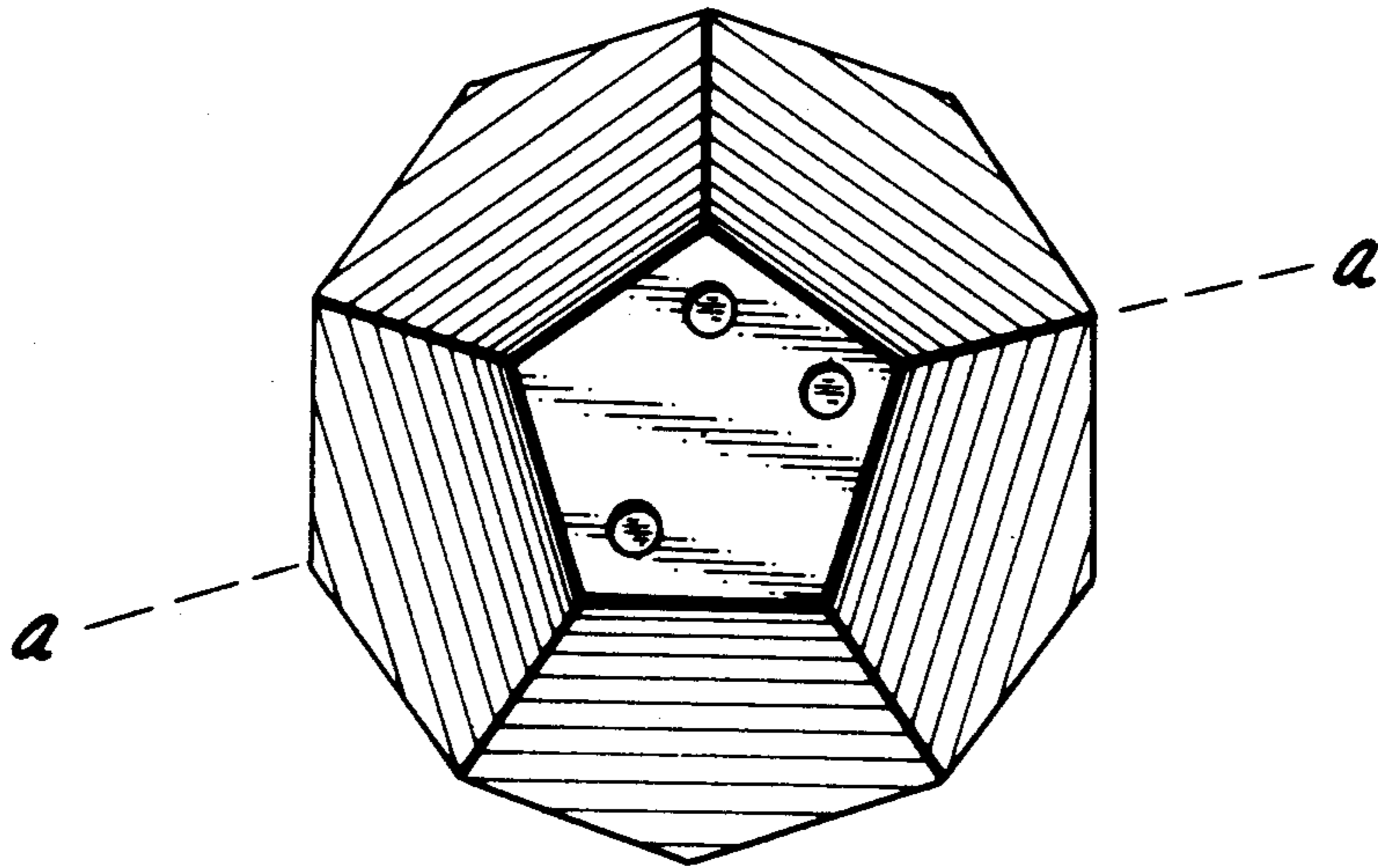
FIG. 3 is a cross-section view of the bowling game indicating device shown in FIG. 1 and FIG. 2 taken along lines a-a.

