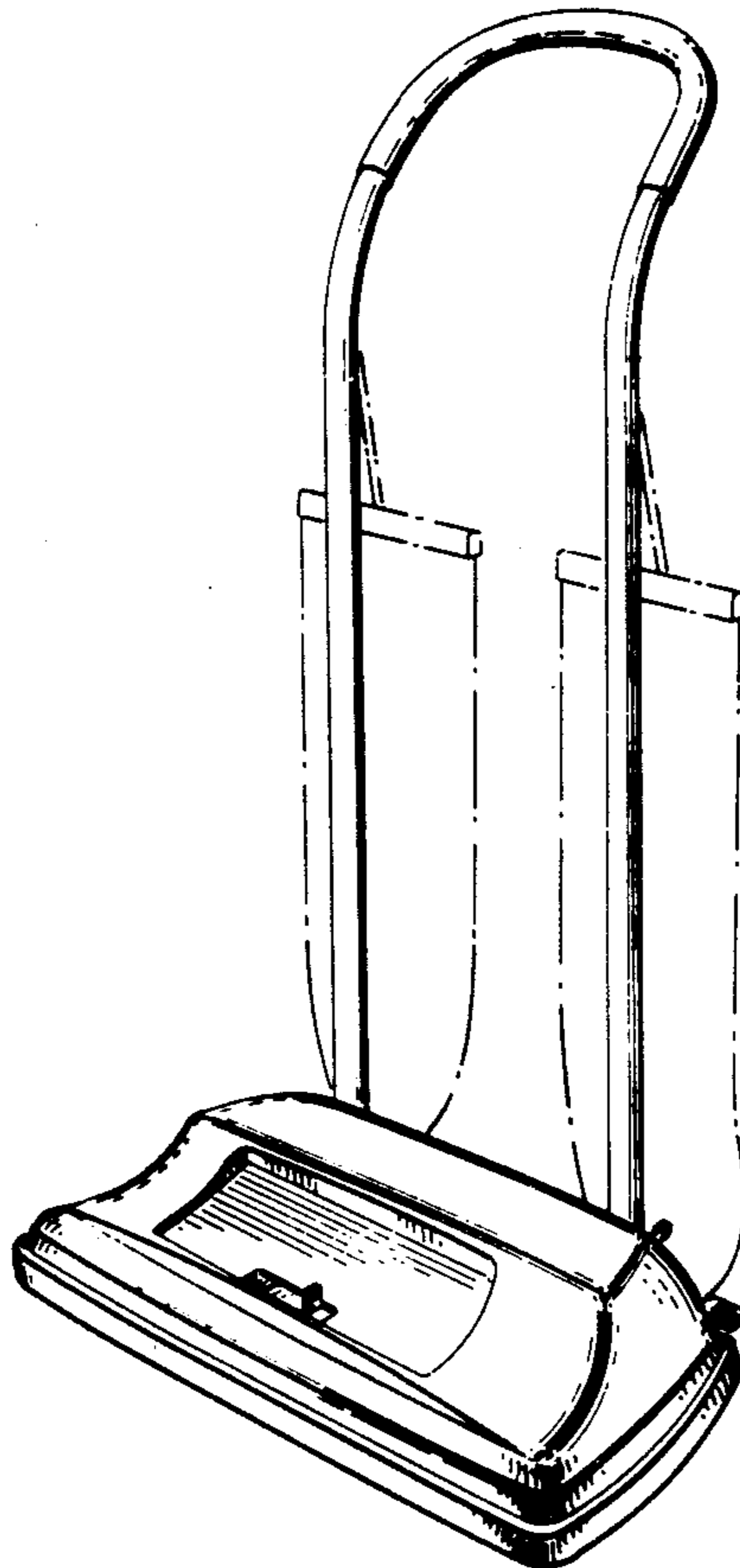
FIG. 1 is a top front