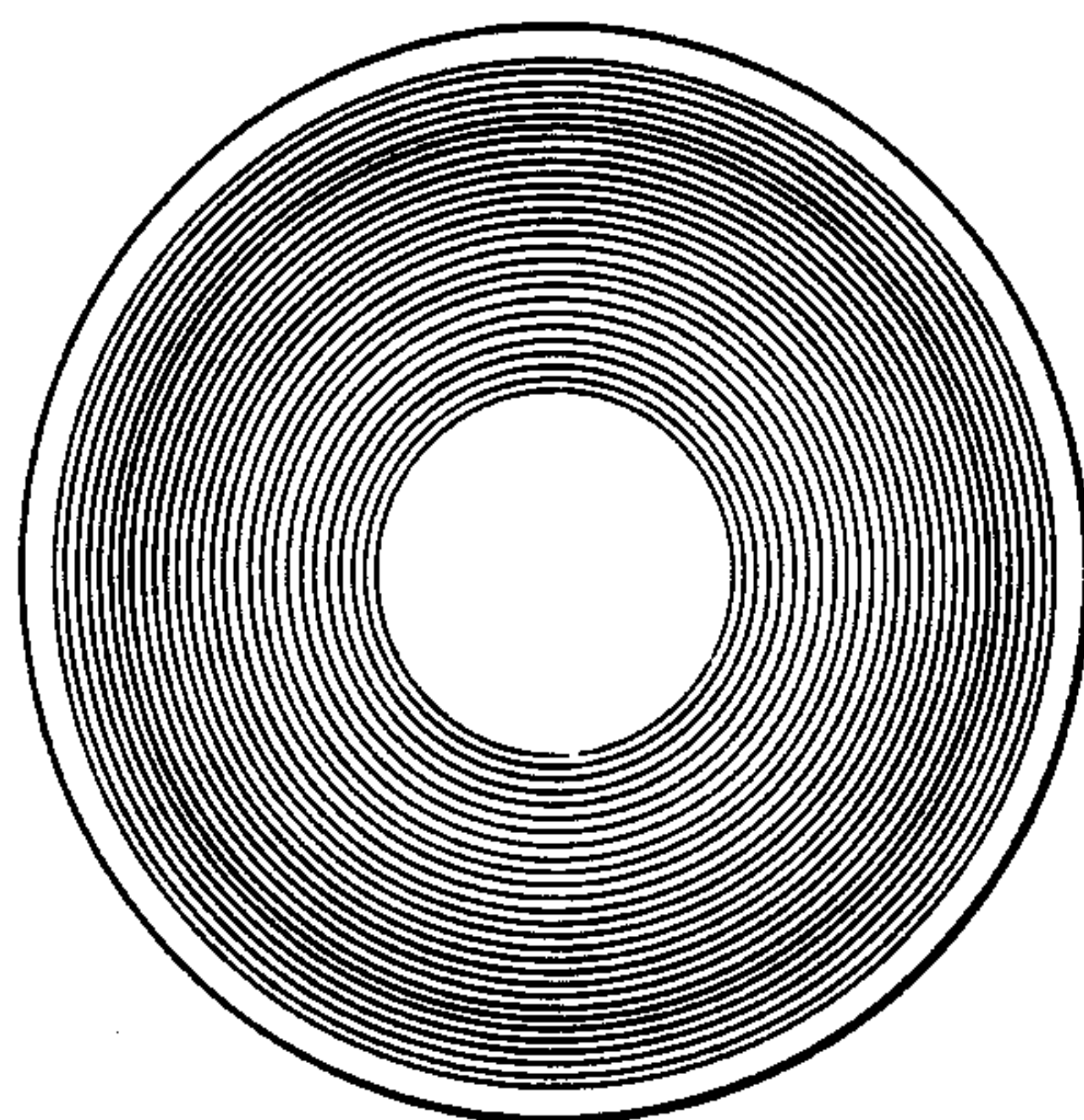
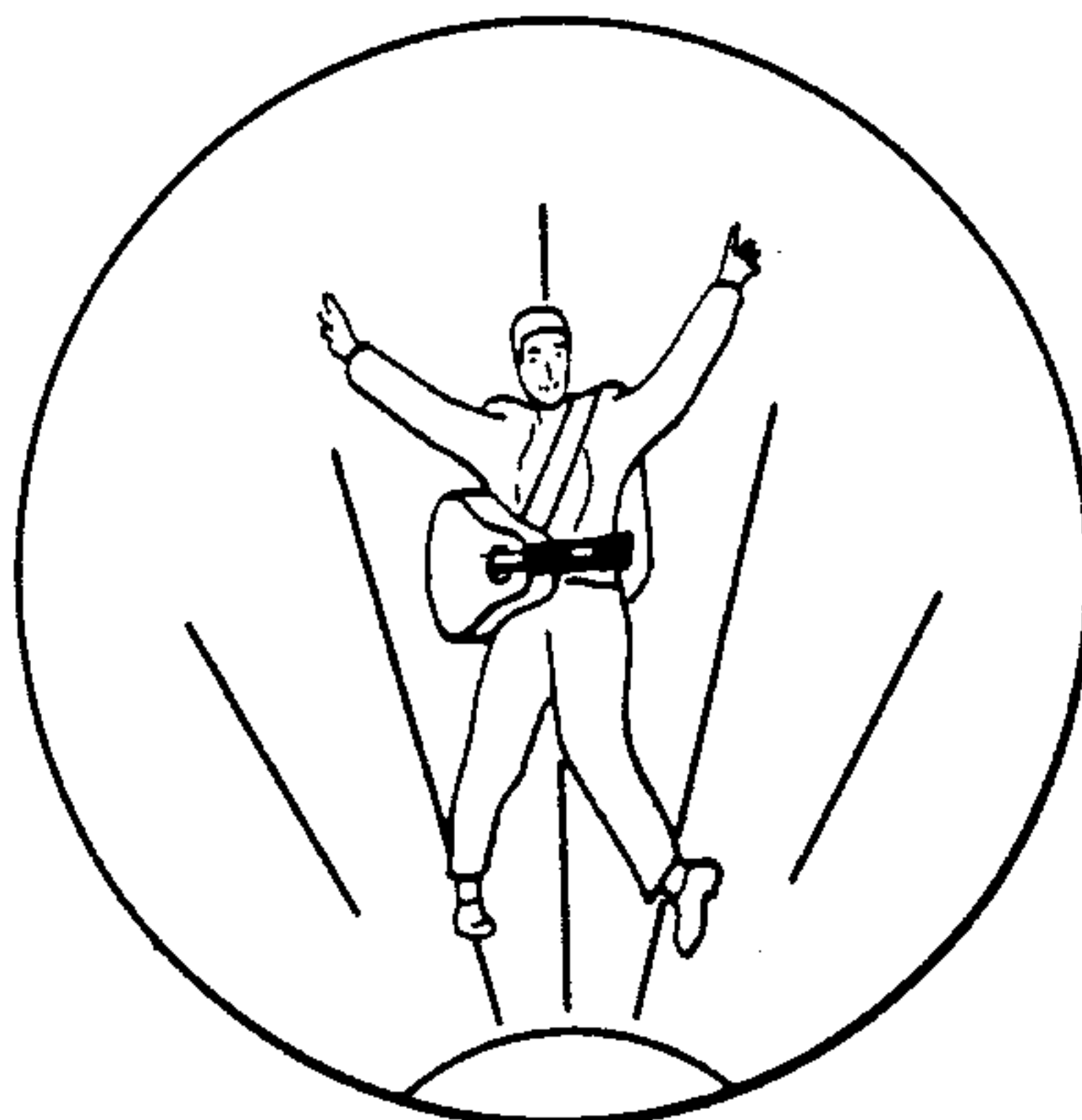
The ornamental design for a charm, medallion or similar article, as shown and described.

