The ornamental design for a player sequence indicator sign, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of a player sequence indicator sign showing my new design;
 FIG. 2 is a perspective view of a second embodiment thereof; and
 FIG. 3 is a perspective view of a third embodiment thereof.

The sides not shown are similar to the sides shown and the backs not shown are planar and unornamented.

The broken line disclosure of the name tags in all views is for illustrative purposes only and forms no part of the claimed design.

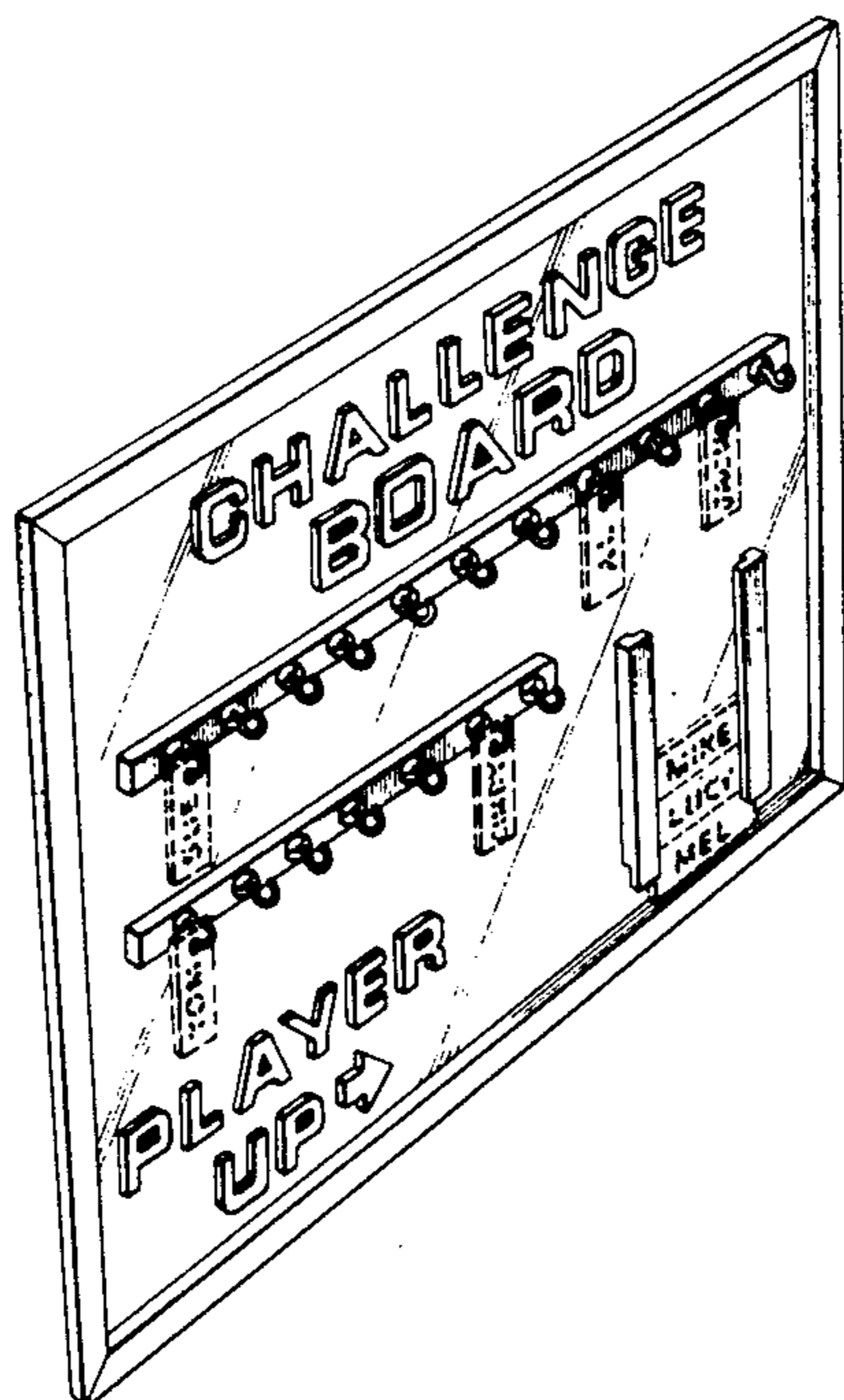

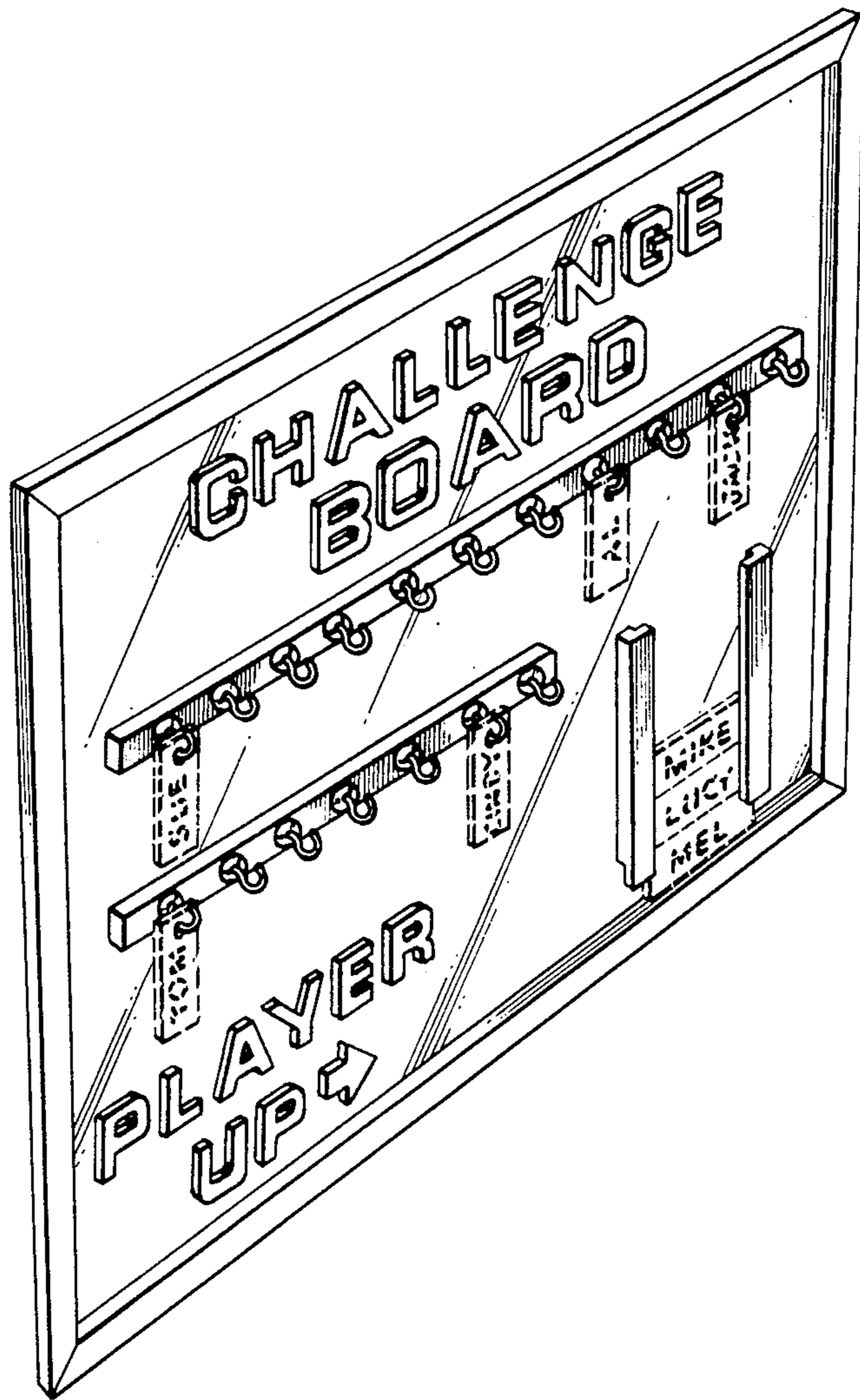

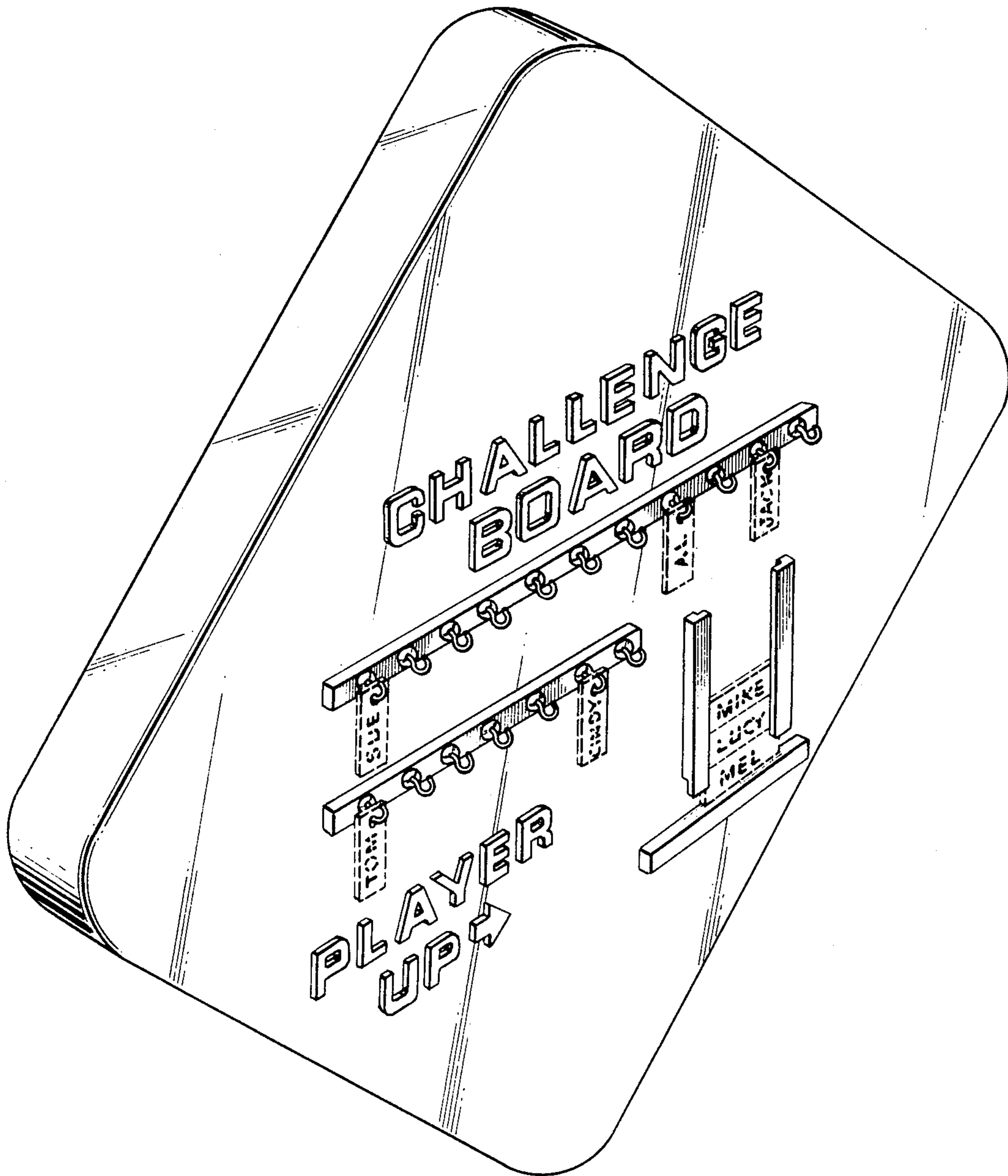
