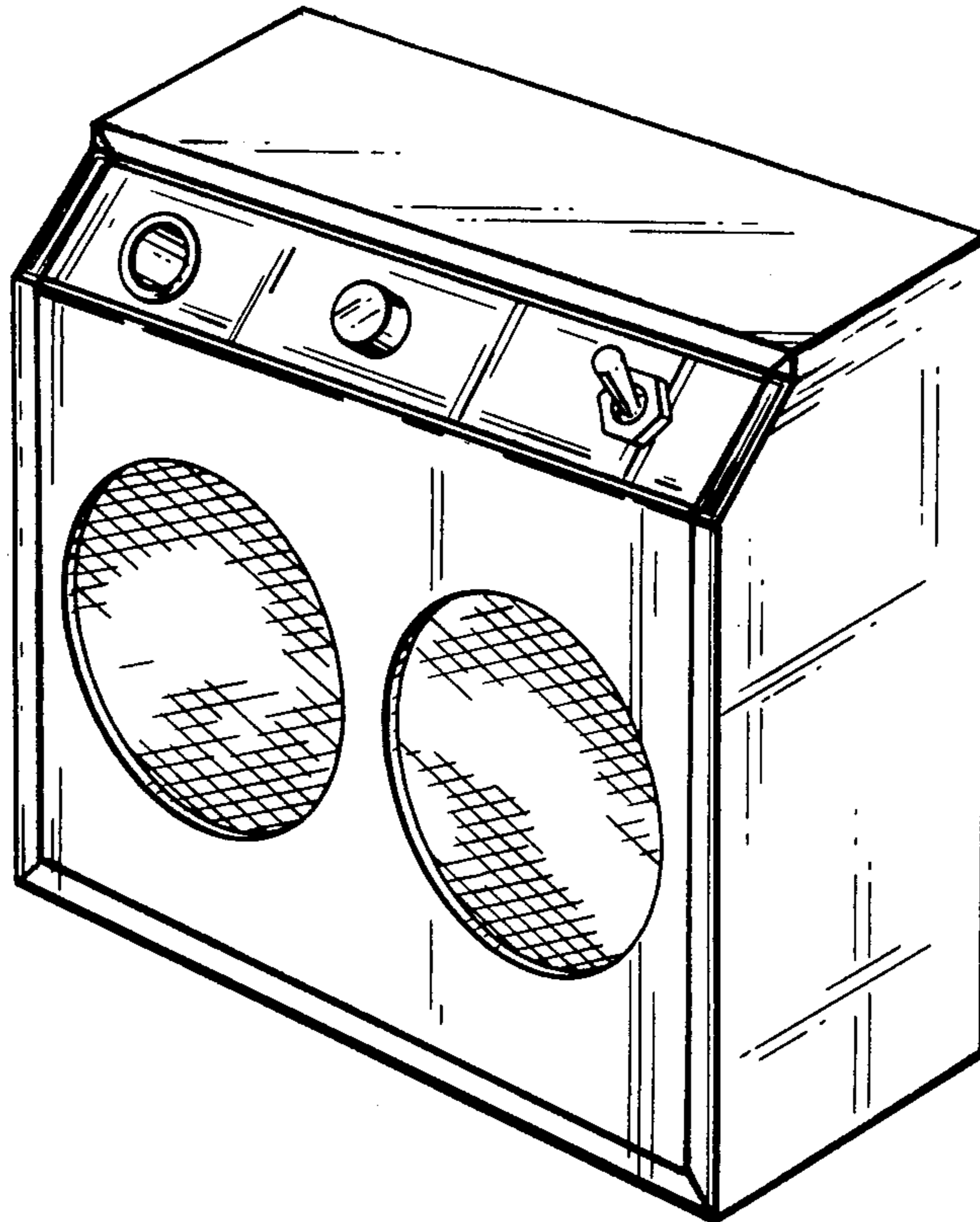

FIG. 6 is a bottom view thereof.