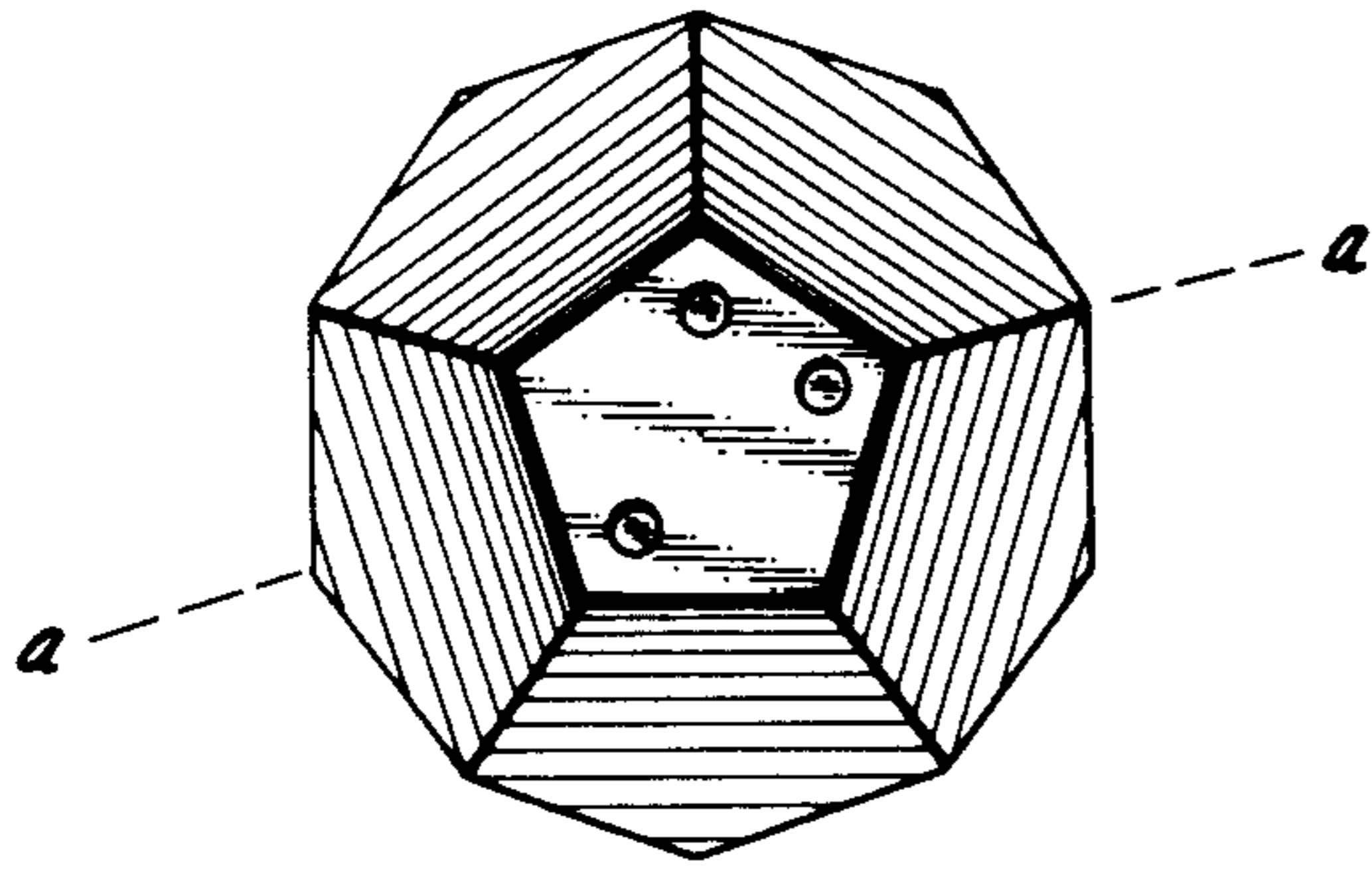

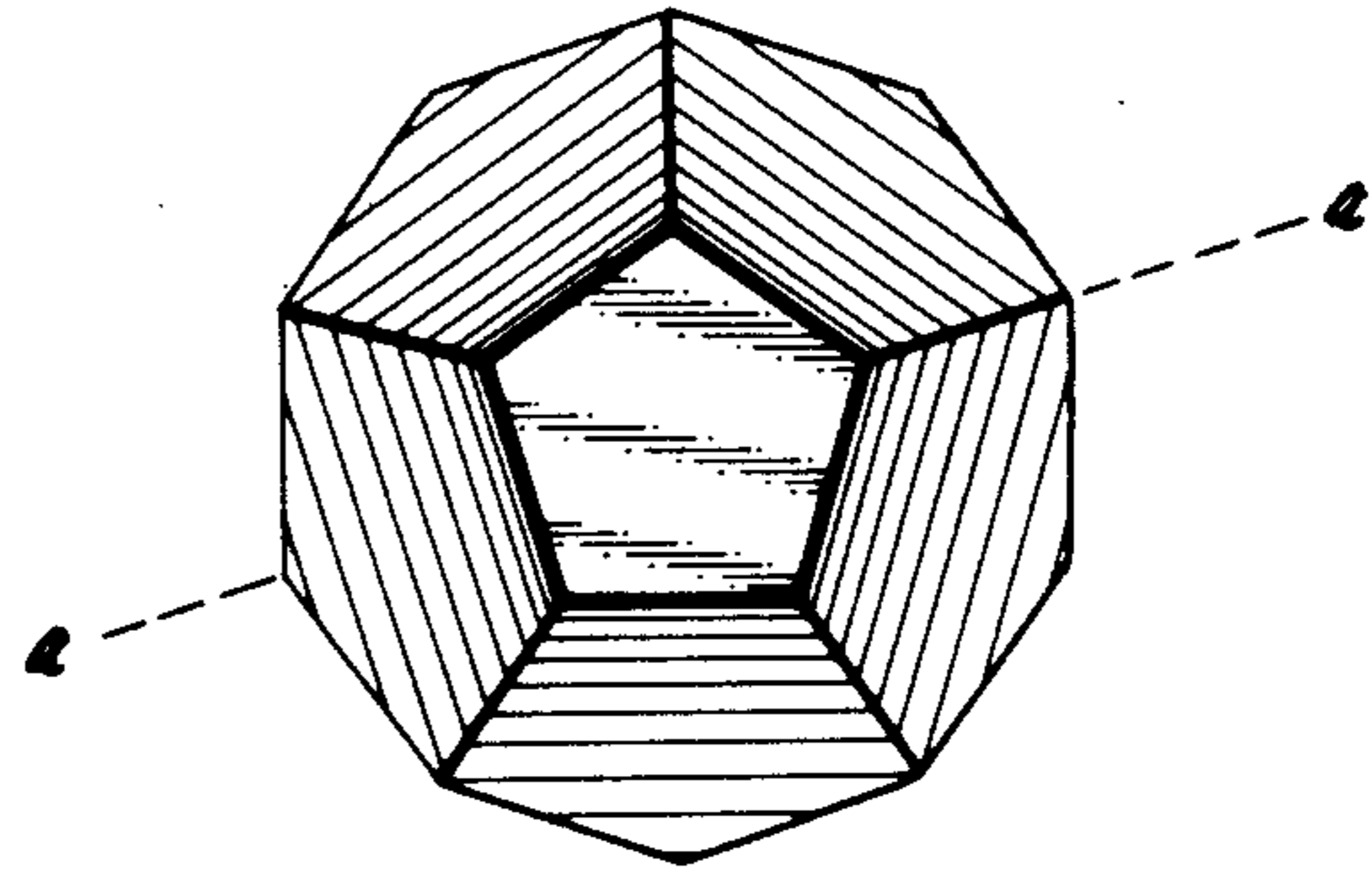
The characteristic feature of my design resides in the combination of the bowling ball finger hole arrangement and the dodecahedron die configuration as shown.
