The ornamental design for a lamp, as shown and de-
scribed.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of a lamp showing my new
design;

FIG. 2 is an elevational view thereof, the lamp being
circularly symmetrical;

FIG. 3 is a top plan view thereof;

FIG. 4 is a bottom plan view thereof;

FIG. 5 is a perspective view showing a second embodi-
ment of my new design;

FIG. 6 is a front elevational view of the design shown in
FIG. 5;

FIG. 7 is a rear elevational view of the design shown in
FIG. 5;

FIG. 8 is a right side elevational view of the design
shown in FIG. 5, the left side elevational view being a
mirror image;

FIG. 9 is a top plan view of the design shown in FIG.
5;

FIG. 10 is a perspective view showing a third embodi-
ment of my new design;

FIG. 11 is a right side elevational view of the design
shown in FIG. 10, the left side elevational view being a
mirror image;

FIG. 12 is a front elevational view of the design shown
in FIG. 10, the rear elevational view being a mirror
image;

FIG. 13 is a top plan view of the design shown in FIG.
10;

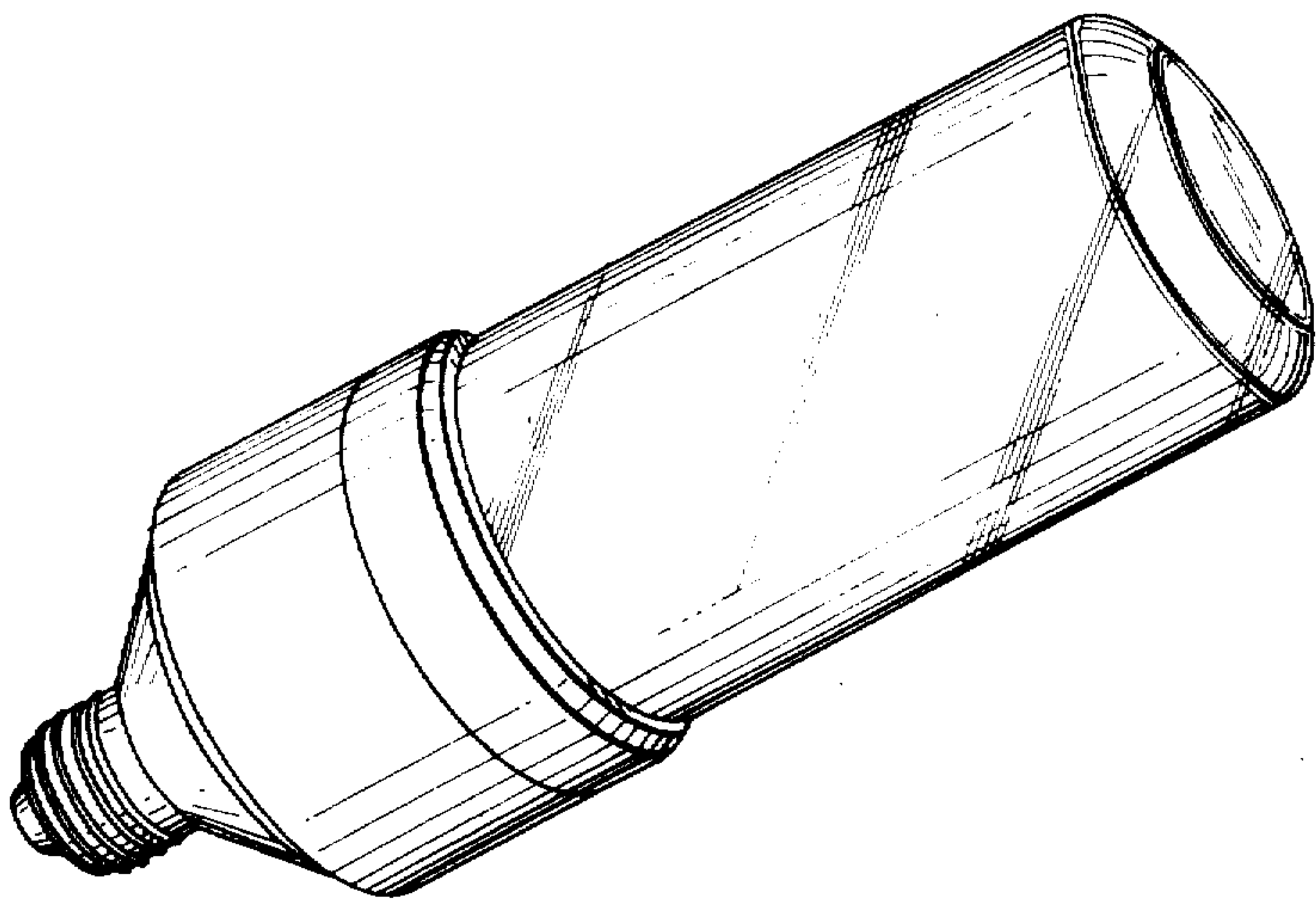
FIG. 14 is a bottom plan view of the designs respec-

FIG. 15 is a perspective view showing a fourth embodi-
ment of my new design;

FIG. 15.