perspective view of the casing for a vacuum cleaner, showing our new design;

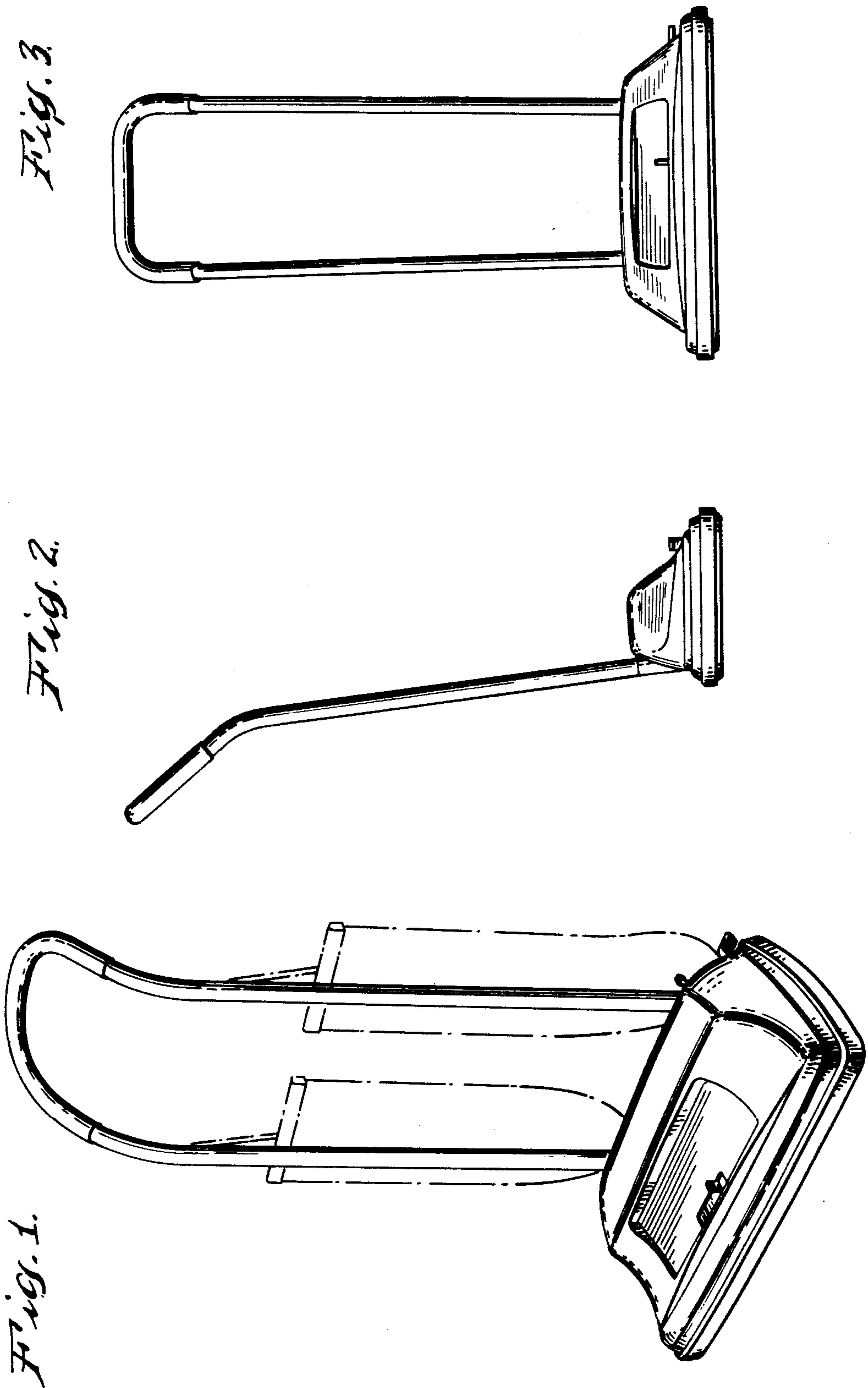

