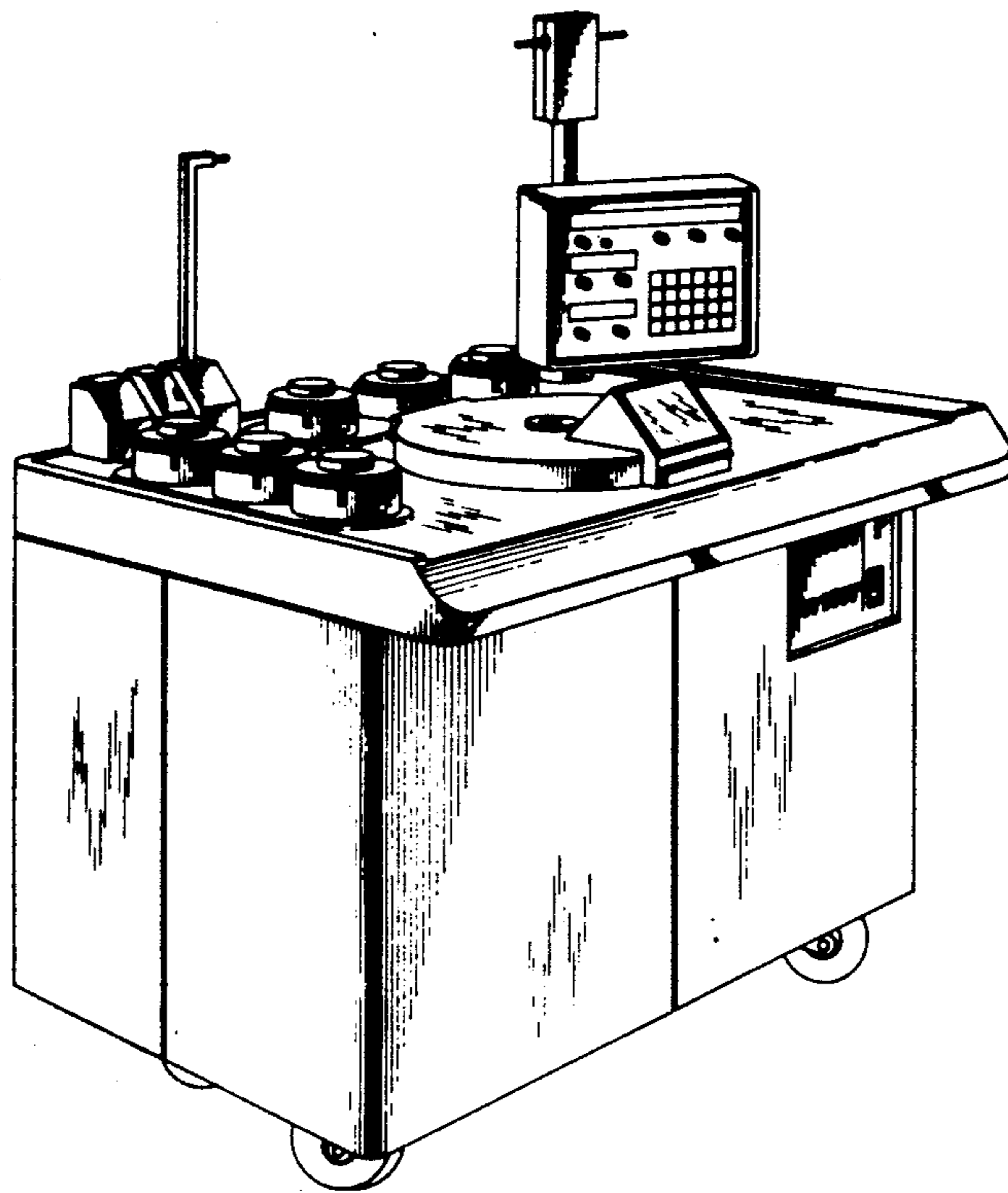

FIG. 1 is a left front perspective view of a blood cell separator showing our new design; and FIG. 2 is a right rear perspective view thereof.