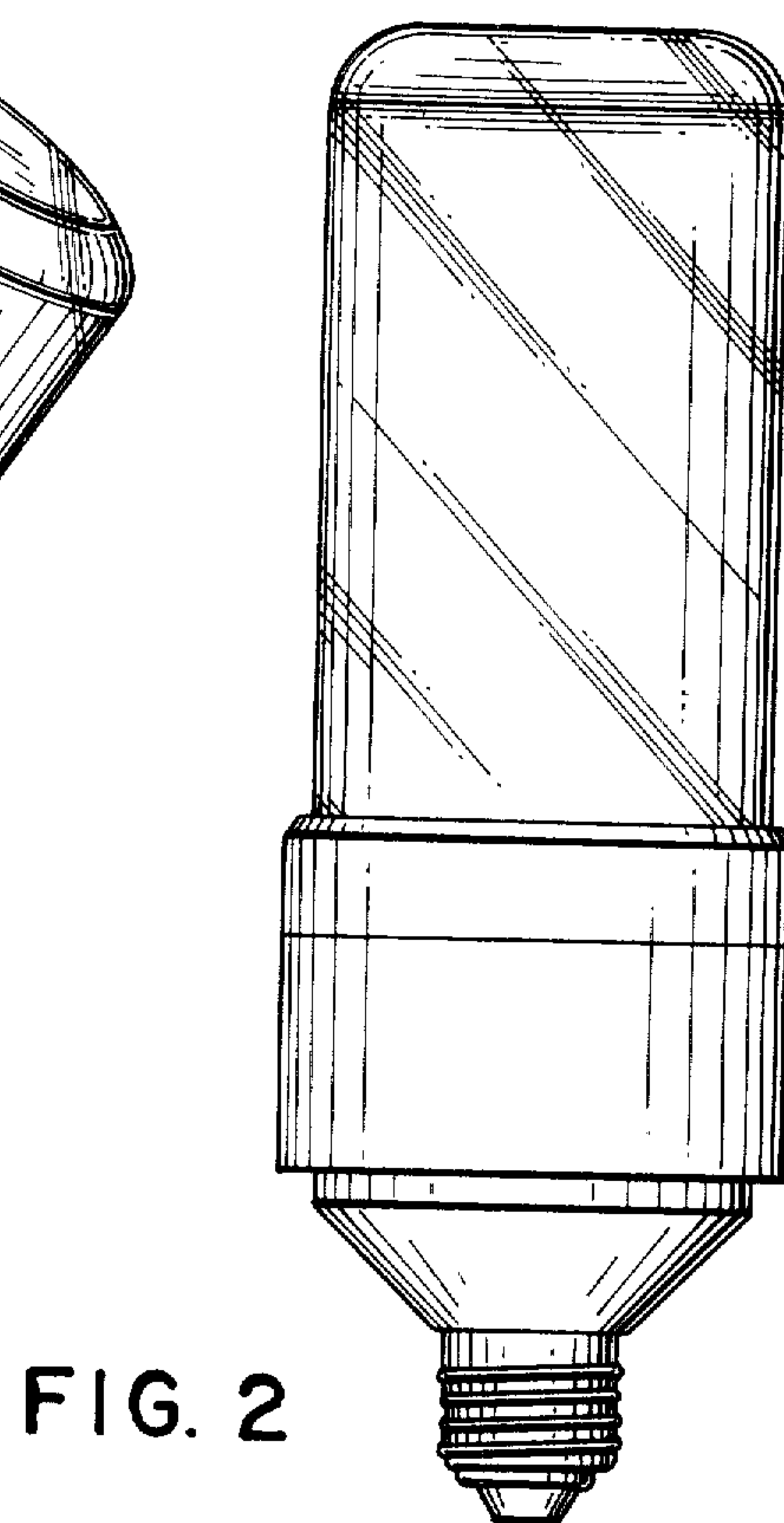
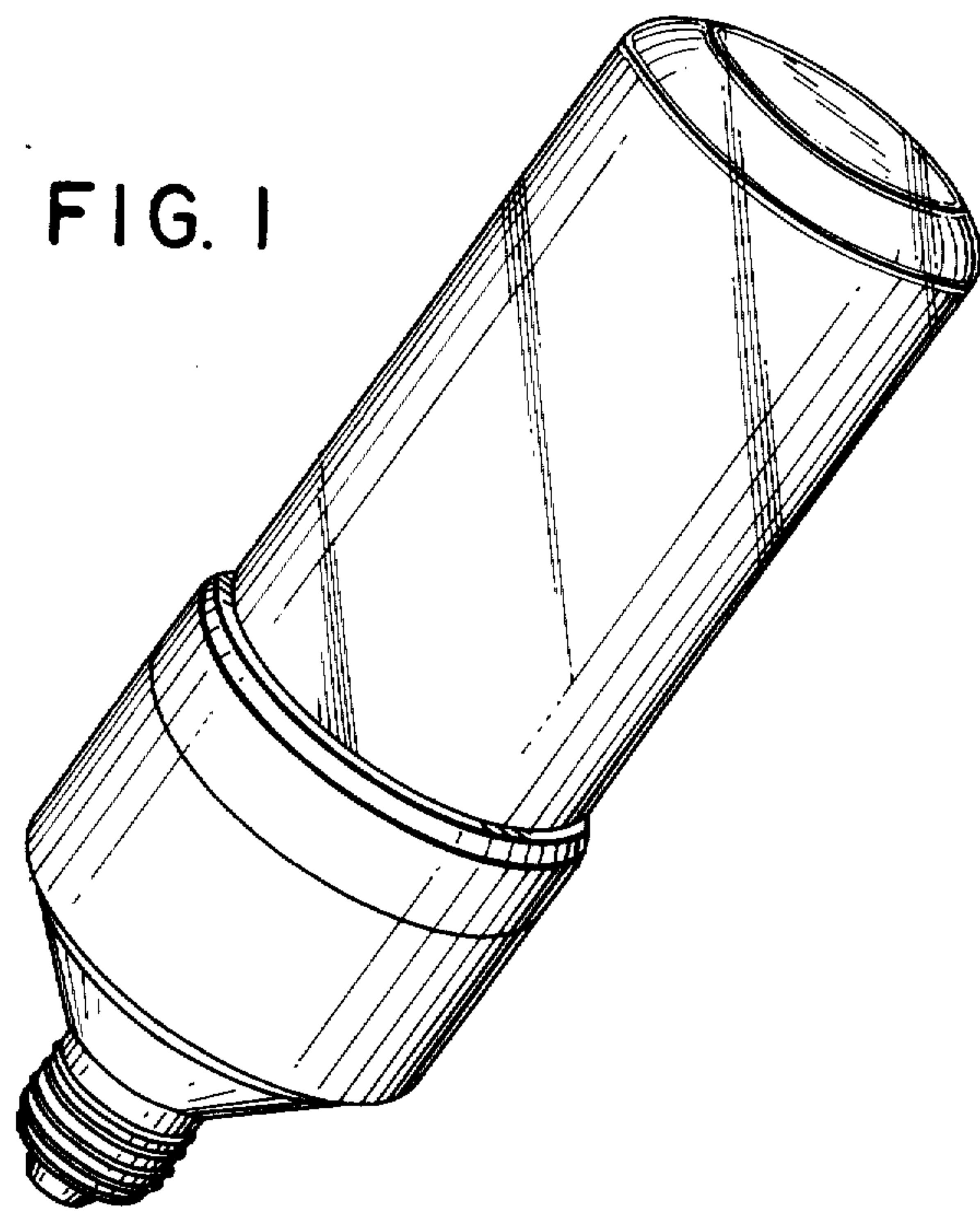

