[57] **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a fishing apparatus for the quick disconnection of the hook from the fishing line, substantially as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of a fishing apparatus for the quick disconnection of the hook from the fishing line showing my new design. The design is shown attached to a fishing line, an additional leader and hook (in broken lines) which are not part of the invention.

FIG. 2 is a top plan view of the back plate.

FIG. 3 is a top plan view of the front plate.

FIG. 4 is a side elevational view.

FIG. 5 is a bottom plan view.

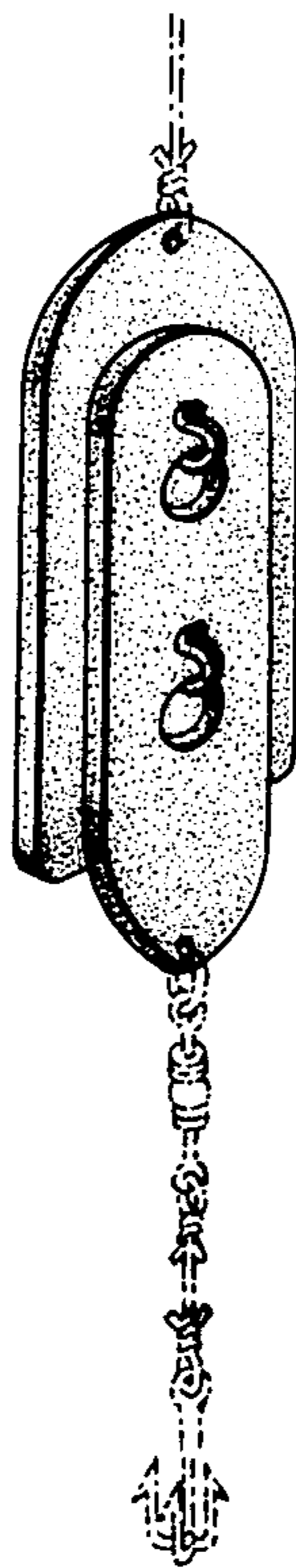

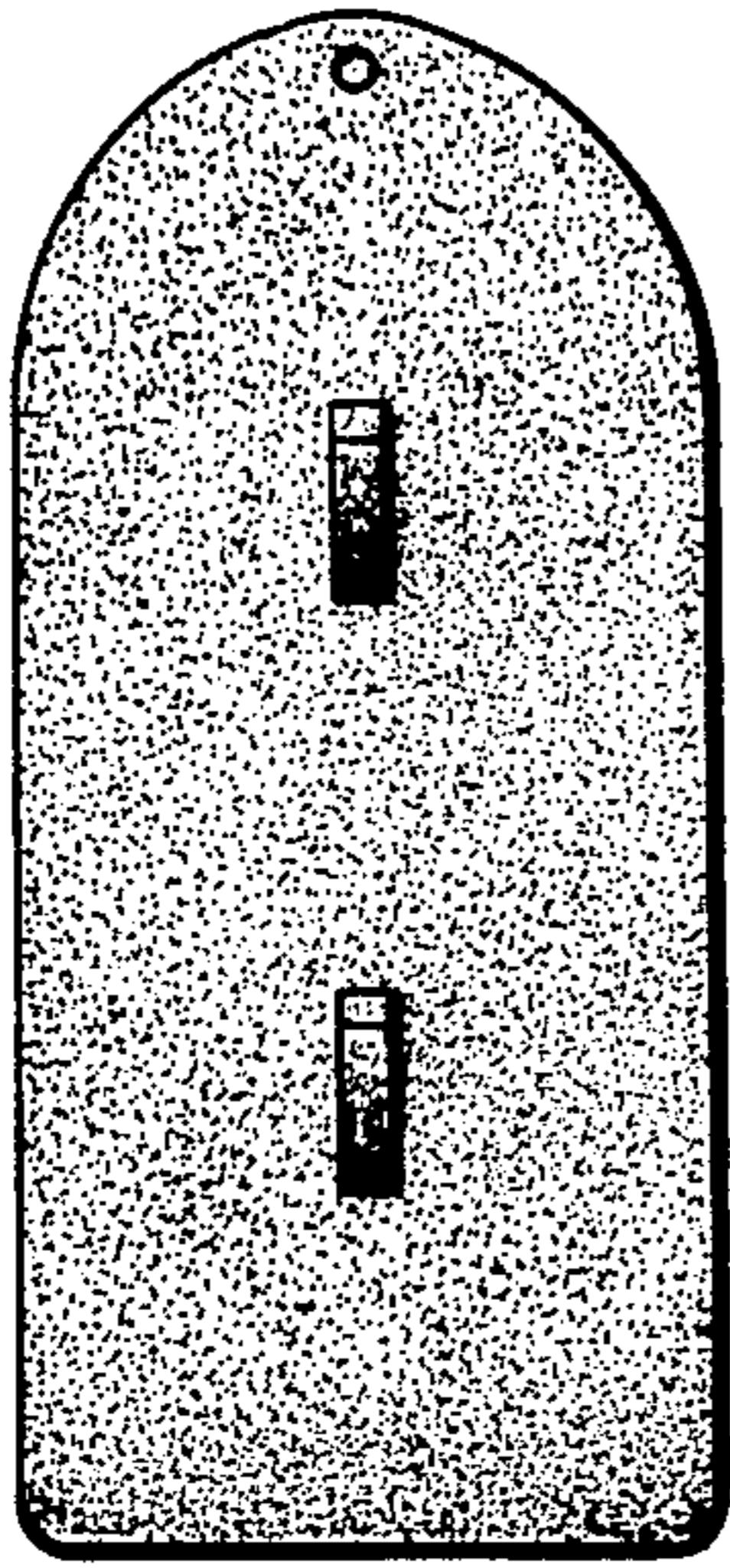

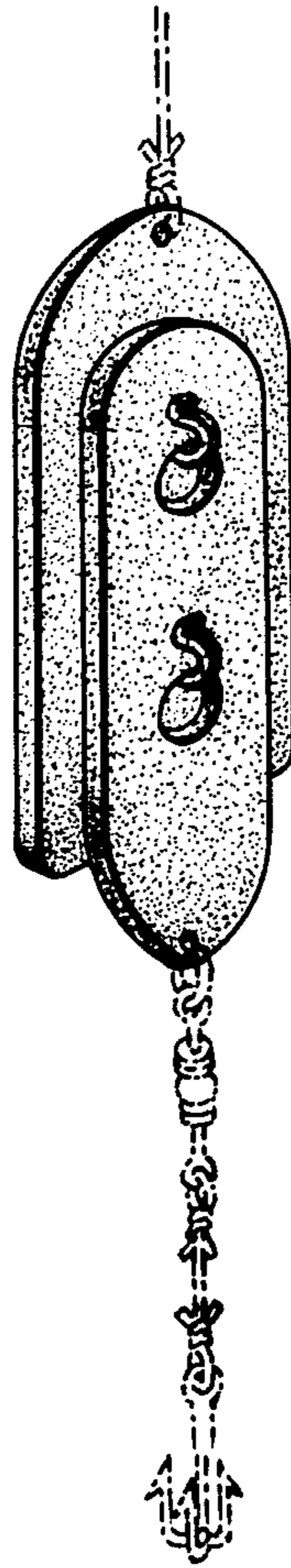

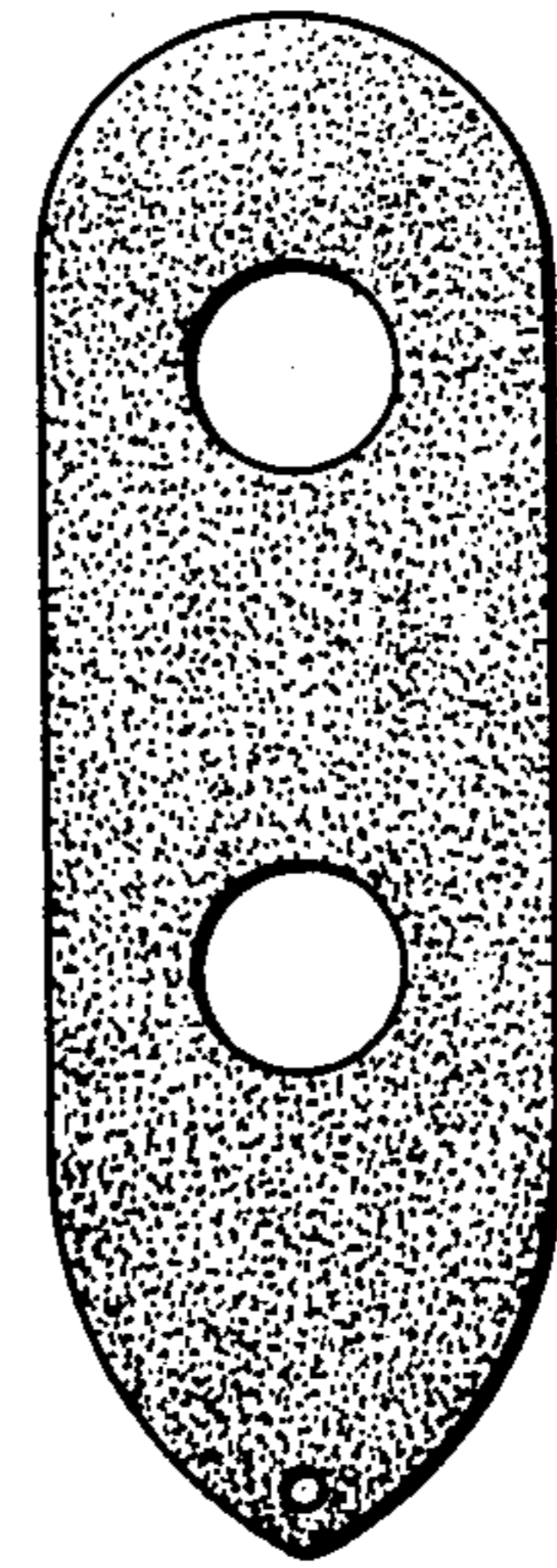
