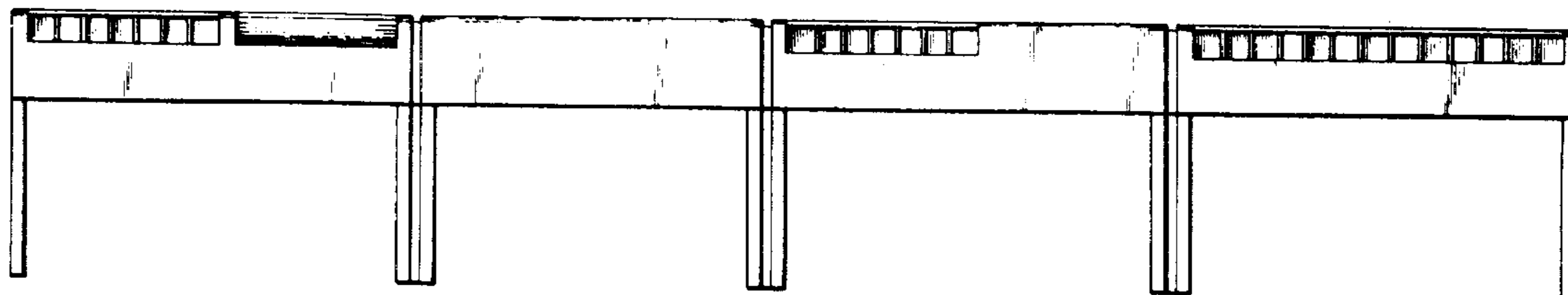

[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a desk, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a top plan view of a desk having four modules; FIG. 2 is a front elevational view of the desk of FIG. 1; FIG. 3 is a fragmentary top plan view showing a typical junction between abutting modules of the desk of FIG. 1; and FIG. 4 is a left side elevational view of the desk. The side of the desk not shown is a mirror image of the side shown in FIG. 4. The rear of the desk is nonornamental.



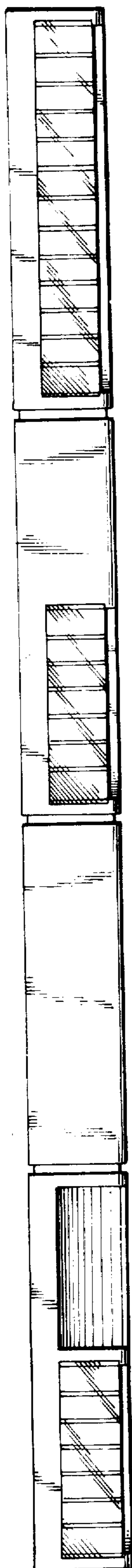

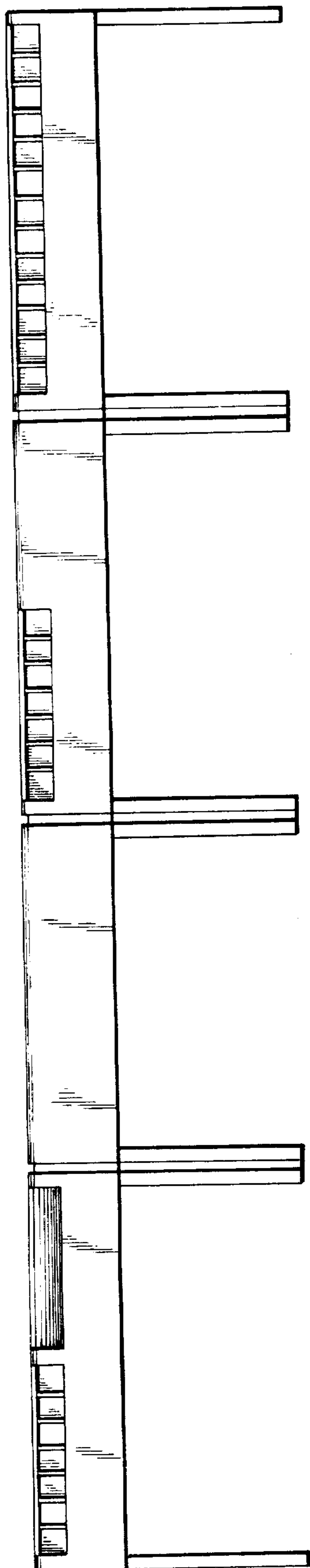

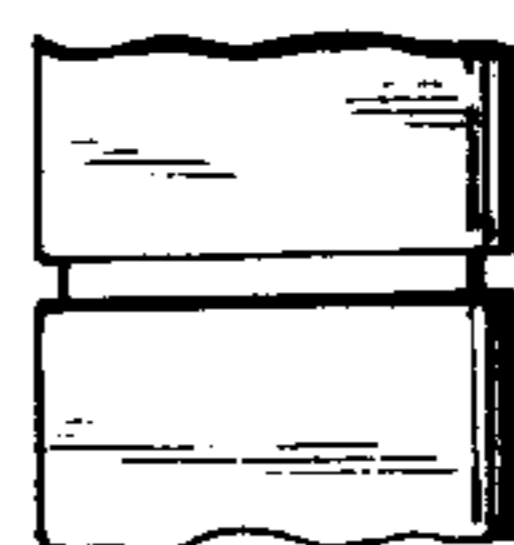

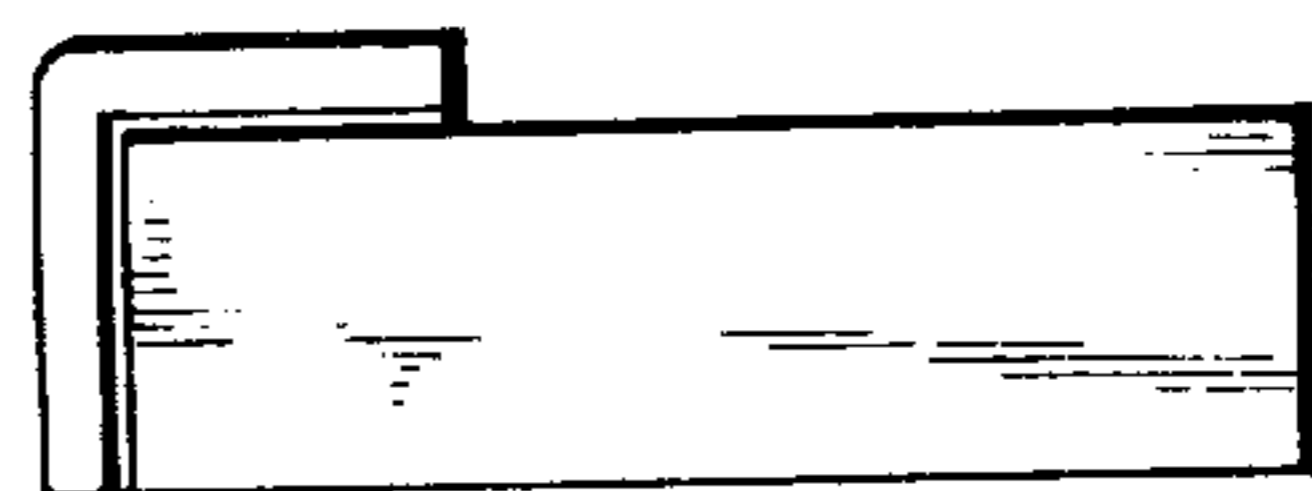