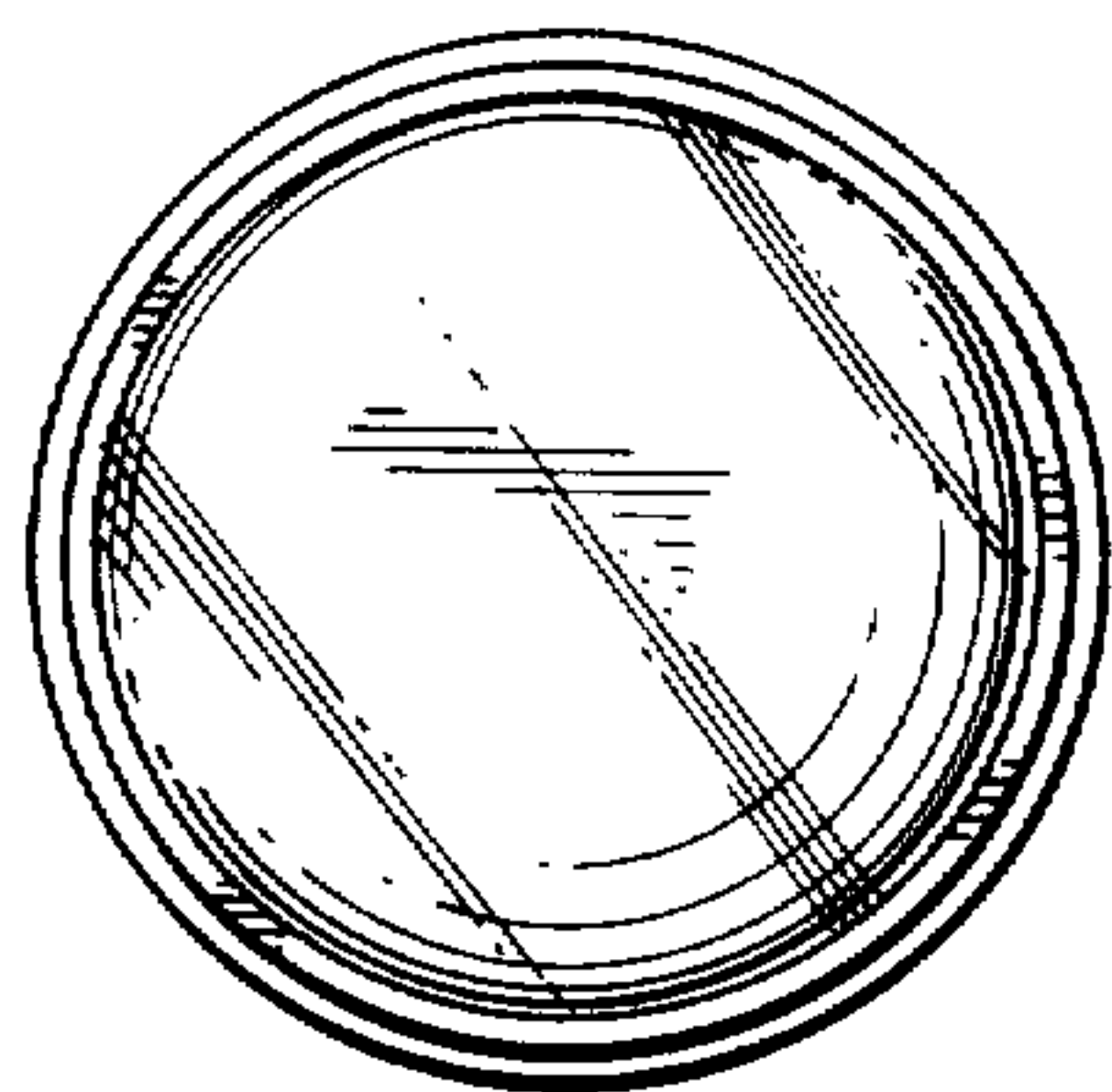
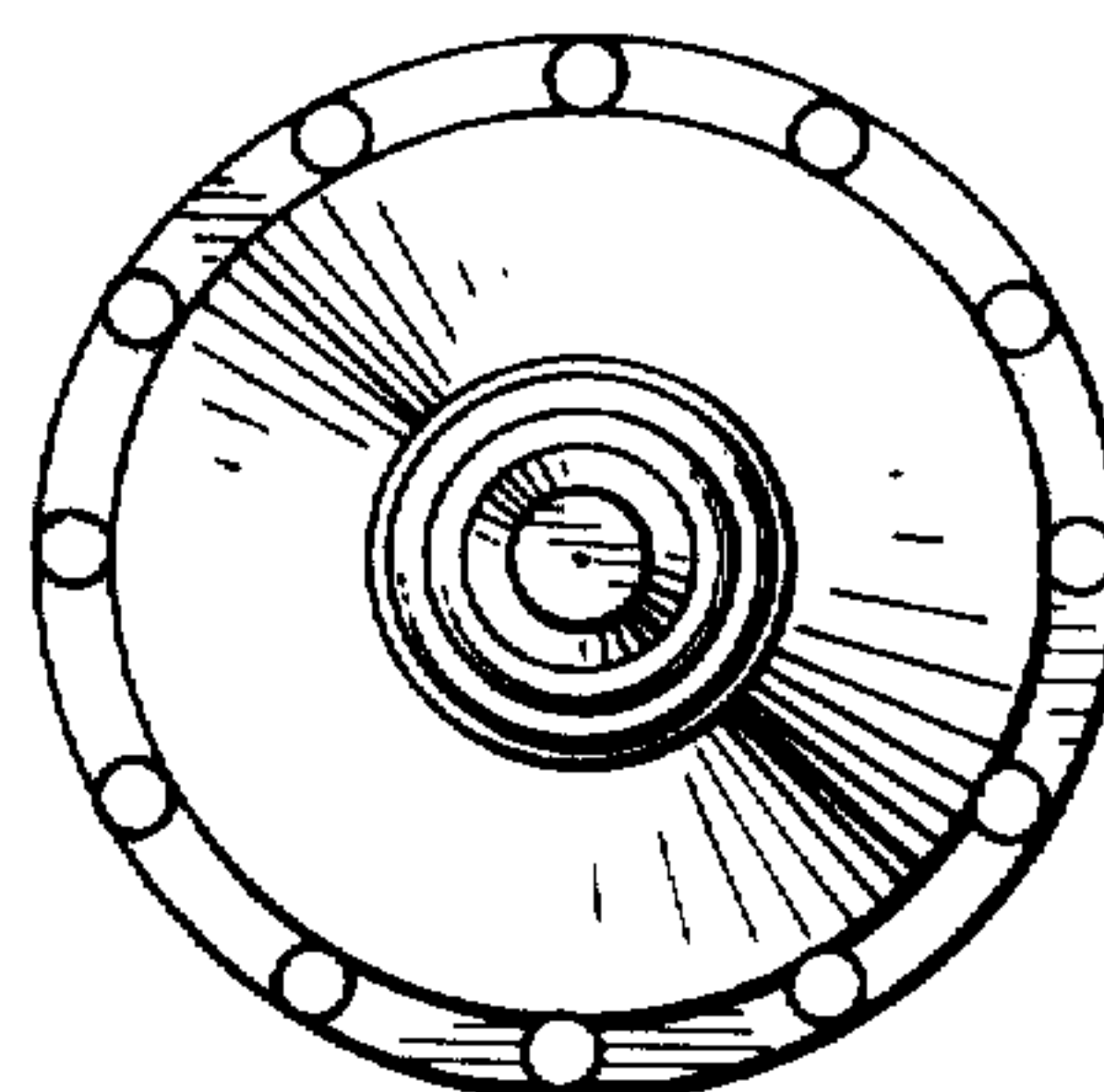