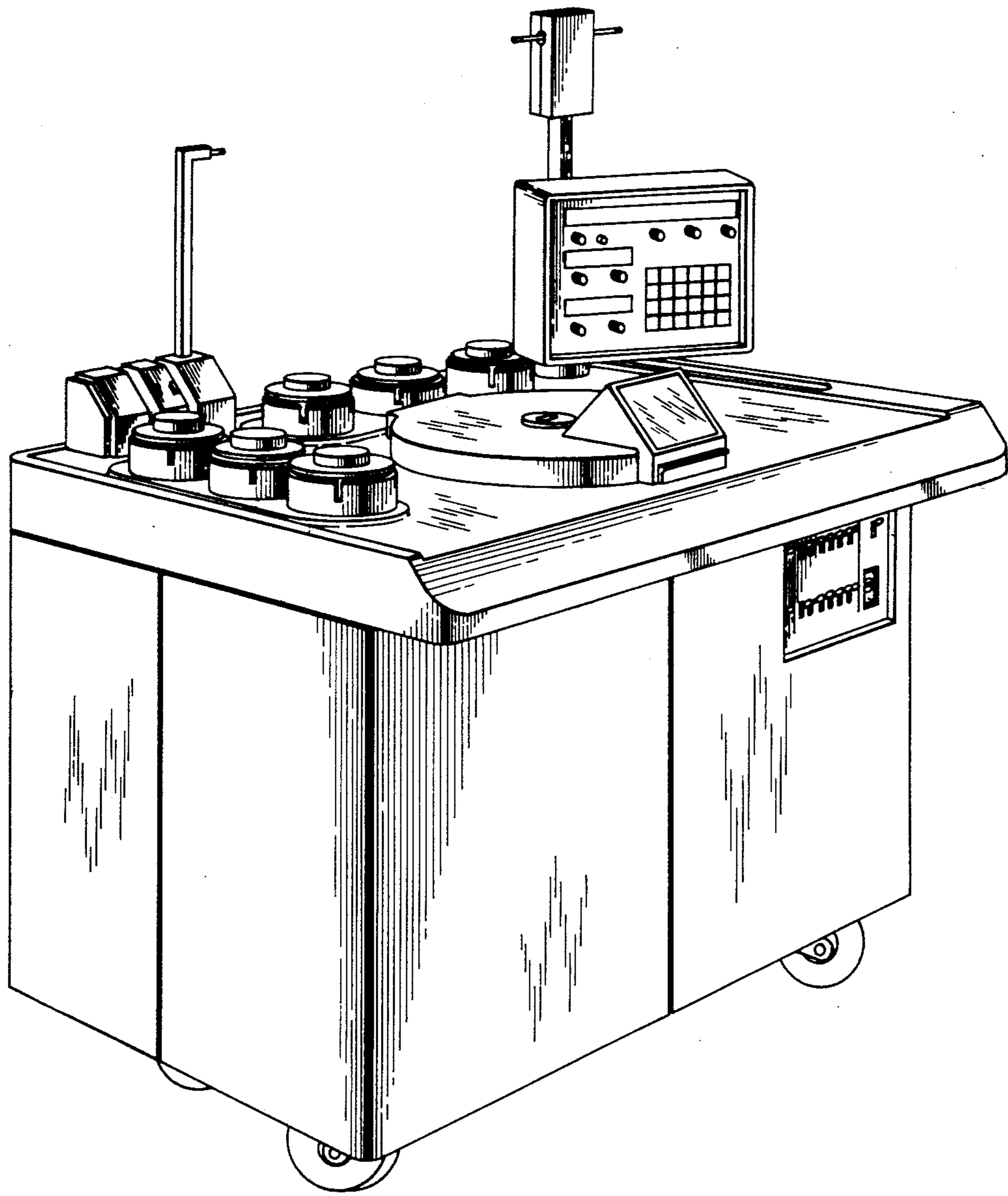

