FIG. 2 is a rear, left side and bottom perspective view thereof.

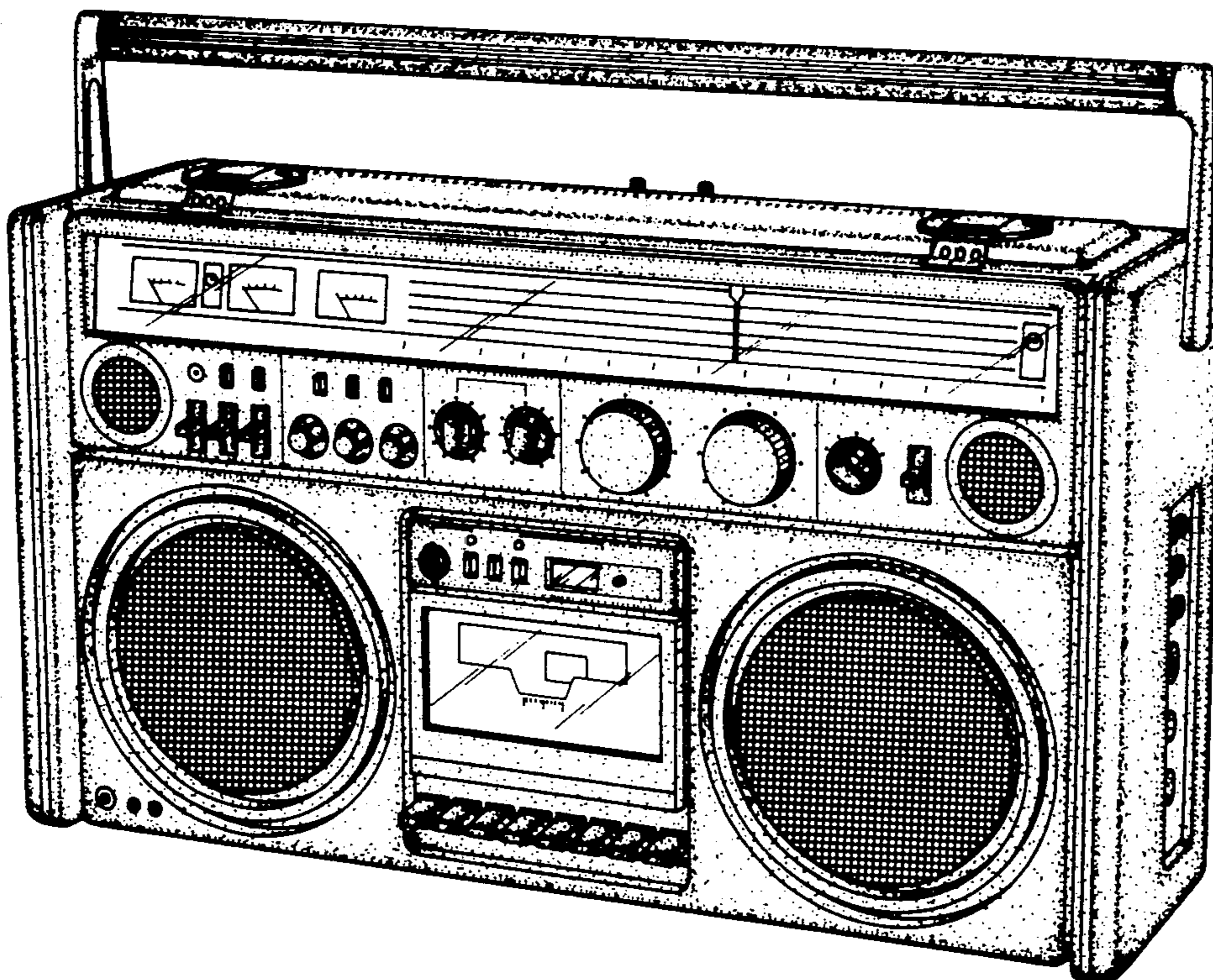

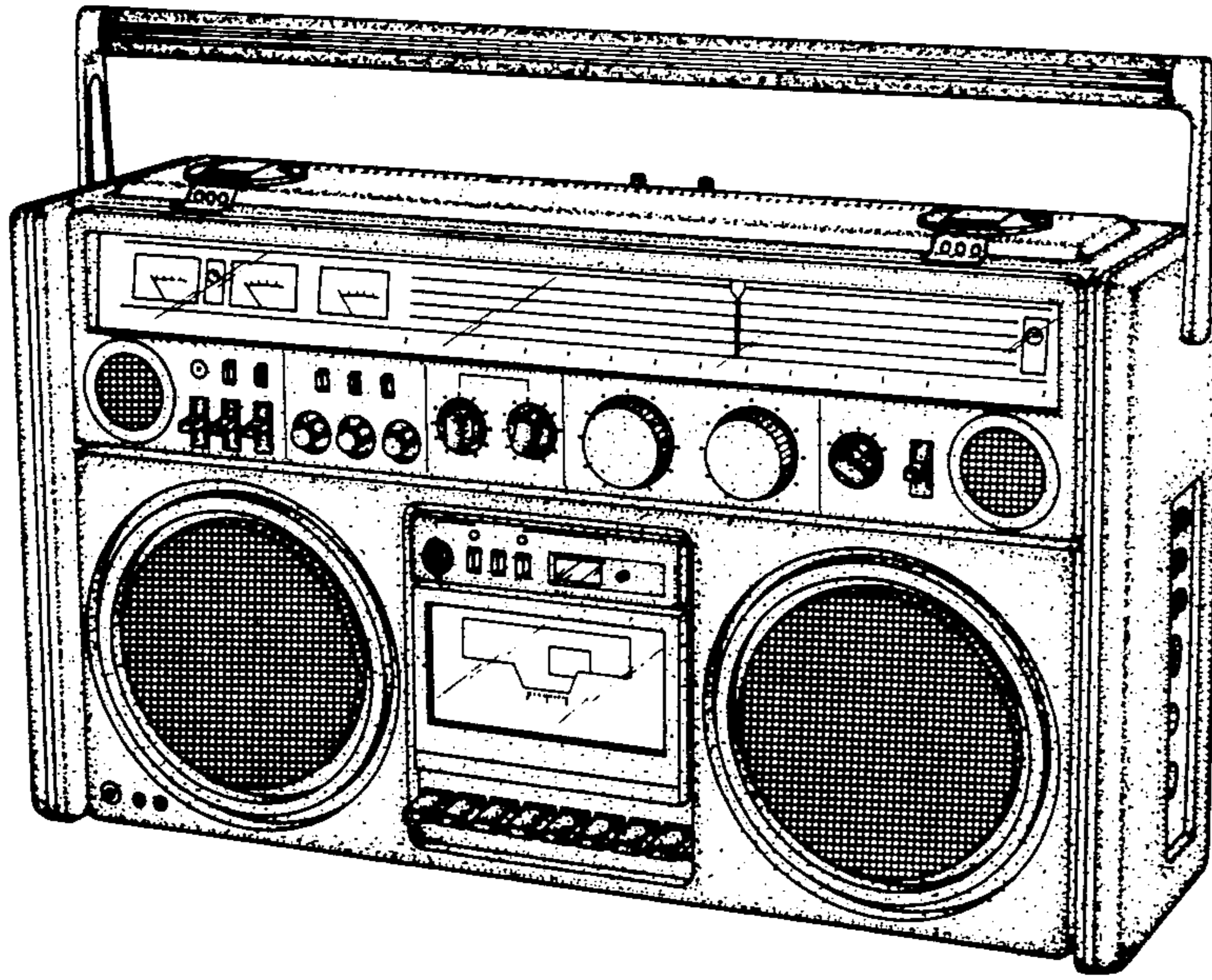