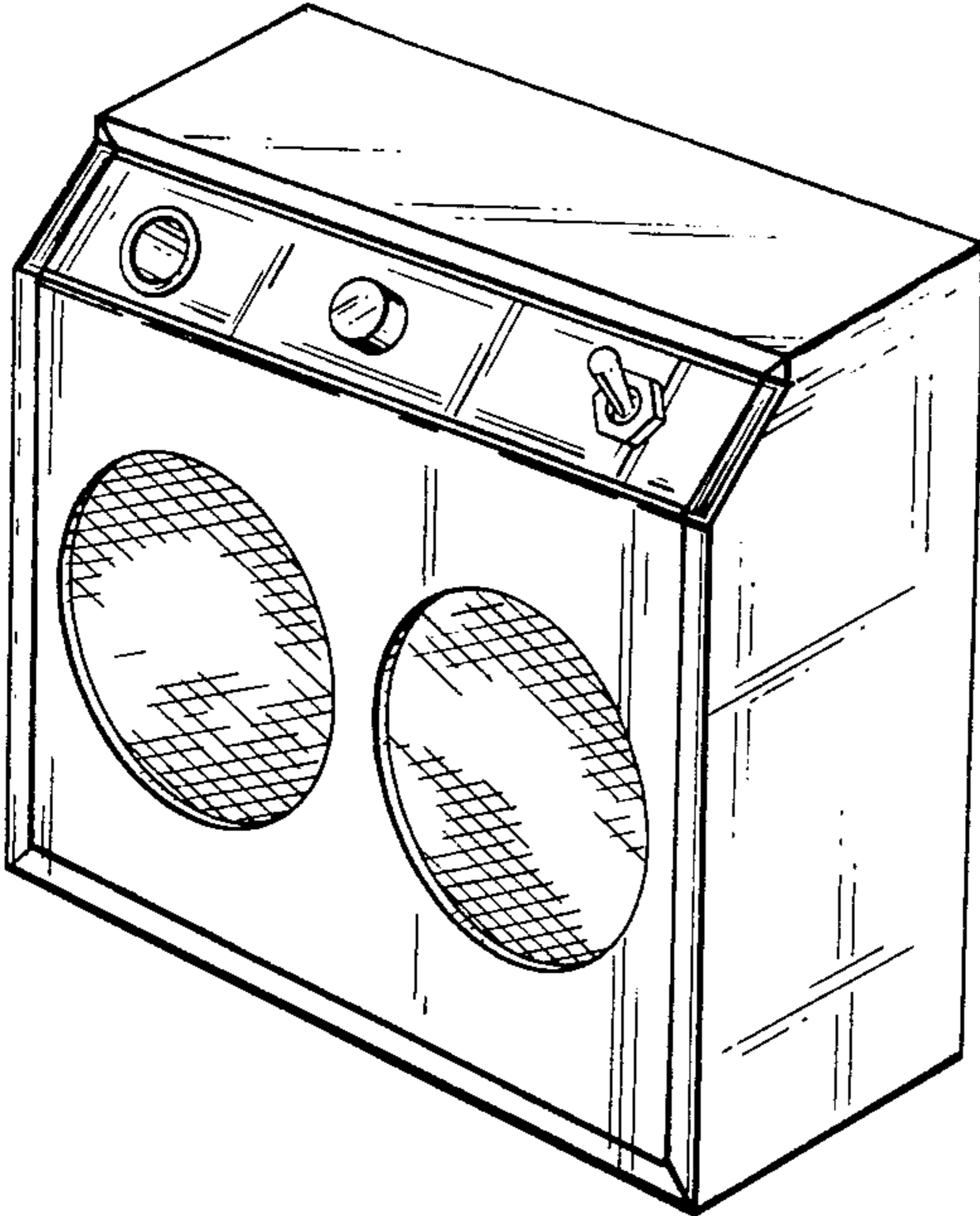

