[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a projection television receiver cabinet, substantially as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front elevational view of a projection television receiver showing my new design; FIG. 2 is a view similar to FIG. 1 with the screen cover in raised condition and the drawer in open condition; FIG. 3 is a right side perspective view; and FIG. 4 is a top plan view of the cabinet in the condition of FIG. 1.

The rear of the cabinet is plain.

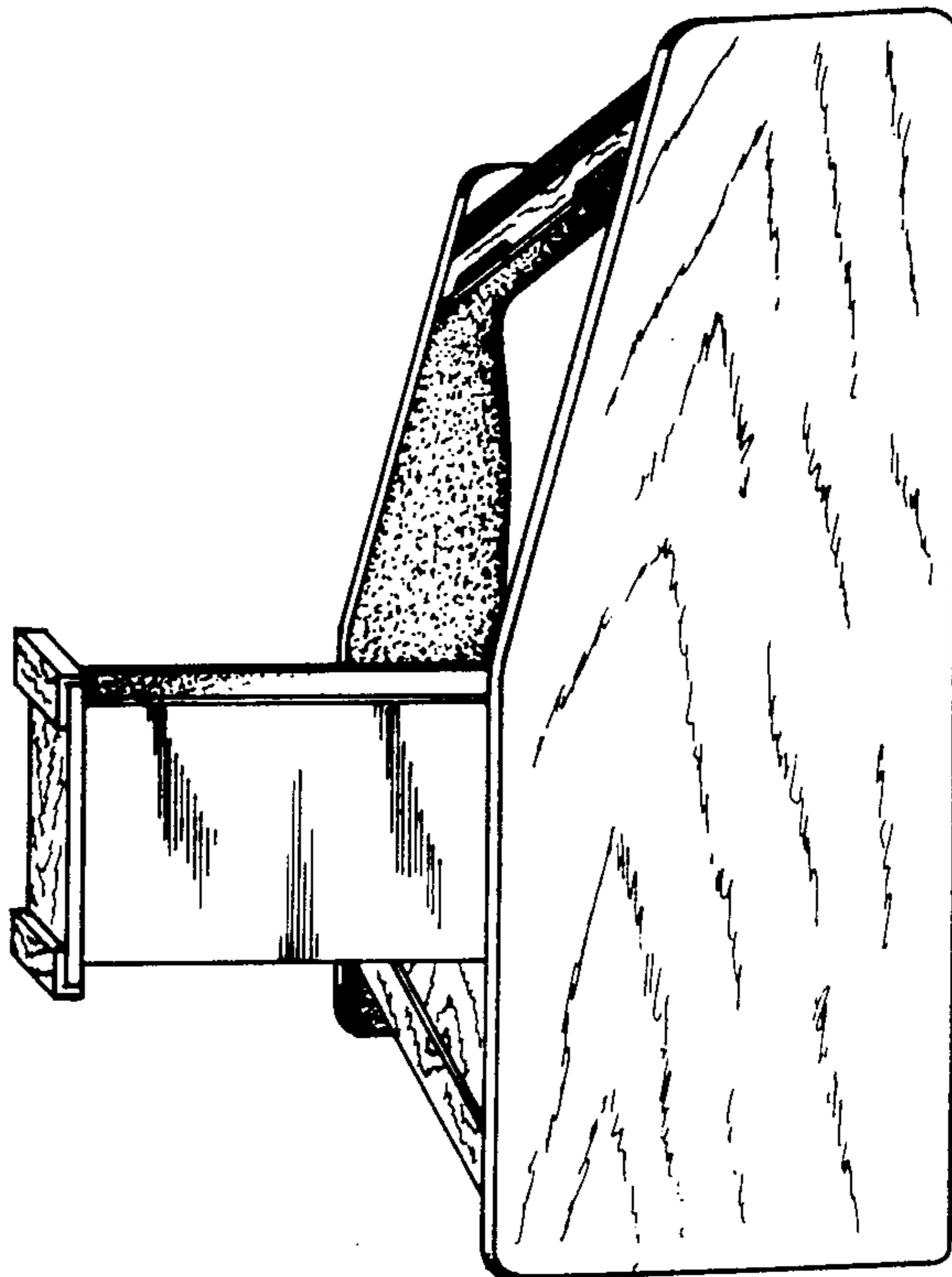
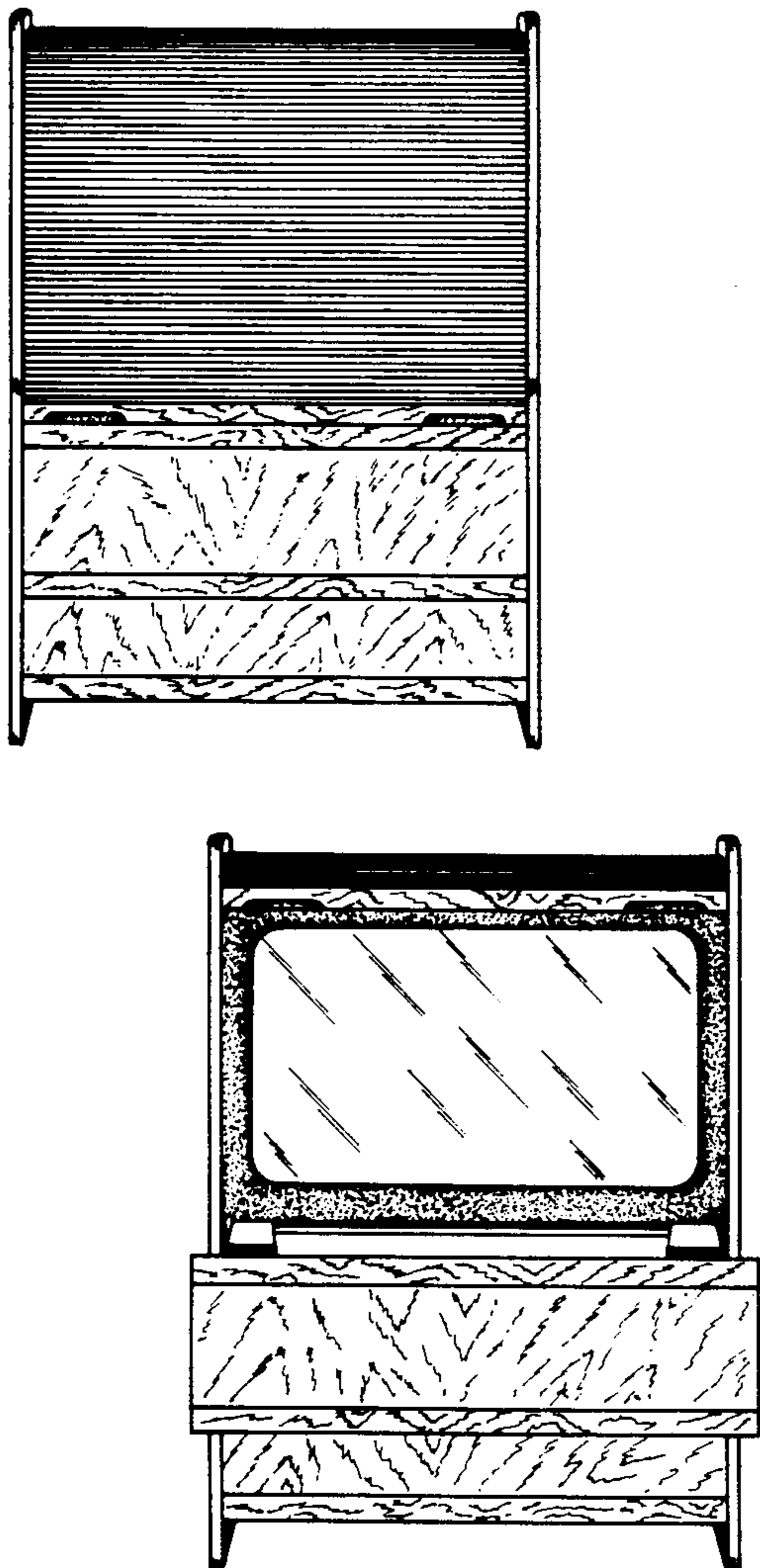