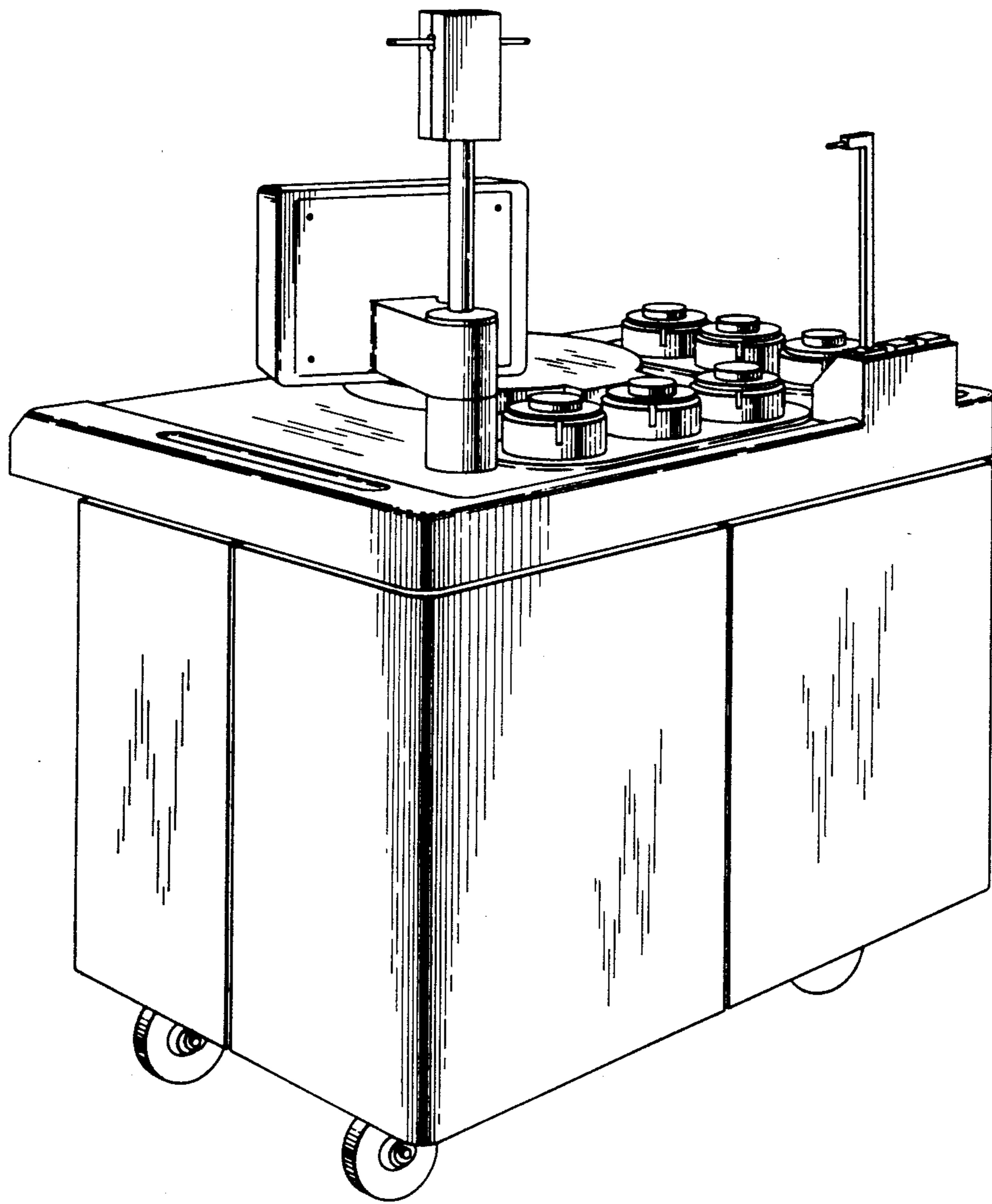