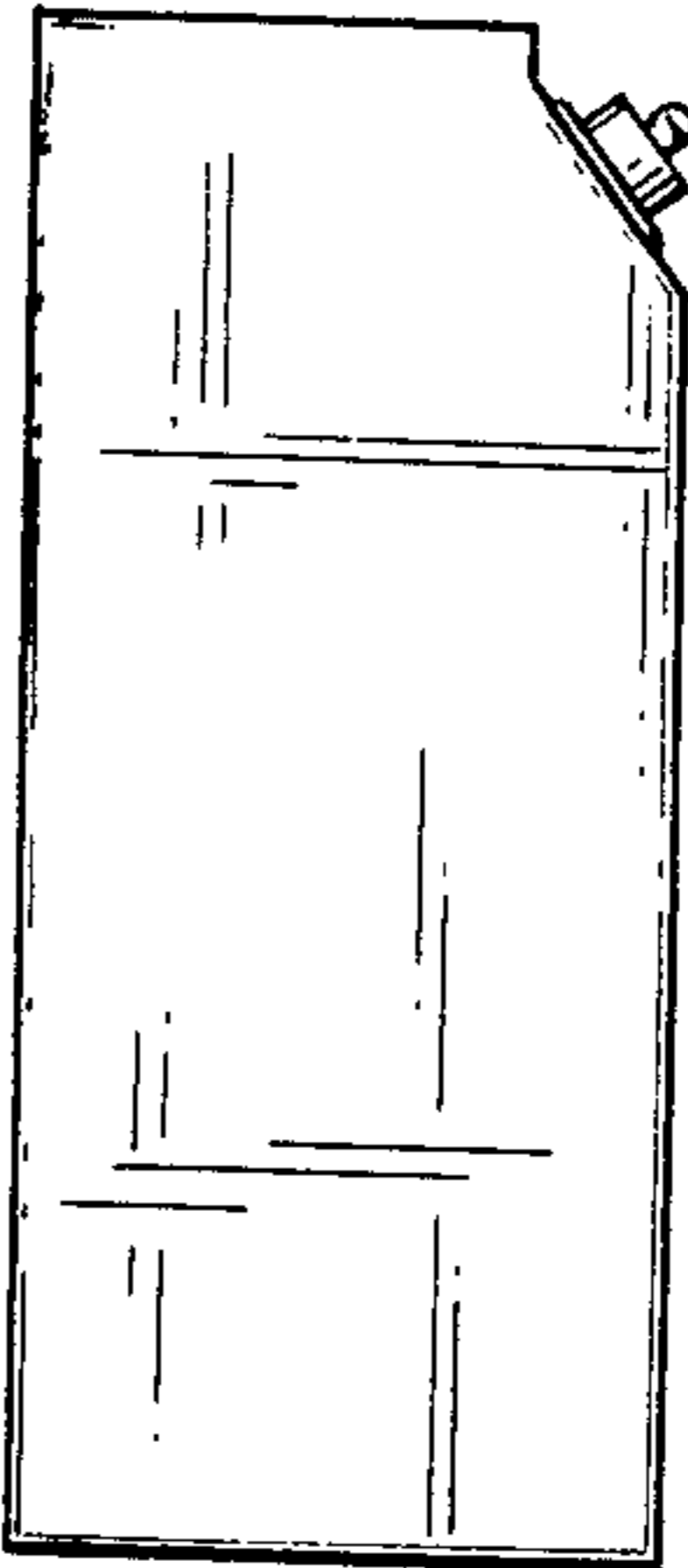

