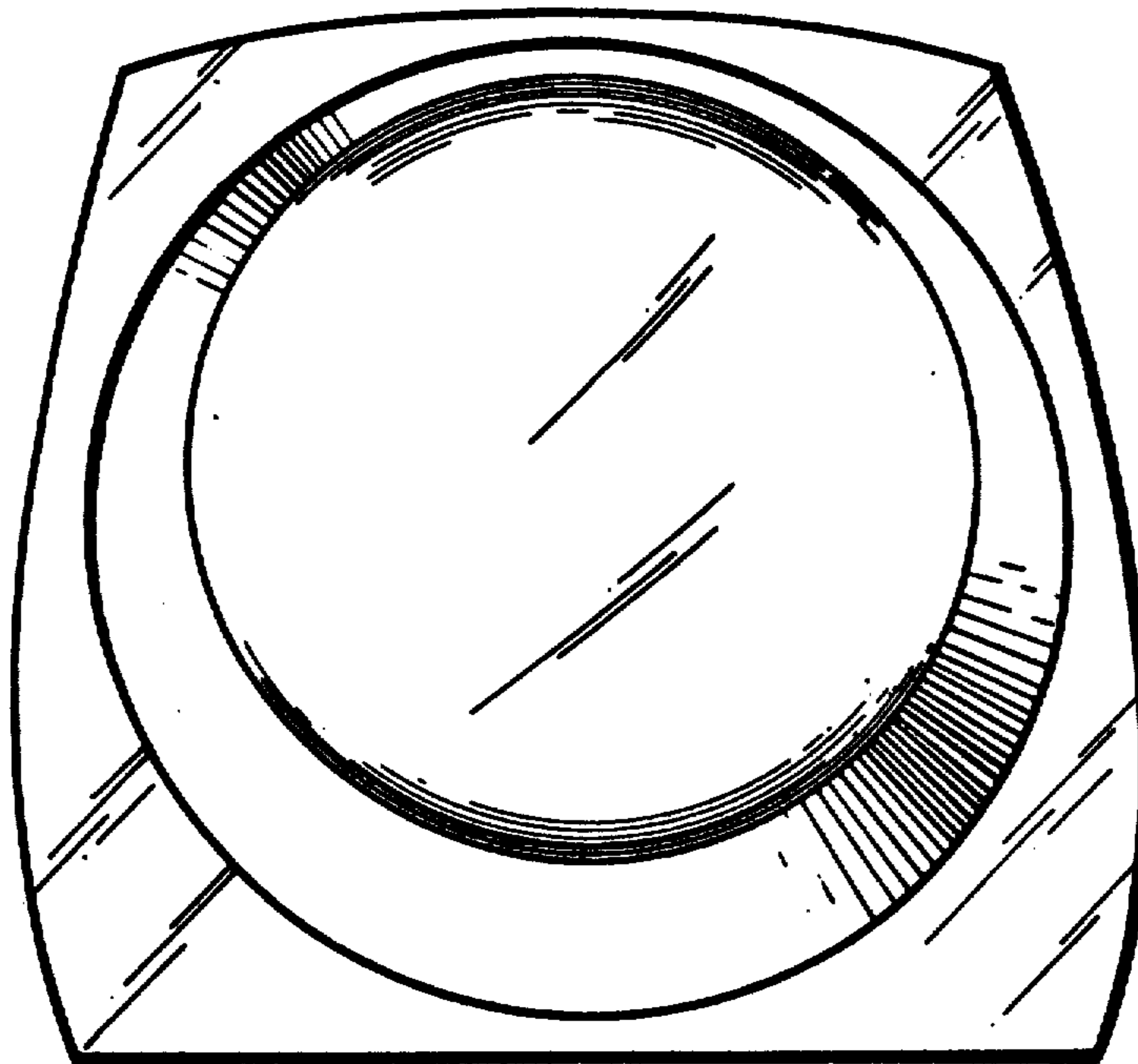

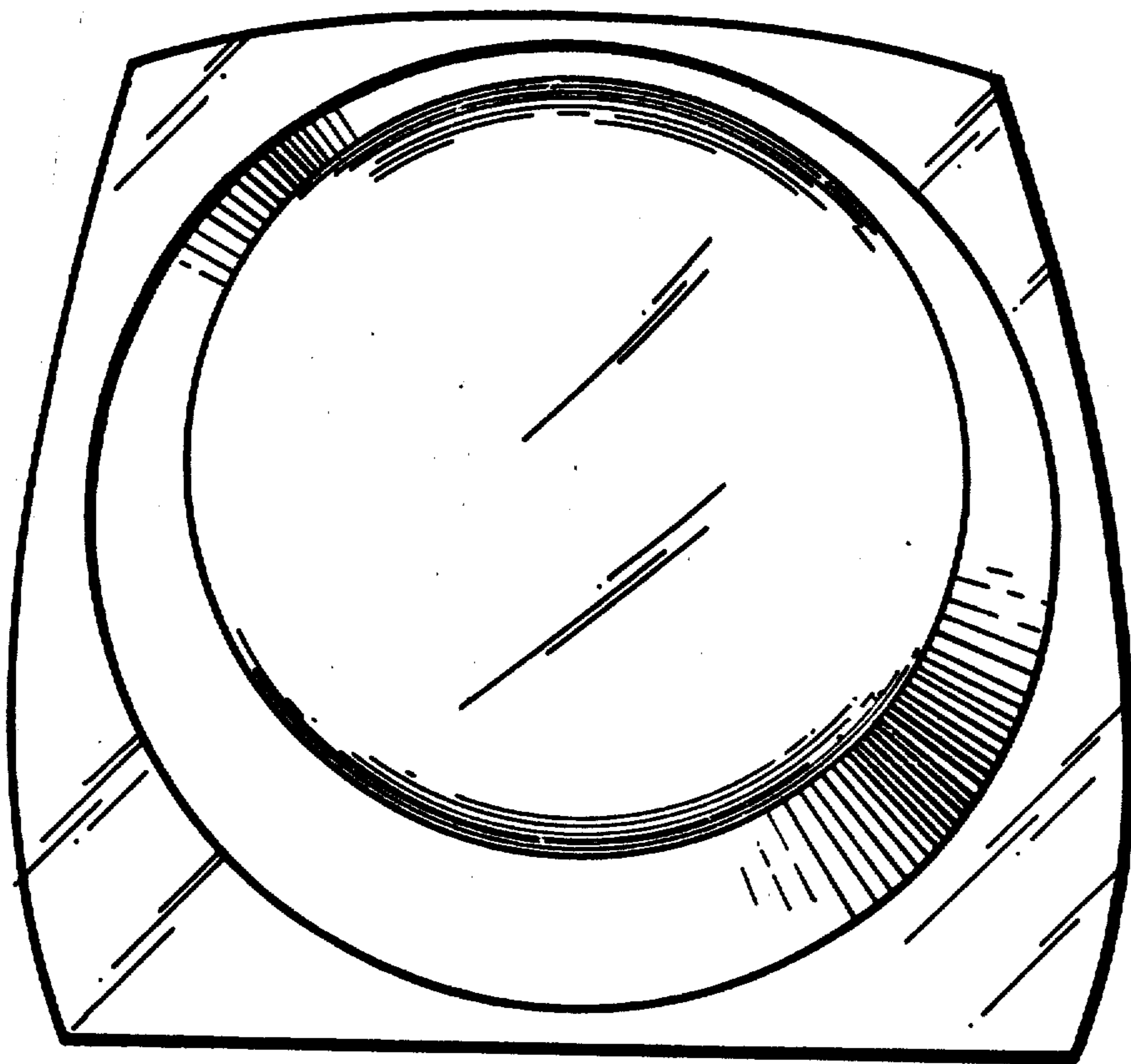
[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a standing