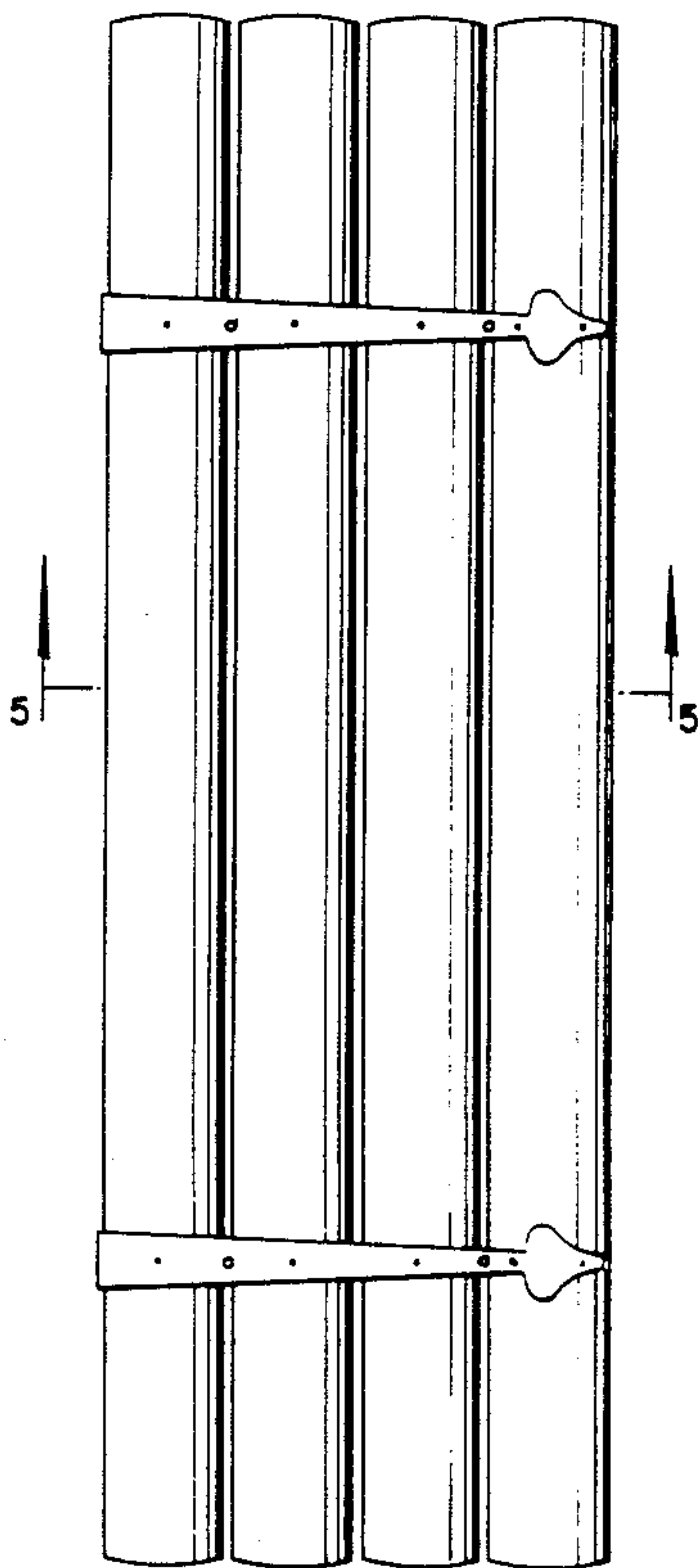

[57] **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a telescopic decorative shutter, substantially as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 shows a front elevation of the invention extended to or close to its fullest (longest) vertical extent, FIG. 2 shows the shutter of FIG. 1 exploded so that the central part is not telescopically received in the upper and lower end parts, FIG. 3 is a view similar to FIG. 1 with the parts telescoped together to or near to their fullest (shortest) vertical extent, FIG. 4 is an end view of the bottom end of the shutter of FIG. 1, and FIG. 5 is a cross section through the shutter of FIG. 1 taken along the line 5—5.



