FIG. 1 is a perspective view showing one end and one side of a radiator cap remover, showing our new design, a perspective of the opposite end and opposite side being a mirror image thereof;

FIG. 2 is a front elevational view of one side, a portion of the protective cone being broken away to show more clearly the inclined blades which bitingly engage the smooth perimeter of some types of radiator caps or which interferingly engage the lugs or denticulations on other types of radiator when urged downwardly thereon.

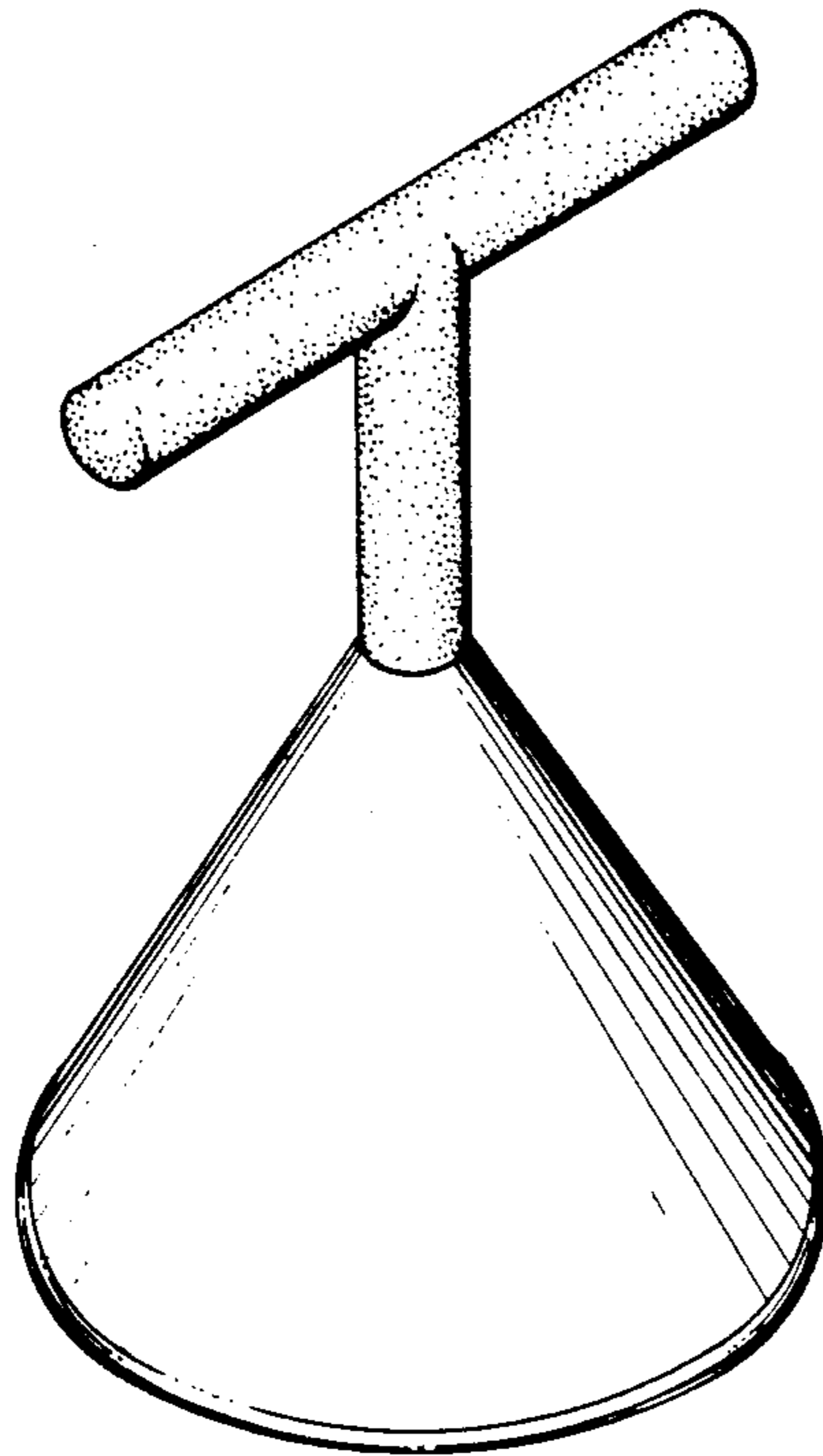