plaque, substantially as shown and described.

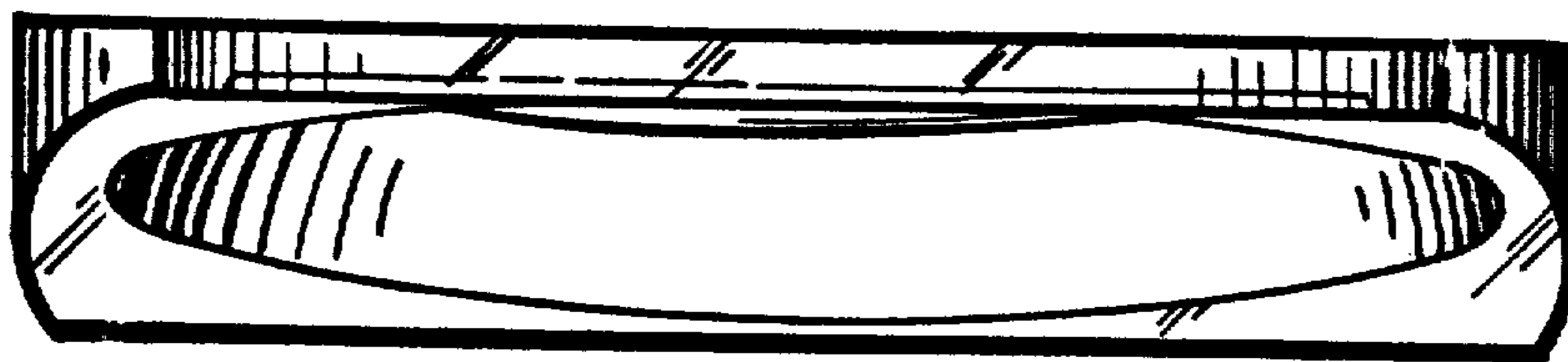
DESCRIPTION

FIG. 4 is a side elevational view thereof.



