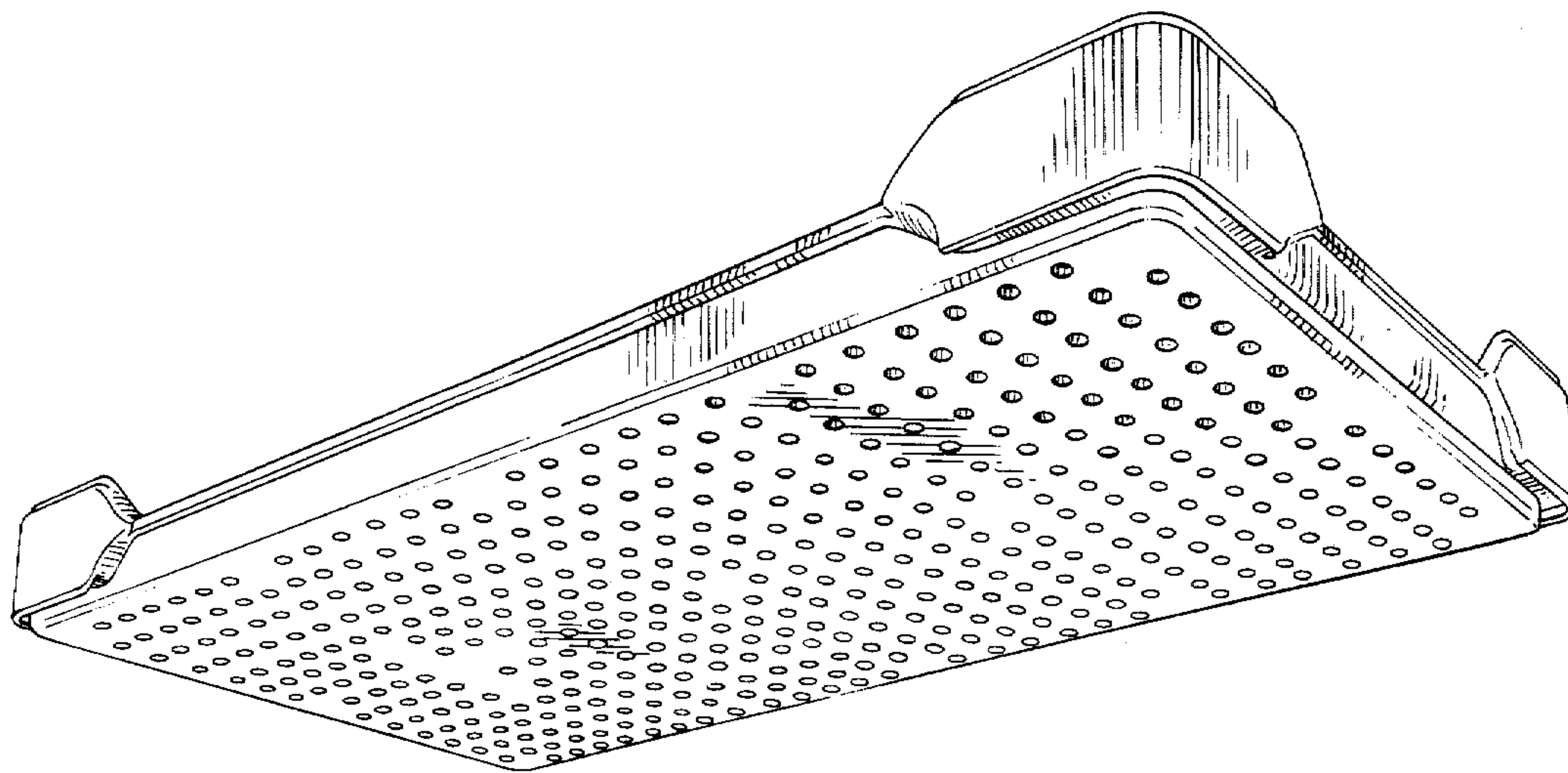

FIG. 4 is a front or rear elevational view thereof.