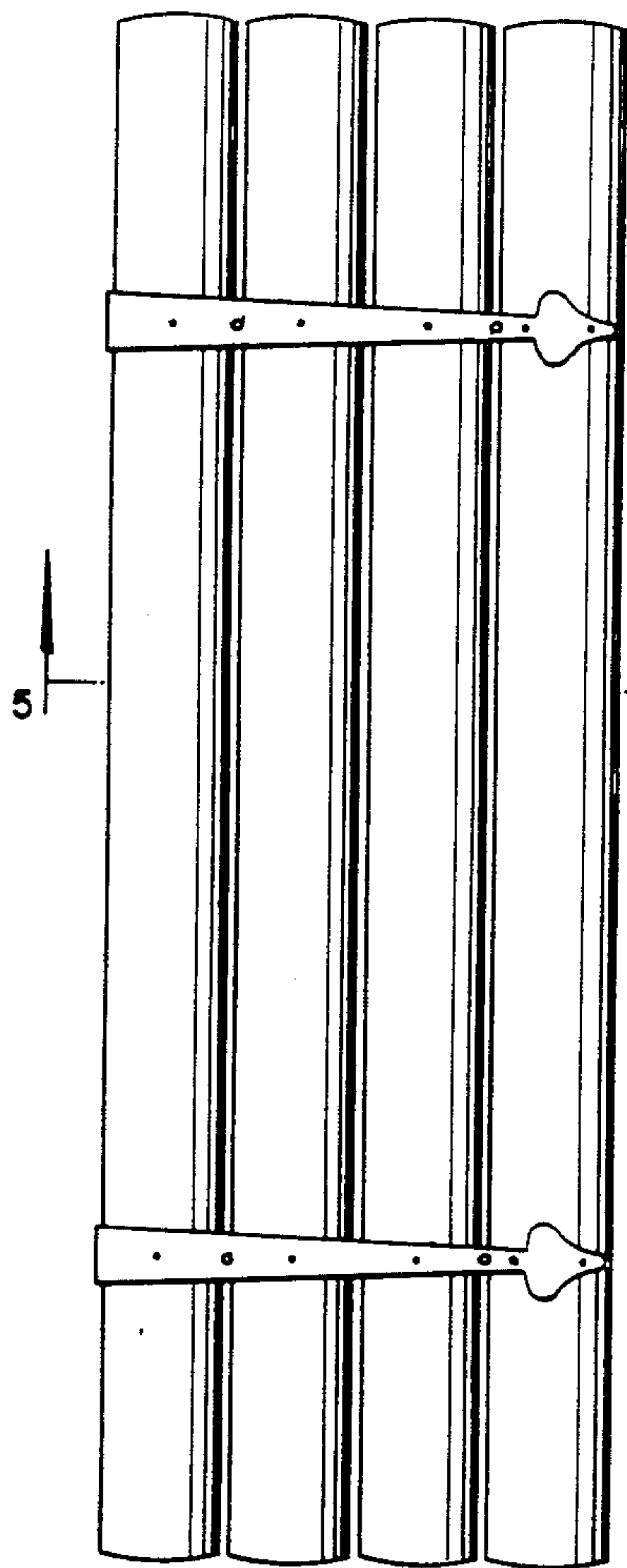