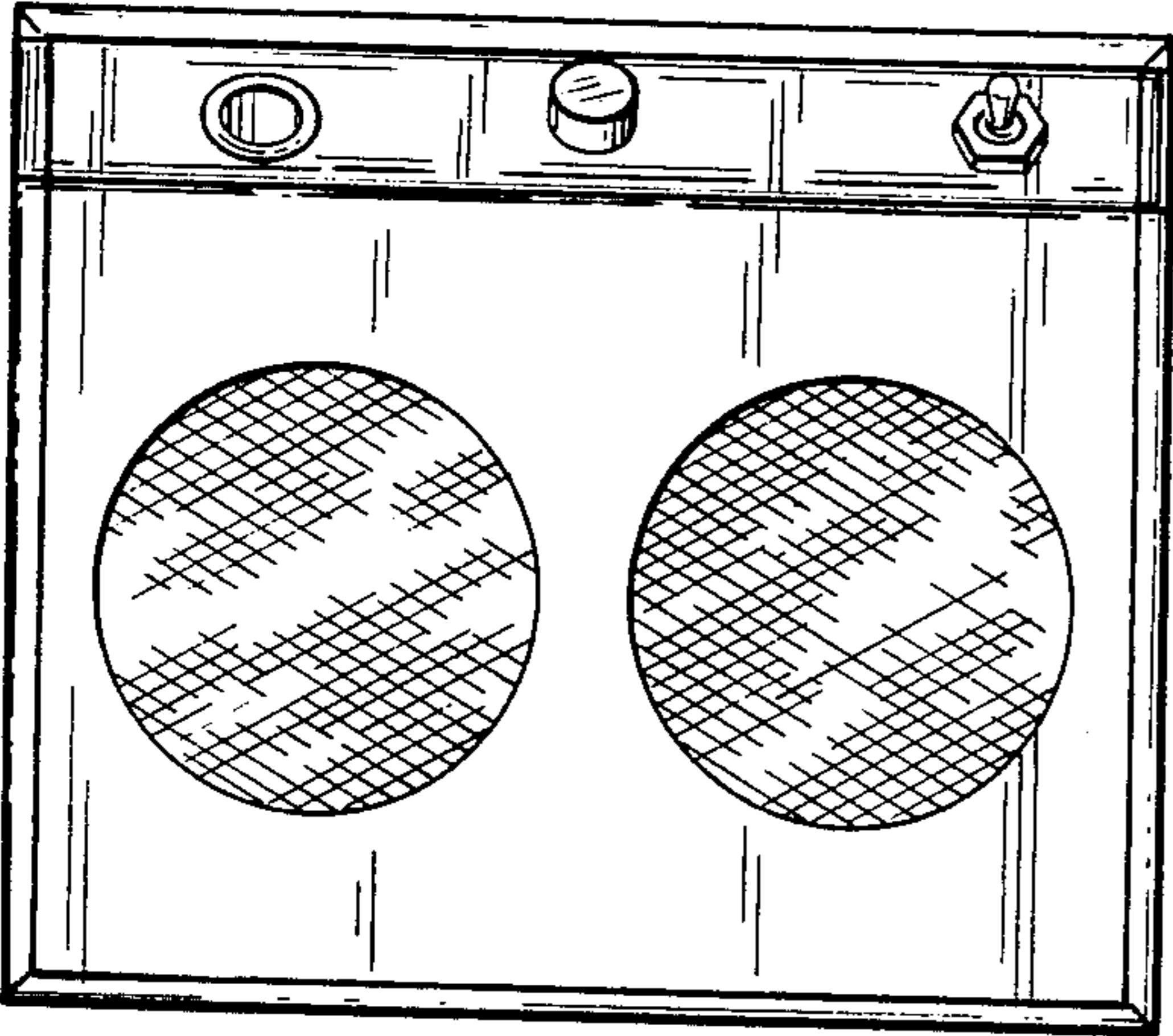

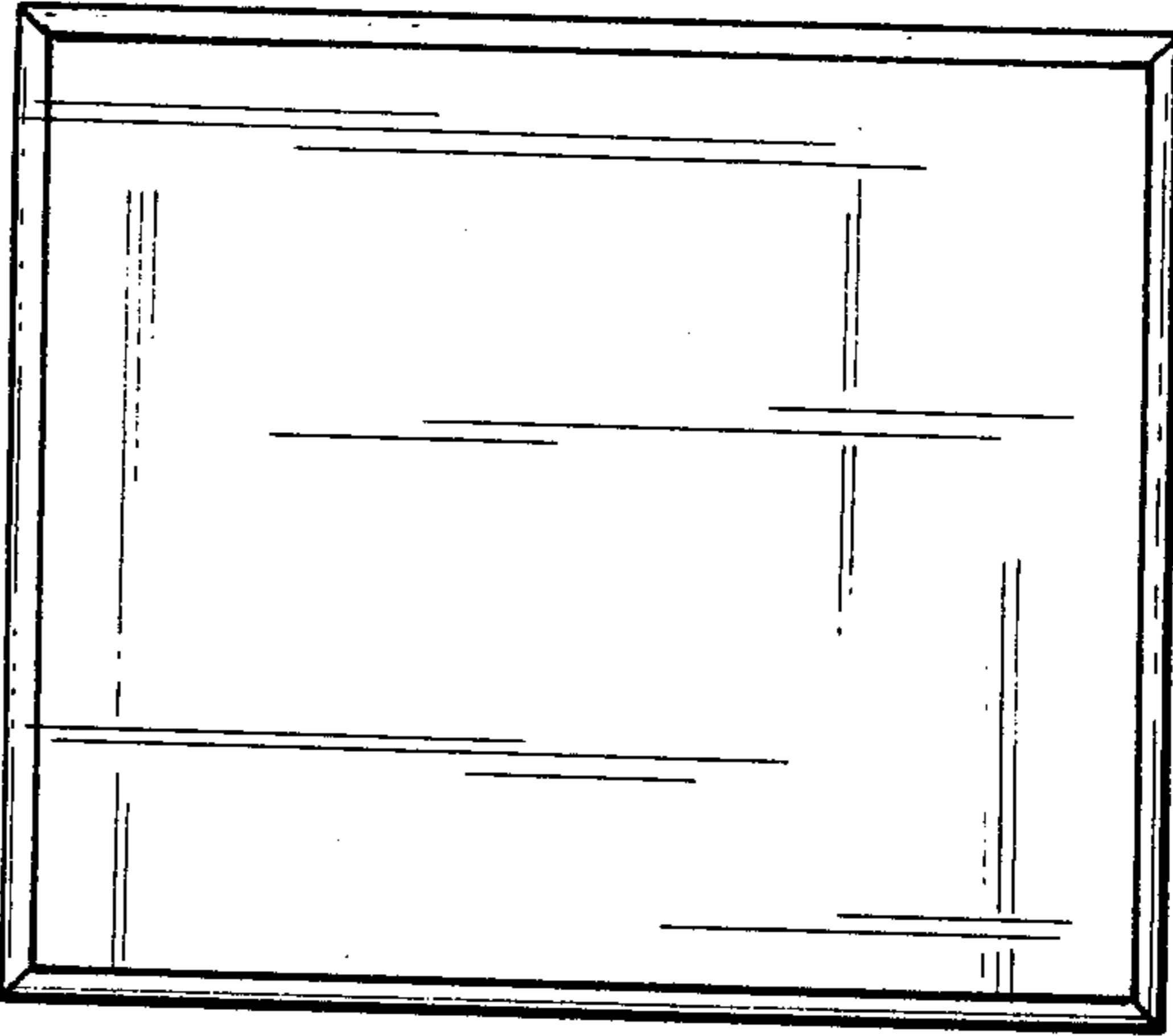

