FIG. 4 is an elevational view of the left end of FIG. 1.

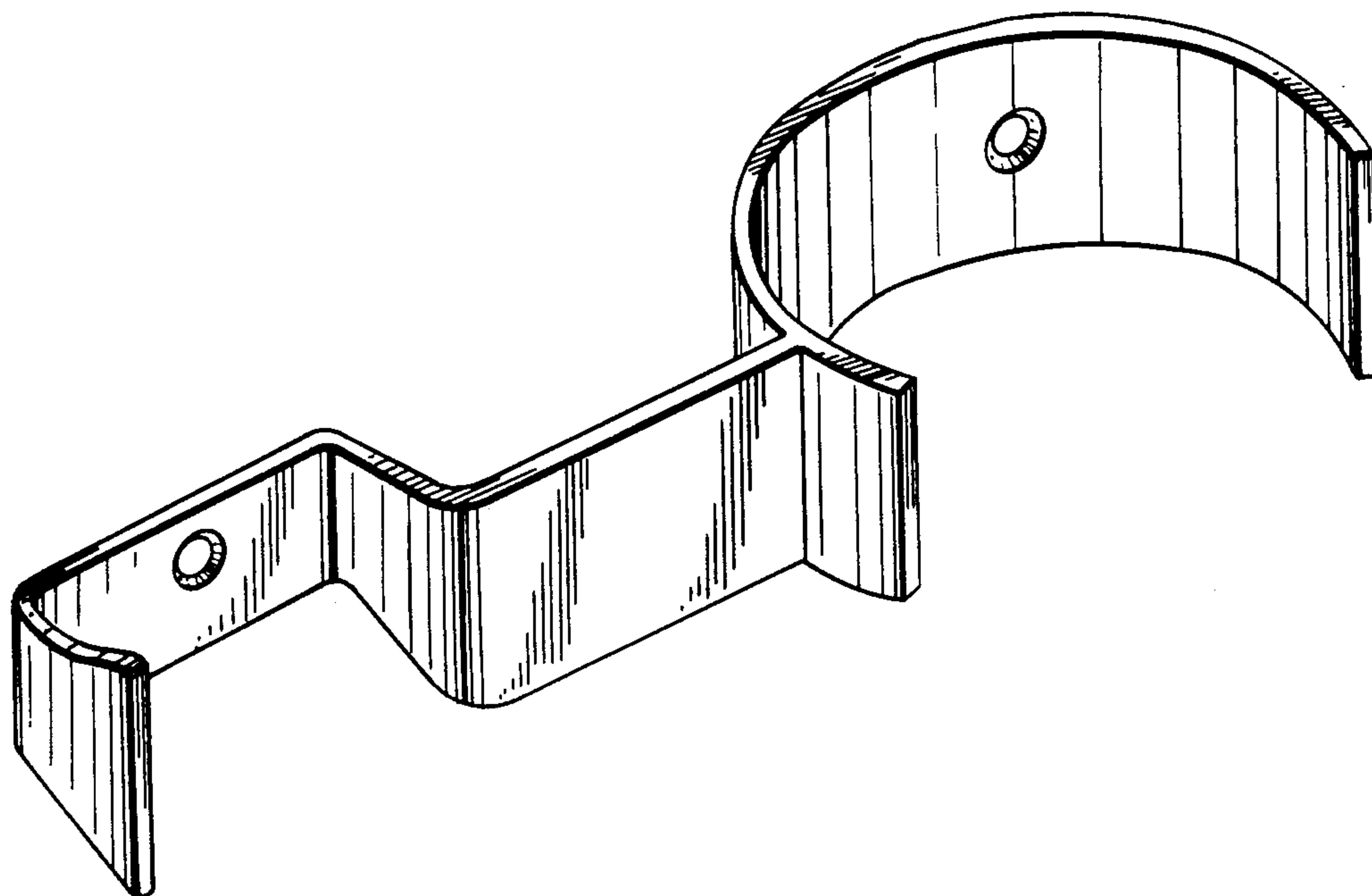

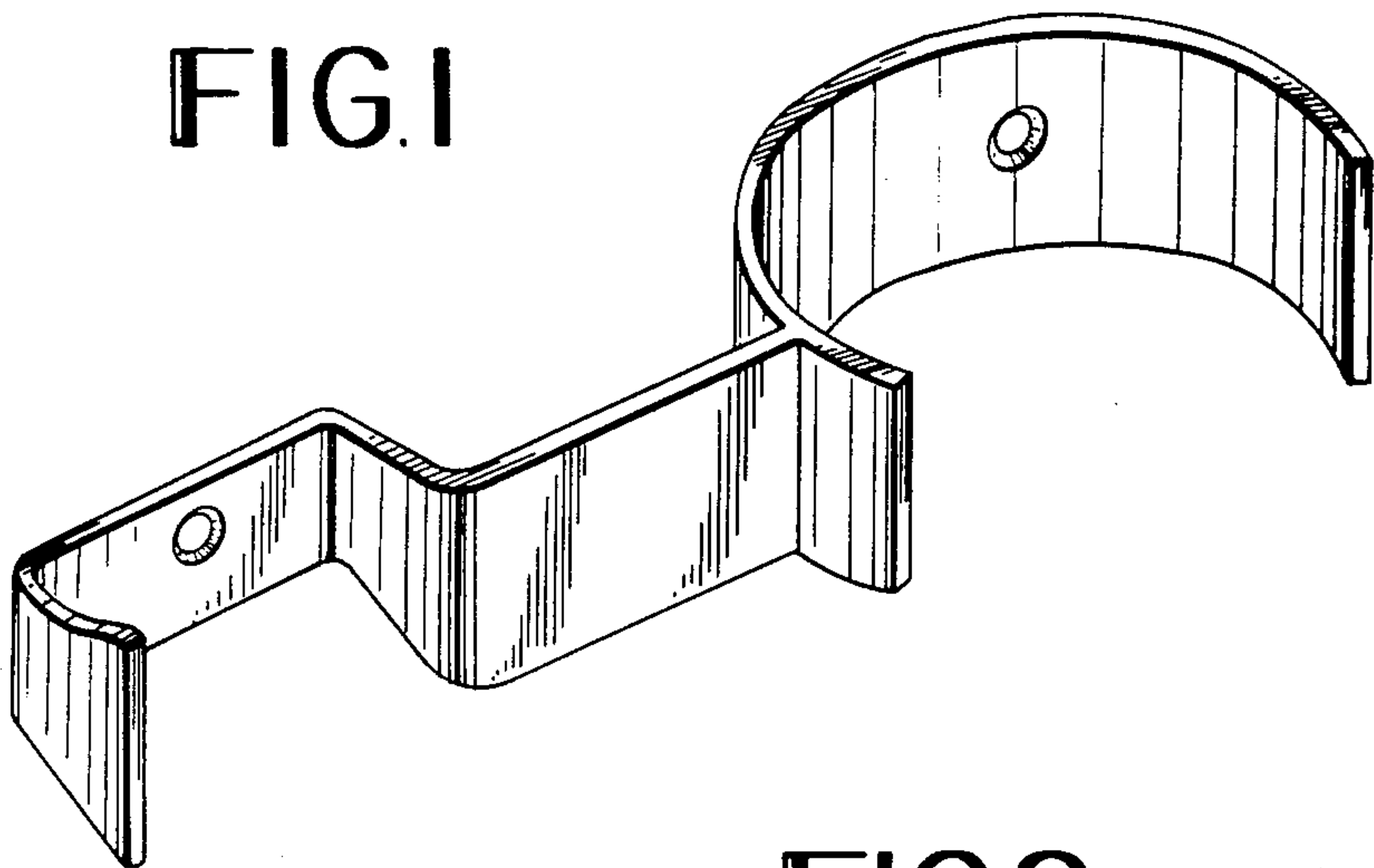

