The ornamental design for a tracking line storage container for a bow, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION


FIG. 1 is a side elevational view of the tracking line storage container showing our new design with a bow and arrow assembly being depicted in phantom for purposes of defining the environment;

FIG. 2 is a first side elevational view hereof;

FIG. 3 is a second side elevational view hereof, and

FIG. 4 is a first end elevational view hereof.

The present invention is characterized by a cylindrical container having a truncated end as well as an open receiving end. The design hereof provides a stream lined appearance which does not interfere with the line of sight of the hunter. The geometric configuration accorded the bends of the mounting bracket provide an aesthetic appearance to the overall design.