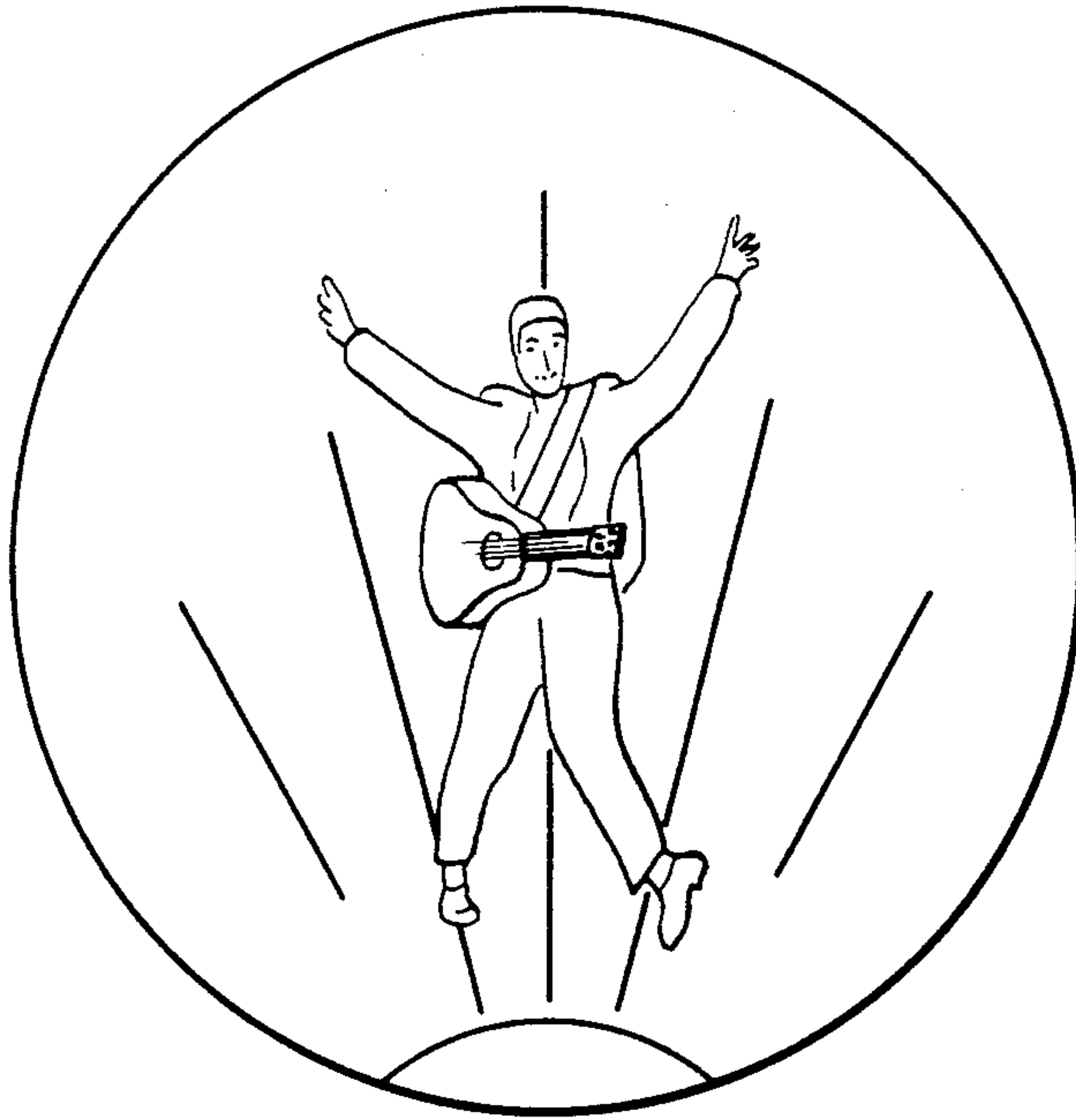
DESCRIPTION

FIG. 3 is a rear elevational view thereof.