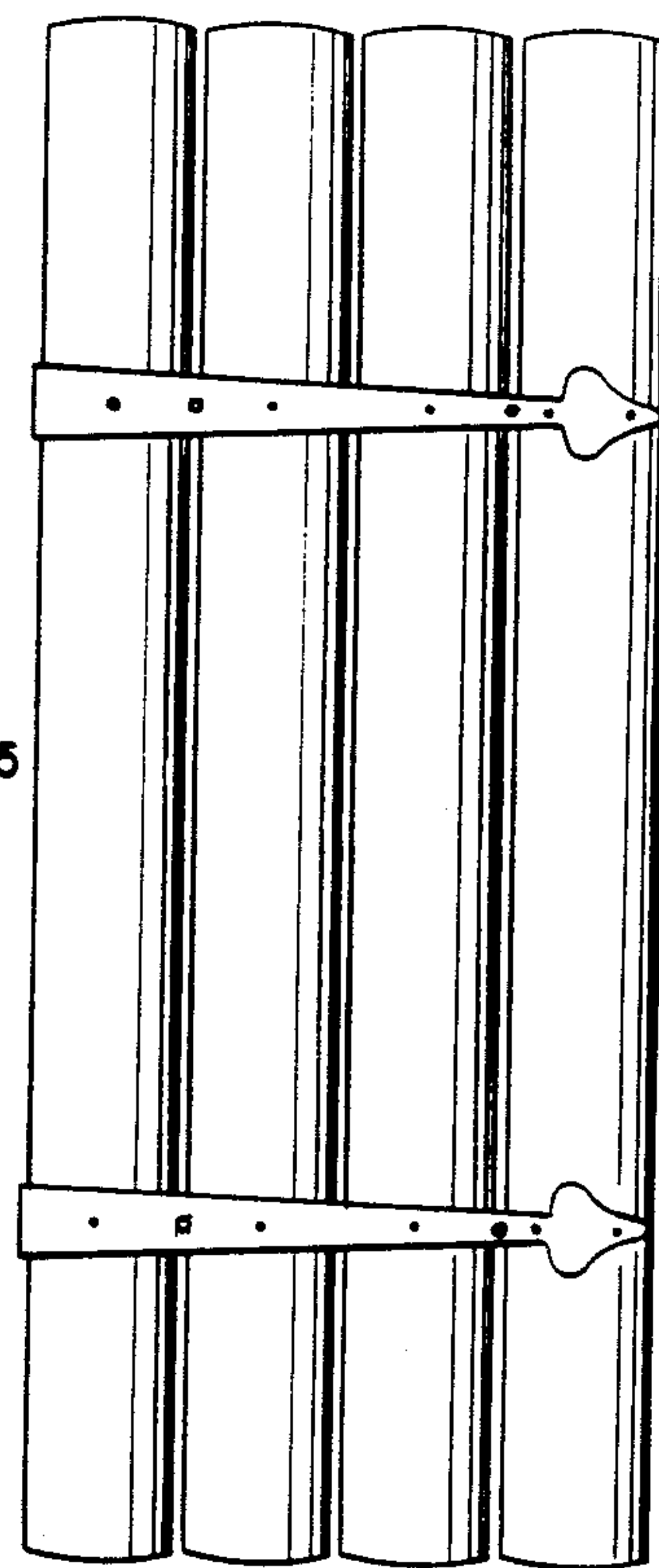

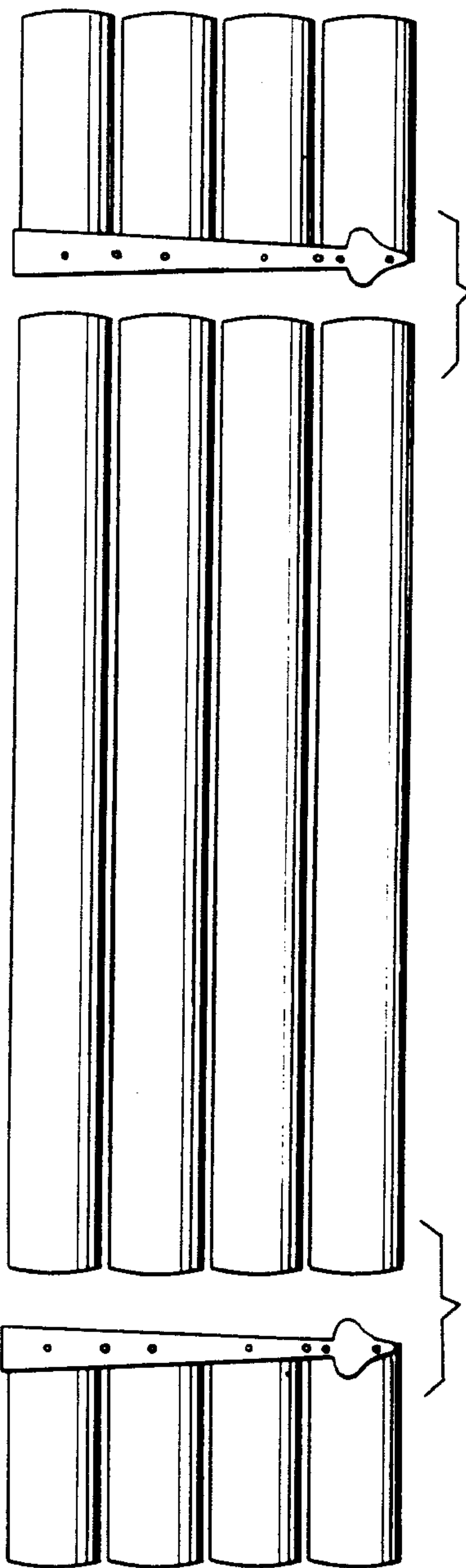
