[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a serving plate, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a top plan view of a serving plate showing my new design;

FIG. 2 is an elevational view thereof;

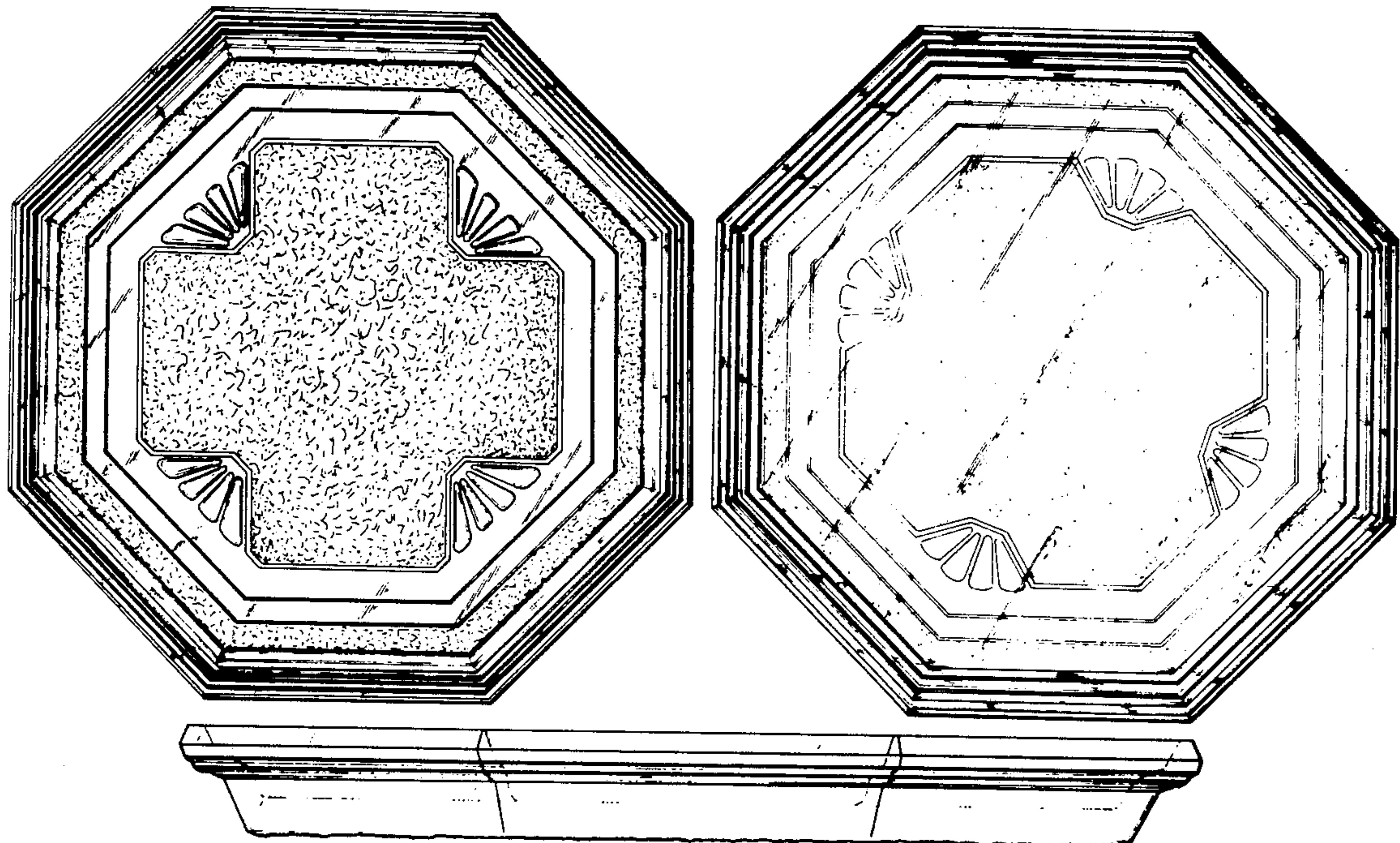
FIG. 3 is a bottom plan view thereof;

FIG. 4 is a fragmentary sectional view taken on lines 4-4 of FIG. 1;

FIG. 5 is a top plan view of a modification of the serving plate of FIGS. 1-4 wherein the bottom decoration is rearranged; and

FIG. 6 is a top perspective view of another modification of the serving plate of FIGS. 1-4 wherein two of the parallel sides are elongated.