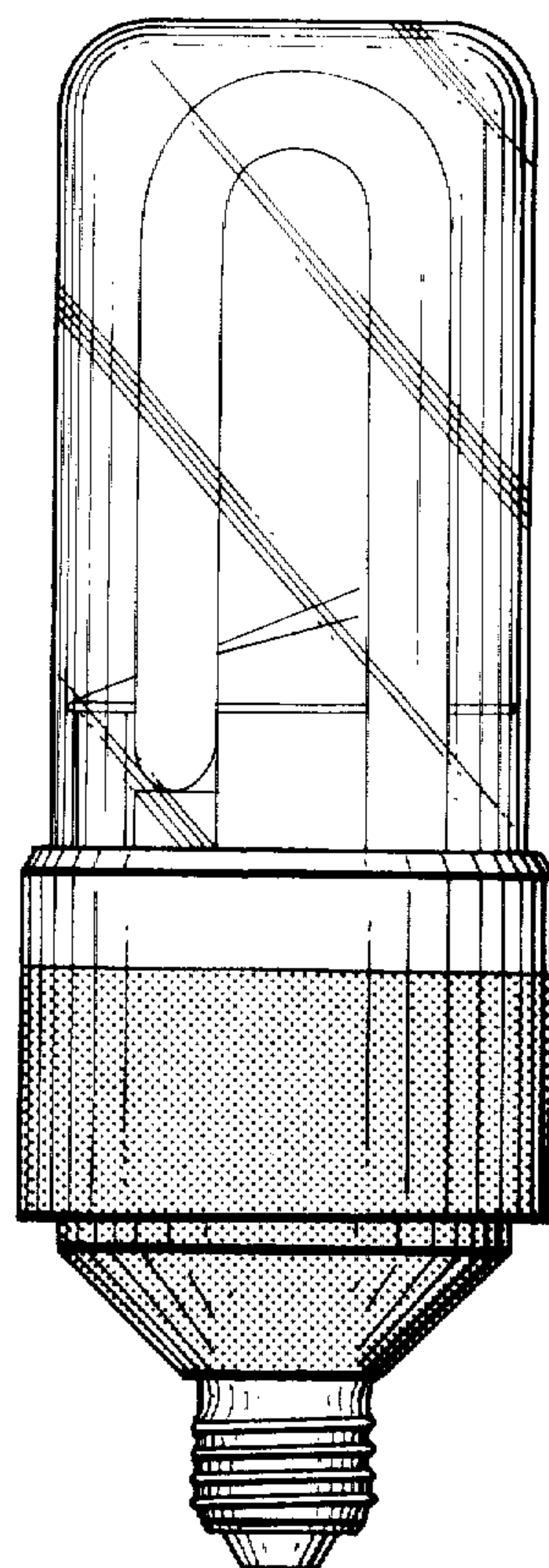
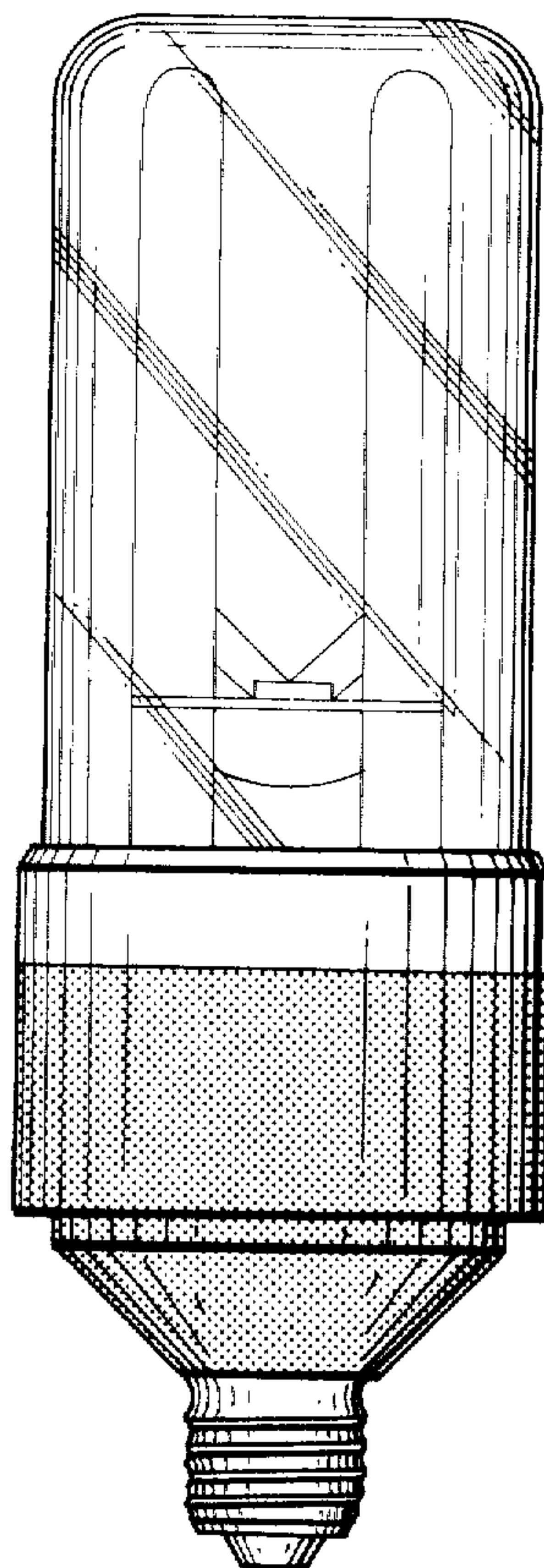
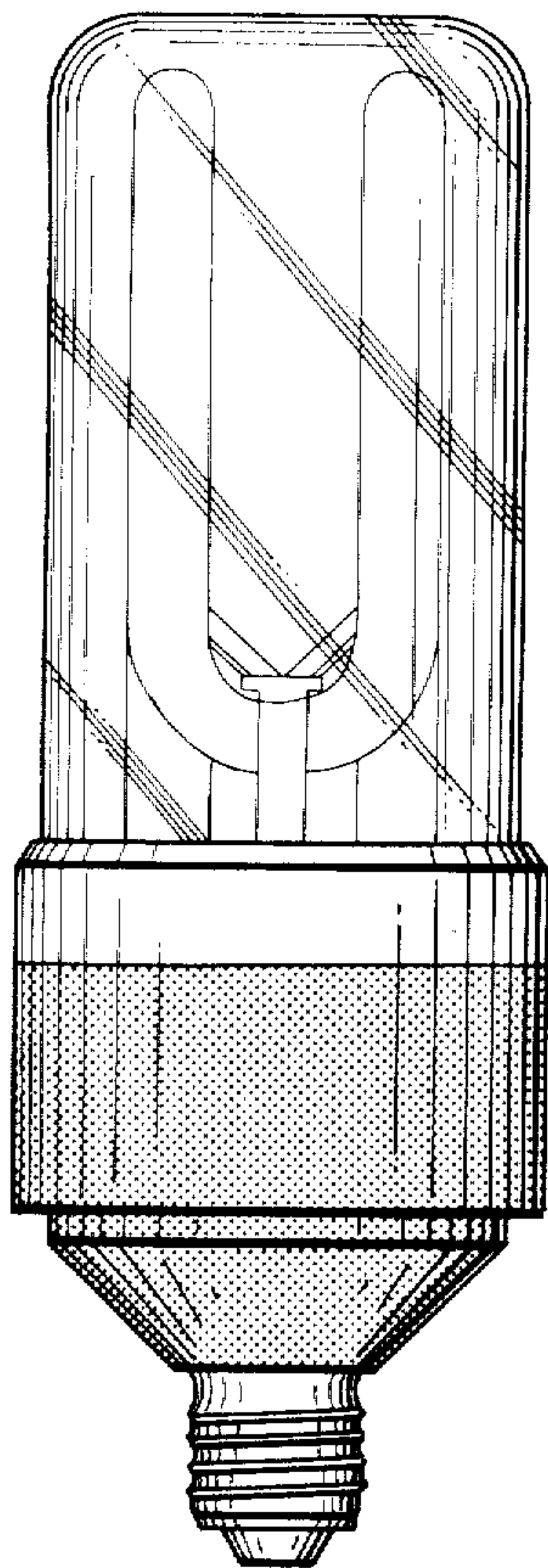
