FIG. 1 is a front perspective view of a combined medical diagnostic instrument and induction charger therefor showing our new design;

FIG. 4 is an opposite side elevation view thereof on a reduced scale.

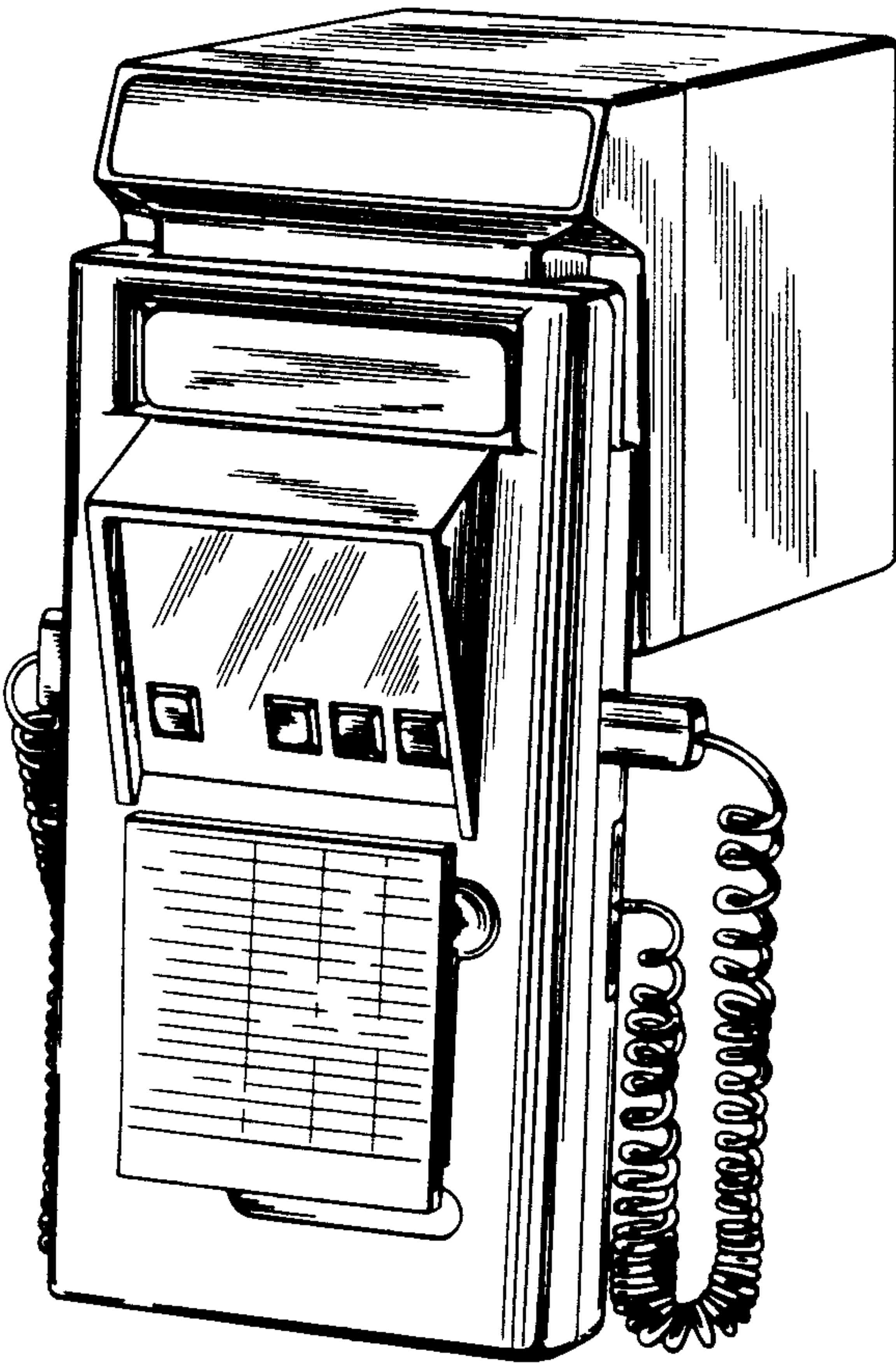