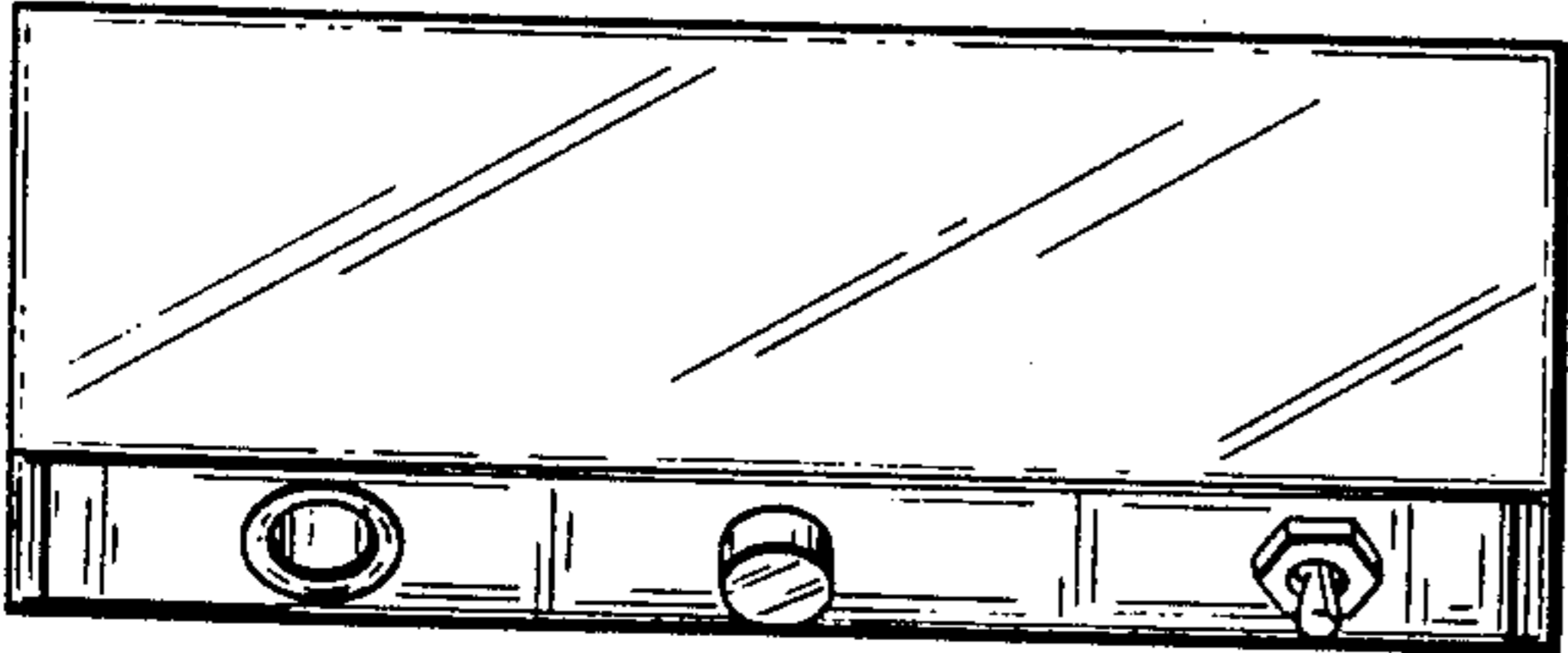