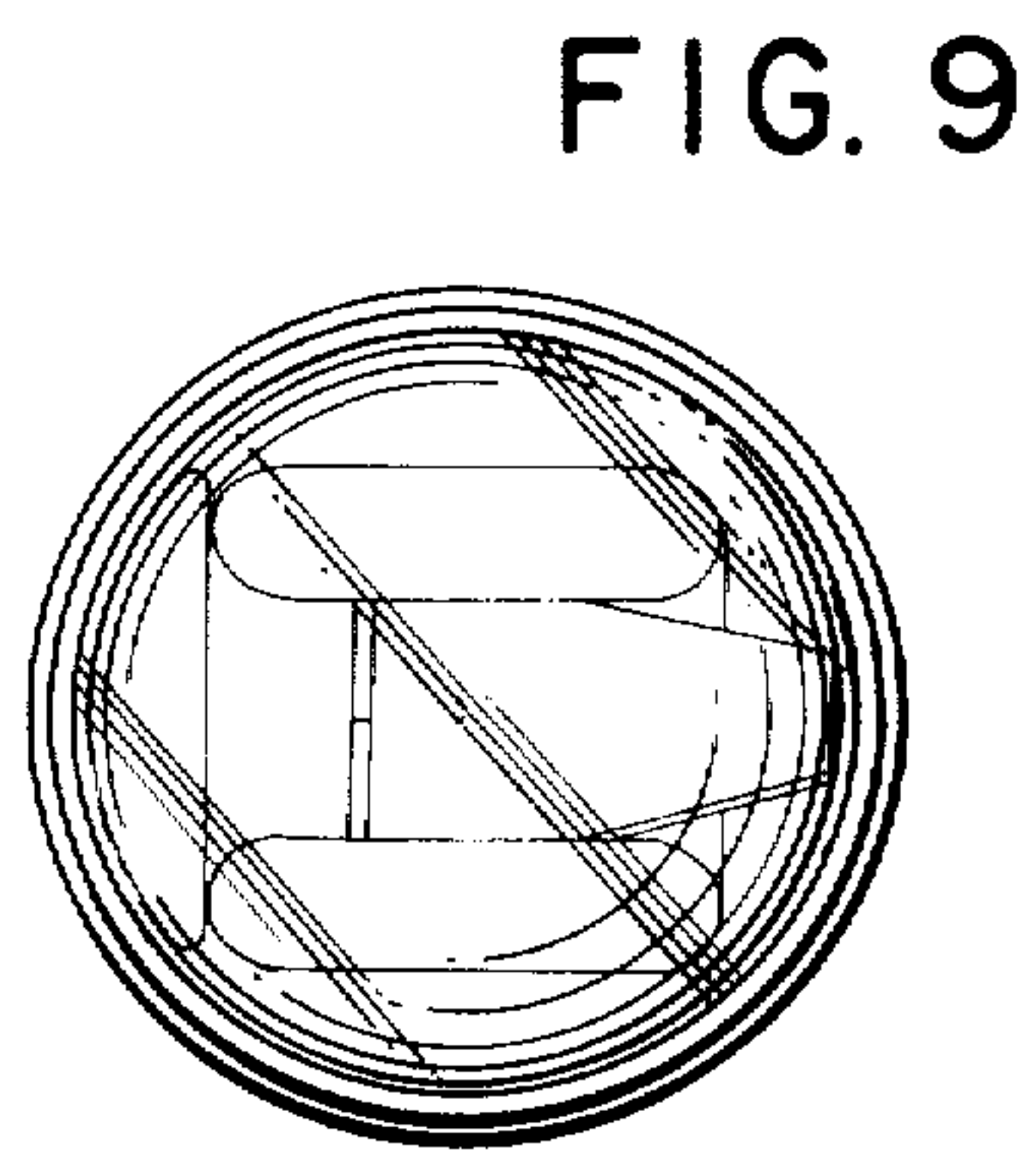
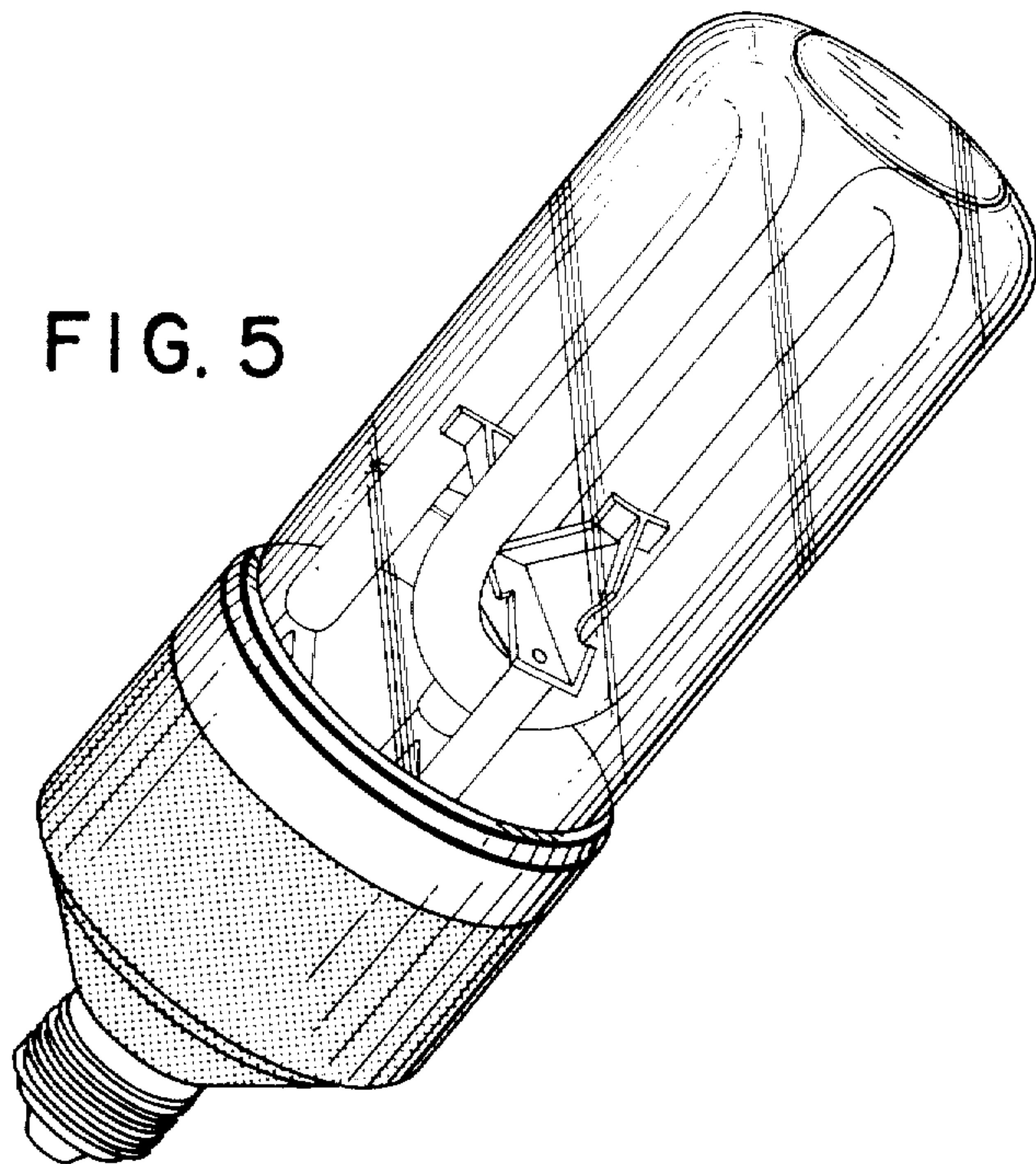