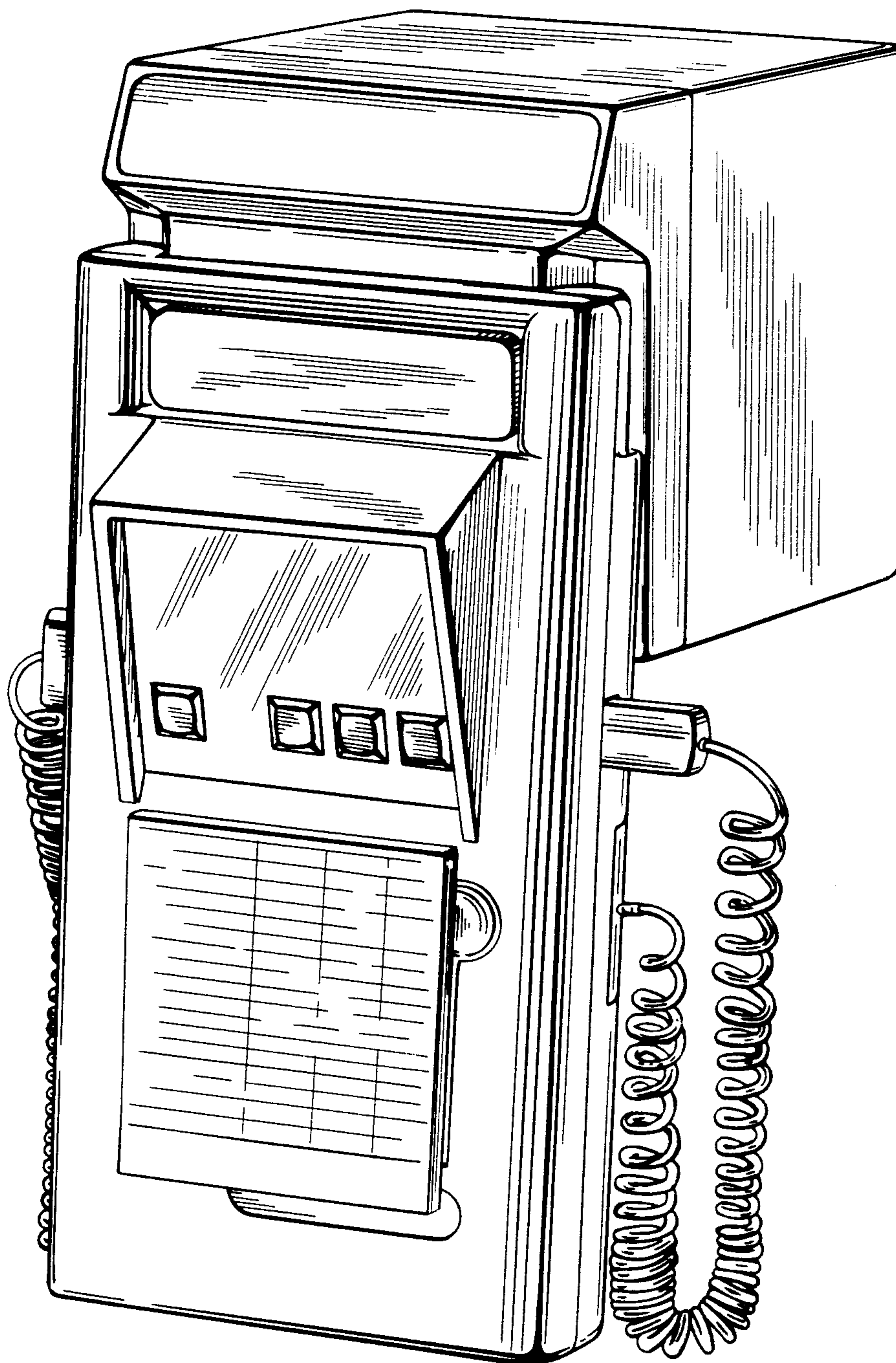

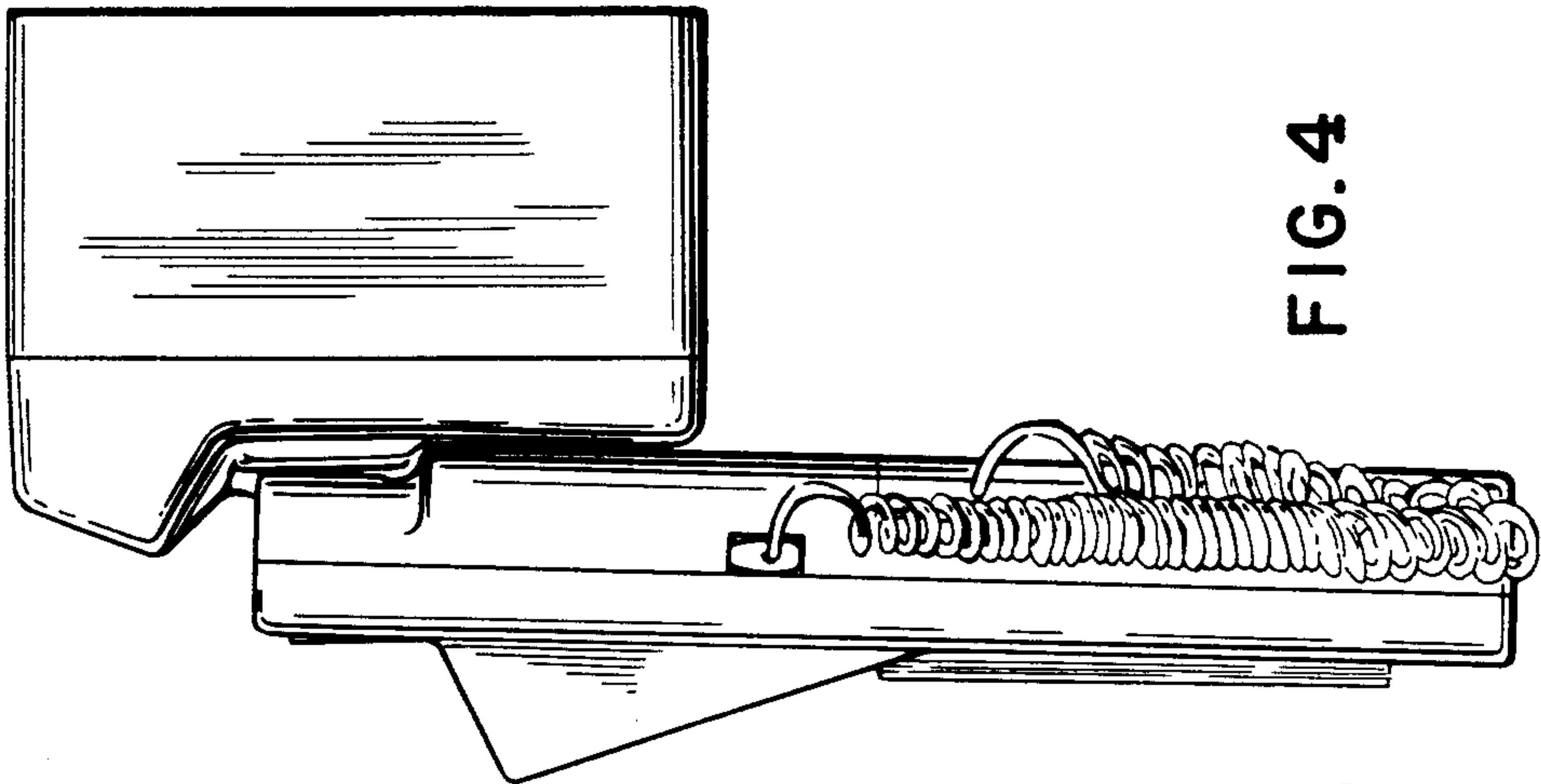