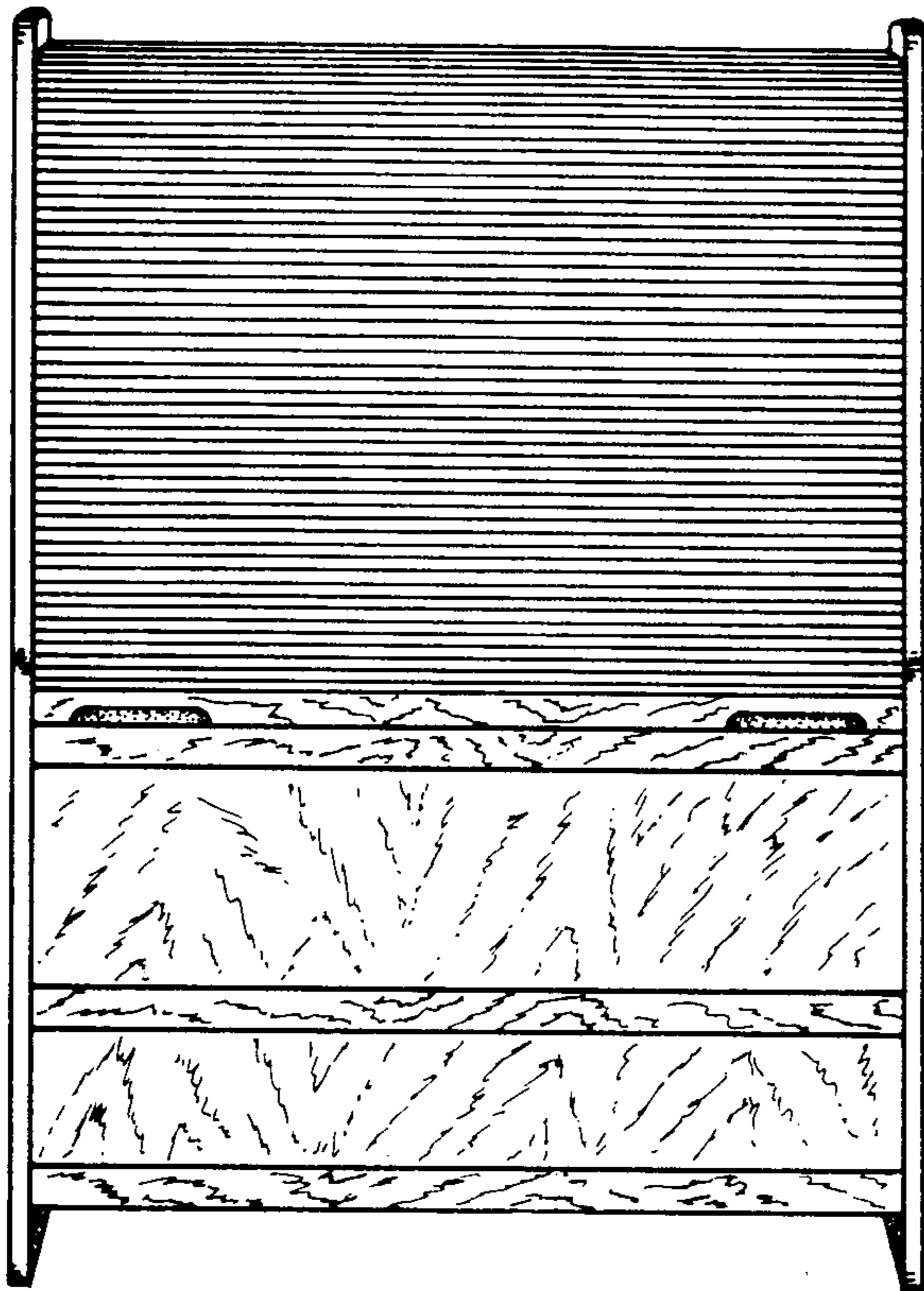
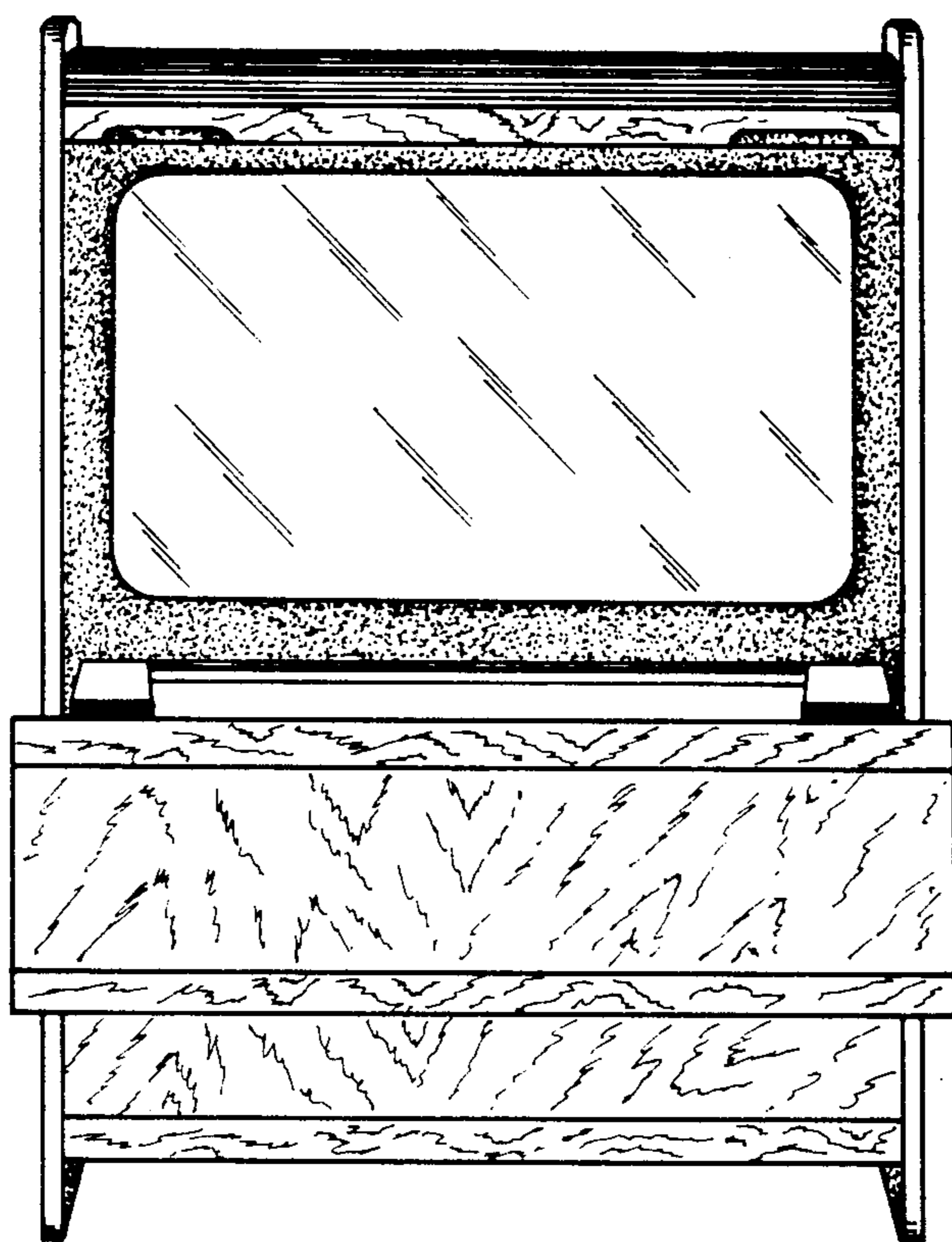

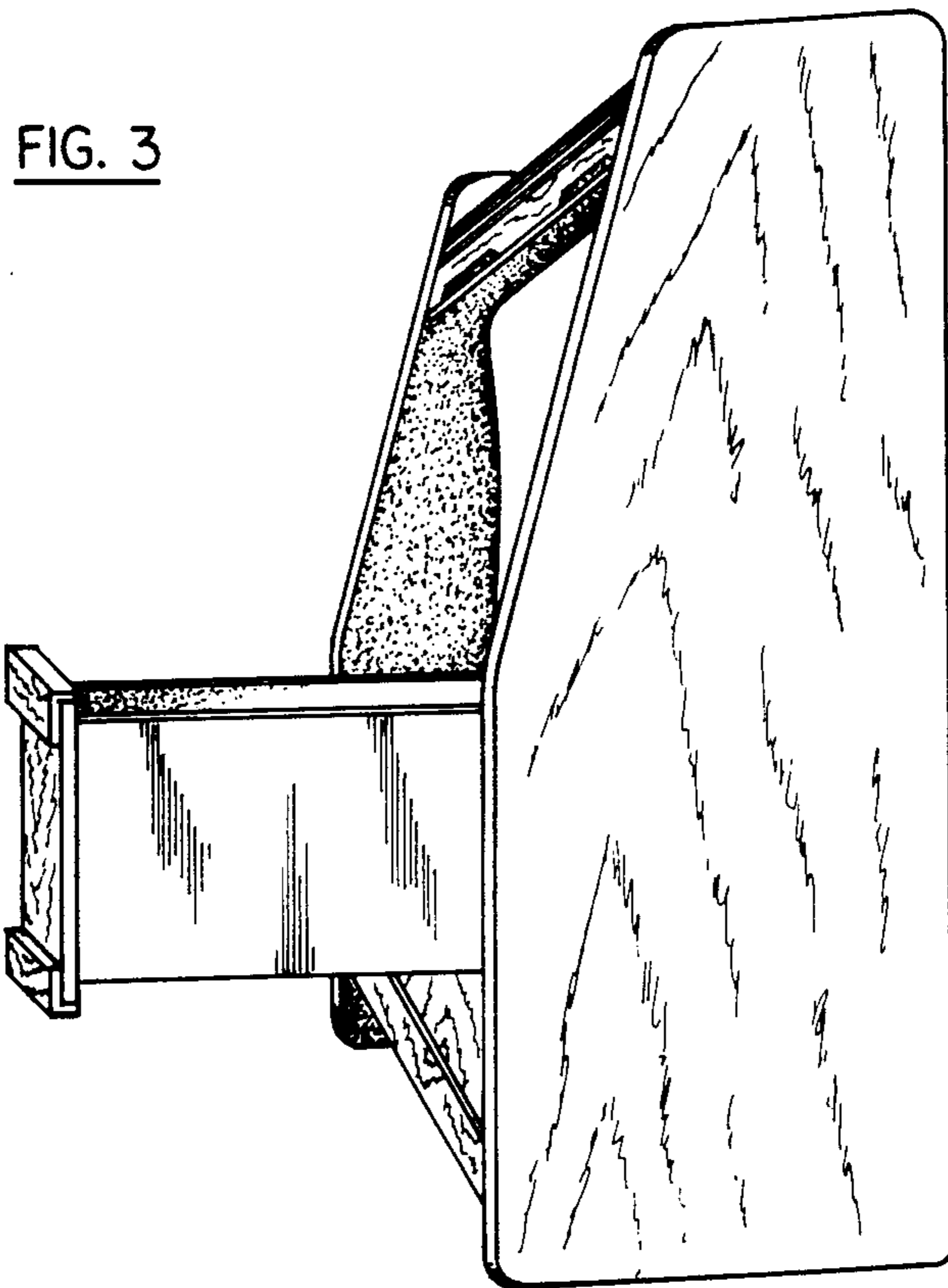