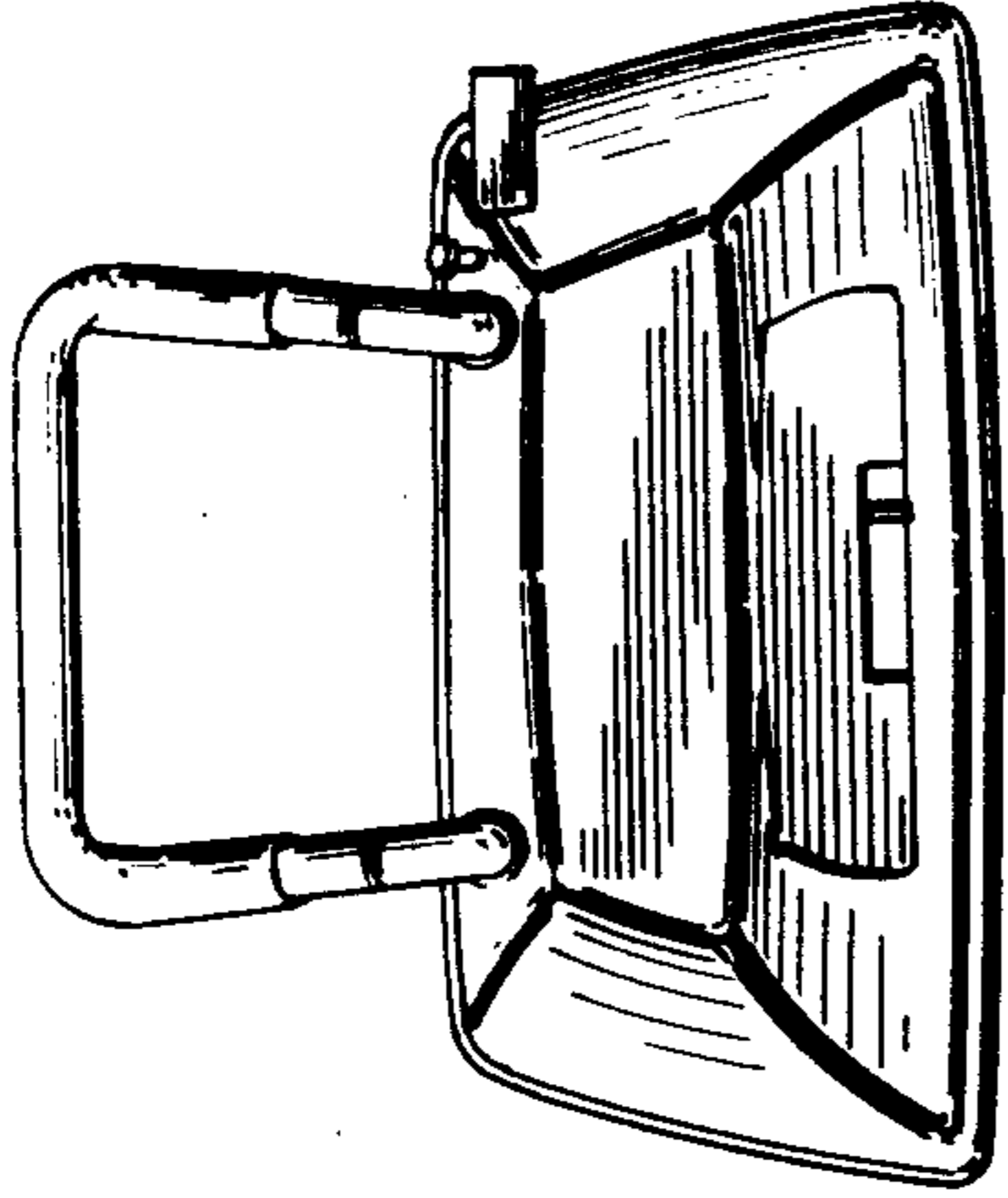

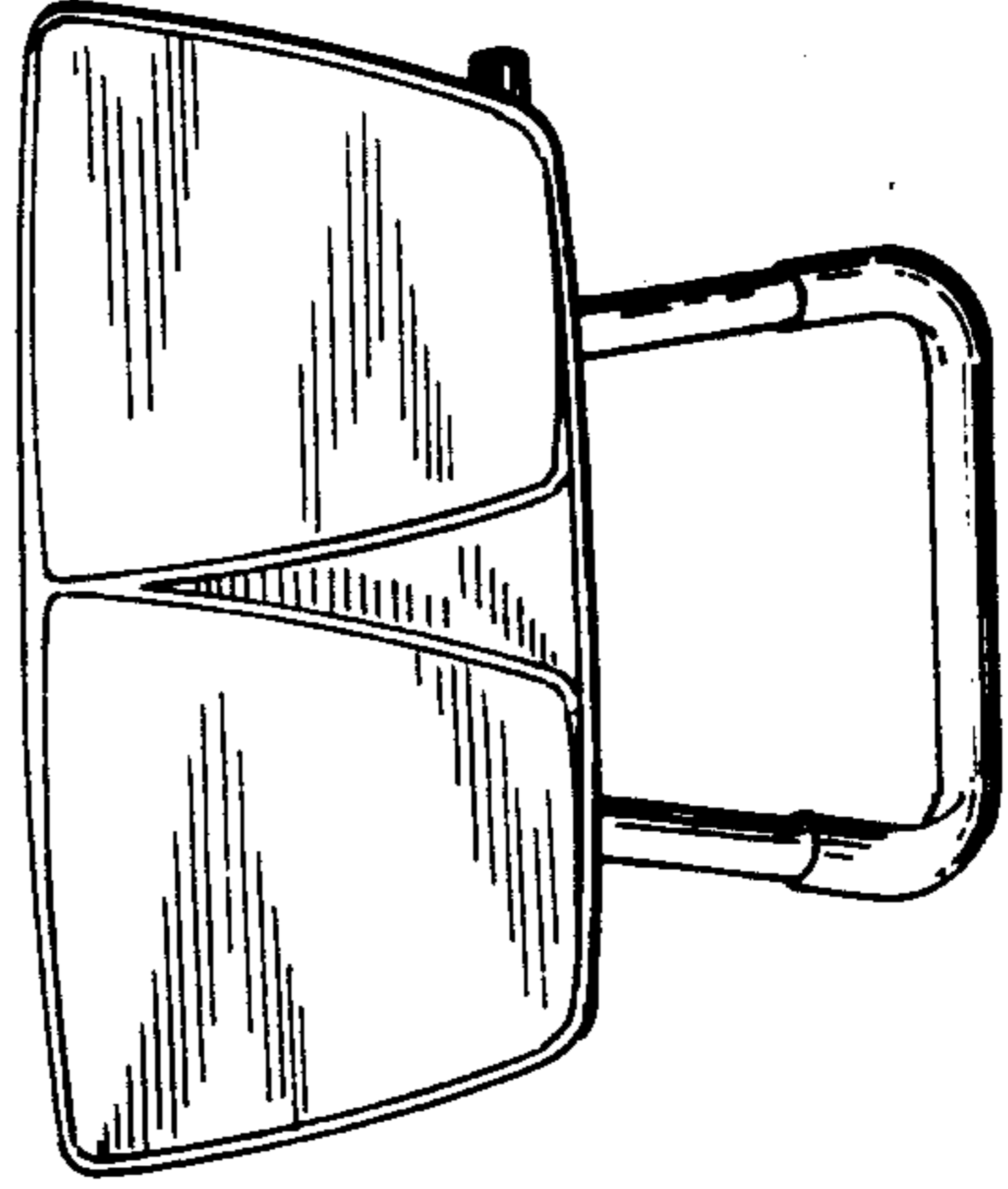