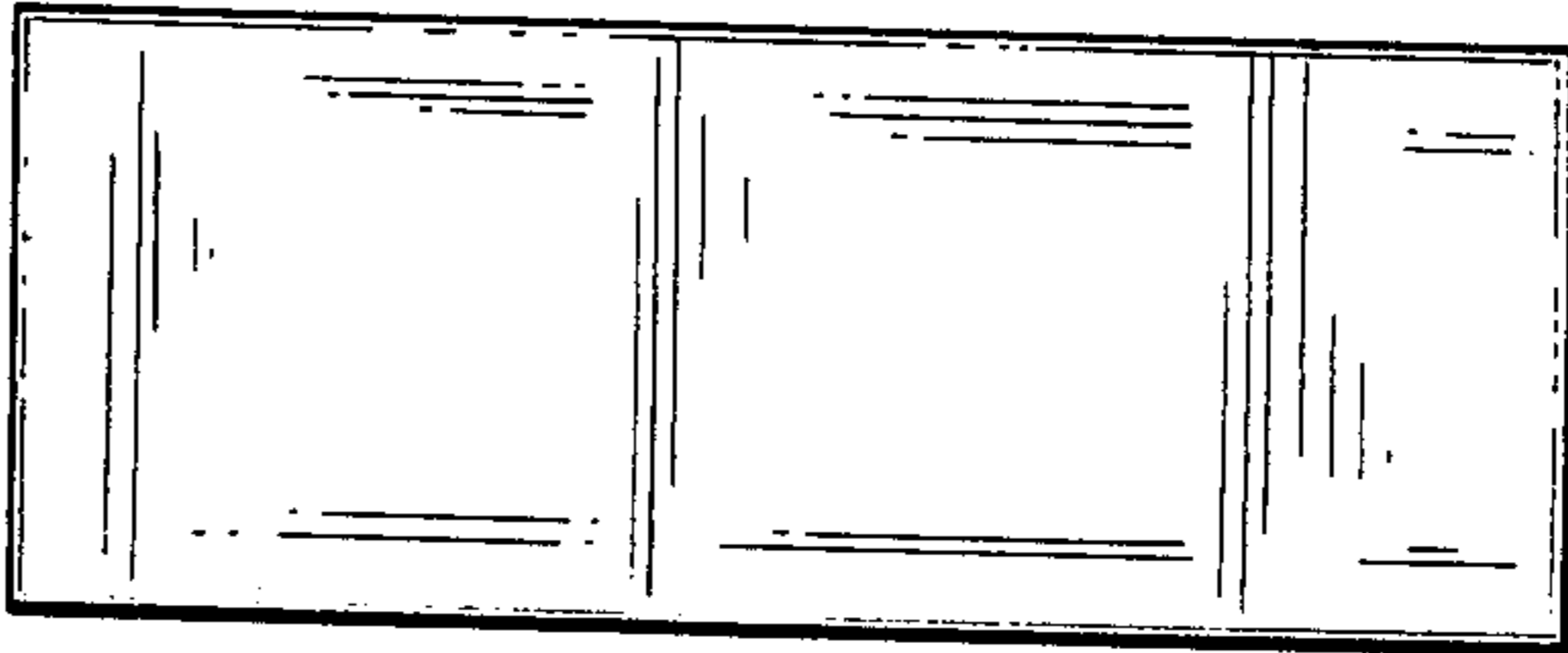