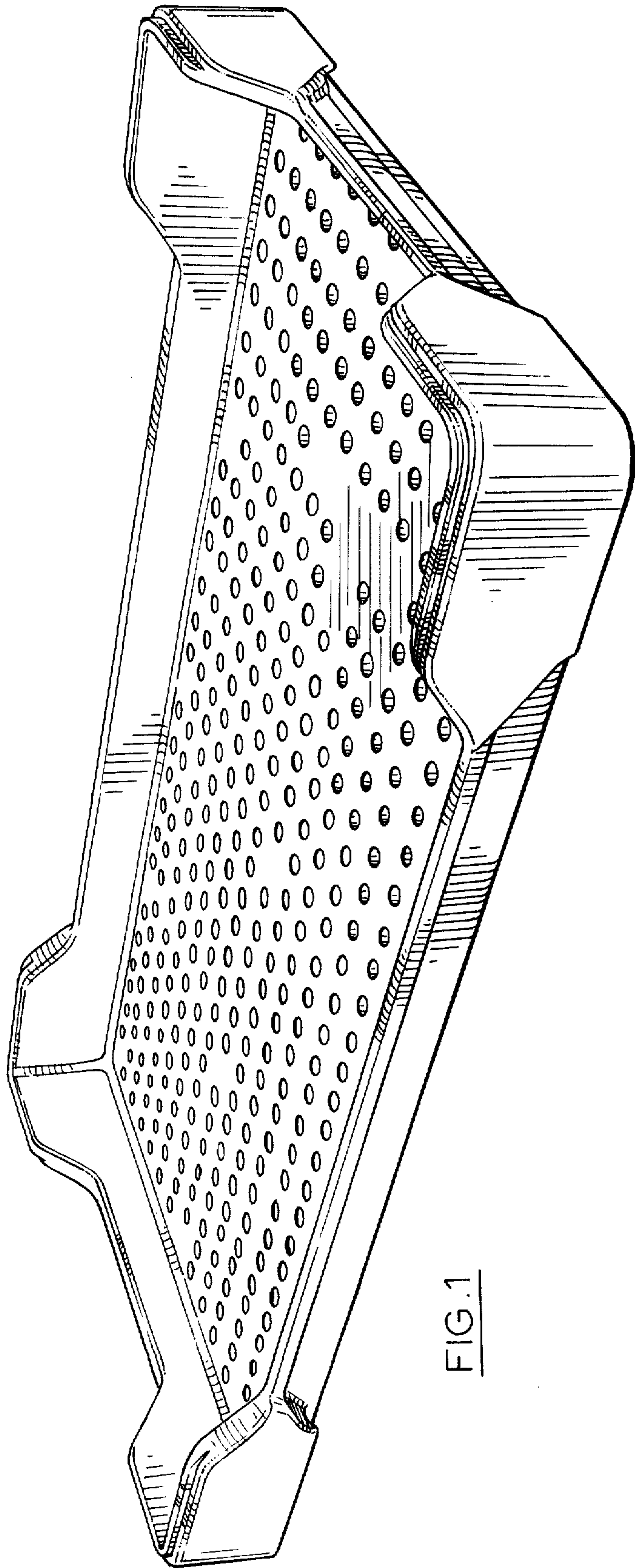

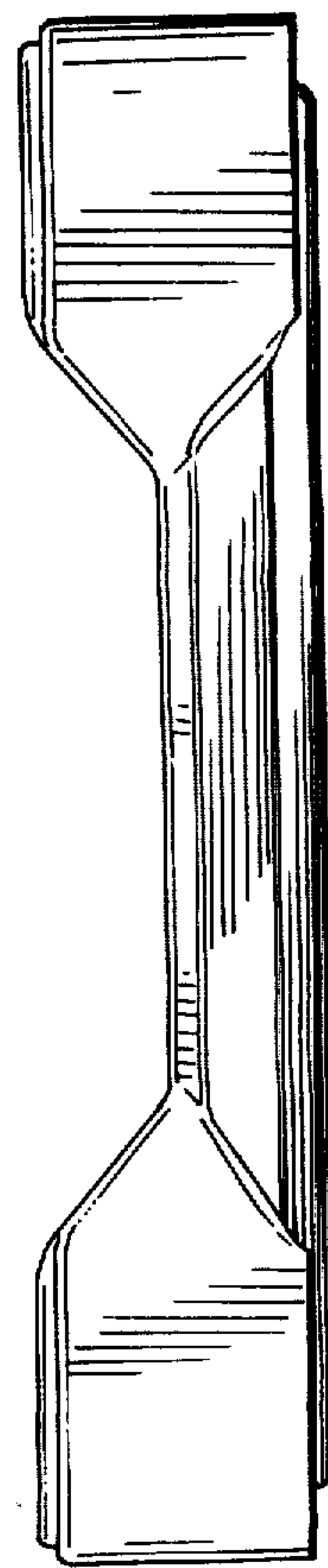