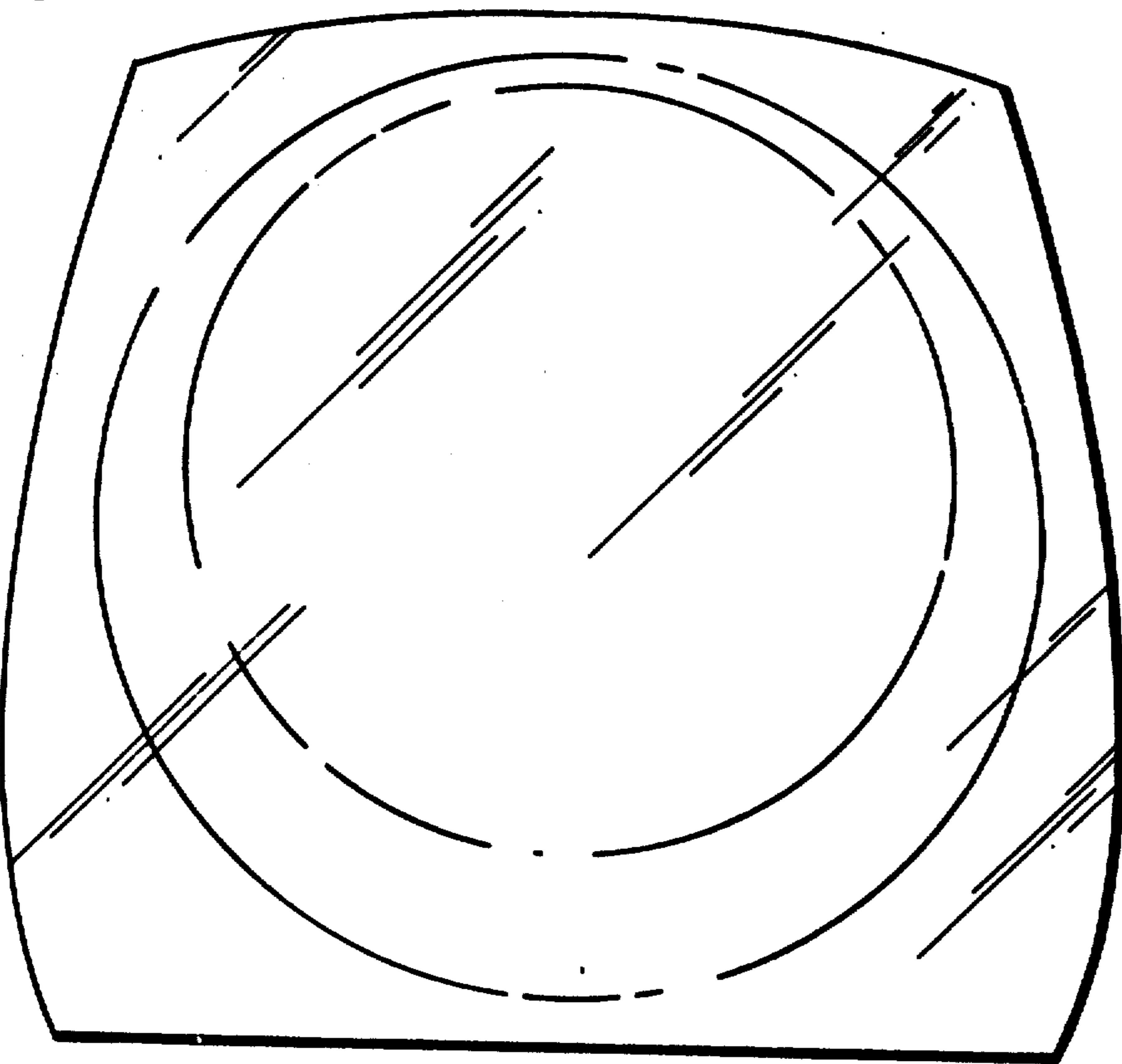