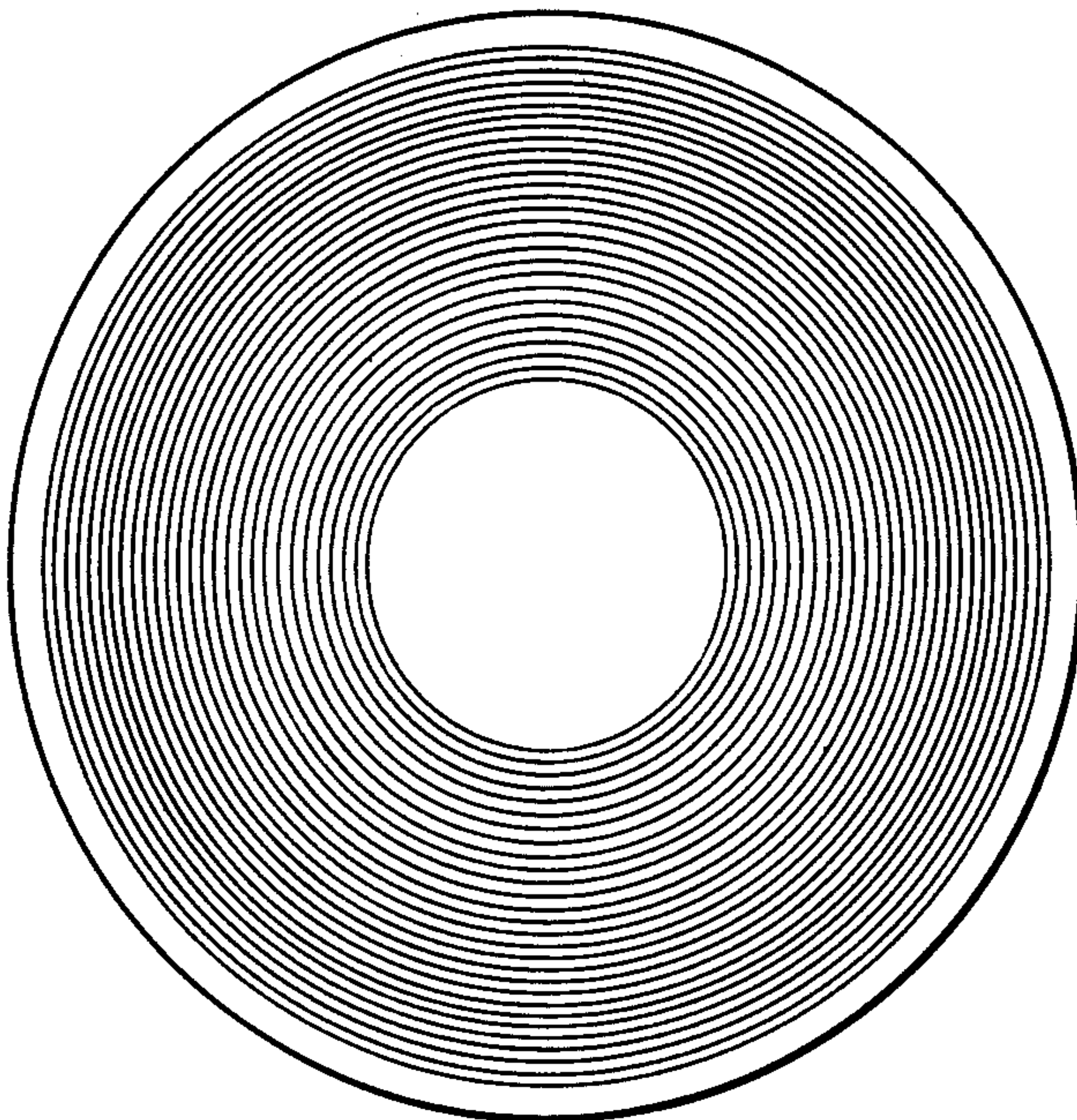