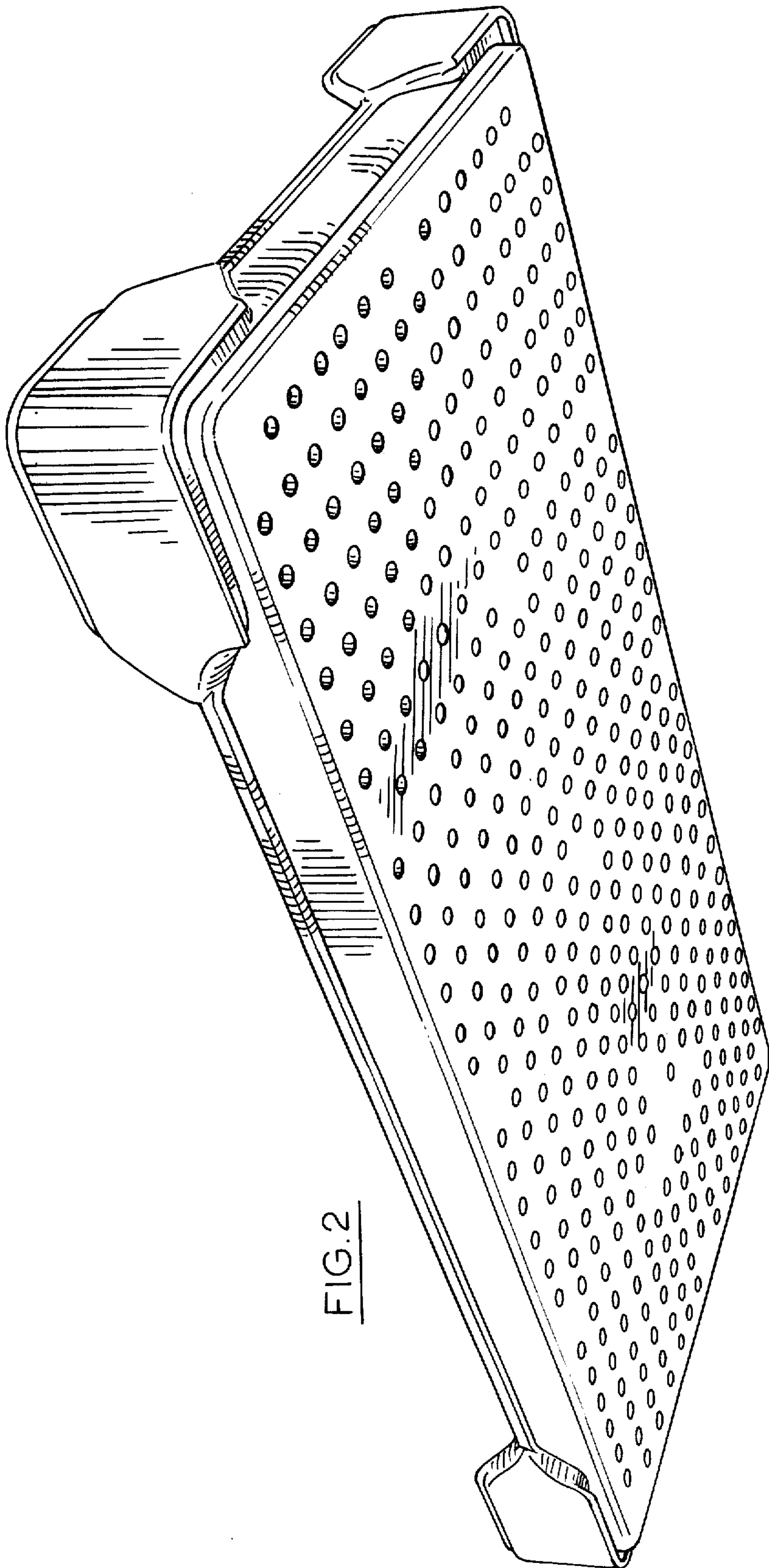

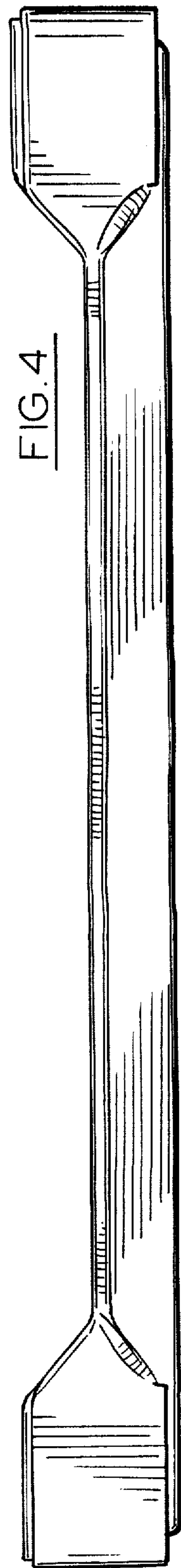
