[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a skirt, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

The FIGURE is a front perspective view of a skirt showing my new design, with the applique shown in partially opened position. The simulated shoelace is printed on the skirt. There is one seam which runs the length of the skirt. The inside of this seam is partially shown inside the waistband. The rear of the skirt is identical to the front, except that it is plain.