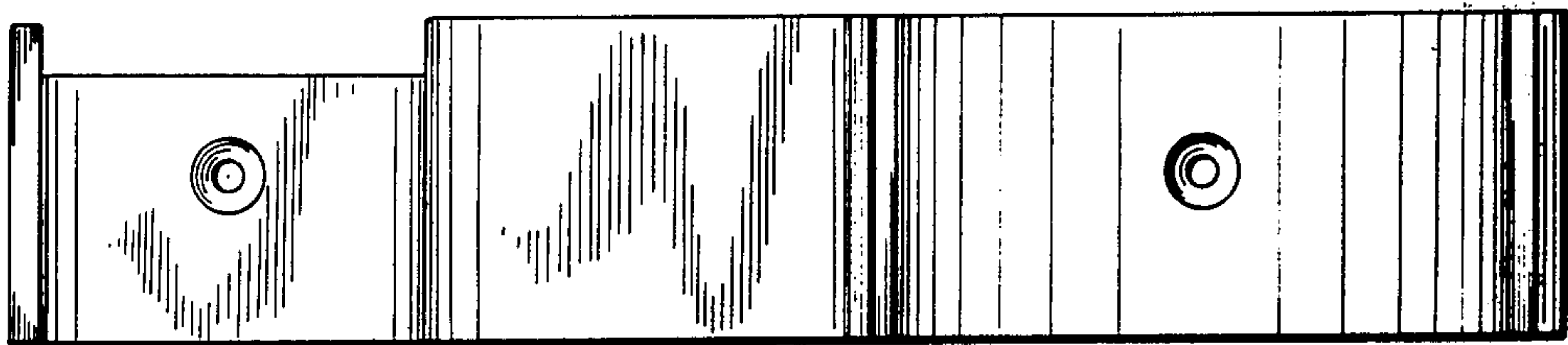

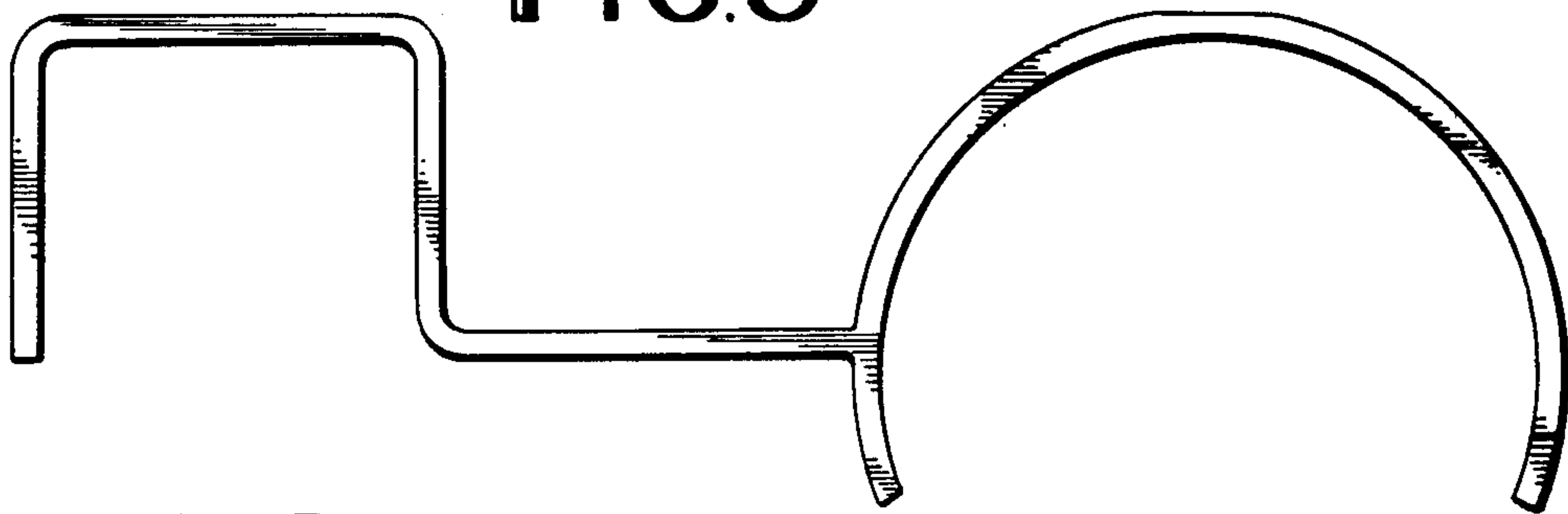