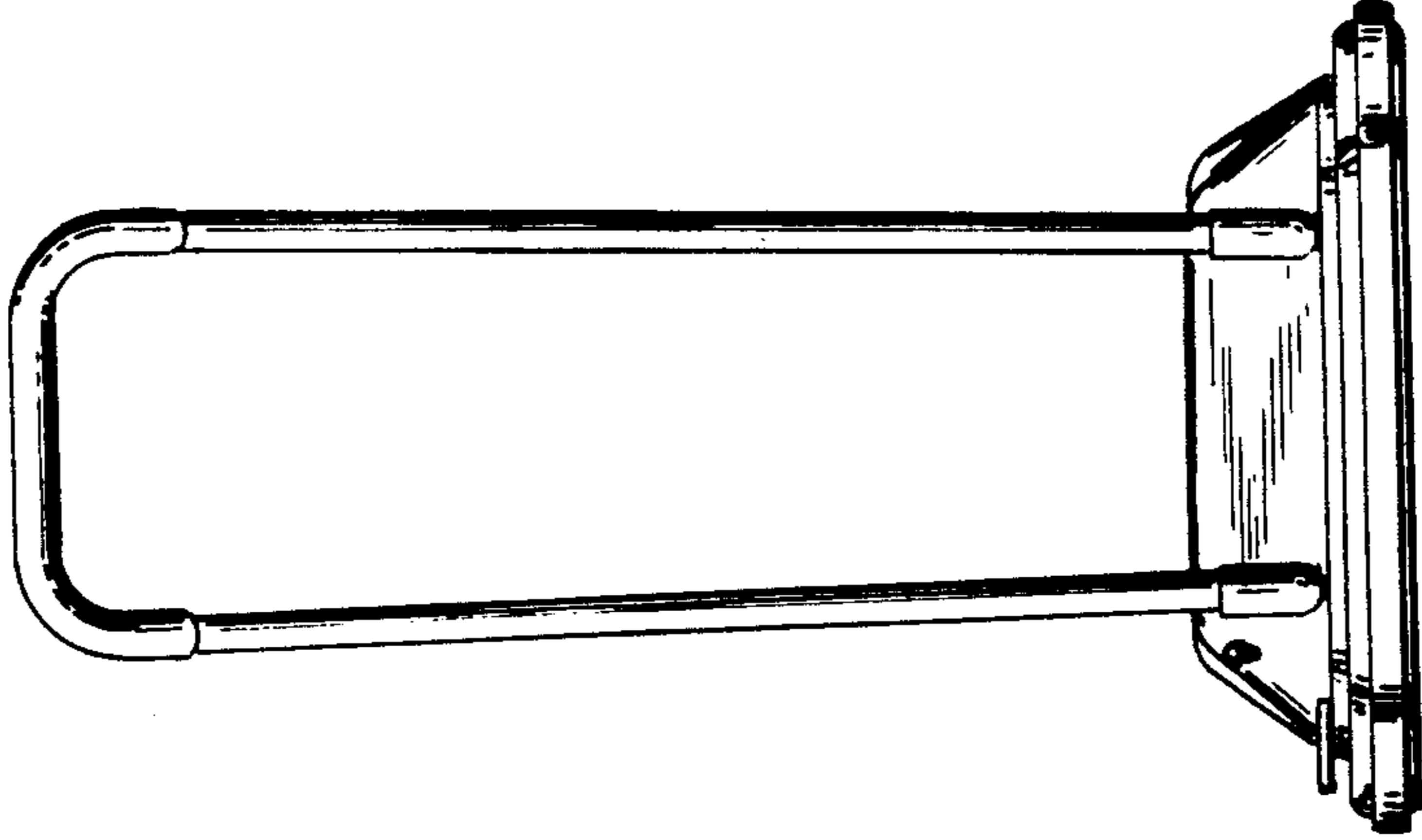
