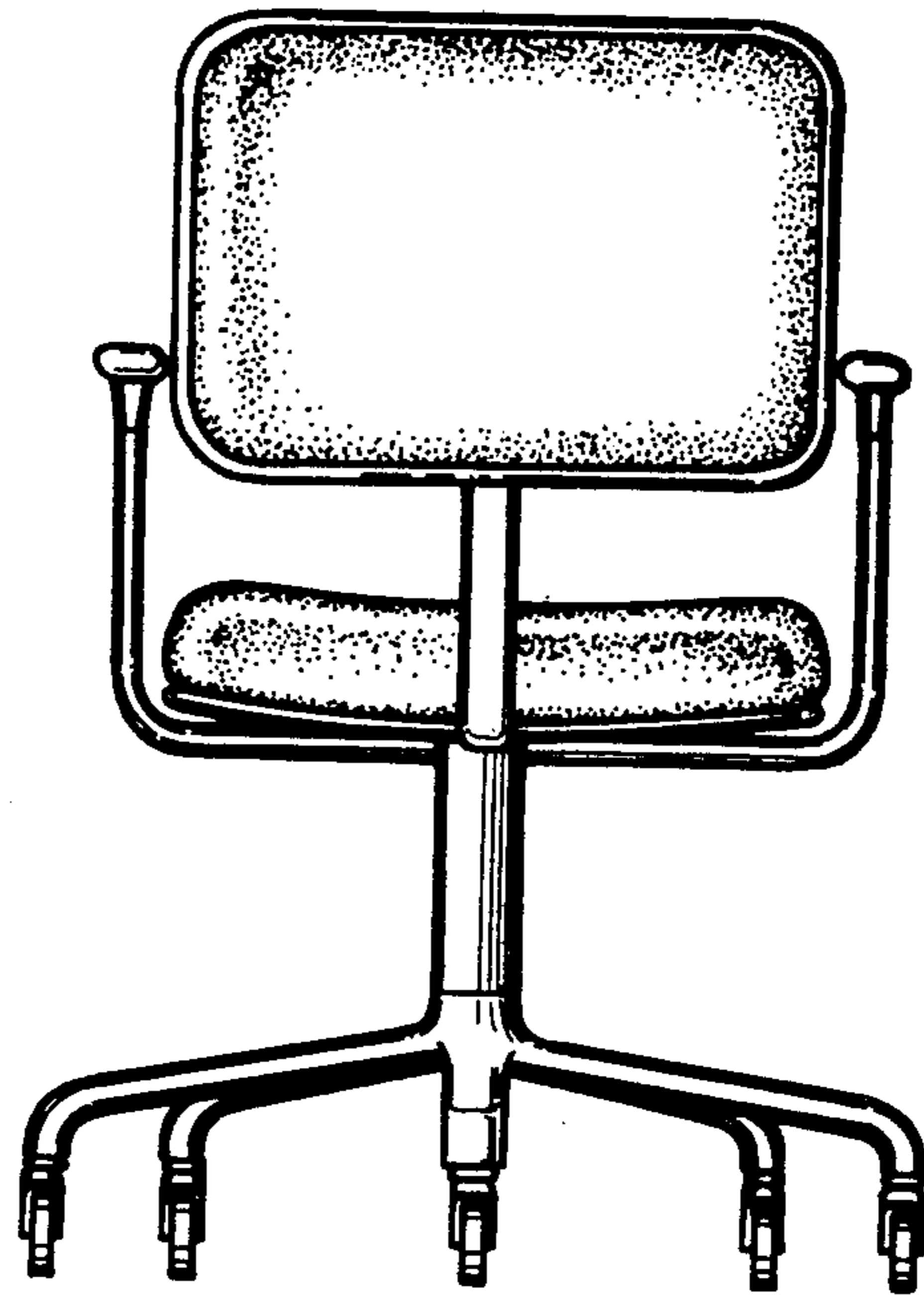