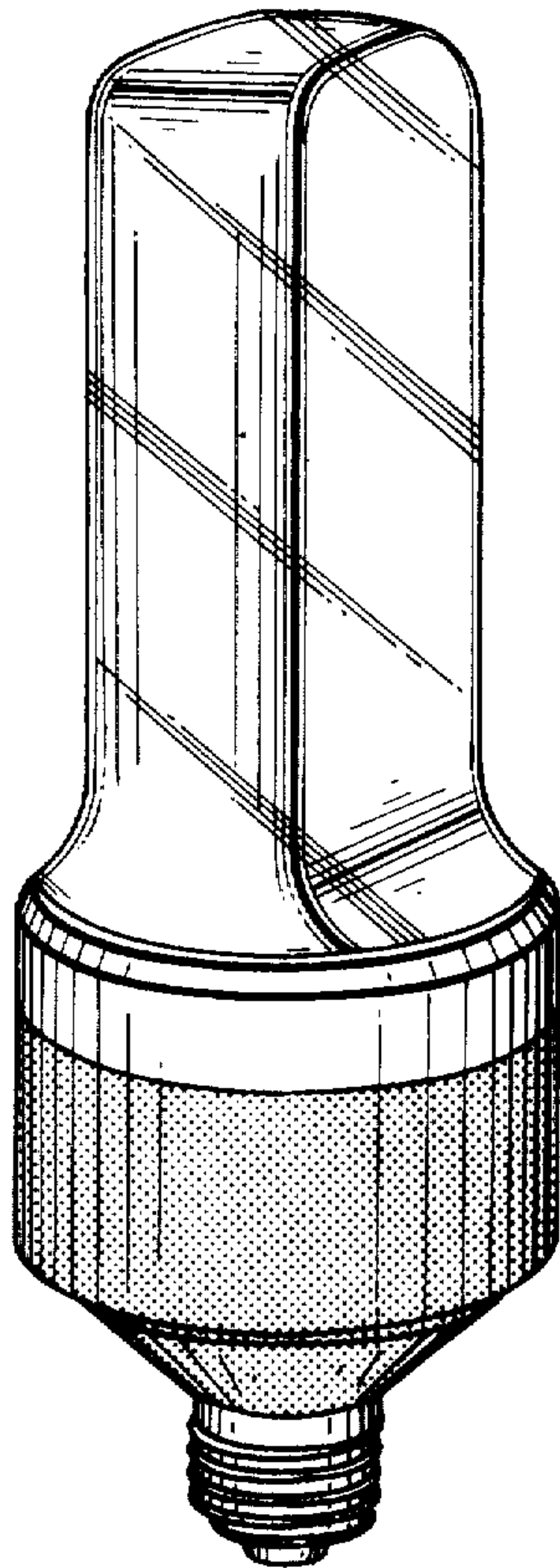

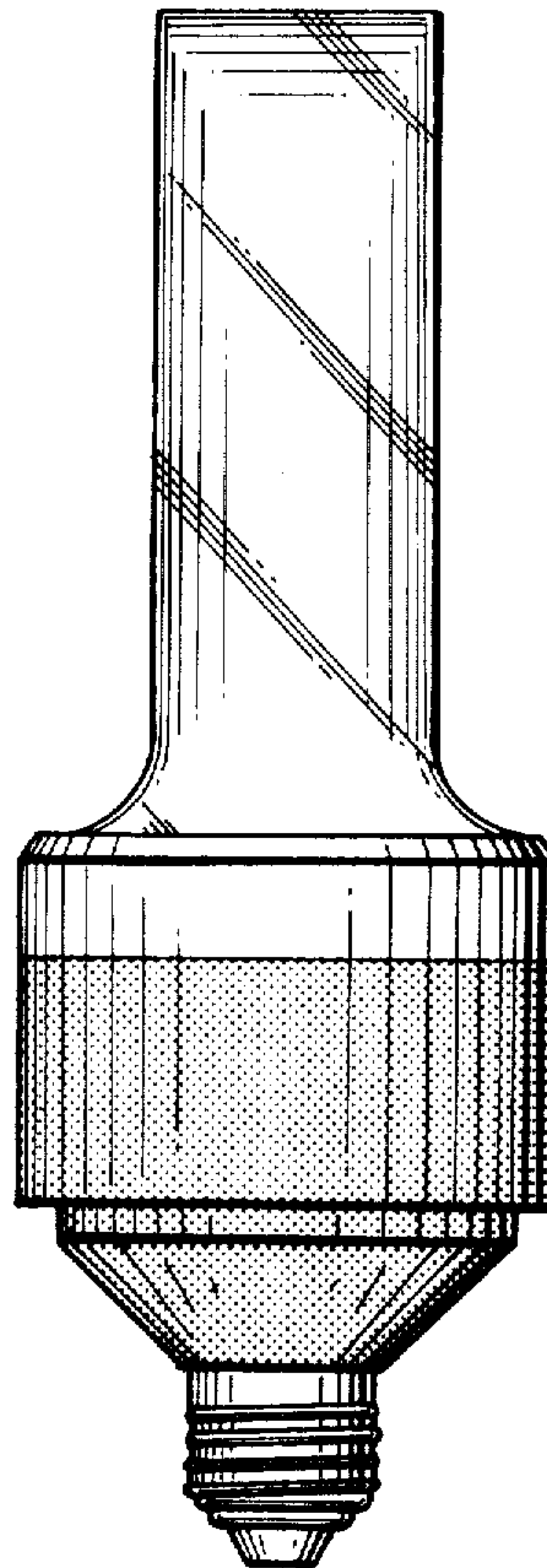

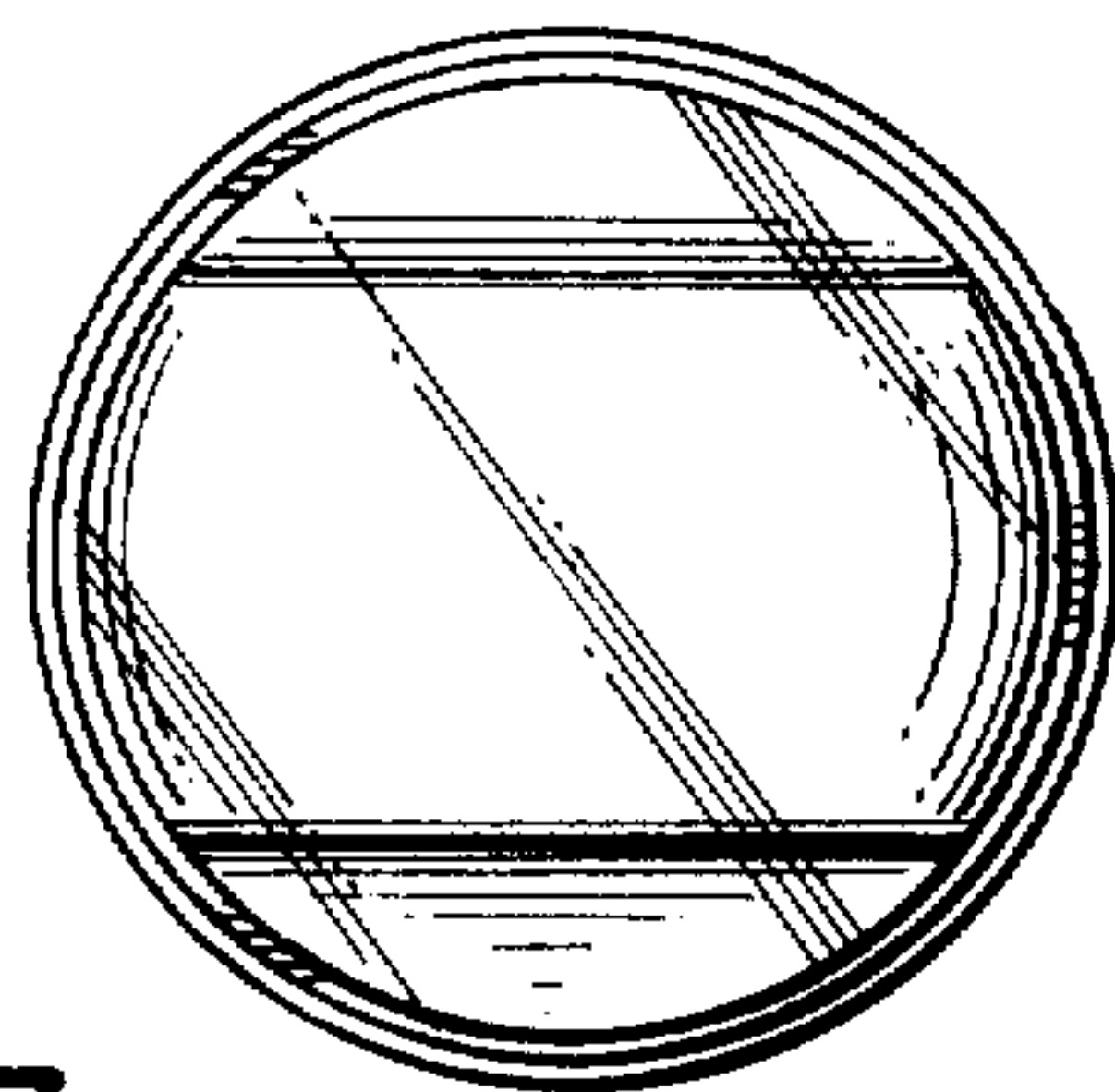
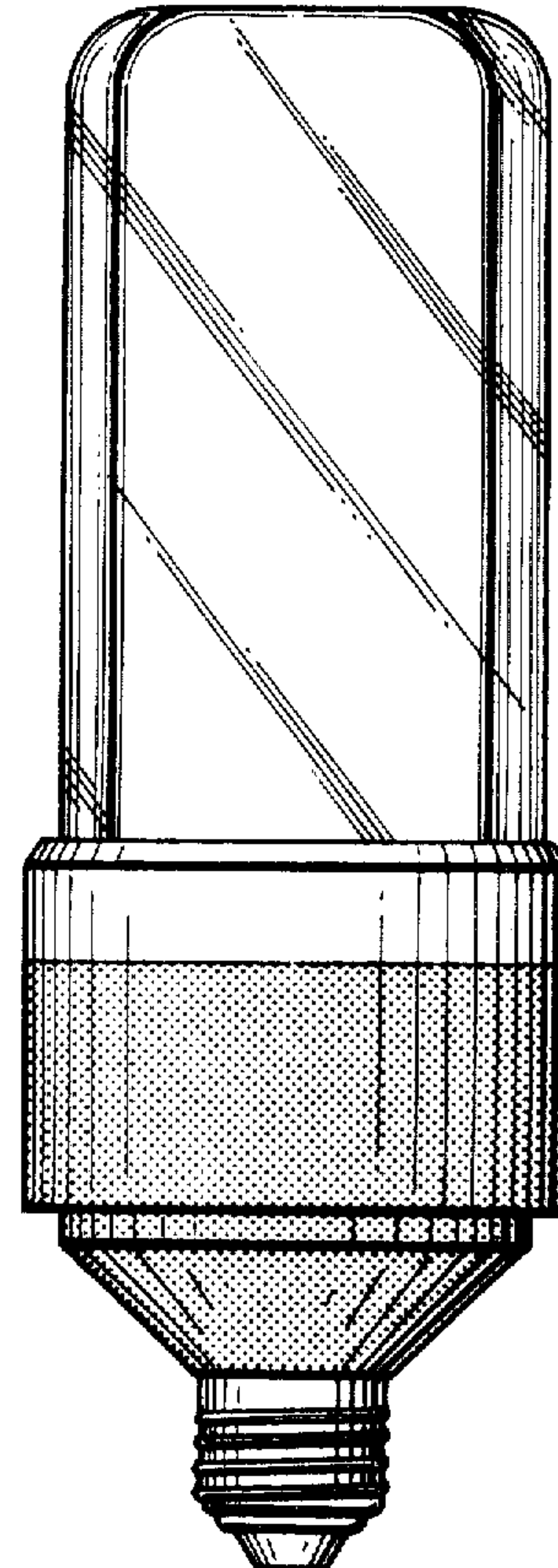