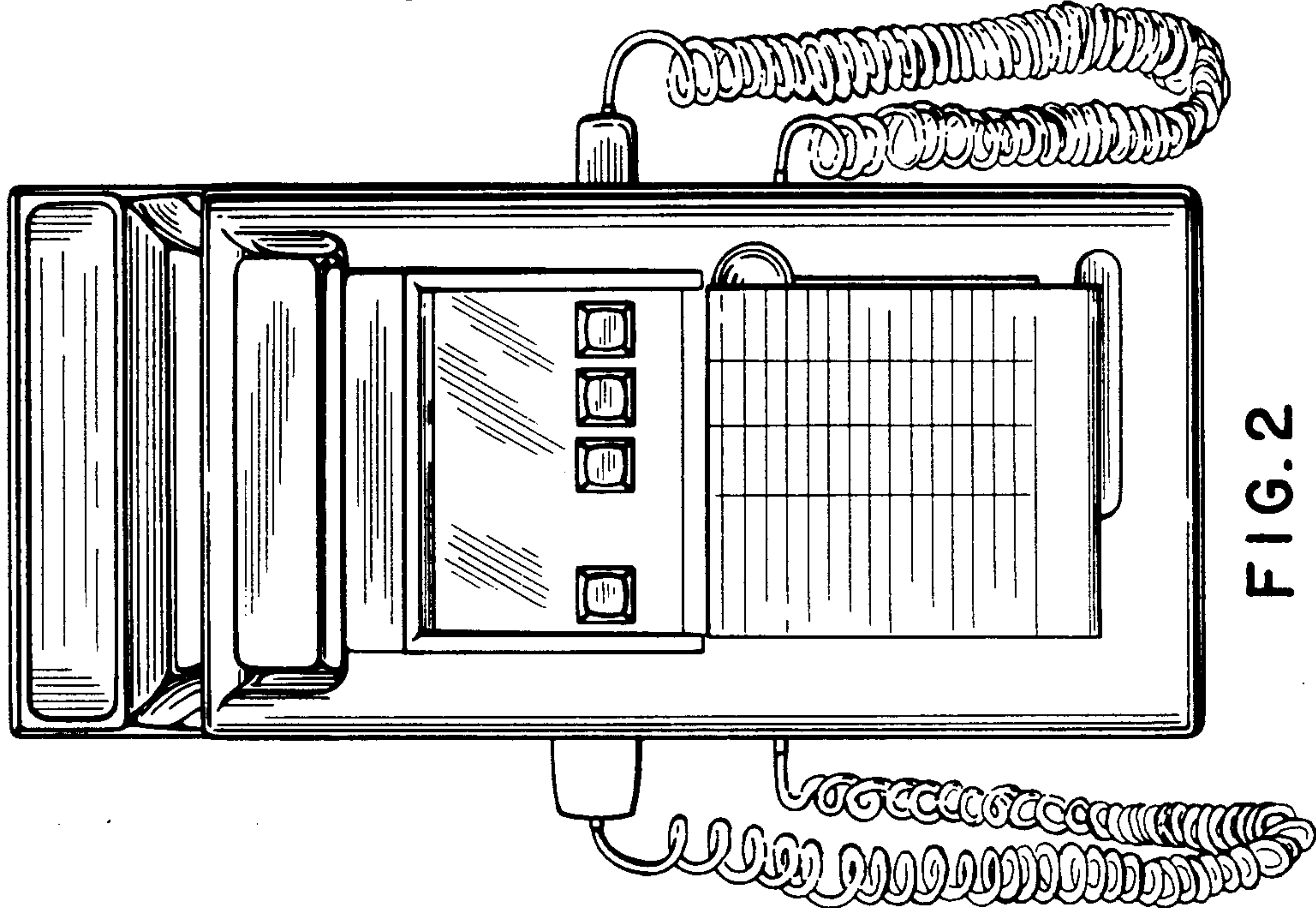

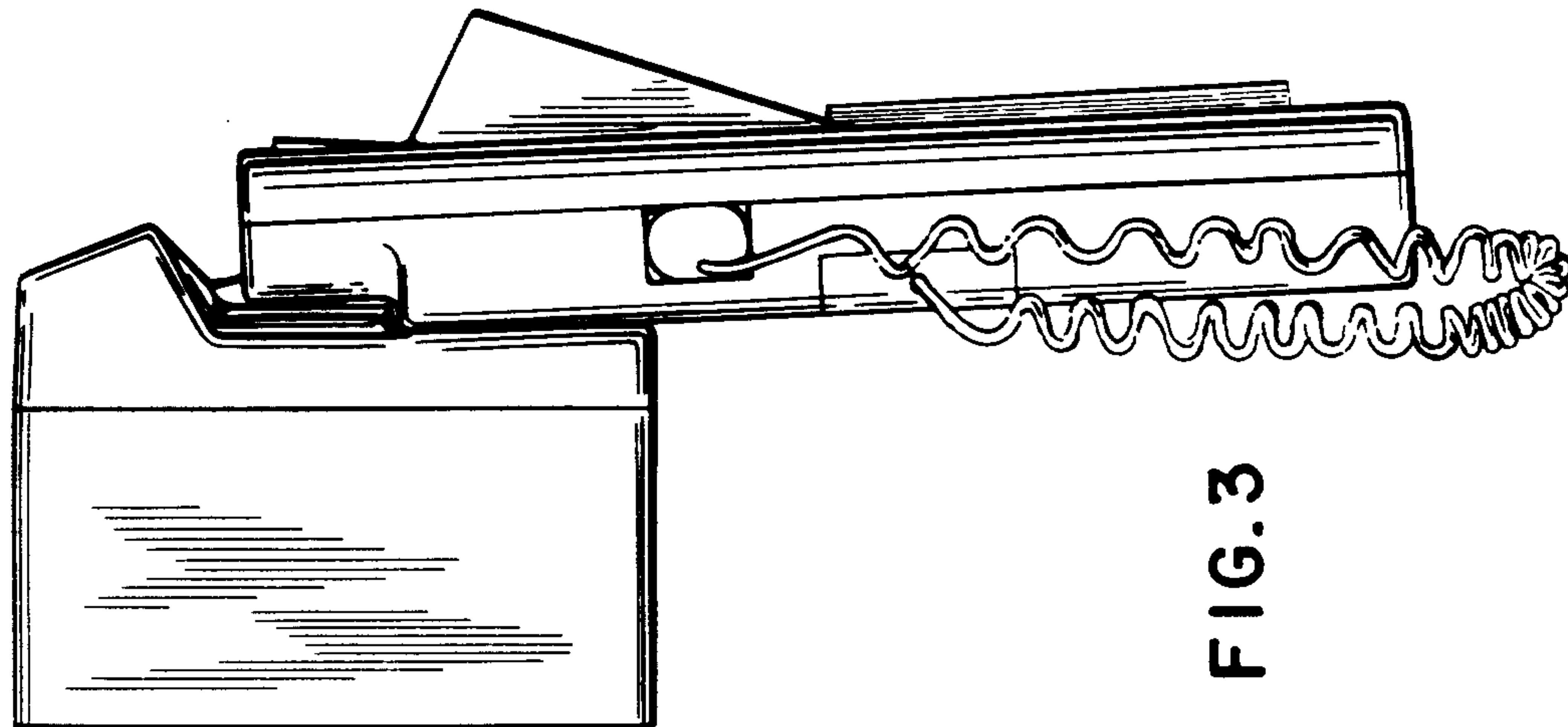