The serving plate is formed of a transparent glass, and the serving or top surface is smooth, while the stippled or grainy surface is provided on the bottom of the serving plate but may be seen directly through the clear glass.



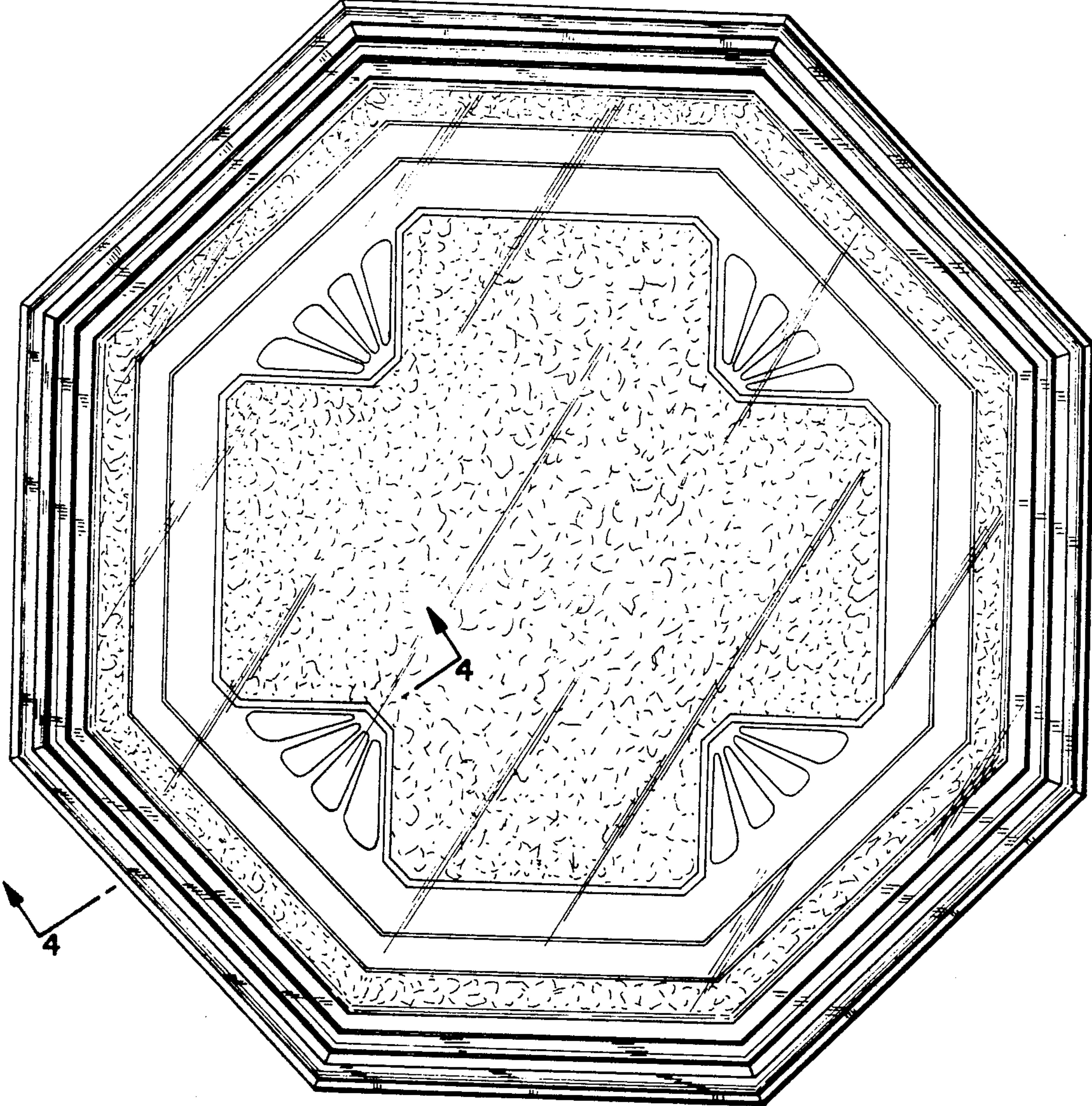