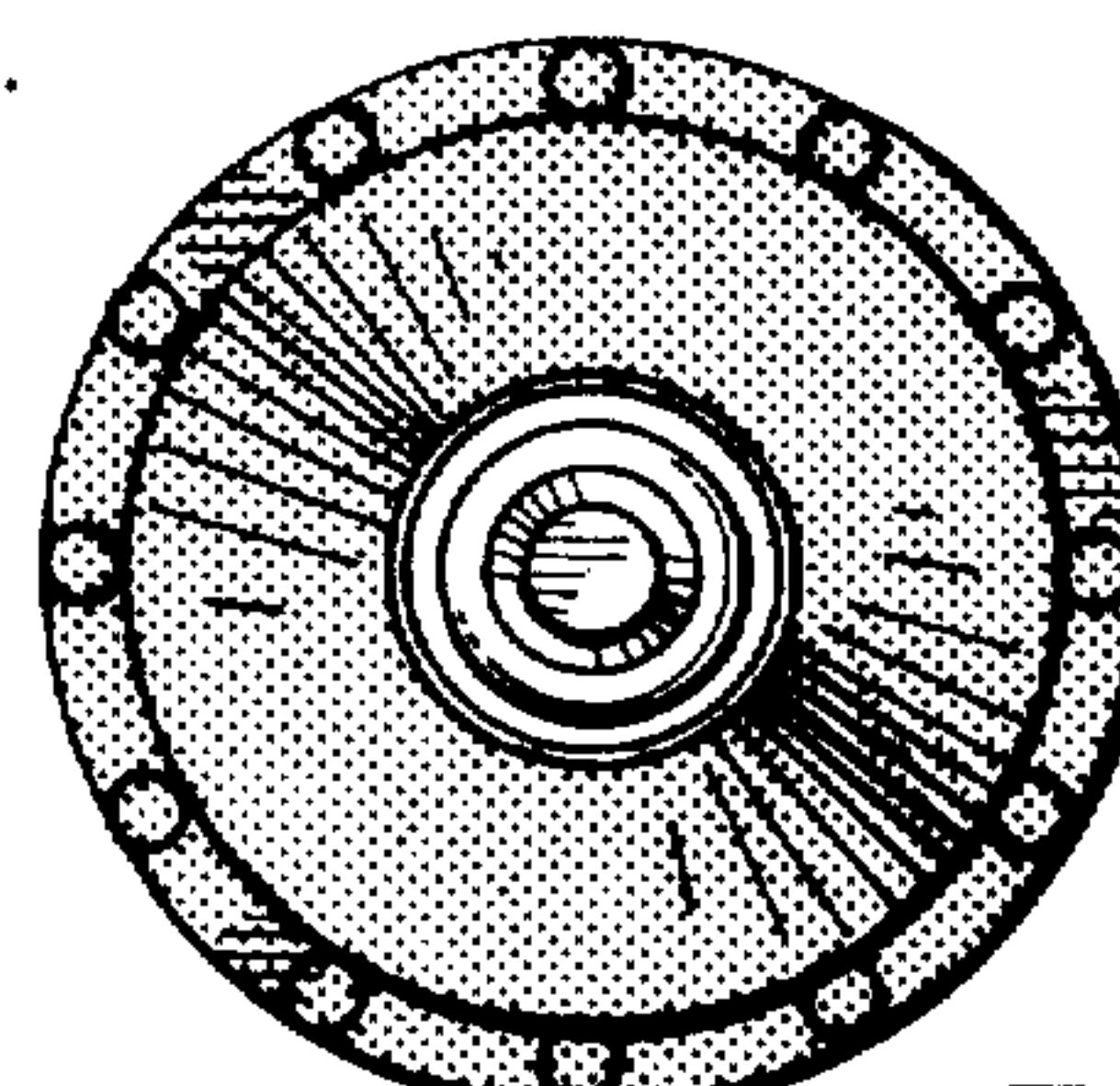

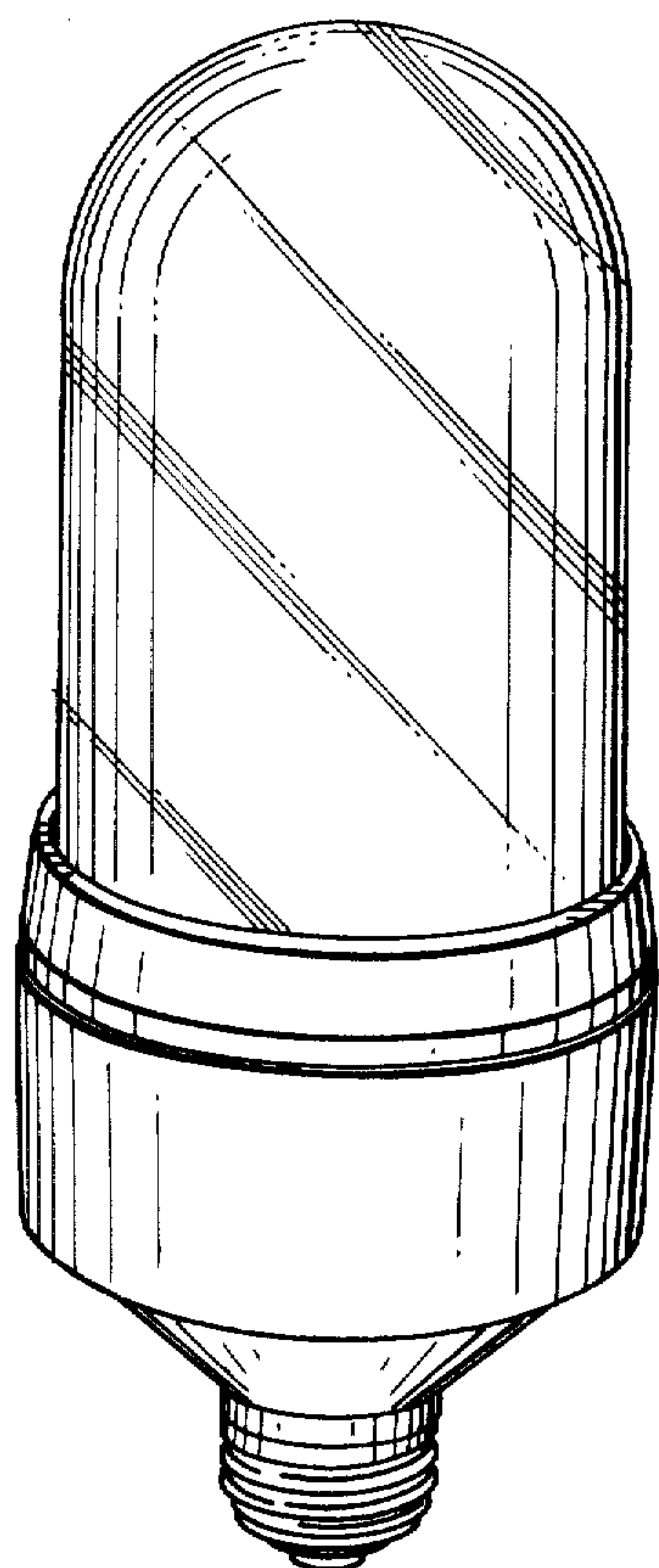