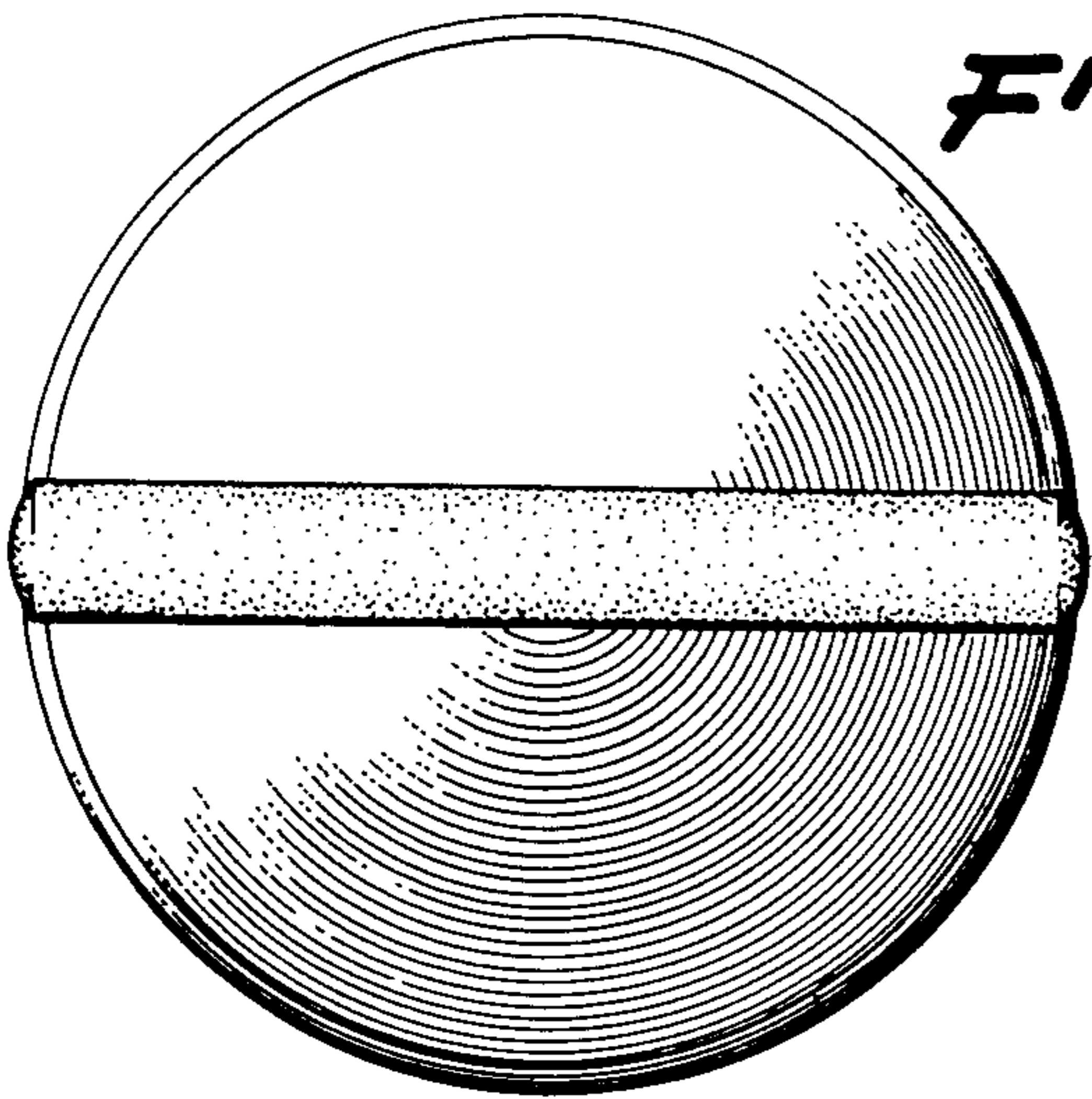

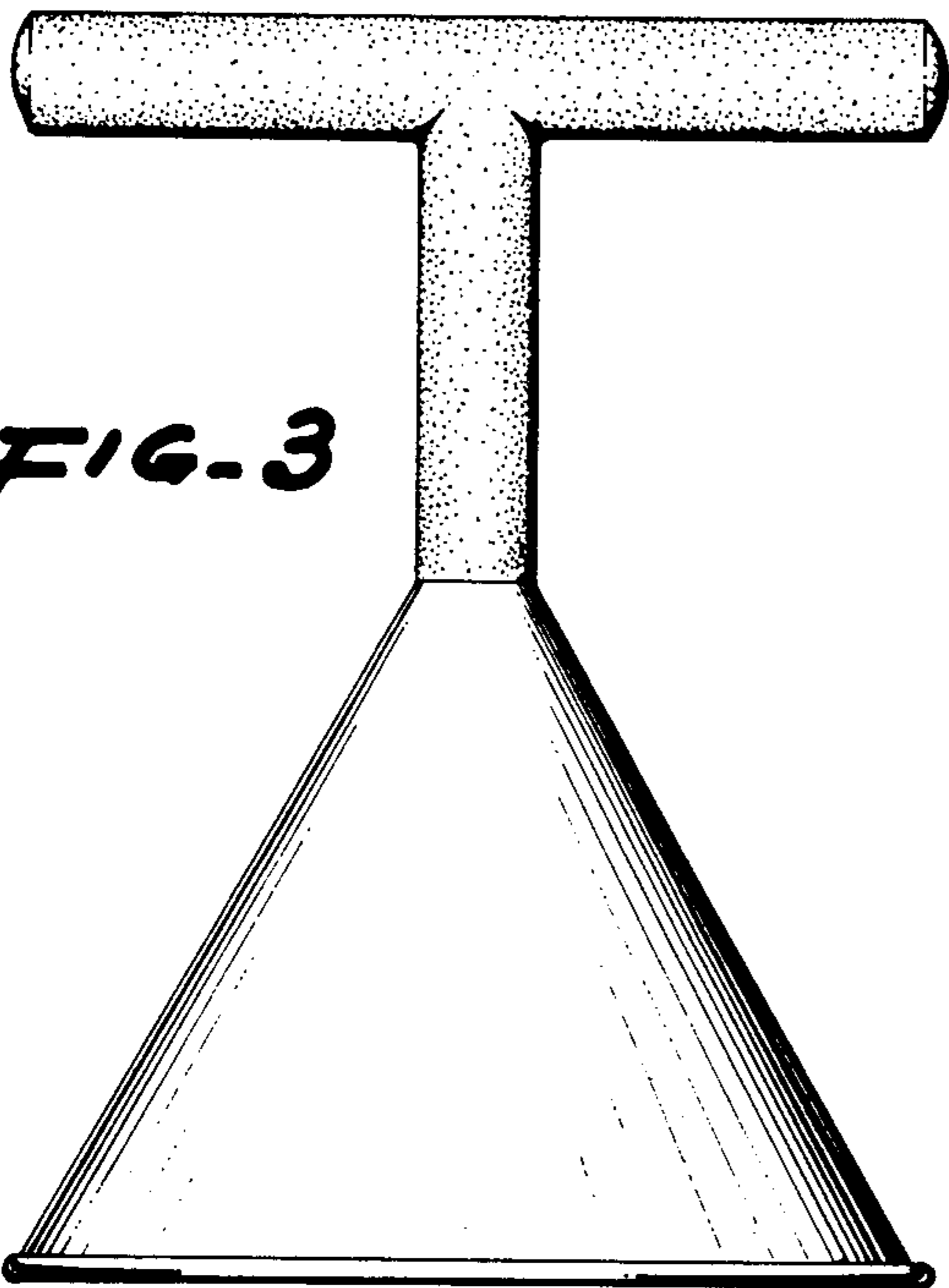

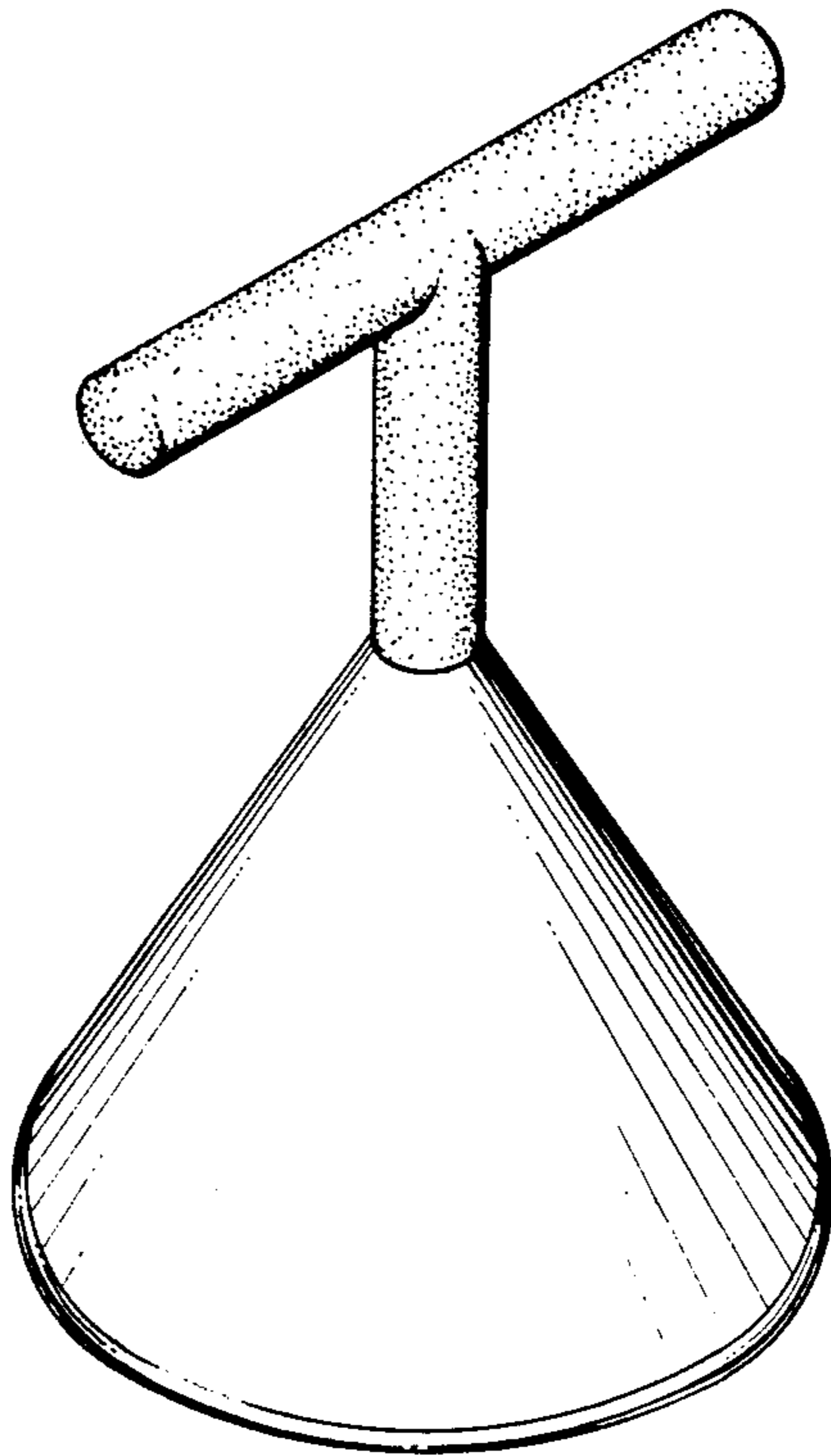

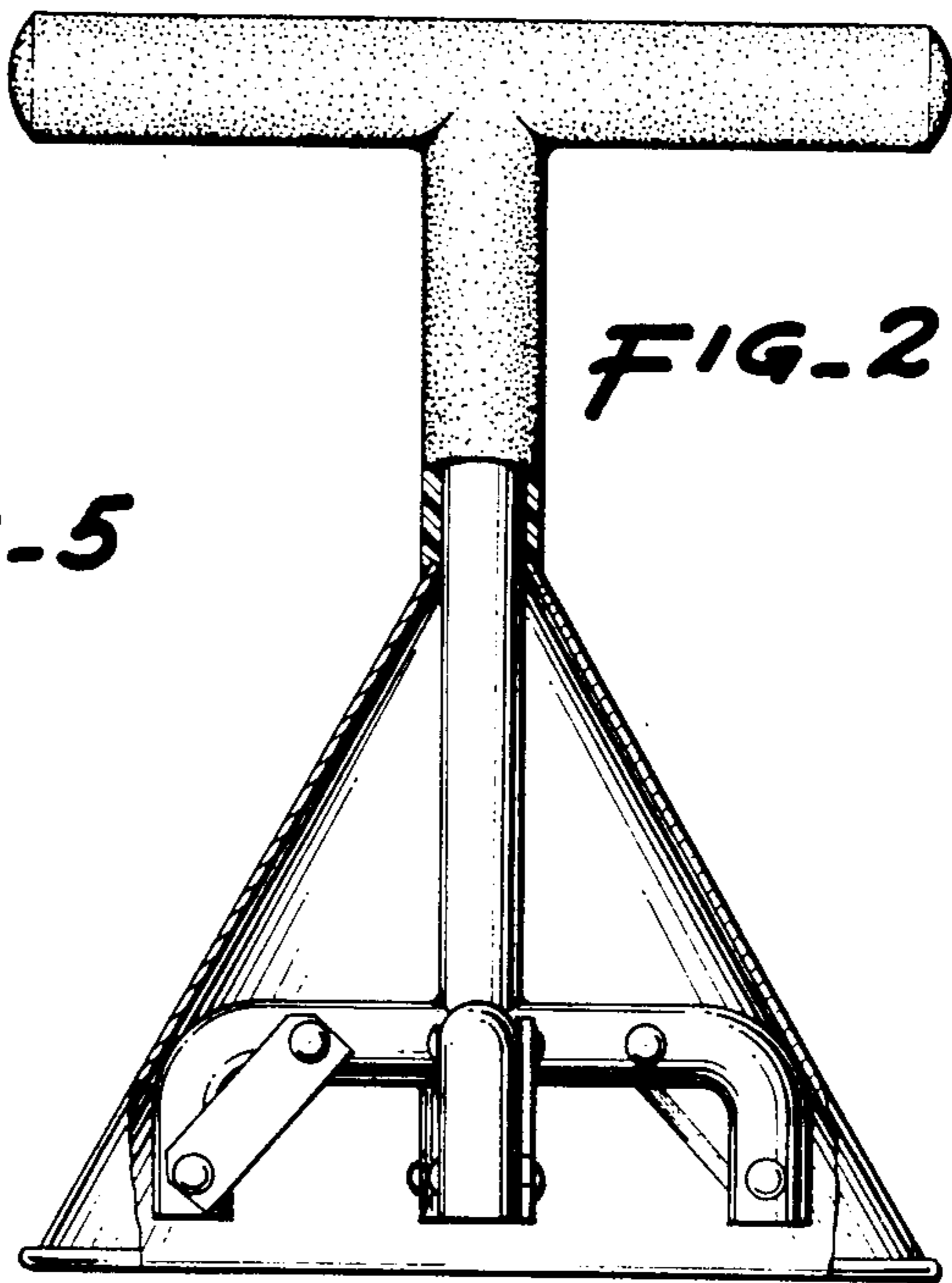