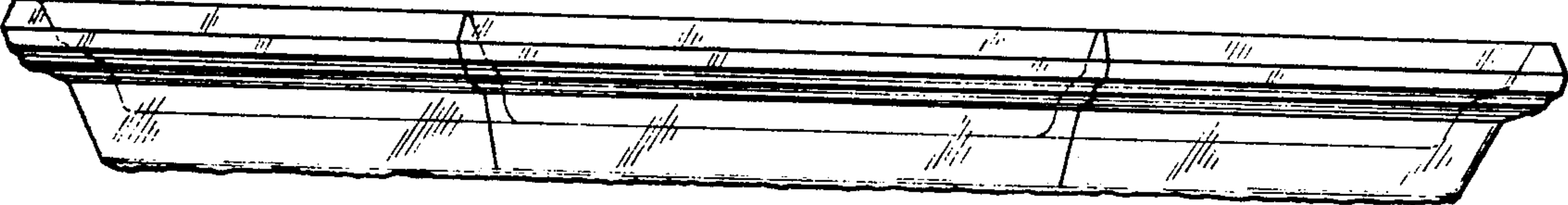

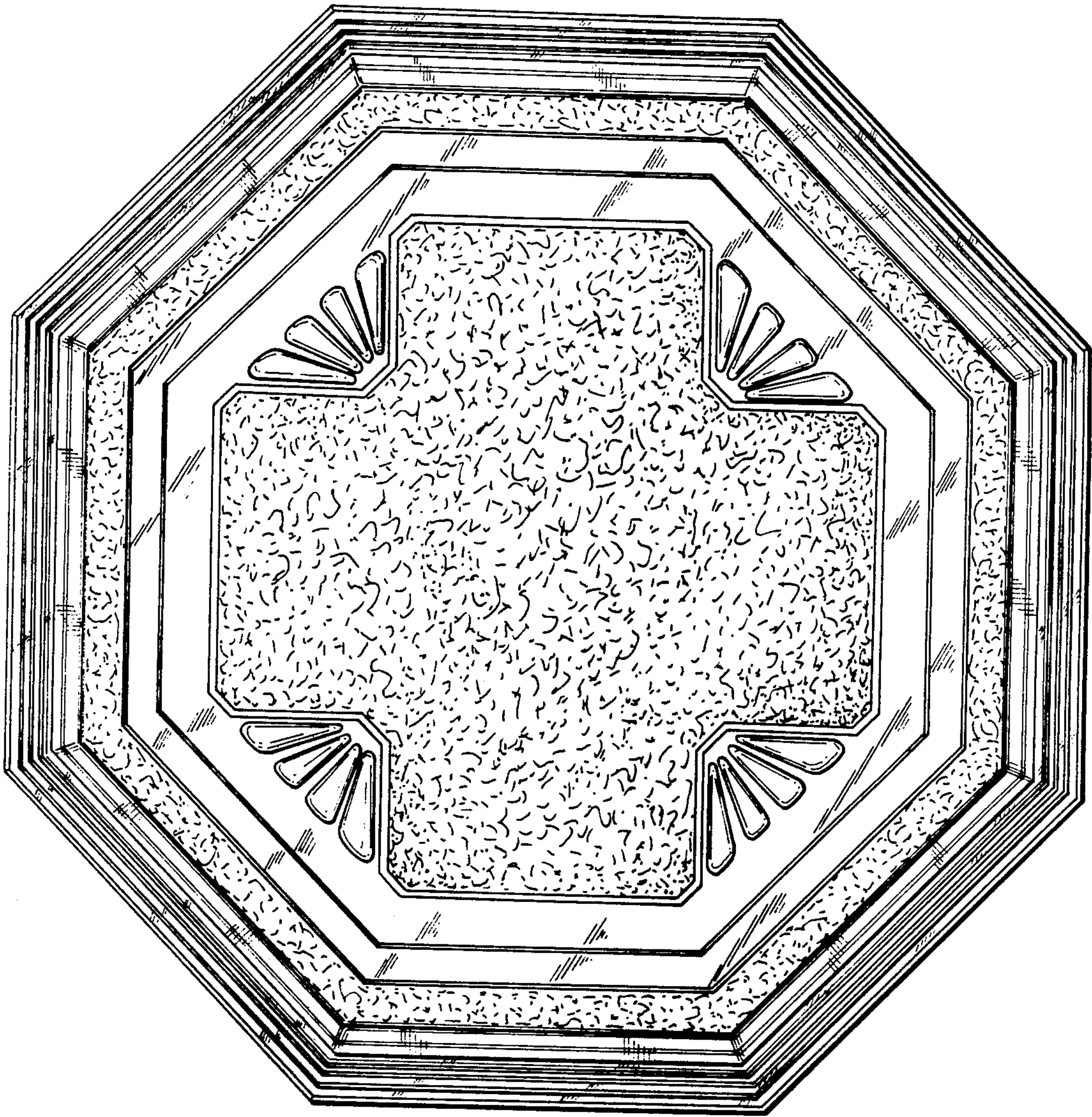

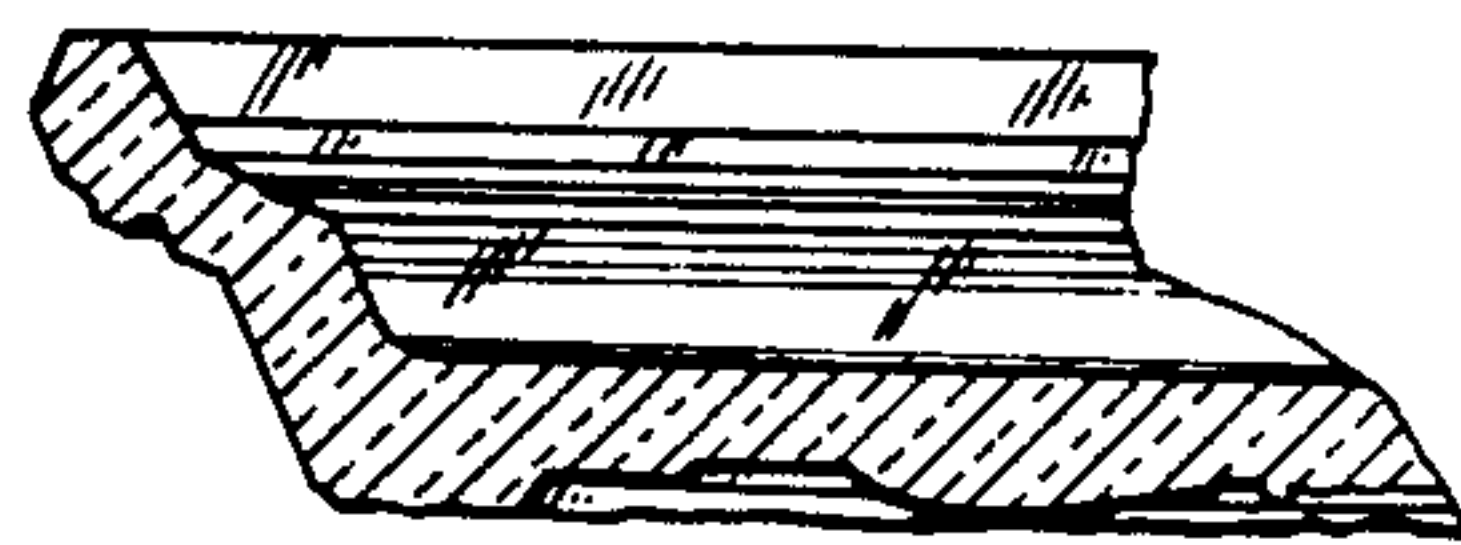