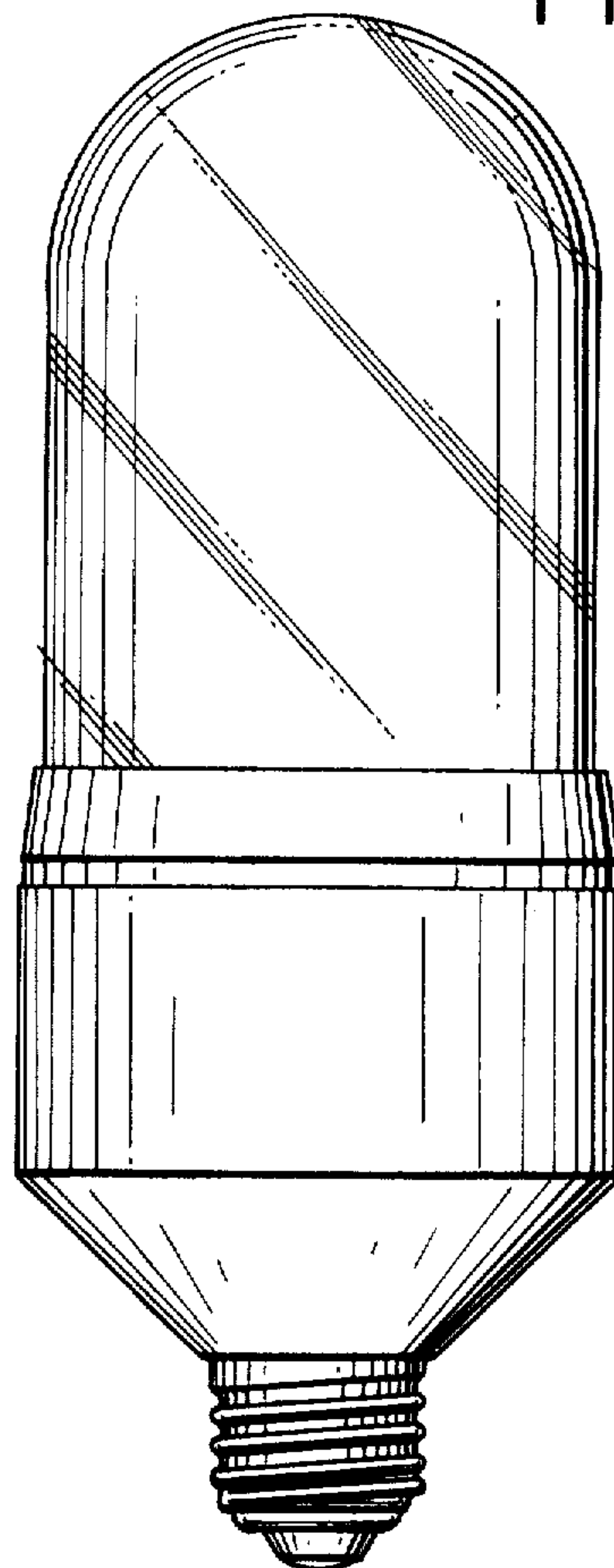

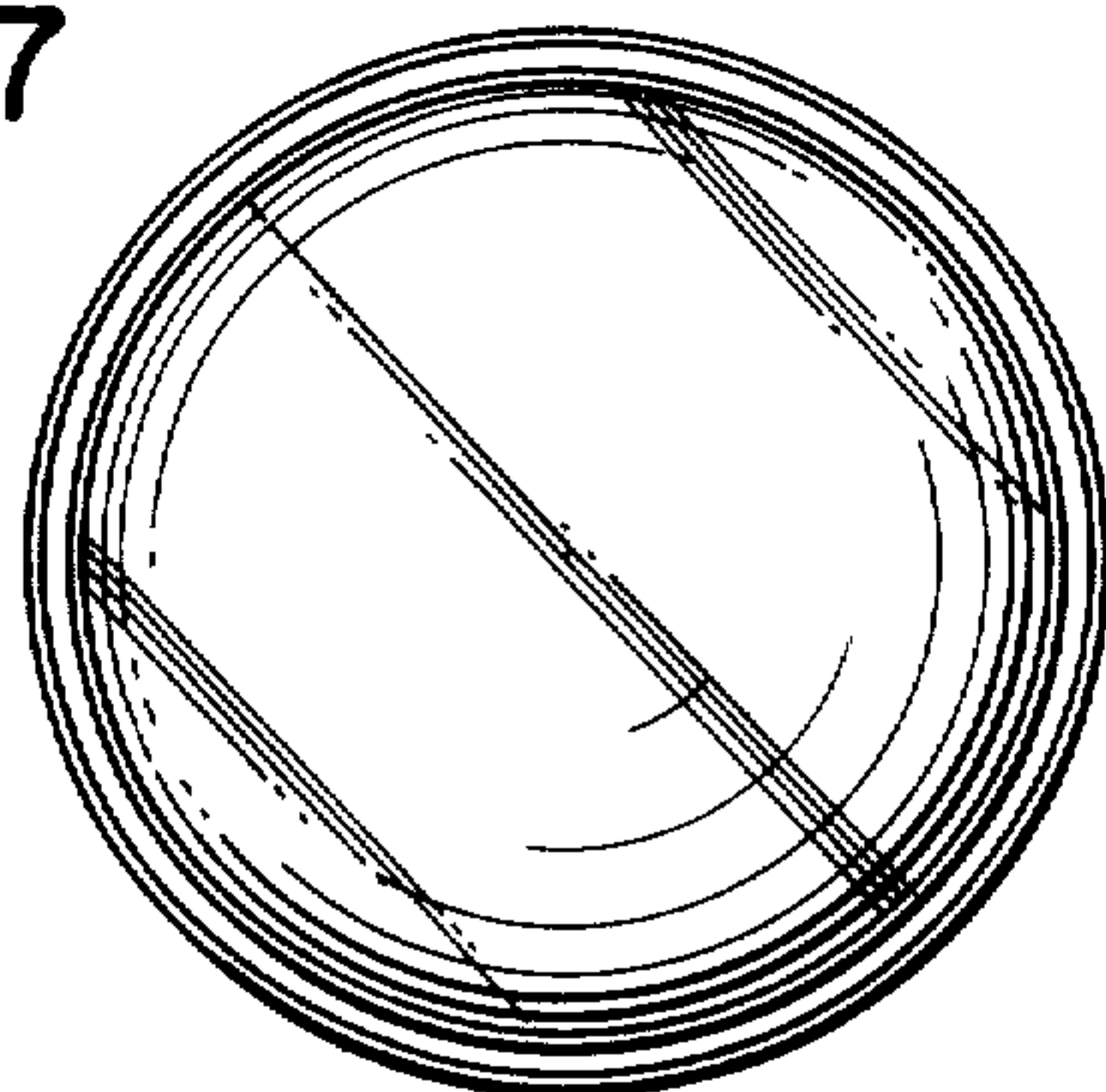