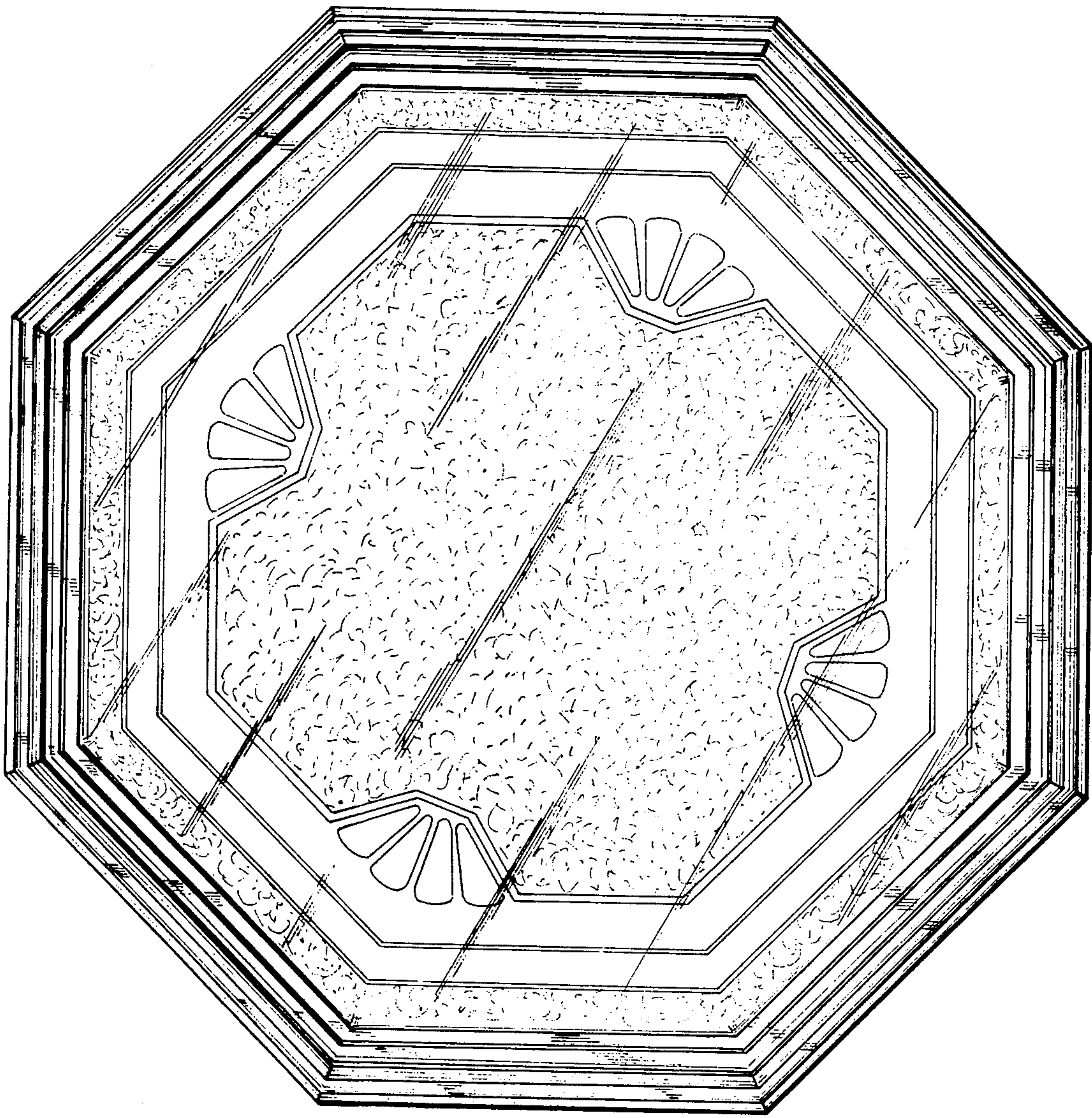

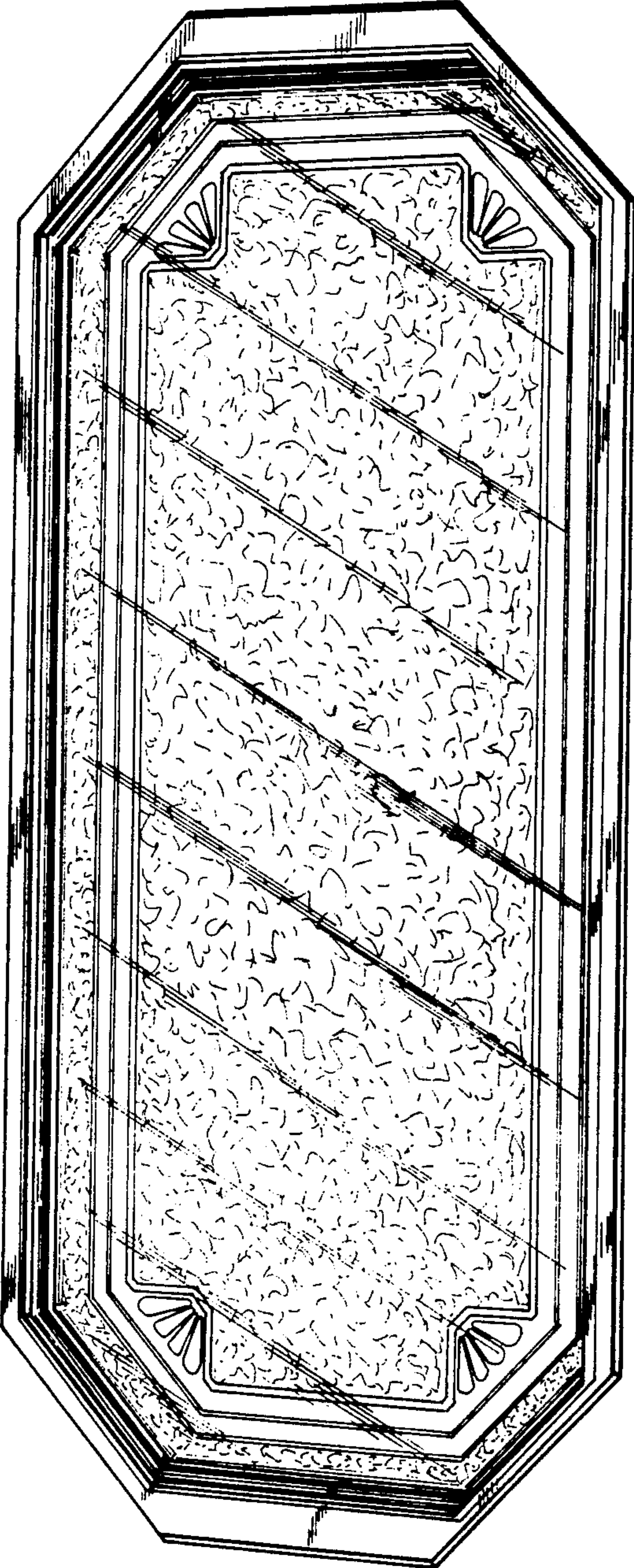
